Scanning the Horizons

ately, we've noticed a welcome trend in business computing: What were once expensive tools for specialists are becoming affordable resources for all sorts of users. It's happened with desktop publishing software and with PostScript printers. Is it time to add gray-scale scanners to the list?

Until recently, publishing professionals like Contributing Editor Richard Jantz made up the market for scanners. With his background as magazine editor, book publisher, freelance writer, and author of a pair of desktop-produced books on *Ventura Publisher*, Jantz has had ample opportunity to put image scanning technology to good use.

These days, though, scanners are attractive for a lot more applications than desktop publishing, says the author of this month's roundup review, "Gray-Scale Scanners Enter the Mainstream." Scanned images are still a tremendous low-cost alternative to conventional half-tones. But as they've become cheaper and more versatile, scanners have been transformed from an expensive novelty into a nearly essential business tool. In fact, Jantz contends, "it's hard to imagine the average businessperson *not* wanting to invest in a scanner today."

One obvious incentive is dollars and cents. In the past year, Jantz reports, prices have tumbled. "Today, you can pick up a top-quality scanner for a street price of around \$2000. That's about half what it was just a couple of years ago."


A much more powerful inducement is the sheer versatility of the latest generation of scanners. "Even if you just buy one to scan in some company artwork you've commissioned in the past, you'll probably come out ahead," says Jantz. "But you can also use a scanner for optical character recognition. There's an emerging technology to do raster-to-vector conversions, which will allow you to move images into other programs, like *AutoCAD*. You can even use scanned images with a data base—to store, say, pictures of all your employees."

Given the march of technology and the steady decline in prices, does it make sense to wait a little longer before springing for a scanner? Jantz doesn't think so. "When prices fall too low, buyer beware. Gray-scale scanners come in different flavors, so you have to be sharp about what you buy. The difference between a 4-bit scanner and an 8-bit scanner, for example, is profound. The compatibility issue is likely to raise its head as well."

You may feel that your business isn't quite ready to take advantage of gray-scale scanning. But after you read Jantz's review, we won't be surprised if you start looking for a little extra room on the desktop.



Color Laptop Ships

NECHE Shows 386SX-Based Portable: The First Small Step for Color NEC Home Electronics heralds a new era in portable computing this month by introducing the first color laptop—and at a relatively affordable price. For \$8499, the 16-MHz, 386SX-based ProSpeed CSX offers a standard configuration of 2MB of RAM, one 3½-inch floppy, and a 28ms 42MB hard drive. A 23ms 100MB ESDI hard drive and a 2400-bps modem are available for about \$1100 and \$600, respectively. The ProSpeed CSX's 80-columby-25-line display measures about 10 inches diagonally and is powered by an on-board VGA controller that can drive an external monitor at VGA resolution. However, the laptop display's maximum resolution is only 640 by 350 with 16 colors in graphics mode, and 640 by 400 in text mode. Rath-

er than use active-matrix technology, which produces crisp images at a high price, NECHE settled on a less costly multiplexed twisted-nematic display, enhanced to reduce color blurring. "The CSX is not the be-all and end-all of color," explains Tom Martin, vice president of NECHE's computer business unit, "but we wanted to introduce a color screen early on in order to establish realistic expectations among customers and to begin production of color screens in quantity so that we could bring the cost down." The 18½-pound CSX costs only \$2000 more than monochrome versions of the ProSpeed. Because of the color display's power requirements, the clamshell-shaped computer is not battery operated.

IBM Shows New Laser

10-ppm Device Slightly More Functional Than Laser-Jet, Much Cheaper to Run BM introduced a laser printer this month that's faster, smaller, and cheaper to operate than Hewlett-Packard's 8-ppm LaserJet Series II. The question is, has HP anticipated such moves and undercut the competition? The 10-ppm IBM LaserPrinter 4019 matches the Series II's \$2695 list price but is 40 percent smaller. Its \$199 combined print drum/toner cartridge has a 10,000-page life, giving it a per-page consumables cost of roughly 2 cents, compared with 3 cents for the Series II. And the IBM label automatically gives Big Blue's corporate sales force an edge even over HP, says Dataquest's John Boldt. "There are just an awful lot of Blue companies." But it may be tougher sled-

ding among non-Blue shops; HP accounts for about 70 percent of all laser sales, and it long anticipated the spate of laser introductions this fall. As a countermeasure, HP is redefining the market by bracketing the general-purpose Series II with the 8-ppm IID work-group printer and the 4-ppm IIP personal printer—both very aggressively priced (see Top of the News, PCW, October 1989). The IIP is likely to sell for under \$1000 on the street, and many of its features surpass those of the Series II. The IBM 4019's price and feature set stack up well against the Series II, but as a personal printer, it may just end up competing at retail with an HP LaserJet IIP that is half its street price.

Speedo Debuts

Bitstream's New Technology Speeds Font Scaling, Reduces Memory Demands Bitstream has developed a new add-in font-rendering technology called Speedo that promises to bring fast, scalable fonts to users of popular DOS software. Bitstream president Rob Friedman says that software developers who license Speedo can embed it directly in their programs. Users will simply select a typeface and point size from an application's menu and watch the font build on screen almost immediately. For example, Speedo can build a 12-point Swiss font at EGA resolution at a rate of 115 characters per second on a standard 286-based computer. The faster the processor and the smaller and less complex the font, the faster the font displays. Users can also create some PostScript-like effects such as mirroring and rotated text. Speedo saves disk space since it stores only a 30K-to-60K

font-outline master rather than the fonts themselves. When the user needs a font, Speedo generates it on the fly. Speedo itself adds only roughly 20K to the size of an application. Approximately 15 software developers are working with the technology. One of the first to market is the newest version of Designer, Micrografx's draw package, introduced at the Seybold Computer Publishing Conference last month. "It's fast, well coded, and efficient," says Micrografx chairman Paul Grayson. "We think it's a great technology and went to a lot of trouble to get it into Designer 3.0." How well screen display matches printer output will depend on the developer, says Friedman.

PCL Upgraded

HP Plans Poor Man's PostScript, Adds Post-Script Cartridges Seeking to cement its leadership in the laser printer markets, Hewlett-Packard is not only launching the downsized \$1495 LaserJet IIP (see this month's preview) and PostScript cartridges but is also upgrading the LaserJet standard Printer Command Language (PCL). The new PCL Level 5 will take users a step closer to the graphics and font-scaling capabilities of Adobe's PostScript page-description language. Due out early next year, PCL Level 5 will add support for Compugraphic's scalable fonts and for HP's HPGL plotter language. PCL 5 will be backwardly compatible with packages written for today's LaserJets. The IIDs also will accept a \$995 PostScript cartridge containing 35 Adobe fonts. Over a year ago, HP

decided to make the LaserJet a "universal peripheral that connects to many platforms," explains Product Marketing Manager Cathy Lyons. Though HP and Adobe hadn't seen eye to eye earlier, "market pressure forced the two companies to work toward a mutually agreeable solution," says Lyons. HP's moves aim to forestall marketing pressure of another kind—IBM, Toshiba America, and Epson, among others, are making major pushes into the LaserJet-compatibles arena this fall. Moves like the IID's aggressive pricing, says Lyons, send a message to rivals: "This is a high-stakes game, and it's going to cost you a lot of money to play." As one analyst remarks, "It will be a battle of bull elephants."

Floppy Capacity Rises

First Models of New High-Density Floppy Standard Go On Sale This month, several vendors will begin shipping high-density drives capable of reading and writing 2.8MB of data on 3½-inch barium-ferrite floppies. Dealers will be provided with external 2.8MB drives with a controller and software for \$499 from Pacific Rim Systems of Hayward, California, and for \$449 from Micro Solutions of De Kalb, Illinois. Pacific Rim will use drives from Y.E. Data, while Micro Solutions will use Teac drives. Toshiba Corporation, expected to be a major supplier of both drives and media, is shipping samples to OEM customers, with quantity deliveries planned for the first quarter. The floppy disks, expected to retail for about \$10 each, may be scarce for a while but will be available from the disk drive suppliers and

retailers. The higher-density drives will read standard 1.44MB disks, but the reverse won't be true. Still higher capacity media has been discussed—notably, a long-delayed 21MB-plus drive from San Jose's Brier Technology (see January's Top of the News), which uses preformatted versions of the same barium-ferrite media. But the 2.8MB drives stand a better chance of becoming the next industry standard because they represent an incremental upgrade and don't require preformatted media, claims Pacific Rim director of marketing Roger Peters. Interest in the drives is being spurred by the increase in laptop sales and by rumors that IBM plans to introduce a computer with a high-density drive sometime this fall.

Wang to Sell PCs

Troubled Mini Giant Makes a Run at PC Business With Inexpensive Systems Professing renewed interest in the microcomputer market, Wang Laboratories has introduced four PCs that it plans to sell retail. The \$3 billion mini vendor is shipping 16-MHz and 20-MHz 286 computers and two 16-MHz models using Intel's 386SX—one with a standard AT-style bus and one with IBM's Micro Channel. Peter Berkel, in charge of Wang Labs' PC group, hopes that attractive discounts and better service and financing arrangements will double Wang's current complement of 100 dealers over the next year. The systems themselves are aggressively priced; the Micro Channel-equipped MC 350/16S with 2MB of memory, a 28ms 40MB hard drive, and five available slots sells for \$900 less than IBM's \$3895 55 SX, which has only

three slots and a 39ms 30MB drive. Other Wang assets include unique software that lets users combine images, data, and voice. But noting Wang's formidable competition, International Data Corporation PC analyst Bruce Stephen is skeptical. "They aren't a major player, haven't been for a couple of years, and the customer confidence level is way down," Stephen says, referring to the \$375 million loss for the fiscal year ended June 30 that forced the resignation of former president Fred Wang and a restructuring of the entire company. The company, which has something of a checkered history in the PC market, does boast 400,000 PCs installed as workstations for its VS minis.



acintosh lovers think their systems have PCs beat on several counts, but PCs still hold the edge in sheer complexity. Here's an example: Several months ago, Apple let loose a quiet revolution in Mac graphics with System 7.0, the next-generation operating system that enhances the Mac's QuickDraw imaging model and gives it scalable fonts-typefaces that can be displayed and printed at any size and distorted to produce special effects. Even though this development means an end to Apple's reliance on Adobe's PostScript in favor of a whole new imaging and printing technology based on QuickDraw, Mac users won't be in for any rude shocks. With System 7.0, Apple promises a nopain/big-gain upgrade.

Meanwhile, at press time PC giants IBM, Microsoft, and Hewlett-Packard were said to be working out an agreement on a similar imaging and font technol-

ogy for IBM's next-generation environment, OS/2 with Presentation Manager. This agreement reportedly also sidesteps Post-Script but doesn't reject it altogether, and makes room for competing technologies like an enhanced Hewlett-Packard PCL printer control language (see Top of the News and Industry Outlook in this issue). Incredibly, it looks as though the deal even accommodates Apple, with the goal of creating a new market of peripherals that work equally well on Macs and PCs. With so many choices, users are bound to get more graphics power. But they also may find themselves asking an already-too-familiar question: Will this software work with this printer?



Another important question: Do "font wars" over imaging standards really matter? To most *PC World* readers, they definitely will. You've demonstrated a serious appetite for products that extend your powers of communication graphically: word processors with desktop publishing capabilities, laser printers, business graphics programs. All these products can deliver impressive-looking output—depending, of course, on the kinds of fonts and graphics they support. But to-

day, using scalable fonts on a PC can be a time-consuming, complicated, and error-prone process. A good imaging standard should change that.

What's more, good imaging technology is crucial to the next generation of software running under Windows and Presentation Manager. Graphical software doesn't simply mean pulldown menus and dialog boxes. 



Open or Universal?

Still, multiple competing standards usually means confusion and incompatibilities; so if you need a high-performance imaging standard, why not stick with PostScript? It's been around a long time; it has great support from font vendors; and it's well supported by many PC software packages. Further, Adobe argues that PostScript could serve as the perfect universal medium for transferring formatted information between multiple operating systems and environments like DOS, Windows, OS/2, the Mac, and UNIX.

Such arguments don't seem to hold much weight with Microsoft, HP, Apple, et al. They'd rather avoid PostScript's licensing fees and instead devise a new standard that allows free document exchange between Macs and PCs. Furthermore, all parties appear eager to encourage a new generation of high-performance, low-cost printers and other peripherals that would take advantage of an open imaging model built directly into the Mac operating system and OS/2.

In the short run, nobody knows how much pain or gain will come from an open imaging model in Presentation Manager. Macintosh owners can rest easy —minimal choices will mean a minimum of disruption. But PC users may not have it so good.

It's no doubt true that most people are willing to pay \$51 to \$100 to upgrade their software ["Rate Your Satisfaction," Consumer Watch, PCW, August 1989]. However, your survey would have generated more useful results if you had asked what percentage of the purchase price users would pay for an updated version.

For example, Microsoft recently charged \$50 for an upgrade to *QuickC*, a product that sells for \$70. That's more than 70 percent of the new user's price. I



find this unacceptable. If I stay with the product long enough, I'll end up buying it three or four times over. I'd like to pay no more than 30 to 40 percent as an upgrade fee.

sion programs, and even a little program called EEMWINFO, which answers Mr. Alsop's request for a way to view and allocate expanded memory. Windows shareware is where the action is.



Tell Us About the Interface

I am tired of word processing reviews that emphasize briefly seductive features over the basic user interface, which has the greater long-term effect on productivity. Your review "Advanced Word Processors-Familiar Faces, New Features" [PCW, July 1989] focused on "critical advanced features" and extolled mouse support because it "lets you edit at warp speed." First, the words critical and advanced don't always wed in practice: Of your list of features, only mail merge might qualify as both. You can get used to the peculiarities of any word processor, but some interfaces are simply better than others. It's hard to believe you would rate *WordPerfect* tops while admitting it has so many options crowding the function keys that "it's hard even for experts to remember the commands."

Catch as Cache Can

Q. No one in my computer science class can clearly explain to me what a cache is. I know it's supposed to speed up my computer, but just how does it work? Wilfredo Reyes P. Miami, Florida

A. Two kinds of caching are available for today's PCs: memory caching and disk caching. Although both serve as repositories for data, they serve different purposes and are often confused. Furthermore, caching is imple-

mented differently depending on the manufacturer, so consider the following only a general description.

Memory caching does not in and of itself speed up a system. It is often mistakenly thought to do so because it's useful only in today's very fast PCs, in which the speed of the CPU outstrips the speed of typical memory chips.


Memory caching enables manufacturers to produce affordable high-speed systems. Such systems could use fast RAM for system memory, obviating the need for a memory cache, but the more expensive memory chips would push the system price too high to be competitive.


Memory caching cannot be

added to a system; it must be designed in from the beginning. A memory cache consists of a cache controller and a small amount—typically 32K to 128K—of high-speed memory. It sits between the CPU and addressable system RAM.

When the CPU requests data from system memory, the cache controller intervenes, looking into its cache RAM to see if the requested block of data is there. If so, the data is passed quickly to the CPU byte by byte. If not, the CPU spins its wheels while it waits for slower system RAM to provide the data. This block of data passes through the cache, which keeps a copy of the data.

The cache's high-speed mem-(continues)

ory allows the CPU to write data to cache memory at full speed and quickly return to other tasks. The cache controller then copies the data to its intended destinations at the slower system RAM rate.

Disk caching can be added to any system, either by installing a caching disk controller or by using a memory-resident program that employs conventional, expanded, or extended RAM. Accessing data from even the fastest disk drive is far slower than getting it from memory. So when the CPU requests disk data, the disk cache program (or controller) first checks the cache. If the requested data is in the cache, it's passed quickly to the CPU. If not, the cache program or controller reads the requested data from the disk into the cache. It also reads a few sectors of nearby data, anticipating that the CPU may soon request it as well. The cache then passes on a copy of the requested data to the CPU. When the cache is full and does not contain requested data, newly read data from the disk usually replaces a portion of cached data.

Disk caching can be finetuned by the user. Some disk caches let you specify that the cache should not replace certain data (for example, a program overlay) or that certain data should not be cached (downloaded fonts, for example). The size of the cache also affects system performance: If it's too large, you'll spend more time searching the cache than it would take to get the data from disk; if it's too small, you'll waste time looking in the cache for data that's never there.

Spaced Out

Q. I inadvertently used a space in naming a file. Application programs cannot open the file, and even DOS, it seems, cannot rename or delete it even though it's listed when I execute DIR. I'm sure there's a simple trick to solve this dilemma, but I don't know what it is. Please help!



A. Let's assume that your file is named MY FILE.DOC (with a space embedded between the Y and the F) and that it's in the current directory of the default drive. At the DOS prompt, type the command dir my?file.doc and press <Enter> to verify that MY FILE.DOC is the first or only file name that matches the mask my?file.doc. If any other file names are listed before MY FILE.DOC, rename those files using a different file name extension. Then type ren and press <F3> to display 'ren my?file.doc'. Next, type a space and an unused file name and press <Enter>. That's all there is to it.

Parking Providence

Q. I run my system from a menu generated by a batch file. Whenever I exit a program selected from the menu, control returns to the batch-file menu and awaits the selection of another program. Because I was worried that I might jar my PC and damage the hard disk, I added to the batch file a command that parks the hard disk whenever I exit a program.

It is my understanding that whenever the PC is on, the hard (continues)

disk is spinning—and wearing out. I've assumed that parking the hard disk to keep it stationary lengthens its life. Am I right?

Doug Russell Clearwater, Florida

A. Parking moves the hard disk's read/write heads so they aren't hovering over recorded data. While parking the heads guards against data loss due to a hard disk crash (in which a read/write head falls into the spinning disk, gouging the surface and destroying the head), parking does not stop the disk from turning at its appointed 3600 rpm. Furthermore, the next command read from the hard disk (for example, your batch file's "user in-

put" command) unparks the heads. Your hard disk's heads probably never remain parked for more than half a second. To solve this problem, put the "user input" command in a RAM disk and have the batch file call it from there.

There are two additional measures you can take to lengthen the hard disk's life. Consolidating fragmented files with a diskoptimizing program minimizes the stressful jostling of the actuator that positions the read/ write heads. So does using the memory-resident utility FAST-OPEN (available in DOS 3.3 and later versions). FASTOPEN stores in memory the location of directories and recently opened files so that DOS knows where to move the heads to reread a file without first having to move the

heads and reread the directory.

The second tip is a bit controversial. Many users believe that turning the disk on and off is more damaging to the hard disk's ball bearings than the wear caused by constant spinning. I, for one, leave my system on all the time (a screen-blanking program prevents burning in an image).

One thing is certain: No matter how long your hard disk lives, it will eventually die. Back it up religiously.



Also, when I use the diagnostics disk to test my PC's Color/Graphics Adapter and its serial port (which connects my modem), I get the error numbers '516' and '1101'. What do the error numbers mean, and how do I correct the problem?

A. A 'Parity Check 1' error message indicates a problem with system board memory (a '2'

would mean there is a problem with memory on an expansion board in one of the PC's slots). To help detect internal memory failures, the PC has a ninth "parity" bit for each 8-bit byte of memory. Each parity bit is set on or off depending on whether its associated byte has an even or odd number of "on" bits, respectively. If, when checked, a parity bit setting is incorrect for its associated byte's number of "on" bits, the validity of that byte is questionable; the system then stops and displays a parity check error message.

The fact that your computer works most of the time (after it's passed its self-diagnostic poweron memory test) and that it

passes the diagnostics disk's memory test suggests you may not have a defective memory chip after all. Since the error occurs after you've been using the computer for a while, heat may be a factor.

My guess is that some memory chip isn't firmly seated in its socket, and when the PC heats up, an electrical connection is lost or weakened. If you feel comfortable working inside your PC, turn it off, open it up, and ground yourself to discharge any static electricity, which can damage PC components. (If the PC, though off, is still plugged into a grounded socket, you can ground yourself by touching the power supply's casing.) Then, as you (continues)



avoid touching the chip's pins, the back of the adapter cards, and any other electrical circuitry, press each system board memory chip into its socket (the memory chips are next to the speaker, arrayed in four rows of nine chips each). While the system's open, take the time to blow out (don't vacuum) the dust that's accumulated inside.

The diagnostic error number '516' means there's a problem with the PC's character set or that you answered no when, after the character set had been displayed, diagnostics asked 'Is the screen correct?' I'll bet on the latter because you wouldn't still be using your PC if you couldn't read the characters. Er-

ror number '1101' means there was a problem testing the serial port. I'm guessing that you didn't use the "wrap plug" that's needed to test the serial port, although your serial port must be fine because you use your modem without incident.

Printing From PFS: First Publisher


Two readers have suggestions regarding how to speed up printing *PFS: First Publisher* documents (see "Buffers and Spoolers Demystified," *The Help Screen, PCW*, June 1989). Both methods begin by having the user "print" the document to a file by entering a drive, path, and file name in the print dialog box's destination field (before "printing," be sure you have selected the proper printer driver).

At that point you have two choices.

You can copy the print file to the printer using the command COPY d:\path\filename.ext LPT1:/B. The /B, for binary copy, must be included. Or you can use the DOS command PRINT d:\path\filename.ext LPT1:/B to print the document in the background, allowing you to continue to use your PC for other purposes. My thanks to Rex A. Firsthand dispatches from the Windows front

Hewlett-Packard's latest,
NewWave, promises a new look
in interface design and a new
definition of ease of use.

Stewart Alsop

One reason I get the opportunity to complain so much about Windows is the nature of the relationship between Microsoft and IBM. IBM struggles to understand new ways of organizing and designing computing systems while still providing reliable service to its customers. Microsoft does its best to figure out how to design graphic interfaces and new operating systems while still trying to satisfy IBM. Meanwhile, the pace of development work on Windows suffers as both companies try to find a compromise that meets their common interest.

One advantage Apple has with the Macintosh is that it neither has to sell its software to an IBM nor buy it from a Microsoft. Instead it can focus exclusively on issues that it believes are important to its customers and establish a single set of priorities for its developers. Ironically, Hewlett-Packard has a similar advantage. (The irony is that Apple is suing Hewlett-Packard for infringing on Apple's interface design.) True, Hewlett-Packard licenses the underlying Windows software from Microsoft. But it has built NewWave in such a way that it doesn't have to worry too much about how Microsoft changes Windows. This lets it focus on making NewWave a solid, state-of-theart system for users.

And that is exactly what it has done. In the first customer version of *NewWave*, released this past September, Hewlett-Packard took the first tangible step forward in user interface design since the Macintosh was delivered in 1984. Actually, Hewlett-Packard has taken two steps forward, in the form of objects and agents.

Object-Management Oomph

The first innovation in NewWave is its object-management facility (fondly known in Santa Clara, California, home of the NewWave development team, as the OMF). The OMF is what makes NewWave an object-oriented environment. Ask half a dozen people what object oriented means, and

you'll get a dozen answers, all wrong. Yet the OMF provides a significant benefit to the user.

The underlying idea is that the system takes a higher level of responsibility than ever before for keeping track of what's going on inside the computer, thereby simplifying the user's job and letting him or her focus on work. Within NewWave, everythingsoftware, data, tasks—is defined as an object with a certain relationship to other objects. The OMF manages these relationships. Instead of having to remember that you stored Word-Perfect and its related files in the WDPFT directory and that you made several directories for different kinds of text files-such as letters and reports-New-Wave hides the software and the directory system so all you need to remember is that you have documents, which you can open, or print, or send.

Because you deal only with objects and not with programs and files, you can work in a way that is more like the way you work without a computer. The transition is seamless, and that's the essential benefit of *NewWave*.

Agents: Beyond Super Macros



tasks. At first, it's easy to dismiss this capability as a better way of programming the keyboard, a kind of super macro editor. But there's more to agents than meets the eye. Because the system is designed as an object-oriented environment with well-defined relationships between objects, agents can automate tasks that span many different applications.

Say you want to forecast your numbers for the month with Excel, graph those numbers using Micrografx's Graph Plus, insert the numbers and the graphs into a report created in Samna's Ami Professional, and then either send the report to another computer using Future Soft's Dynacomm or just print it locally. (All the companies mentioned have promised a NewWave-specific version of their software by mid-1990.) The entire process can be built by making each individual portion an agent and then tying the agents together. You

automate it by asking *NewWave* to watch what you do and then assigning a name to the process.

The net result is that using NewWave—or I should say, doing work in the NewWave environment—is a significantly different experience, one in which you spend less time worrying about the computer and more time worrying about how to get your work done. 

Who Sets PostScript Standards?

Microsoft, IBM Writing PostScript Alternative

Building OS/2 "Imaging Model"



Adobe president Charles Geschke says PostScript is the only imaging model you'll ever need for display and printer.

A t Adobe Systems,
PostScript's most remarkable output is cash.
Embodied in more than half a million laser printers, the page description language and its spin-offs are logging more than \$100 million in sales annually, and more than a quarter of that goes straight into the bank account of its Mountain View, California, creator.

Small wonder that three formidable groups want slices of that pie: PostScript clone hardware is arriving; Adobe's closest ally, Apple, has filed for divorce; and the Microsoft/IBM team is prepping Presentation Manager for a coup.

Like Apple, which is writing an alternative to PostScript, Microsoft and IBM are drafting a blueprint for fancy graphicsintensive applications and high-quality output. The goal: to give users fast, easy, and sophisticated ways to manipulate text and graphics on screen and printer. The means: a "single imaging model" that displays fonts and graphics and prints them exactly the same way, offering true WYSIWYG for the first time.

No, the Macintosh doesn't do that. Steve Jobs' famous Next machine comes closest; it employs Display PostScript (Adobe's Post-Script-based imaging model) so a file drives the screen and the printer in identical fashion. "Wherever an image goes, it's a Post-Script image," explains Adobe president Charles Geschke. "That reduces the risk of unpleasant surprises." That approach also permits Next to offer a laser printer sans controller.

"A common imaging model is a key factor for future operating platforms," agrees Peter Neupert, Microsoft's senior general manager of OS/2. "We want to make Presentation Manager the richest imaging model." Microsoft need not invent or even own every piece of the technology, he says, "but it's important that we can control the direction."

"For Microsoft, Post-Script and Display Post-Script are a real threat almost like somebody else going into operating systems," comments Rob Friedman, president of Bitstream in Cambridge, Massachusetts.


The next step for PM's imaging model (dubbed Graphical Programming Interface, or GPI) is state-of-the-art scalable text fonts. Microsoft and IBM are studying offerings from Bitstream, Compugraphic, and others. Outsiders expect scalable fonts to appear, at the earliest, in OS/2 2.0 in mid-1990.

Microsoft and IBM are encouraging manufacturers to build GPI printers, although GPI lacks suitable printer controls. So Microsoft, QMS, and Epson are taking different slants on GPI devices—helping to ensure customer confusion, comments Jim Upham, director for electronic printers service at Dataquest in San Jose.

PM and Apple's system software will still talk to PostScript printers, says Paul Grayson, president of Micrografx in Richardson, Texas. "Both environments always will provide a generic Post-Script driver, and, over time, we would expect it to offer very high quality."

Naturally, Microsoft must work with Adobe to make all this happen. That cooperation is just (see Microsoft, IBM, p. 70)

one thread in a Byzantine web of PostScript alliances between computer vendors, system software suppliers, printer manufacturers, font makers, and application houses.

But only PostScript files work without conversion on diverse personal computers, workstations, printers, and typesetting equipment. "People are accustomed to the connectivity PostScript offers, which will be lost if compatibility is lost," Geschke maintains. Neupert downplays this concern: "PostScript is a vehicle for connectivity, but probably

not the best vehicle." But with Microsoft, Apple, and others tooling up, a better vehicle won't arrive soon.

The ability to jump from PC to Mac to printer leaves PostScript "more of a standard than ever." declares Rob Auster. group director for electronic printers at CAP International in Norwood, Massachusetts, "Billions of dollars are invested in PostScript," he points out. "The ball is rolling, and it's so big and so fast that you'd have to invest a tremendous amount of marketing effort to stop it."

But is it still Adobe's ball? Adobe shrewdly emphasizes its standards role, pointing to the difficulties that PostScript clones suffer with Adobe fonts (the clones work fine with fonts from other vendors). Even so, Auster insists PostScript's endless upgrades make Adobe "incompatible with itself."

"We're at least as compatible with the Post-Script standard as any Adobe [licensee]," claims Bob Downs, vice president for peripherals at Phoenix Technologies in Norwood, Massachusetts. Phoenix, one of a handful of credible PostScriptcompatible suppliers, ran 7000 test cases. Downs says the standard is not Adobe's latest version but rather the millions of existing PostScript customer files, which any offering must accept.


Heightened competition already pays off for cus-

tomers: Adobe has softened its licensing terms, and the clone makers charge still less, slowly helping to depress Post-Script printer costs.

But Geschke says that Adobe, which counts more than 30 licensees, won't change its course. The major players in type fonts support PostScript. Adobe is rapidly expanding its font libraries. Display PostScript has attracted broad backing in the UNIX world. And Geschke predicts that technical progress will leave PostScript with the final word. Among advances, Adobe is expected to mute the most common user criticism early next year with a big boost in throughput. -E. B.

DeskMate Packages Arrive

Tandy's Interface Gains Backers



Tandy's DeskMate environment is attracting big names.

he first 1-2-3 modified for a graphic user interface will arrive this month or next. But instead of *Windows* or OS/2 Presentation Manager, it's

tailored for Tandy's DeskMate.

Tandy has shipped well over a million copies of its low-end graphic environment and expects 50 DeskMate titles by yearend. Lotus Spreadsheet for DeskMate heads the list of recent endorsees, which also includes Symantec's Q&A Write.


DeskMate packages can run on 8088-based PCs with 640K of memory or less, and they aim straight at Tandy's core market of cost-sensitive home and small-business users. "This is the highest-growth segment in our market," notes Lotus president Jim Manzi. Symantec president Gordon Eubanks adds that these customers want DeskMate's ease of use and consistency between applications.

Developing DeskMate applications "is not that difficult," says Jill Groginsky, product manager for First Publisher at Software Publishing. "We

did the whole project, start to finish, in six months."

With 7000 outlets, "Tandy is the leading retailer of computers in this country," Eubanks points out. But Tandy's distribution system appears to have two drawbacks. First, Radio Shack stores have never pushed software effectively. "There's usually one person in the store who knows software," says Groginsky. "If he or she is on the floor. they sell software. If not, they sell hardware." Groginsky and Eubanks agree that Tandy is making progress here, but only a handful of Desk-Mate packages can expect attention from Radio Shack staff. And second, while a few independent resellers offer DeskMate. sales have been negligible to date. -E. B.



Ashton-Tate Staggers

Financial Reserves Remain Strong

B attered by criticism, and bleeding red ink, Ashton-Tate is lurching through the second half of 1989. Stung by the market's rejection of dBASE IV, the company has been forced to split its data base flagship into two versions—one that simply fixes version 1.0 bugs and one that exploits extended memory and connects to SQL Server.

This isn't the first test of Ashton-Tate—nor of company chair Ed Esber, who was hired five years ago under similar circumstances. But it is unquestionably the darkest hour for both.

Last summer, soon after Ashton-Tate posted a \$19.8 million second-quarter loss that prompted the resignation of president Luther Nussbaum, Esber revealed yet another delay in attempts to resuscitate dBASE IV. He couldn't offer ship dates for version 1.1; beta testers say the standard release could ship by year-end, with the SQL Server edition following three months later. But Esber allowed that the third-quarter loss will deepen.

After a grueling early-morning session with press and analysts on August 15, Esber gathered workers in the central courtyard of the company's Torrance, California, headquarters. Visibly shaken, he told them that more than 250 of the company's 1700-plus work force would be laid off. He describes the experience as "the hardest thing I've ever had to do."


The announcement was the first intimation of mortality for a company that has sometimes stumbled but in general has dominated its market and maintained remarkable growth in revenues and profits.

During the past year, Esber has gotten nothing but heat over what he admits was the premature shipment of dBASE IV in October 1988. Before that he attracted just as much criticism for not shipping the product. The continuing miscues have severely undercut the company's credibility and thrown a cloud over the dBASE language standard. The uncertainty has stalled many corporate development projects and angered add-on developers and consultants who rely on the dBASE aftermarket.


Many have deserted the language for one of the socalled *dBASE* add-ons. "I haven't been able to earn a living with *dBASE* for a number of years," reports Tom Rettig, principal in Tom Rettig Associates of Beverly Hills, California, and a member of Ashton-Tate's dBASE Language Advisory Board. "Serious developers must have a copy of dBASE, but they use [Fox Software's] Fox-Base or [Nantucket's] Clipper to do their development."

Pat Adams, owner of New York City's DB Unlimited and a founding member of the International Dbase Users Group (I-DBUG), agrees. But she adds that this trend has been nearly invisible: her corporate end-users usually don't know which tool she used to build their applications. Those companies won't desert the dBASE standard, she says. "They have too much invested in the training of thousands of end users, custom soft-(see Ashton-Tate, p. 74)

(continued from p. 72) ware applications, and live .DBF files to move."

But Ashton-Tate's dealings with developers have never been worse. Unable to deliver on last year's promises of more frequent updates and a better working relationship, Esber indefinitely postponed this year's developers' conference. He isn't sure when the compiler he unveiled last year will ship.

But the focus of developer anger is dBASE IV. Esber acknowledges that it was a mistake to wrap all user-requested features into a single product for a 640K machine. The

standard edition of 1.1 will be a networkable product that will run in 640K of memory but won't talk to a dedicated data base server. The second release will include SQL Server hooks by using Rational Systems' DOS extender technology and will require a 286 machine or better. Anyone buying dBASE IV 1.0 can step up to either upgrade for free or get both for a nominal fee.

If the strategy works, all will be forgiven and forgotten, says Rettig, because consultants and corporate developers alike would like nothing better than a strong standard. But, cautions Adams,

"success or failure depends upon their getting out a good, solid product."

Ashton-Tate has the time to get it right, adds Bahar Gidwani, vice president at Kidder, Peabody & Co. He notes that the firm is sitting on a \$90 million cushion-enough to allow it to lose money at its current rate for six quarters and still have cash on the balance sheet. "Their position is actually quite good," Gidwani observes. "They have a dominant share of a large market, a strong balance sheet, and enough cash to weather any problems. There is virtually no chance of their going bankrupt."

While a hostile takeover can't be ruled out, Wall Street looks favorably on Esber's assumption of day-to-day control and his cost-cutting measures. Moreover, Ashton-Tate still faces no serious contenders for its data base crown; its trials are the equivalent of heavyweight champion Mike Tyson's beating himself up. "The good news," says David Bayer, a vice president with Montgomery Securities, "is that the solution to [Ashton-Tate's] problems is in its own hands." -Mike Hogan

Private Eye Adds a New Focus

Tiny Display Is Equivalent to a 12-Inch Screen



The Private Eye provides computer users on the go with the equivalent of a 12-inch screen that fits in a pocket.

magine a high-quality PC screen so small you can easily slip it into your vest pocket. Allen Becker imagined one, and then came up with the Private

Eye—a tiny "virtual display" that provides the equivalent of a 12-inch screen in a package about half the size of a cigarette pack and weighs a tad over 2 ounces.

You hold it up to your eye, and a screen slightly smaller than a postage stamp shows a clear, bright red image. While the Private Eye isn't meant for prolonged work, its image is very readable-with or without glasses. You can focus the image so it appears to be within 9 inches or on the horizon. You can mount the device on a headset so it sits slightly below your eye and then use it like a bifocal.

Inside the Private Eye, light from an LED bar travels through a magnifying lens, hits a vibrating mirror, and is reflected out to the viewer. This ingenious scheme gives 720 by 268 resolution; VGA resolution will be next. The device will

cost manufacturers as little as \$100 apiece (in volume) early next year.
Becker's start-up, Reflection Technology of Waltham, Massachusetts, shoots for a five-year goal of a full-color, 1000 by 1000 display—"a high-definition TV in a matchbox."

The Private Eye will be used with diagnostic equipment, video games, and paperless fax machines. It's ideal for pintsize PCs because it doesn't depend on ambient light and draws less than half a watt. But while the concept is intriguing, the Private Eve may not fit in everywhere. Observes Mark Eppley, chair of Traveling Software, "Can you picture a business executive sitting in business class on an international flight, wearing a headband with a Private Eye hanging from it?" -E. B. ●



The Fox Turns Pro

More than a speedy dBASE clone, FoxPro adds a windowing environment and a slick report writer


—and it's faster than ever.

A fter releasing the dBASE-compatible Foxbase + 2.1 two years ago, Fox Software began playing around with the Macintosh to develop ideas for a Presentation Manager data manager. The result was Foxbase + Mac, which deftly wed windows with the dBASE language.

Rather than move up to Presentation Manager, Fox has returned to DOS, delivering Mac benefits in its new FoxPro data manager. FoxPro sparkles with a character-based windowing interface designed for use with a mouse. A spiffy band-oriented report writer, an advanced text editor, and an animated debugger head the list of added features designed to please

developers and casual users alike.

FoxPro also boosts the speed and retains the dBASE compatibility that earned Foxbase + a PC World Best Buy (see "Five Against IV," PCW, May 1989). But don't expect a bargain: Like dBASE IV, FoxPro costs \$795—twice the price of Foxbase.

FoxPro's initial release won't win a features faceoff with Ashton-Tate's dBASE IV—it lacks SQL and query by example (QBE), and its screen generator is a step behind. Yet FoxPro provides enough advances to rank with the heavyweights. It may be the easiest programmable data manager around—and probably the fastest.

Mousing Around

Fox has chosen to emulate a Windows-style graphic

interface with a speedier character-based environment. Optimally, you'll use a mouse to open Fox-Pro's pulldown menus, but you can take <Alt>-and <Ctrl>-key short-cuts. The menus call up well-designed pop-up windows and dialog boxes. Alternatively, purists can open a window to enter commands directly.

FoxPro lets you open up to 50 windows at once and resize and move them

at will. For example, you can open up to nine browse views while building a report in another window, or type a memo in one window while browsing data in another.

Unlike with Windows, you don't have to squint at pixels to grab the edges of windows; it's easy to find the handles on characterbased icons. You can expand, scroll, and close the Windows-like hot corners at top speed. Color options are extensive, and you can invoke such built-in desktop accessories as a calculator, a file manager, and a calendar/scheduler.

With its View window, FoxPro almost matches dBASE IV's Control Center. Here you can manage data files, work areas, indexes, and relationships. A helpful, integrated Browse/Edit window lets you create virtual joins from linked files. You can even specify validating user-defined functions (UDFs) and calculations.

Like dBASE IV's, Fox-Pro's relational talents are a cut below those of Borland's Paradox. Unlike with Paradox, users wrestling with complex one-to-many or many-tomany relationships must write procedural code.

Like dBASE IV, Fox-Pro has a superb bandoriented report writer, which separates related elements into on-screen rectangles—and FoxPro's menus are more intuitive. FoxPro's report writer doesn't generate code, but it lets you embed UDFs, and it gives an almost instant page preview. In many cases it circumvents the need for QBE. Unfortunately, the FoxView screen painter is unchanged from Foxbase +.

Sharper Tools

FoxPro's development tools don't quite match dBASE IV's, but they're easier to use and far more powerful than FoxBase's. The biggest draw is Fox-Pro's debugger, which takes full advantage of windowing. You can watch variables during command file execution in a debug window, while a trace window highlights the code and lets you point and click at breakpoints.

FoxPro's text editor is a vast improvement over Foxbase's. With clipboard cut and paste, search and replace, and other features, it's even suitable for basic word processing.

Fox has lifted its restrictions on UDFs—you can even include them in reports. And FoxPro matches Clipper in support for long text strings. In addition, the precompiler creates object code files automatically when you run the source code.

The main programming drawback is the application generator. Tied to the screen generator, it's a step behind the times. A simple code generator, it's faster than dBASE IV's but not nearly as powerful.

Still a Rocket

Although final benchmarks await a shipping product, FoxPro appears to be stunningly fast. Informal beta tests tend to support Fox's claim that FoxPro is three times as fast as Foxbase + and six to ten times zippier than dBASE IV.

Unlike dBASE IV 1.0, FoxPro provides full EMS support, though you don't need expanded memory to enjoy swift performance. While dBASE IV sweats bullets to squeeze into 640K, FoxPro can run in 512K, aiding network use. Currently, Fox plans no 386-specific version, claiming the performance boost would not be significant.

Fox boasts 100 percent syntax compatibility with dBASE IV, but support for the new .MDX multiple indexing awaits a future release. You're still limited to a total of 22 open indexes, but the limitation of 7 open indexes per file has been lifted to 22. Commands can run to 1024 characters, and records to 1024 fields.

Looking ahead, an interim release will upgrade the screen and application generators and provide .MDX indexing. Early next year, version 2.0 should offer an .EXE compiler and a SQL frontend for the upcoming FoxServer server (a superset of Novell's NetWare SQL). FoxPro 2.0 will offer a full

mixture of SQL and dBASE commands.

Unlike dBASE IV, Fox-Pro 1.0 doesn't try to be all things to all people, but it hits the high points. More important, it successfully eases the inherent difficulty of data management—and it runs faster than ever. Despite FoxPro's steep price, users awaiting a bug-free dBASE IV 1.1 may find it's time to switch. ●

HP Cuts Cost of Laser Printing

The 4-ppm LaserJet IIP brings laser printing within reach of a new audience—with optional PostScript support.

The Hewlett-Packard LaserJet IIP costs about \$1000 less than the LaserJet Series II, but all you forfeit is speed (you get 4 pages per minute rather than 8). The small-footprint IIP offers a large 4.5MB memory capacity for full-page graphics and multiple fonts.

Q uite a few people who want a LaserJet but balk at spending more than \$1000 are about to get a very nice surprise. With the release of the LaserJet IIP—a low-cost, 4-page-per-minute printer based on the Canon P110 engine—Hewlett-Packard has single-handedly reinvented the laser marketplace.

This LaserJet II compatible lists for a deliciously low \$1495 (which probably translates to around \$1000 on the street, little more than the price of a high-end dot matrix printer). Addi-

tionally, it weighs only 25 pounds, puts out a standard 300 dots per inch, and supports an optional PostScript cartridge with scalable typefaces.

While the IIP's 4 pages per minute is only half the rated speed of the popular LaserJet II, in most reallife printing situations you may never notice the difference. You will notice the printer's modular design that lets you buy a low-priced entry-level machine and then upgrade at your own speed. The basic unit comes with 512K of RAM, 14 internal fonts,

and a 50-sheet paper tray that adjusts for letter- and legal-size paper and four sizes of envelopes. Whenever you're ready, you can add goodies like a 250-page paper cassette, one font cartridge, and up to 4.5MB of memory.

Early in 1990 you'll be able to add a \$995 Post-Script cartridge with 35 scalable Adobe typefaces. Although this cartridge will require at least 2MB of extra memory, the full PostScript setup (with printer, cartridge, and extra memory) will probably sell on the street for under \$3000—far less than any PostScript printer

available today.

The IIP is fully backward compatible with the LaserJet line. It takes standard toner cartridges, font cartridges, and downloadable fonts and supports HP's PCL printer language. The IIP is even a little quieter than earlier LaserJets, topping out at 47db rather than 50db.

While a number of lowend HP-compatible laser printers have come onto the market in the last year, none of them approaches the IIP's price and feature set. If this printer comes as a nice surprise for price-conscious laser printer shoppers, it seems likely to prove a very nasty one for HP's competitors.



Improvements in the Works

Microsoft's low-end integrated package gains a host of small enhancements.

U pgrading its popular \$149 integrated package, Microsoft has given Works more power while adding Windows-like touches to a fast character-based application.

Microsoft Works is a prime example of welldesigned integration. Version 1.0 offered a firstclass spreadsheet backed by word processing and data base and communications modules, all run by a consistent set of pulldown menus and dialog boxes (as noted in PC World's April 1989 review). Version 2.0 incorporates multiple windows, WYSI-WYG character formatting, print preview, a 300,000-synonym thesaurus, and EMS support.

The upgrade also

smooths a few of *Works*' remaining rough spots. For instance, the utility that converts *Works* word processing files is now built in, as is the macro program. Microsoft has also managed to shrink the manual from a mammoth 700 pages to 400.

Version 2.0 scores big gains in convenience. The package can display up to eight files in side-by-side or overlapping windows and zoom each window to fill the screen. And you can split the screen into two or four panes to see different parts of a file without scrolling. Works 2.0 lets you copy and rename files, copy disks, create and remove directories, and format and copy disks without exiting to DOS. And thanks to a

new applications launcher, you can run your most commonly used programs without leaving *Works*.

The print preview can't zoom or show facing pages, but it displays business graphics, character formatting, and type styles on screen. (Note, however, that you still can't see charts embedded in a worksheet or a word processor document until printout.) Works 2.0 even includes a pop-up calculator, an alarm clock (with a snooze feature), and an auto-dialer.

Individual modules have picked up a few niceties. Besides the thesaurus, the word processor has gained footnotes and bookmarks. In the spreadsheet, users can fill series and sort rows, and the speed-charting business graphics function is much easier to access.

The data base has put on the most muscle. Need to design a form or fill out a preprinted one? You can print both field names and values, field values alone for preprinted forms, or just field names to create a blank form. Finally, statistical summaries can be copied directly to a word processor document or to a worksheet.

Works 1 was criticized for using proprietary file formats in its word processing and data base modules, and the upgrade ignores that objection. But overall, Works 2.0 works—quickly and elegantly. ●

Mix-and-Match Modules for Building a Portable PC

t takes engineering sleight of hand to squeeze the functionality of a PC into a laptop. No one has yet mastered the trick completely, but portable makers like Dynabook Technologies come close.

The Dynabook 286 combines a one-wait-state 16-MHz 80C286 processor with a modular design that breaks down into four elements—CPU, display, battery, and docking module. All are encased in glossy black magnesium, ready to mix and match with each other or with full-size peripherals.

At center stage is the CPU module, which is truly laptop size—11 by 131/2 inches and only 11/2 inches thick. There's still room for a hard disk and an internal 2400-bps modem, and you can expand the standard 1MB of system memory to 8MB on the motherboard. The VGA-quality monochrome LCD is, likewise, razor thin. But if you want to drive this beauty with a battery, keep the health club membership. Its 2-to-4-hour, 5.4-pound battery pack brings the total weight of the system to just over 14 pounds.

On the other hand, if you'll have a screen and an AC outlet at your destination, you need only carry along the CPU and its AC adapter. In addition to two serial ports and a parallel port, the Dynabook's narrow backplate has an external VGA monitor port backed

up by a VGA adapter on the motherboard. Since laptops usually log most of their miles on the homeoffice shuttle, you can leave your full-size monitor and keyboard and your printer plugged into a Dynabook docking module at home, at the office, or both. The docking module's ports neatly match those on the back of the CPU and include a connector for a future AT bus expansion chassis.

The \$3695 Dynabook 286/1A comes with a 3½inch 1.44MB floppy, DOS 4.01, setup software, and an AC adapter. The LCD display adds another \$1000, a docking module is \$299, and you can choose a 28ms 20MB hard drive for \$500 or a 28ms 40MB hard drive for \$1100. 





Once your work group joins hands on a local area network, PC proficiency isn't enough-you also must learn to navigate the maze of network servers and subdirectories. But. Saros FileShare makes sharing files on an OS/2 LAN Manager network as easy as cruising the subdirectories of your own PC, by providing a standard way to distribute files all across the network.

That scheme means you don't have to specify server location and path and file names every time you store or retrieve a document. And if you blank out on the file name, you can still find the document with a quick search by author, subject, date, or other attribute.

During FileShare's installation, the network administrator determines how data files should be distributed across the network's servers for quickest access. Once that's done, when you add a file to FileShare, the software automatically stores it in the proper location (for instance, it might route your work group's regular files to a server in your department).

To aid file tracking, FileShare draws up a profile for each file on the network. This profile can combine up to 26 file attributes that the system tags automatically (such as user name and date) with up to 20 customized attributes that the user

can enter (such as work order number).

FileShare's Windows interface makes it easy to combine these attributes and initiate searches. It represents files as index cards so you can skim through a group of related files. The package also lets you save search pat-

terns (such as search by date) for reuse.

You can prevent user access to a given file or specify read-only or read/write access. Other security measures include file-version tracking and automatic storage or trashing of older versions of files.

FileShare works with Windows-equipped DOS workstations and requires a LAN operating system that supports OS/2's Named Pipes interprocess communications, such as Microsoft's LAN Manager, IBM's LAN Server, 3Com's 3+Open, or Ungermann-Bass's Net/One. Pedal Ball May Put Your Mouse Out to Pasture



Say goodbye to awkward clicking and dragging. Kraft Systems' threebutton Trackball saves your arm by letting you use your middle finger to rotate the ball and move the cursor around the screen. The unit also supports an optional foot pedal, which you click instead of the left button.

Mice are nice, but they nibble away at your desk space. Trackballs seem the best alternative to the little cheese burners, since a trackball sits in one place on your desk, and you move a rollerball instead of your arm. The trouble is that clicking and dragging requires an awkward combination of stationary fingers and rolling palm—advanced digital yoga, in short.

Serious trackball users have mastered those moves, but now Kraft Systems introduces the three-button Trackball that attacks the problem in two ways. First, the unit measures 5 by 7 inches—large enough for your thumb and pinky to rest comfortably on the buttons, with your middle

finger perfectly positioned to rotate the ball. Second, the unit supports a foot pedal (think of it as oneon-the-floor) that you click instead of the left button.

Installation is simple. The Trackball connects easily to any spare serial port and comes with a pop-up Speed Window utility that lets you adjust resolution from 10 dpi to 1150 dpi or anything in between. You can save your favorite speed setting as a default. The unit works perfectly even if there's a Microsoft bus mouse installed, although the Trackball driver will disable the mouse until the system is rebooted.





QMS ColorScript 100 Model 10

Color PostScript in a Smaller Box for a Smaller Price



QMS puts color and PostScript together in the ColorScript 100 Model 10, a downsized printer with a \$10,000 price tag.

QMS was the first to pack color and the Post-Script page description language into one box, but the original price for its ColorScript 100 Model 30 was \$25,000. Now comes the one-third-smaller ColorScript 100 Model 10, which ships with less

memory and prints smaller pages—and sports a price tag of a "mere" \$10,000.

The ColorScript 100 Model 10 is equipped with a Mitsubishi G370 300-dpi thermal transfer print engine that can use monochrome (black), three-color (cyan, magenta, and yellow), or four-color (cyan, magenta, yellow, and black) film. With four colors, you get more than 16 million shades. QMS claims that it delivers an 81/2-by-11-inch monochrome image in 15 seconds, three-pass color in less than 60 seconds, and four colors in 85 seconds. That's due to a 16-MHz Motorola 68020-based controller, which comes standard with 4MB RAM and 1MB ROM. The controller features Adobe Post-Script version 50.3 and 35 resident Adobe typefaces.

While the Model 10 can print on both plain paper and transparencies, QMS recommends coated paper for the best-looking output. An adjustable letter/legal-size paper cassette holds up to 100 cut sheets of paper or transparency film, and the output tray handles 50 sheets, face

up. Other standard features include serial, parallel, and AppleTalk ports as well as an external SCSI interface for a hard disk drive. The printer ships with a collection of utilities that simplify printer start-up and testing.

The Model 10 has enough memory to handle a letter-size page of Post-Script text and graphics. An optional 1MB board enables you to image text and graphics on legal- or A4-size paper. Beefing up memory with a 4MB option adds the headroom for soft fonts. However, choose memory options wisely; you scrap the 1MB board when you jump to the 4MB version.







Taking the Right Cut at Your Data

You have data, reams of it, routinely collected on the mainframe or in your PC data base manager. But making sense of it is another matter.

In the past, many users pulled that data into 1-2-3 for analysis. But now Ashton-Tate has teamed up with statistical analysis software maker SPSS to introduce a package that lets you manipulate and analyze information from the company data base more directly.

As the name implies, dBASE STATS is an addon for Ashton-Tate's popular data base, reading dBASE files directly and applying the 12 most common statistical functions.

For example, you might use regression analysis to determine environmental factors impacting worker productivity or curve-fitting techniques to extrapolate tomorrow's sales from yesterday's.


dBASE STATS employs a dBASE IV-style control center interface with pulldown menus and pop-up dialog boxes to parse your data before you import it. You can call the program from within dBASE, which unloads automatically, reloading when you exit dBASE STATS.

The real beauty of the program, though, is that it enables you to get regular updates of data for analysis without having to export a file. And dBASE STATS reads Lotus .WKS and .WK1 as well as SYLK and .DBF files.

You can export your findings directly to Ashton-Tate's graphics programs, Chart-Master and Draw Applause. dBASE STATS, which retails for \$400, requires DOS 2.1 or a later version, 512K of memory, and a hard drive. Keeping Expenses in Check


When Intuit first set out to create a check-register package, its goal was pretty basic: to make a program that was faster to use than doing the math by hand. The result was a convenient tool to balance checkbooks, print checks, and do limited financial reporting.

Version 3 of Quicken cements its links to the small-business community by adding muscle to asset handling and reporting while retaining its intuitive interface. Quicken 3 now tracks multiple cash and credit card accounts: makes transfers between multiple accounts and produces reports from them; and includes report templates for tax summaries, account balances, profit and loss, and asset and liability management. Like Andrew Tobias' Managing Your Money 6.0, Quicken 3 has a tie-in with CheckFree, an electronic payment service in Columbus, Ohio (see Product Outlook, PCW, October 1989).

Aimed at spenders as well as scrooges, the \$59.95 program now tracks income and expense categories for amounts up to \$10 million. Its instant reports consolidate information from multiple savings, checking, and credit card ac-

counts and provide loan amortization and capital equipment depreciation data. As with version 2, you can break the figures down by account or general category, making yearend tax calculations a lot faster. But Quicken 3's new spreadsheetlike display makes it easier to compare the profitability of various properties, projects, or jobs.

Other additions include ASCII and 1-2-3 export capabilities, a pop-up calculator, two levels of password protection, and



The latest version of Corel Systems' Windowsbased illustration program makes life easier for desktop publishers. In addition to the typefaces bundled with it. Corel Draw 1.1 includes a conversion program that lets you import from several

manufacturers' typeface outlines-including all Adobe's font outlines (rather than bit map approximations). Corel has thrown in 45 new typeface outlines from 14 type families for a package total of 102.

Once in the draw program, you can reshape the font, adding special effects such as graduated fills or even curving the text. Then you can send your creation to any Windows-compatible device, including PostScript printers and the HP LaserJet Series II. 





Polished Presentations

With the right tool, you can turn humdrum data into informative and convincing visuals, without jumping through hoops.

Seven business graphics programs help you practice the art of persuasion.

With solid graphics in spreadsheets like Excel, Quattro, SuperCalc, and 1-2-3 release 3, you may wonder if you really need a graphics package. If your brush with graphics consists of creating a quick black-andwhite chart and slipping it into a report, stick with your spreadsheet. But if your job regularly requires standing up in front of a group and delivering your best shot, you need high-quality visuals, and that means using presentation graphics software.

Each of the seven popular products reviewed here enables you to do much more than crank out charts from data sets. 35mm Express, Draw Applause, Freelance Plus, GEM Presentation Team, Graph Plus, Harvard Graphics, and Xerox Presents can all satisfy your business graphics presentation needs. Uniformly priced at \$495, they deliver word charting, drawing tools, clip-art libraries, PostScript and 35mm-slide support, and even monitor-based slide shows.

Three of these packages offer the convenience of icon-based graphic interfaces and a WYSIWYG work area, courtesy of *Windows* and *GEM*. Ironically, the two winning entries, *Freelance Plus* and *Harvard Graphics*, use old-fashioned, full-screen input forms for building charts and make you switch modes to preview final output. Clearly, there's more to power and ease of use than pulldown menus.

From Ideas to Images

Effective presentations don't happen by accident. They begin with careful selection of data (including words) and depend on proper timing and execution. A good package should cover every step in the process—including entering data, choosing and modifying chart formats, picking fonts, adding art, and selecting the order of images—without making you jump through hoops.

Data Import Most graphics users also use spreadsheets, and those who don't soon discover that the data has to come from somewhere. Charting often involves last-minute variations in the same data, which must be updated, massaged in a spreadsheet, and then imported into the graphics package.

Hot linking is the ultimate in tying worksheets to charts. Once you specify the worksheet file name (and in better programs, the cell range) for a chart, any change made to the worksheet updates the chart automatically. For people who habitually use graphics for desktop data analysis, *Harvard Graphics* and *Graph Plus* offer their own built-in spreadsheetlike functions.

Even if graphics programs lack such functions, they hold data for charting in their own type of spreadsheet. To give you the flexibility you need, a package should be able to plot at least a half-dozen data sets (equivalent to columns) and 24 data points (equivalent to rows). Only *Xerox Presents* falls short of this minimum standard.

Chart Selection Harvard Graphics, Graph Plus, and Freelance Plus provide the richest set of charts in the roundup. Along with the usual assortment of bar, pie, and line charts, these packages supply mixed charts (such as bar/line); scatterplots (to show the correlation between two distributions); charts with dual vertical axes (to reveal the relationship between two trends); and high/low/close charts (for securities analysis).

Most of the packages include templates for every chart type. Each template makes the decision for you about fonts, colors, line styles, patterns, and so forth. Look for a program that enables you to tailor these templates to your own requirements so you can use them again and again. However, not even Those who have neither the time nor the talent for drawing can avoid it entirely with clip art.

the most complete set of templates can accommodate all your presentation needs, and it's here that you'll appreciate a solid set of chart editing tools.

Chart Editing A few simple editing features can save you chronic headaches. For example, beginners quickly discover that the more data sets they have, the more likely labels along the horizontal axis are to overwrite each other. A good charting application lets you skip labels (dropping 1985 from between 1984 and 1986, for instance); better packages let you rotate labels by degrees.

Automatic scaling conveniently rounds off axis values and displays a label, such as "In Thousands," in the margin. However, not all packages let you decide how many zeros appear before rounding occurs. Similarly, most packages have handy predesignated positions for the legend, but only a few let you move the legend without considerable trouble.

Business graphics is an art of persuasion, and experienced chart makers know that lengthening the scale for profits, for example, can make a bad month look like a slight dip. Only Xerox Presents doesn't let you manually adjust scales on the axes; overall, Freelance Plus, Harvard Graphics, and Graph Plus have the best selection of chart-editing features.

Enhancements The first enhancement feature to look for is a wide array of high-quality fonts. After all, an estimated 70 percent of all charts are word charts, and attractive type styles give a chart a polished look. Every package reviewed offers a PostScript driver, but not every user has a PostScript printer. The LaserJet is the common denominator for laser printers, and if a package includes (or is compatible with) Bitstream fonts, you'll have LaserJet type of excellent quality.

When most people think of artistic enhancements, they think of drawing. But those who have neither the time nor the talent for drawing can avoid it entirely with clip art. Choosing a symbol from a library and dropping it in a chart is one of the easiest ways to add life. For maximum impact, you can place a scanned photograph of a company product or an ideal customer alongside a chart instead of a generic symbol.

Freelance Plus and Graph Plus deliver more drawing power than any of the other programs reviewed. One of their crucial features is curve smoothing of freehand lines. Smoothed, vector-based curves are far easier to manipulate than simple splines, especially for forming complex objects.

A top-notch program should also let you pick polygons, circles, arcs, ellipses, and other shapes from readily accessible menus and dynamically size objects at will. When you can select all or a subset of objects and flip, rotate, or zoom in on them with ease, the drawing process hums.

Output Most graphics packages drive a slew of devices, but you usually have only two practical choices of output. For high-powered, professional presentations, color slides are a necessity. For reports, in-house meetings, and other less momentous occasions, you'll want black-and-white handouts or overhead transparencies printed on a laser printer—dot matrix output is suitable for previews only. A lucky few can justify the cost of a plotter or a color ink jet printer for color transparencies.

Put together a string of charts for a slide presentation, and any package reviewed here can generate output files that one or more commercial slide services can turn into slides. The resolution and color quality these services offer are a magnitude better than those of a desktop slide camera; in addition to expressing the slides overnight, many offer extras, such as special fonts or graduated background shading missing from the originating graphics program. Packages with built-in telecommunications, such as \$55mm Express or Draw Applause, make the process smoothest.

If you want to print chart handouts to go with your slide show, only *Harvard Graphics*, *Freelance Plus*, and *35mm Express* automatically convert solid colors to black-and-white patterns. With the remaining programs (except for *Draw Applause*, which offers no patterns at all), the only way to "automatically" produce a black-and-white pattern is to use color patterns for slides.

You can run a monitor-based slide show with any of the packages, but the quality varies. The best programs provide control over how fast each slide appears and how long it remains on screen, along with such transitions as fades, wipes, and dissolves. With *Freelance Plus*, you can even produce a disk-based slide show that runs on other PCs without requiring the program.

35mm Express 4.1

Until *Draw Applause*, 35mm Express was the program to beat if you wanted slides. It offers excellent color control, handy default formats, and a built-in communications module for sending output to slide services. But file handling and the user interface are cumbersome, and while the drawing features are strong, other programs provide more charts and drawing tools.

35mm Express is the only package reviewed that makes you generate a chart in 1-2-3 before you import the worksheet data. Worse, the outdated method of file management (which requires fixed-capacity "folders" and "cabinets") is needlessly restrictive.

Except for the missing bar/line option, the program supplies an adequate selection of charts, but the number of data points is a bit low. The program has two high-quality, built-in typefaces, but it can't use Bitstream fonts.

The menus sometimes group related features on different menus, leading to needless mousing around. And although the options for freehand drawing and object manipulation top those of *Draw Applause*, they're a notch below the ones in *Freelance Plus* or *Graph Plus*. You won't find rulers, grids, or snap-to-grid functions, for example, and there's no support for scanned images. However, the clip-art library, along with separately available additions, may provide all the images you need.

35mm Express still glitters when it comes to color. You get up to 64 colors per chart, and cycling through an intelligent array of default color combinations—including color-coordinated 3-D effects—can produce quick results. Drop shadows supply the finishing touches, while a summary screen for colors speeds last-minute changes. The program also offers the best slide camera support.

For proofing or handouts, the program automatically converts colors to fill patterns. However, because some of the patterns are

quite similar, you may need to change colors to produce readable hard copy. 35mm Express also prints speaker's notes and offers a basic slide-show feature.

Superb color capabilities make 35mm Express a smart choice for users willing to stick with good default formats and a basic set of charts. And the drawing features are quite good. Only Draw Applause's special effects and slightly better charting edge 35mm Express out of first place for slides.

Draw Applause 1.1

Sometimes, even if a product is weak in key areas, its unique features make it irresistible. That's *Draw Applause* all over. In version 1.1 (due to be upgraded), a graceless user interface, restricted data entry, and a lack of fill patterns add up to a weak general-purpose graphics package. Use it for slides, though, and the special effects will convince you that you can't live without it.

Want to apply shading to any object, including text? No problem. Expend more effort, and you can take two copies of a logo—one small, one large—and produce shaded, overlapping duplicates in between to create a sense of motion and depth; you can even twist the duplicates into a spiral. *Draw Applause* is the only package reviewed that in-

cludes a color reference card for its (64-color) palette. The card enables you to compose slides using the actual colors that will appear instead of on-screen approximations.

Draw Applause provides excellent templates for word charts, but the selection of graph types is basic. However, you get a larger capacity for data points than with 35mm Express, and the option of dual y-axes. The program imports data files only in .DIF or .WK1 formats.

Unlike 35mm Express, Draw Applause doesn't offer freehand drawing, and the drawing tools overall are a cut below those offered by Freelance Plus and Graph Plus. Incredibly, the program offers no fill patterns whatsoever; the only way to get them is through Ashton-Tate's slide service, for which a communications module is provided.

Draw Applause is the only program that makes you send away for its PostScript driver (although it's free), and it doesn't support Bitstream fonts. For rehearsals, you can display a timed series of full-screen charts but with no fancy transitions.

Rumor has it that a forthcoming upgrade will answer most of the major criticisms leveled at the current version, with changes ranging from a revamped user interface to a complete set of patterns. But even without these enhancements, *Draw Applause*'s effects still make it top banana for slides.

Lotus's Freelance Plus 3.0 took a quantum leap beyond earlier versions, and version 3.01 adds two small but significant improvements: Memory requirements have shrunk from 640K to 508K (so you can run it on a networked PC), and the program now supports slide services. Couple these extras with an already incredible breadth of features, and Freelance Plus 3.01 emerges as the best package in this roundup.

Though less intuitive than *Graph Plus*'s *Windows* interface, *Freelance Plus*'s two-line menu bar should be second nature to 1-2-3 users. Moreover, the hot links to 1-2-8 (including release 3.0) are unsurpassed. You can actually view an entire worksheet from inside the program and automatically display the named ranges. With such close 1-2-3 ties, *Freelance Plus*'s lack of data manipulation is no great loss.

Freelance Plus 2.0 was weak on charting, but with such options as area, bar/line, and high/low/close charts, version 3.0 introduced a chart selection that virtually matches that of Harvard Graphics. The program also offers high-quality fonts (with access to a

wealth of Bitstream typefaces), along with automatic text boxes and drop shadows.

The robust editing and drawing features are tops. You can slant or rotate text, control the depth of 3-D effects, and move legends wherever you like. Drawing tools include curve smoothing, a complete array of easy-to-manipulate geometric shapes, and the most versatile object-selection features available. The clip-art library is enormous, and if that's not enough, you can import scanned images (though not gray-scale ones).

Like Harvard Graphics, Freelance Plus converts color into black-and-white patterns painlessly, and it does its rival one better by providing a black-and-white preview mode. The support for output devices is exceptional, and a slide-show function provides plenty of transitions and even generates run-time shows. A new file management module enables you to prepare and print an outline of your presentation.

For slides, you can do better than *Free-lance Plus:* It's limited to 12 colors per chart, it lacks a communications module, and it doesn't offer shaded backgrounds (though slide services can add them). But for presenters who need both slides and black-and-white hard copy, no other program offers as much punch across the board, from charting, to drawing, to high-quality fonts, to output options. It's the best all-around solution and the perfect companion for 1-2-3.

GEM Presentation Team 1.1

GEM Presentation Team is three programs in one, all of which run under the graphic GEM environment. GEM WordChart delivers the best word charting around, but the combined strengths of GEM Graph and GEM Draw Plus don't approach the power of Freelance Plus or Graph Plus. And the GEM trio is conspicuously lacking in advanced presentation features.

Like the Windows programs reviewed, GEM Presentation Team cultivates an interactive working style. Instead of filling in blanks on a separate screen to select charting or drawing options, you pull down a menu or pop up a dialog box while a WYSIWYG work area stays in view. Unfortunately, GEM Presentation Team doesn't offer the integra-



tion of any of the Windows-based presentation graphics programs.

Word charting doesn't get much easier than with *GEM WordChart*. You pick a style, enter text, and click on an icon to change such attributes as style, size, and alignment; a full selection of templates makes things easy. The bundled Bitstream starter kit ensures high-quality fonts on a laser printer, but you can install only two at a time.

GEM Graph offers basic charting, with high/low/close charts and dual *y*-axes notably lacking. It's particularly unfortunate that the

Freelance Plus fits hand in glove with 1-2-3. You can hotlink charts, specify ranges for several data types, and even view a 1-2-3 worksheet.



Graph Plus couples a fine clipart library with a rich set of drawing tools. The WYSIWYG work area gives you an ongoing preview of the final output. package imports .WKS—but not .WK1—files. On the plus side, *GEM Graph* is the only program reviewed to offer pictographs, which liven up bar charts by substituting clip art for bars.

You can up the color ante to 16 in the draw program and employ one of 37 fill patterns. But if you want curve smoothing, lots of clip art, or support for scanned images, you won't find it in *GEM Draw Plus*. And once you enhance a chart in *GEM Draw Plus*, you can't reload it in *WordChart* or *Graph*.

GEM Presentation Team supports a sparse selection of printers, though you can buy additional device drivers from the company at nominal cost. Colors print as grays on black-and-white output devices, and the slide-show feature, like Draw Applause's, is better for rehearsals than for desktop presentations.

For those who create word charts exclusively, *GEM Presentation Team* is worth considering, especially if you've already adopted other *GEM* applications. But for complex charting, sophisticated enhancements, or flexible data import, look elsewhere.

Graph Plus 1.3

Micrografx's *Graph Plus* is the third-best package in this roundup, coming in behind *Freelance Plus* and *Harvard Graphics* by a nose. It's the only program with data manipulation comparable to *Harvard Graphics*',

and its enhancement features give *Freelance* a run for its money. Only data import and font support fall short.

Thanks to Windows, you can change the values in Graph Plus's spreadsheetlike data input window and watch the graph change dynamically in the WYSIWYG work area. Unlike Harvard Graphics or Freelance, however, Graph Plus makes you strip the formulas from a 1-2-3 worksheet before you import the data, so hot linking is impossible. You can, however, hot link to Excel worksheets.

A large capacity for data, support for dual y-axes, and both log-log and semi-log scales will lure number crunchers, while the overall selection of graphs rivals the best. In addition, the program has a full set of arithmetic and logarithmic functions, including linear, exponential, and logarithmic regressions.

Graph Plus falters when it comes to word charts. You can use one of ten sample word charts as a model and overwrite the text or create word charts from scratch, but both methods require more work than using an empty predesigned template does.

The program combines excellent drawing tools with one of the highest-quality clip-art libraries available. You can apply up to 192 ready-made colors to a single chart, with additional color options available through Windows. And like Xerox Presents, Graph Plus

A run-time version of *Windows* boasts a slew of printer drivers, including one that provides full access to PostScript printer fonts. If you want any Bitstream fonts, however, you have to buy them separately. *Graph Plus*'s capable desktop slide-show feature offers 14 transitions.

A lack of high-quality, built-in fonts and weak word-chart templates mar an otherwise superlative package. But if you use Excel (or such Micrografx products as Designer or Draw Plus), Graph Plus is the presentation package for you.

Harvard Graphics 2.12

Harvard Graphics may not have a fancy Windows interface, but abundant templates and a commonsense menu structure make it the easiest-to-use charting tool reviewed. At the same time the program offers the most powerful data-manipulation features and the richest array of charts. As a drawing program, however, Harvard Graphics leaves a lot to be desired.

When it comes to features like regression analysis, only *Graph Plus* can compete with *Harvard Graphics*. And although *Harvard Graphics* lets you specify named ranges when importing 1-2-3 data, *Freelance Plus* offers better import features. But in some areas, *Harvard Graphics* stands alone. It's the only program with a LAN version, a macro recorder, and a spelling checker (to prevent every presenter's worst nightmare).

Thanks to a nice assortment of templates, you can create attractive word charts easily. Although it offers the greatest number of built-in fonts, the package lacks *Freelance Plus*'s ability to rotate text, and Bitstream fonts are not supported.

Drawing is *Harvard Graphics*' Achilles' heel. It lacks many of the enhancement tools provided by *Freelance Plus* and *Graph Plus*. For example, you can't draw freehand or flip, mirror, or rotate objects. Worse, *Harvard Graphics* is the only program missing a zoom command for touch-up work. The program's clip-art library is less extensive than those


Harvard Graphics' device support is legendary, and a built-in communications module makes sending color slides to service bureaus a snap. Converting colors to black-and-white fill patterns is completely automatic, even slightly easier than with Freelance Plus. You can print speaker's notes for your presentation, and a fine slide-show feature is provided, but you must buy a separate utility to create run-time slide shows. Harvard Graphics offers a fine assortment of optional accessories, including additional templates, specialized clip-art libraries, and so on.

Strong charting, with arithmetic and logarithmic functions, is *Harvard Graphics*' standout feature, but ease of use keeps its users loyal. Those who want to turn out attractive charts quickly could hardly have it easier. But if you think you'll ever outgrow the preformatted approach to charting, *Harvard*'s slim set of enhancement features may send you in search of *Freelance Plus*.

Recently ported from the Macintosh to the Windows environment, Xerox Presents represents a new class of PC business graphics program. Its unique and useful features focus on controlling slide presentations: arranging the order of images, creating uni-

form backgrounds, generating handouts, and the like. Unfortunately, *Xerox Presents* is a poor charting package, and it's much slower than any other program reviewed.

A narrow range of chart types handles only four data sets and 20 data points per chart—less than two years' worth of monthly data. Scaling and axis options are especially weak: You can't set minimum/maximum axis values, place the y-axis on the chart's right side, or skip axis labels. As with GEM Presentation Team, Xerox Presents' ability to import 1-2-3 spreadsheets begins and ends with old-fashioned .WKS files.

Xerox Presents joins Graph Plus as one of the two programs reviewed that imports scanned gray-scale images. You also get a good selection of line types, geometric shapes, and fill patterns, but you can't smooth curves automatically or flip and rotate objects, and the clip-art library is the smallest in the roundup.

Start thinking of the presentation as a whole, however, and you'll quickly see the benefit of *Xerox Presents*. Each slide has two layers, enabling you to use a uniform background—containing, say, a border, a shaded background, and a logo—while you use the top layer for different charts. Furthermore, a preview mode displays thumbnail sketches of up to 12 slides per screen, enabling you to rearrange images at will. No other package has equivalent features.

Handouts can include notes along with black-and-white renditions of slides, and you can create separate speaker notes with their own black-and-white images. Not surprisingly, the monitor-based slide show features are also innovative, though you can't create run-time presentations.

Because slides, backgrounds, handouts, and speaker notes are linked in the manner of a relational data base, you can shuffle items easily: You can even print handouts on one printer and speaker notes on another and send slides to a slide service using the built-in communications module. Doing so, however, makes printing slower than usual, and even with a black-and-white preview converting colors to patterns is not automatic.

Xerox Presents wouldn't be worth considering without its unique presentation features. The charting and data import features are clearly substandard, and it's probably not worth running on anything less than a 386. If a future revision eliminates current weaknesses, few who make frequent slide presentations will be able to resist it.

Gray-Scale Scanners Enter the Mainstream

If you use black-and-white photos in DTP projects, gray-scale scanners provide an affordable alternative to halftones.

Our survey of five scanners turns up some nearly irresistible bargains.

f you're a desktop publisher who's tried to spice up a newsletter or brochure with photographs, you've probably discovered that conventional halftoning is time-consuming and innovative effects cost dearly. To gain greater control over your publication and speed up turnaround time, you can switch to a desktop gray-scale scanning system. This way you can scan digital halftones, integrate them into a document using a page-layout program such as Ventura Publisher or Page-Maker, and print them on a high-resolution, PostScript-compatible phototypesetter. The digitized photographs come close to the quality of commercial halftones, and it's often easier-and cheaper-to create special effects. If you use a lot of photos, or if you can also use a scanner for other tasks, the investment will pay off.

This review evaluates five gray-scale scanning systems ranging in price from \$1995 to \$3995: the Datacopy Model 730GS, the Hewlett-Packard (HP) ScanJet Plus, the IBM PageScanner Model 3119, and the Microtek MSF-300G and MSF-400G. The Datacopy scanner assigns 6 bits of gray-scale data to each pixel, for a total of 64 shades of gray. The 8-bit PageScanner generates 128 grays, and the 8-bit HP and Microtek systems deliver 256 shades. All the scanners

record images at a resolution of 300 dots per inch (dpi), and the MSF-400G also records 400 dpi.

All the scanners are flatbed units. Unlike sheet-fed models used for optical character recognition (OCR), which pull the original through the scanner, flatbed scanners let you carefully align the original and can scan material from books. The systems also include Windows-based software for controlling the scanning process and editing images. Each system includes an interface card that takes up a standard PC or Micro Channel slot, except for the IBM 3119's adapter, which fits only in a Micro Channel slot. An AT-level system and a VGA display are recommended, and VGA is required for the IBM and Microtek scanners.

The systems scan black-and-white line art and provide optional OCR software, but they're designed primarily for desktop publishers who need to output gray-scale photos on a laser printer or phototypesetter. Accordingly, they're evaluated with this task in mind

A year ago, 4-bit, 16-gray-level systems were the standard, and today's bargain hunters may find some 4-bit steals. But if image quality is all-important, a 6- or 8-bit system

Richard Jantz is the way to go. Compared to a 4-bit scanner, it offers better image quality when printing photos on a 300-dpi laser printer. The differences are even greater between 6-or 8-bit systems and the non-gray-scale scanners used for OCR work, though you won't see a disparity with line art.

It's in the higher resolutions that gray scaling shines. At resolutions higher than 300 dpi, non-gray-scale photos are unacceptable, and 4-bit photos aren't much better. With a 6- or 8-bit scanner, quality improves if you boost your 300-dpi printer's resolution with an enhancement board such as Intel's Visual Edge. You'll enjoy incremental improvements on 400- and 600-dpi laser printers and dramatic differences on 1200-to-2540-dpi typesetters. The gap between 6- and 8-bit quality is slight at 300 dpi, but 8-bit scanners dazzle as resolution increases.

Users interested only in OCR may want to look elsewhere, but desktop publishers and those who need scanners for image data bases or fax input should seriously consider these products. Although the systems are designed for typeset output, graphics professionals should weigh the factors of quality, cost, and versatility before buying. Traditional photochemical halftoning usually offers higher quality at a lower cost, but many graphics professionals will find the convenience and flexibility of creating digital halftones on a gray-scale scanner worth the trade-offs (see the sidebar "Digital Versus Photochemical Halftoning: Which Way to Go?").

Scanner Buying Criteria

Image quality is paramount in evaluating gray-scale scanning systems. *PC World* used default scanning settings to output scanned photos on a variety of printing devices, ranging from 300-dpi laser printers to typesetters. The ultimate challenge was scanning a high-contrast photo with dark gray levels and then printing it on a 2400-dpi Agfa Compugraphic (see **FIGURE I**). The results generally indicate that the greater the number of gray



scales supported, the better the image quality. Other factors also come into play, however, such as the resolution level and the line frequency of the halftone screen (see the sidebar "Secrets of Gray-Scale Image Quality").

Scanning options are next in importance. In addition to scanning at 300 dpi, a system should be able to scan at lower resolutions and with fewer gray scales for proofing. This saves disk space and reduces printing and scanning time. The ability to scale (reduce or enlarge) and frame part of an image while scanning also saves time and disk space. Other features to consider include brightness and contrast controls for improving poorly photographed images, and extras such as image flipping and reversing.

Equally critical for most users are image editing features—software tools for manipulating photos after they've been scanned. Here you see the greatest variations between the systems. HP's Scanning Gallery Plus software provides sparse editing tools, and Datacopy's PC Image is even more lim-

These gray-scale (TIFF) images were printed on a 2400-dpi Agfa Compugraphic phototypesetter, using PageMaker to control the halftoning process with a dot screen pattern at a 45-degree angle. All the test photos were screened at 133 lines per inch except for the Datacopy photo, which was set at an optimal 90 lpi (the 133-dpi versions displayed poor shadow detail).

Each image was captured using the scanners' default settings—none of the enhanced (interpo-

lated) resolutions or gray-scale editing tools available were exploited. By experimenting with contrast and brightness controls and by applying grayscale editing tools, you might improve the quality.

The test challenges the scanning systems with a high-contrast photo halftoned at a high resolution and line frequency. In more informal tests, the differences in quality were less marked when using lower-contrast photos shot at lower resolutions, but the relative rankings in quality were similar.

The Microtek MSF-300G is the Best Buy of the scanning systems reviewed. Despite its low \$2195 price, it delivers superb image quality and sophisticated gray-scale editing.

Hewlett-Packard's easy-to-use ScanJet Plus is a good choice for beginners. Image editing tools are limited, but if your photo's right to begin with, you can generate magazine-quality halftones with 256 gray levels.

ited. Scanning Gallery Plus lets you cut, copy, paste, and crop a gray-scale image after scanning, and PC Image lets you resize, but neither provides tools for retouching photos or creating special effects.

In contrast, Astral Corporation's Picture Publisher (bundled with the Microtek scanners) and IBM's ImagEdit provide sophisticated gray-scale editing features once available only on the Macintosh. Designed for polishing high-resolution output, both products let you view the actual grays on a VGA display. You can modify brightness and contrast after scanning and manipulate gray levels, either globally or locally. For example, you can lighten darker grays to render more detail, or soften or sharpen the focus by changing the tonal range. The programs offer gray-scale painting tools and allow you to

cut and paste between photos to create composite images. *Picture Publisher* even provides airbrushing and texturing effects,

Less important for the purposes of this review are line-art editing features—fat-bit pixel editors used for cleaning up errant "garbage" around solid-tone line art. Only the HP scanner lacks this feature, but all these systems except the IBM scanner let you save files in .PCX format so you can send line-art images to a paint program such as PC Paintbrush for pixel editing.

All the systems support PostScript and PCL (LaserJet-compatible) printers, and all can output files in Tagged Image File Format (TIFF) so that you can send images to pagelayout programs. All but the Datacopy scanner support Encapsulated PostScript Format (EPS). With an EPS file, you can use DOS to send your image directly to a PostScript printer or typesetter—you don't need a page layout program. IBM's ImagEdit even lets you assign halftone settings within the program and save them in an EPS file so that you can control the typesetter remotely. In contrast, HP and Microtek users must accept the halftoning defaults of the output device or set them in a page layout program.

Speed on all the systems is about the same —slow. And the higher the resolution and number of gray levels, the slower the scan. Ease of use varies between the systems. All the hardware components are easy enough to install and use, but software usability varies. Because gray-scale retouching requires extensive training no matter how intuitive the interface, ease of use is given less weight than in the usual *PC World* review. Still, it can be a factor, and the following reviews evaluate the user interface of each system to help you make your buying decision.

Datacopy Model 730GS

If you usually output your publications on laser printers, Datacopy's \$1995 Model 730GS may fill the bill. Because it's a 6-bit system, however, it's not optimal for producing scanned photos on a high-resolution typesetter. Image quality is comparatively poor, and the editing tools are the weakest in the roundup.

Considering that it captures only 64 gray levels, it's no surprise the 730GS was hamstrung by the challenging test photo in **FIGURE**1. Image quality is poor at the 133-lines-perinch (lpi) setting used with the other systems; only after dropping down to a coarser 90 lpi was the 730GS image accetable, and even then its quality was inferior to that of its rivals. However, with a fully lit mediumor low-contrast photograph, the 730GS produces acceptable business-quality halftones.

Datacopy's system includes its *PC Image* software, which provides good scanning controls but scant editing features. Its *Windows* interface is relatively easy to use, but there's no on-line help. *PC Image* can't display true gray scales on screen, but dithering options show a crude emulation of halftone styles. (See the sidebar "Secrets of Gray-Scale Image Quality" for more information on dithering and other scanning options.)

Although rated at 300 dpi, the Model 730GS can approximate 450-dpi resolution by using interpolation, a technique that sometimes smoothes transitions between grays. You can also select low-resolution and 4-bit options for quick proofs.

PC Image's biggest drawback is its lack of gray-scale editing tools. It provides a pixel editor for line art, but with photos, you're limited to resizing. *PC Image* supplies a bat-

SECRETS OF GRAY-SCALE IMAGE QUALITY

The quality of a gray-scale photo depends primarily on the resolution of the output device and the scanner's resolution and number of gray levels. Although it's often a matter of taste, the range of groy scales is usually more important than resolution. For most business applications, 300-dpi scanned images coupled with 64 to 256 gray levels will do the job.

Many other factors affect image quality. Most important is the condition of the original photo, including contrast, focus, and range of gray tones. No amount of tinkering can fix a grossly flawed original. Also key are the settings you use to scan the image, the adjustments you make with image-editing tools after scanning, and the halftone screen you select. In turn, the halftone screen should jibe with the texture of paper you'll use. Other variables may be beyond your control: An image can go sour if the typesetting operator lacks the expertise to optimize for digital halftoning.

Here are some factors to keep in mind:

Resolution A scanner's resolution is tied to the number of dots per inch (dpi) the scanner reads.

Most scanners are rated at 300 dpi, but a few 400-dpi units are available, and 600 dpi is on the way.

The higher the resolution of a scanned photo and the closer it approaches the resolution of the output device, the better the image quality. For example, the top quality of an image scanned at 400 dpi isn't perceptible when the photo is printed on a 300-dpi laser printer, but it becomes noticeable when printed on a 400- or 600-dpi loser printer and is even more evident on a phototypesetter set at 1200 or 2540 dpi.

Interpolation Some scanners emulate resolutions above 300 dpi using interpolation, o gray-scale averaging technique that adds new values between existing ones during scanning. Though the true resolution is still 300 dpi, interpolation sometimes produces smoother tronsitions between grays on high-resolution output devices. Interpolation doesn't always match the apparent resolution it attempts to emulate, and with some photos it won't improve the quality at all. Successful use requires experimentation with different resolution levels and other variables.

Dithering The number of grays a scanner captures is determined by how many data bits the scanner assigns to each pixel. Non-gray-scale scanners capture only 1 bit per pixel: on (black) or off (white). You can simulate shades of gray with dithering (fixed halftone patterns of black and white dots), but the tonal quality of a dithered image is often poor, especially beyond 300 dpi. Also, resizing creates interference patterns, rendering the image useless.

Gray Scales Gray-scale scanners, on the other hand, provide greater image quality by using 4, 6, or 8 bits to store different values of gray for each pixel. The halftone pattern isn't applied until after the scan, so you can choose the best screen for the printer's resolution and resize the image without distortion.

On a high-resolution typesetter, an 8-bit image with 256 grays renders the broadest range of continuous tones. A 4-bit image is unacceptable at high resolutions, but an 8-bit image with 128 grays or, to a lesser extent, a 6-bit image with 64 grays can still produce a decent halftone, depending on the photo and screen. Differences between 6- and 8-bit images are pronounced at 1200 and 2540 dpi but slight at 300 dpi.

Halftone Screen Choosing the right combination of halftone screen variables—a halftone pattern, on angle, and a line-screen frequency—is paramount. Usually you'll do this in a page makeup program, such as PageMaker or Ventura.

The line-screen frequency, expressed in lines per inch (lpi), is usually the key factor. Generally, with a higher lpi, the apparent resolution improves; with a lower lpi, you get more shades of gray. Magazines and books typically use a 120- to 150-lpi screen; newspapers use coarser 65- to 85-lpi screens.

The best-looking images from a 300-dpi laser printer are usually produced at a 50-lpi screen setting. With some laser printers, you can boost both the number of grays and the resolution by installing an enhancement board such os DP-Tek's Laser-Port. With a typesetter, you can use on even higher lpi and still obtain a large number of grays.

With all these variables, it's not surprising that perfecting gray-scale images often requires numerous proofs. Still, experience will gradually put you on track. —R. J.

The tonal quality of a dithered image is often poor, especially beyond 300 dpi. tery of dithering options with 7 preset scanning patterns and even more postscanning patterns, but the usefulness of dithering is usually limited to 300-dpi output. Other print options are weak, and it's the only program that can't save a gray-scale image as an EPS file.

Datacopy also sells a Model 830 6-bit system designed for OCR tasks. The \$3495 system is not recommended for gray-scale imaging.

All told, the Datacopy 730GS can't match its 8-bit rivals at creating gray-scale half-tones. It may do the job for laser printer users, but it's only a fair deal for typeset output.

Hewlett-Packard ScanJet Plus

The easiest system to use in the roundup, Hewlett-Packard's sleek, \$2190 ScanJet Plus produces magazine-quality halftones with 256 grays. Scanning Gallery Plus's scanning tools are capable, but its image-editing skills are only slightly better than those of Datacopy's PC Image. Still, the ScanJet Plus is a good entry-level system.

The ScanJet Plus provides sharp resolution and contrast, but its default settings produced a slightly darker image than the other 256-gray-level scanners. If you don't mind a softer image, you can adjust the

brightness and contrast settings for more shadow detail.

HP's Scanning Gallery Plus software is easy to use, and on-line help is excellent. The user guide includes valuable tips for Page-Maker and Ventura users. Separate windows are provided for scanning and image editing, and scanning controls are conveniently clustered in the same dialog box. However, you can't display gray-scale images accurately.

Scanning options are better than most. Using interpolation you can approximate resolutions up to 1500 dpi or choose lower resolutions and a 4-bit mode to output rough drafts quickly. Print options are also good: You can print a selected part of an image and output multiple copies.

Image editing is limited, unfortunately. Unlike *PC Image, Scanning Gallery Plus* lets you cut and crop gray-scale images, and copy and paste sections together to create a crude composite. However, you can't manipulate gray levels after scanning, and you don't have gray-scale paint tools or a line-art pixel editor.

For those who need an easy-to-use scanning system that can output high-quality images, the ScanJet Plus is made to order. If you want advanced tools, you can buy version 1.2 of Astral's \$595 Picture Publisher (due this fall), which will include a ScanJet

driver. Or, for \$5 more than the ScanJet, you could buy the Microtek MSF-300G, which offers slightly better image quality and gives you *Picture Publisher* for free.

IBM PageScanner Model 3119

The star attraction of IBM's PageScanner is ImagEdit, an excellent image editor that lets you set halftone screens within the program. The 8-bit PageScanner reads 256 gray levels but saves only 128 grays. Still, its output almost matches the image quality of 256-graylevel scanners. Unfortunately, the PageScanner is available for Micro Channel systems only, and the price is a steep \$3840. Also, because the glass platen moves over the scanning mechanism instead of vice versa, it's difficult to scan thick books, which must be pressed against the glass. Despite these flaws, ImagEdit makes the PageScanner a good deal for users of Micro Channel-based systems.

Surprisingly, the PageScanner's output on the 2400-dpi test image came close to the quality of the 256-level ScanJet, though it couldn't match the Microtek scanners. Its default settings produced a softer image with lighter tones, but you could use ImagEdit to adjust the gray-level distribution and produce a better image.

Though not quite as powerful as *Picture Publisher*, *ImagEdit* is easier to use, thanks to its excellent on-line help and faithfulness to the *Windows* interface. It accurately displays gray scales on a VGA or an 8514 monitor.

ImagEdit's top-notch scanning options are





Gircle 181 of redder service card Pay this amol somewhat better than *Picture Publisher*'s, offering such extras as image flipping. One unique feature even lets you apply a user-defined gray-scale distribution curve during scanning to alter highlights and shadows or create special effects.

Image-editing features are quite advanced but don't match *Picture Publisher*'s. Both include numerous editing and paint tools for altering gray-scale images after scanning. However, *ImagEdit* lacks *Picture Publisher*'s sophisticated airbrushing and texturing tools, and it can't cut and paste irregular shapes. A pixel editor is included for line art.

The PageScanner is the only system reviewed that lets you control the halftone screen. You can pick the screen pattern, angle, and line-screen frequency and send the image directly to a PostScript printer as an EPS file.

IBM's scanning system is a good deal for graphics pros who want to bypass page makeup and transmit digital halftones directly. Despite its high price, many Micro

DIGITAL VERSUS PHOTOCHEMICAL HALFTONING: WHICH WAY TO GO?

Do you really need a gray-scale scanner system? First, consider the alternatives. Two of the most common methods for publishing continuous-tone images are the photoprint and the halftone; both are line-art versions of continuous-tone images. To create them, a photo is rephotographed through a fine mesh or screen that converts photographic tones into a pattern of dats or lines. Our eyes and brain blend the patterns to perceive gray.

With a photoprint positive, you paste the image onto a camera-ready page and rephotograph it along with text and line art to produce the film used to produce the printing plate. A halftone negative, on the other hand, can be stripped directly onto the film, saving you a reproduction step and producing a better-quality image.

Why choose such traditional techniques? Photochemical halftoning usually provides a higher-quality image than digital halftoning with a scanning system. And although it requires a graphic arts camera and photochemical processing, making it prohibitively expensive for most companies to bring in-house, it's generally cheaper than digital halftoning when done through a commercial service.

Most services charge a flot rate of about \$30 for each photochemical print, no matter how many proofs they have to run to get it right. In comparison, a digital halftone on the same typesetter costs about \$20 per page for final output, and most users will also want a \$10 paper positive for proofing. So far, the cost is about the same, but digital halftones rarely come out perfectly the first time. You frequently need to order one or more pa-

per proofs, each at a separate charge, and then an additional final negative. So a digital halftone is likely to cost twice as much as a conventional halftone, and that doesn't include the original cost of the scanning system.

However, digital halftoning offers some striking advantages in convenience, security, and flexibility, and some of these benefits translate into lower costs. With a commercial service, generating and stripping photochemical halftones can take hours or even days. With digital halftoning, on the other hand, you can send a gray-scale image already integrated with text and line art directly to a type-setter. If you use a modem, you can reduce delivery charges. This direct access also keeps canfidential documents safe from prying eyes.

Yet the greatest benefit of digital halftoning is the control you gain over image production. If you often require special effects, the cost of training an employee to use gray-scale editing tools can pay off. Instead of paying a photo lab to retouch or alter a photo in the darkroom, the office scanning expert can quickly retouch the photo on a PC, saving time and lab charges. You can also create unusual images—say, the compony CEO standing on the moon—that are too difficult or expensive to accomplish in a lab. Collages are especially costeffective.

If you don't require innovative effects and you don't need a scanner for onother purpose, stick with traditional halftones. But if you want more control over image production, digital halftoning is the way to go. —R. J.

Channel users will find it's worth the cost. But take note: The other vendors also offer Micro Channel versions.

Microtek MSF-300G and MSF-400G

Microtek's \$2195 MSF-300G and top-of-theline \$3995 MSF-400G are the class acts of the roundup. Except for the MSF-400G's higher price and 400-dpi resolution, the systems are identical. Both scanners are 8-bit models that let you scan an image as large as 8½ by 14 inches, and both bundle the superb *Picture Publisher* editing software. Graphics professionals may covet the MSF-400G's resolution, but at \$1800 less, the MSF-300G is the roundup's Best Buy.

Surprisingly, the Microtek MSF-300G produced slightly better output than the 400-dpi MSF-400G. It displayed the most easily distinguishable range of grays of the roundup, with good resolution, highlights, and shadow detail. The MSF-400G came in a close second, offering the sharpest resolution of the roundup, but it showed fewer shadow highlights. Still, some will prefer the MSF-400G's sharper image quality, even though the higher resolution creates mammoth disk files.

Picture Publisher improves image quality even further—but don't expect to master it overnight. The program provides two screens, one for scanning, managing, and printing images, and the other for editing. The scanning screen is fairly easy to deal with, drawing on Windows conventions, but the editing screen adopts a separate, less intuitive interface. It accurately displays gray

levels, but it's hard to use. You pick editing modes from lists and select additional controls via function keys, but the function-key assignments change from mode to mode. And there's no keyboard template or on-line help to assist.

Picture Publisher's scanning controls are good, but they don't equal *ImagEdit*'s. Although you can save frame settings for reuse, you can't control contrast and brightness settings or flip an image until after scanning.

When it comes to image editing, though, Picture Publisher has no equal. Whereas ImagEdit limits you to rectangular cut and paste, Picture Publisher also supports irreg-

At press time, Microtek announced the MSF-300Z, a 300-dpi color/gray-scale scanning system. At \$2595, it's a bargain compared with similar color/gray-scale scanners such as the \$4570 Sharp JX-300 Color Scanner.

ular shapes. Both programs provide a paint tool for removing flaws, but Picture Publisher also supplies tools for smoothing, sharpening, and airbrushing parts of an image and applying various textures. A separate EyeStar Plus program competently handles line-art pixel editing.

With its low price, superb image quality, and excellent editing tools, the MSF-300G is a winner. The MSF-400G may appeal to some high-end users, but the 300G is the Best Buy.

Gravitating Toward Gray

If you want to produce top-quality halftones on a high-resolution typesetter, invest in a scanner system that captures 256 gray levels and offers versatile scanning and editing tools. The Microtek MSF-300G fits this prescription perfectly and wins a Best Buy.

The higher-resolution Microtek MSF-400G is a good deal for graphics professionals, and HP's ScanJet Plus fills the bill for beginners. IBM's PageScanner has its flaws, but it's still a solid buy. Dropping down a notch. Datacopy's Model 730GS is a good match for laser printers but far less adequate for higher-resolution typesetters.

Only a short time ago, gray-scale scanners were an expensive luxury. Now that image editing tools have achieved sophistication, they're more attractive than ever as an alternative to traditional halftoning. And if you also use them for fax, image retrieval, or OCR tasks, they can really pay off.

The Easy Road to Desktop Publishing

Occasional desktop publishers need easy-to-use software that still yields elegant pages.

Four under-\$200 DTP packages let even novices produce surprisingly sophisticated short documents.

ant to put out a professional-looking report or newsletter enlivened with snappy graphics? You needn't strain your word processor's talents or spring for an expensive (and complex) high-end desktop publishing (DTP) program. Today's low-end DTP programs are intelligently streamlined versions of the big boys, with prices and learning curves anybody can handle. This review tackles the four leading products in the category: Logitech's new Finesse, Software Publishing's best-selling PFS: First Publisher, Springboard Publishing's Springboard Publisher, and our Best Buy, Timeworks' Publish-It.

In document-production power, these four programs fall between high-end word processing and professional-level DTP. Superficially, *Microsoft Word*'s and *WordPerfect*'s newspaper-style column layouts, wide range of font styles and sizes, and support of graphics integration might seem to make these word processors able DTP programs. But while both offer primitive page preview with graphics, neither lets you edit WYSI-



WYG text, the critical DTP capability.


On the other hand, the packages reviewed here can't equal *Ventura*'s or *PageMaker*'s ability to create long documents or those programs' sophisticated typography and design features. None of the four can import Encapsulated PostScript (EPS) files, for example, and only *Finesse* accepts scanned TIFF images.

Assuming you can live without Bezier curves and book-length documents, here are the essential features to watch for. A good low-end DTP program should supply document templates to help beginners position imported text and graphics. Once the material is in place, solid word processing features become essential. Style sheets-found only in Publish-It—are a major convenience, letting you quickly set and change layouts and paragraph styles throughout a document. Good drawing tools are helpful, but you don't have to be an artist if the package has a good clip-art library. Finally, support for downloadable fonts (such as those from Bitstream) can greatly improve the appear-



Finesse 3.0

The new kid on the low-end DTP block, Logitech's \$179 Finesse, has a useful range of page-design features and a fine selection of Bitstream Fontware. Alas, Finesse is limited to 16-page documents, and the program's slim image-handling features make it a poor choice if your documents require sophisticated graphics.

Finesse offers an array of design elements: 20 single, dashed, and double line styles, for example, versus the other programs' maximum of 5. But its word processing features are just adequate: Finesse lets you set eight left-justified or decimal tabs, for instance, but doesn't offer center- or right-aligned tabs. The package's graphics support is very limited; you can draw lines and boxes, but that's about all.

Finesse's excellent font package compensates somewhat for its poor graphics support. The newsletter on the left was output on a 9-pin dot matrix Brother printer. Publish-It's control of typography is unrivaled. Note the tight, ottractive letterspacing and word spacing in the newsletter on the right.



PFS: First Publisher is quick and neat, but its page preview leaves much to be desired: Elements are dropped, resolution is poor, and the page image is squashed. Finesse's offering of Bitstream Fontware is the best in its class, however, with 11 scalable outline fonts (the installation kit is included free). Moreover, the program's built-in scanner support is a persuasive enticement for users to buy Logitech's \$309 hand-held ScanMan unit.


Combined with its good layout tools and scanner support, the Bitstream tie-in makes *Finesse* a laudable product. But its features set is slimmer than *Publish-It*'s, and its anemic graphics controls make designing heavily illustrated documents taxing.

But Software Publishing has rested on its laurels, and the program's feature set is now bested by the other programs in this review.

First Publisher lets you save page designs as templates for laying out other documents but lacks true style sheets. Worse, its word processing features are rudimentary, lacking even search and replace. And skimpy drawing tools limit you to straight lines, boxes, and freehand sketching.

While graphics handling is basic, the 150 images in the included clip-art library are of high quality (3000 images are available in separate libraries). You can also take snap-

First Publisher is aimed at novices, and its manual is stuffed with handy tips. But the low-end category that First Publisher once dominated has moved beyond it. The easiest-to-use package in this roundup, it also has the least all-around DTP power.

A wealth of well-implemented features puts *Publish-It* a peg above its rivals in this review. Where others give a passing nod to hyphenation and kerning, for example, *Publish-It* excels at both. The \$200 program lacks only automatic text flow and an undo command.

Feature-rich but friendly, *Publish-It* helps you work smoothly and logically. Want to change the overall appearance of a document? Powerful style sheets control a full range of formatting specs. Need to align the columns in a table set in proportionally spaced text? *Publish-It* comes to the rescue with a table-justification feature that lets you

set up nine tabs using left, right, center, or decimal justification and dot or underscore leaders.

Publish-It's word processing features are the best in the bunch, and its typographic features are a delight. You can kern letter pairs in half-point (1/141-inch) increments and set letterspacing (tracking) for text. A commendable hyphenation routine can even prevent two specified words from being separated at the end of a line—a trick that baffles PFS: First Publisher and Springboard Publisher.

First-class graphics features let you scale

Springboard Publisher 1.01

Windows-based Springboard Publisher is one of those programs that almost gets it right. Its image manipulation and drawing tools are the best in this group, but its word processor is flawed. Creating master pages is remarkably easy, but the \$200 program accesses the hard disk so often it becomes unbearably slow.

Springboard delivers such niceties as widow and orphan control, automatic file backup, and page and column hard breaks, and it deserves special mention for the way it flows text between page frames. While the other programs make you link new frames manually to allow text to flow onto subsequent pages, Springboard creates new master pages automatically.

Yet just when you get your hopes up, the program stalls. Its indifferent word processing features don't include search and replace, and you must convert *WordPerfect 5.0* files to 4.2 format before importing. Worse, the program lacks automatic hyphenation, so you have to insert hyphens manually before printing a document. Moreover, these hard hyphens move to the middle of lines when you edit the text and must be removed manually. In a program otherwise well suited to longish documents, this inconvenience lets you down with a thump.

Springboard Publisher's graphics tools are top-drawer; of the programs reviewed, only Publish-It comes close. You can easily draw straight lines and perfect squares and



circles, create transparent or opaque patterns and lines, and use 35 paintbrushes and 24 fill patterns. And only *Springboard Publisher* can trace image edges and rotate images freely (the other programs limit you to rotation in 90-degree increments).

Springboard Publisher's few large flaws obscure its many small virtues. It handles graphics beautifully, for example, but sometimes runs like a turtle. It accepts long documents but can't hyphenate properly. It's recommended only for people who need its superior image manipulation.

Hand-Eye Coordination

The programs reviewed represent your best bets in low-end DTP, but the category is a lively one, with new mid- and low-end programs popping up all over. More important, emerging *Windows*-based word processors may finally lend word processing the DTP punch it now lacks (see the *Ami Professional* preview in this issue's Special Report).

Meanwhile, PFS: First Publisher will give you an easy introduction to DTP—though not much else. If you need flashy drawing tools and own a fast hard disk, Springboard Publisher will probably fill the bill. And if support for scanned images is important, Finesse is a must. But for all-around utility, Publish-It is the top choice; its wonderful

No Pain, Big Gains: Five Low-Cost LANs

Peer-to-peer LANs emphasize
easy access to data and
resources—not complicated
administration.

If you'd rather spend more time working and less time playing network administrator, you may fit the peer-LAN profile.

eer-to-peer LANs have a bad—and wholly undeserved—reputation as underpowered country cousins to slick serverbased LANs like NetWare and LAN Manager. They offer almost every important capability of server LANs (file and printer sharing, E-mail support, and the ability to run multiuser business software), plus one crucial capability that many server LANs lack: the ability to access network resources anywhere on the LAN, not just on the server.

Whereas server LANs often must be set up by high-priced network specialists, peer LANs are designed to be installed by end users. Also, peer LANs are generally easier to maintain and use—and much kinder to the pocketbook. A full-featured ten-station peer LAN will save you at least \$1000 over a comparable server LAN—and probably even more. If you include the cost of the expensive high-speed server that you won't need to buy, you could end up saving \$5000 or more.

PC World has taken a close look at five of the most popular peer LANs: DCA's 10Net Plus 4.0.83, D-Link's Lansmart 1.14E, Artisoft's Lantastic 2.53, Performance Technology's Powerlan 1.2, and Sun Microsystems' TOPS 2.1. All five are similar: They use menus to access network resources (but let you use the command line, or a batch file, if you prefer); and they let you guard sensitive data with password protection.


Performance is overrated as a server LAN buying issue; unless network traffic is exceptionally heavy, disk access speed, not LAN performance, is the limiting factor. With peer LANs, which are generally unsuitable for heavy-duty multiuser applications, speed is even less important (see the sidebar "Peer LANs: Who Needs 'Em?"). Nonetheless, all these LANs are fast enough for everyday computing.

To simplify product comparisons, all LANs have been priced in a standard tenworkstation configuration that includes software, ten of the company's least expensive adapter cards, and E-mail.

10Net Plus 4.0.83

DCA's 10Net Plus comes packed with extras, including a strong E-mail package and real-time conferencing software. It offers securi-

ty and administrative features rivaling those of server LANs like NetWare and 3+Open. But it falls short in three key areas: its relatively complicated setup and use, the less-than-average amount of RAM it leaves free for applications, and its price (\$4950), among the highest in the roundup.

Like all the peer LANs reviewed here, 10Net Plus follows a "host/client" model in sharing network resources. Hosts offer local resources, like a printer or a group of files, to the rest of the network. Clients use resources on a remote host. Any PC on the net can be a host, a client, or both; being a host uses up more RAM.

10Net Plus provides a series of crude but functional menus for sharing network resources. For instance, the Use Network Device menu shows prospective clients a list of host computers and the resources each offers. To use a resource, you highlight it, then tap a key to assign it a drive letter (if it's a directory) or an LPT port (if it's a printer). Unfortunately, not all network accesses under 10Net Plus are this friendly. If you're

running in host mode, the Share Network Device menu requires that you type in the designations of directories or printers you want to make available. Happily, good context-sensitive help is provided, because most users will need it.

With DOS 3.3 and all network software loaded, 10Net Plus leaves host PCs with only 443K of usable RAM; you get a bit more (471K) in client-only mode. Considering that many applications require 512K, this belowaverage headroom may be a problem.

Installation is menu driven, but some of the settings are obscure, and you must follow the manual carefully to avoid confusion. And while the manual is clearly written, it's poorly organized.

10Net Plus's security and administrative features are unusually powerful for a peer LAN. In most peer LANs, password protection and read/write/create restrictions descend automatically to all subdirectories below a shared directory. But 10Net Plus lets you set unique restrictions for each subdirectory, and even for individual files. Utilities are provided to help the network administra-

10Net Plus comes with a generous bundle of communications software, including the Network Courier E-mail package, real-time conferencing for up to 40 users, a work-group calendar scheduler, and a network bulletin board.

10Net Plus is the only peer LAN whose security and administrative features are as powerful as those of high-end server LANs.

But unless you need those features, you'll probably find *10Net Plus* unnecessarily hard to use, overly RAM hungry, and too expensive compared to other peer LANs.



D-Link's *Lansmart* is wonderfully easy to install, a treat to use, and (at \$2980) one of the lowest-priced products in this review. You can even access *Lansmart* commands from within applications by running it in memory-resident mode.

Lansmart's pop-up interface is its biggest strength. Network menu choices are so descriptive and well organized that you may never notice the lack of on-line help. Whether you're sharing or using resources, you choose from a handy on-screen listing of available directories and printers. You can save your current set of resources so that they'll be loaded automatically the next time you start your PC.

The amount of available user RAM is average—which is to say not very good. You get 448K in host mode (barely sufficient for many business applications) and 518K in client mode. Moreover, if you run *Lansmart* in memory-resident mode, it gobbles an additional 80K of already scarce memory.

Share—But Not Alike



In server LANs, you can't access hard disks attached to other workstations (red)—the only shared resources are those on the server (green).

But in peer LANs, you can access any workstation's hard disk or printer (green), and it can access yours—provided you both choose to share.

While Lansmart has no menu-driven installation utility, it's so easy to set up that you'll never miss the menus. The first time you log on, you'll be asked a few questions about the network board you're using and whether you want to be a host or a client. Thereafter, every time you start your PC you'll be asked whether you want to load Lansmart or not. That's all there is to it.

Administrative and security features are minimal. Options for protecting subdirectories are limited to assigning passwords and toggling read/write/create access. The manual is clear, complete, concise, and well indexed.

D-Link provides no software bundle, and its optional programs are disappointing. A bare-bones E-mail package has a nice text editor but can't send separate files as part of a message, and a remote-control trouble-shooting utility is too slow to be practical.

Aside from the amount of RAM it needs and substandard E-mail, there's very little wrong (and a lot right) with *Lansmart*. Its price is low, its ease of use is exemplary, and despite the lack of menu-driven installation, setup is the easiest of any product in the roundup.

Lantastic 2.53

Artisoft's *Lantastic* is a fantastic deal. At \$2517, it's the least expensive LAN reviewed, but its value is anything but low-end.

Installation is painless, the user interface is a snap, and it offers the highest amount of workstation RAM in the roundup.

Lantastic's menus provide point-and-shoot access to resources, and clear context-sensitive help is just a keystroke away. If you run the program in host mode, the list of resources you offer is automatically saved and is reloaded every time Lantastic starts. (Unfortunately, resources used in client mode cannot be saved.)

With both DOS 3.3 and *Lantastic* loaded, you get a remarkable 542K of usable RAM in host mode and 564K in client mode. That's enough to run almost any business application, with enough left over for TSRs like *SideKick*.

PEER-TO-PEER LANS: WHO NEEDS 'EM?

Peer-to-peer LANs are particularly appropriate for small, independent, informal work groups whose members need to share data and are capable of protecting it themselves. Peer LAN partisans tend to find network security disruptive and network administrators intrusive.

If, however, a multiuser data base is one of your main business tools, a peer LAN may be inadvisable. There's no problem with several users' looking up information in the same file at the same time, but if multiple users need to enter information simultaneously, you'll need to use one PC as a dedicated file server to protect against data corruption. In addition, if many users try to make simultaneous entries, you will find out the hard way that peer LANs can't match NetWare's high-speed performance under a heavy load. Finally, peer LANs lack advanced fault-tolerance features that give multiuser data bases extra protection from corruption.

Furthermore, working on a peer LAN can be slightly awkward. Shareable files may reside on any PC on the net, not merely on the server; if a given PC is not turned on, essential files may not be available. This also makes LAN-wide backup tricky. Finally, if you're running an application that resides on someone else's PC, and the host PC crashes, your PC may go down too. —R. L.

Installation is simple. A menu-driven setup program automatically loads and configures network software. The manual itself is a mixed blessing; its explanations are good, but it lacks an index and fails to explain some important features, like E-mail.

Lantastic provides a surprisingly powerful set of administrative tools. You can assign access rights to groups of users, and you can keep audit trails of network activity. You can even restrict file lookups (DIRs) and program execution.

Lantastic gives you an E-mail feature, but it's relatively crude—you'll probably want to buy a third-party program. Even so, Lantastic's low price, painless installation, slick user interface, and minimal use of RAM hit all the key points, and hit them hard. It's a winning package—and a Best Buy.

Powerlan 1.2

Performance Technology's *Powerlan* is quite expensive (\$5080), but it doesn't offer much in the way of advanced features. In fact, it's a lot harder to use and install than peer LANs that are far less costly.

Powerlan's interface is unnecessarily complex, with 11 different submenus. It's also the only peer LAN reviewed that makes you specify the location and network name of a resource before you can use it. The context-

sensitive help doesn't add a great deal to what you see on the menus.

Installation is also overly complicated, and the manual doesn't help much; it's poorly written and disorganized and lacks troubleshooting tips.

With careful tuning (and hand-holding from your dealer), *Powerlan* can be tweaked to leave slightly more user RAM than the norm: 466K in host mode and 520K in client mode. But the default configuration leaves you with 20K less, and the documentation doesn't tell you how to improve on that.

Powerlan's security features are minimal. Your only options are password protection and the ability to restrict read/write/create permission.

BUYING SMART

The make-or-break features to keep in mind when choosing a peer LAN can be reduced to three: ease of installation, ease of sharing network resources, and amount of available workstation RAM.

Software installation should be much simpler and faster than with your average server LANs. Ideally, it should be handled by a menu-driven utility and require minimal tweaking afterwards. It should demand no prior knowledge of DOS, take no more than 5 minutes per station, and provide context-sensitive on-line help. If jumpers on the network boards need to be set or software parameters optimized for speed, memory, and so on, the process should be outlined clearly in the installation section of the manual.

Ease of sharing network resources means that clients should be able to pick remote hosts, drives, and printers from a list. Hosts should be able to access a similar point-and-shaot menu to choose which directories they want to share.

Peer LANs' appetites for memory vary widely and your ability to run common business software varies with it. With DOS and network software loaded, these peer LANs leave you an average of 500K of usable RAM in client mode and 450K in host mode; some of the products reviewed leave you even less. If you use memory-resident E-mail, the memory drain becomes even more critical. TOPS's appetite for RAM is by far the worst in the roundup.

No software is bundled with the LAN. If you want to pay extra, Performance Technology will sell you a copy of *cc:Mail*, an excellent third-party E-mail package the company guarantees will work with its software. Other options include network backup software and a disk mirroring utility.

Powerlan has the second-best memory size in the roundup, but Lantastic offers more memory—and more features—at less than half the price.

TOPS 2.1

Sun Microsystems' *TOPS* has been one of the most popular peer LANs on the scene for many years, thanks to its unique ability to connect PCs and Macs. Version 2.1 adds support for Ethernet and NETBIOS. Unfortunately (to quote TOPS technical support), it is "inherently just a memory hog," and at \$5469 it is also the most expensive LAN in the roundup.

(At press time, we learned that Sun Microsystems is about to release *TOPS* version 3.0—a "radically different product" that seems to address many of the problems with version 2.1. Version 3.0, which should be shipping by the time you read this, will include printing, messaging, E-mail, and a full file-sharing system—and use only 80K in host mode.)

The excellent interface in version 2.1 is un-

changed from the earlier version, with pointand-shoot resource selection in both host and client modes. Users can save their resource sets to batch files, which can then be loaded automatically. Context-sensitive help is, um, tops.

TOPS's appetite for RAM is by far the worst in the roundup. While clients get a passable 462K, if you want to share resources in host mode, you can end up with as little as 359K of usable RAM. If one of your applications needs NETBIOS, that eats another 47K. As a partial solution, you can switch from host to client mode without rebooting.

Worse yet, the new version seems a bit buggy. In our test, perfectly innocuous batch files occasionally froze the keyboard, and WordPerfect wouldn't grant a second user read-only access to an open file. TOPS acknowledged most of the problems and even had a patch for the WordPerfect glitch—but finding so many bugs is still troubling.

Installation is such a snap, you may never need to crack the thorough, easy-to-understand manual. A menu-driven utility even helps you configure your network adapter board.

TOPS's lack of administrative utilities may make you nervous. Security is limited to password protection and setting read-only or read/write access for shared subdirectories.

Those who must have Mac-PC connectivity may be willing to put up with *TOPS* 2.1's bugs and RAM gobbling. The rest of us will want to take a very close look at version 3.0.

Making a Peer LAN Plan

Users who want peer-to-peer capabilities plus powerful security features may find 10Net Plus irresistible, despite its high \$4950 price and awkward interface. On the other hand, if Mac-PC connectivity is a must, TOPS is your only choice among peer LANs—despite its stratospheric \$5469 price tag. But for most peer LAN shoppers, easy-to-use Lantastic, with its come-hither combination of high workstation RAM and bargain-

basement \$2517 price, is simply impossible to beat.

With leading server LANs like Net-Ware/386 including more and more peer LAN features, it seems clear that peer-to-peer networking is the wave of the future. Still, until peer LANs offer all the features found in top server LANs, they won't be right for everyone. But the reverse is also true: If you don't need server-based security, fault tolerance, or the ability to make simultaneous entries to a data base, why pay the proverbial arm and leg for them? Happily, with peer LANs like Lantastic and 10Net Plus to choose from, you no longer have to. ●



orking with *Windows* or Presentation Manager (PM) on a 12-inch screen has its drawbacks. Rather than spend time maximizing and minimizing windows, wouldn't you rather have a screen that's big enough to accommodate several applications in open, usable windows simultaneously?

Sure you would. And rest assured that the industry, beginning with IBM, has anticipated demand for displays so large they take much of the window shuffling out of multitasking. IBM's 8514 monitor measures 16 inches diagonally and, when driven by the 8514/A graphics board, offers 1024 by 768 resolution—nearly 65 percent more viewing area than the typical VGA setup and more than 2½ times the pixels. In practical terms, that adds up to about twice the space for open windows.

IBM introduced the 8514/A in 1987, when CAD and desktop publishing were the only applications that needed it. But that was before PM. Now nearly every graphics hardware vendor is working on its own 1024 by 768 board, in the hope that PM will catch on and cause an upgrade frenzy.

At 1024 by 768, you need the power of a processor like the 8514/A's; in a fast PC, a VGA controller running at 1024 by 768 (in one of the proprietary "super VGA" modes provided with many VGA boards) causes a bottleneck. Most graphics hardware companies are working on 8514/A clones, while several—including NEC, Dell Computer, Vermont Microsystems, and Compaq/Renaissance GRX—have released boards based on Texas Instruments' 34010 graphics coprocessor. Software written specifically for one type of board won't run on the other, but both will be compatible with PM and, of course, any application written for the environment.

The key role of PM is clear. As long as software developers write for PM and graphics hardware engineers provide PM drivers, any PM application will drive any dis-

play at its maximum resolution. If PM becomes the mainstream business computing environment, we'll exchange shuffling through setup menus and fiddling with drivers and DIP switches for plug-'n'-play convenience.

Another Cost of OS/2?

To the multitudes who use EGA or VGA hardware, the prospect of yet another graphics upgrade is discouraging—especially after a look at IBM's prices. Shell out \$1550 for the 8514 monitor, \$1290 for the 8514/A board, and an extra \$270 for enough RAM to display 256 simultaneous colors at full resolution, and you could have bought a fully loaded 286 for the same \$3110.

Fortunately, IBM has competitors. The general industry consensus is that the cost of large-screen, 1024 by 768 graphics must drop to a street price of around \$1000 for both board and monitor before business people upgrade en masse.

According to Greg Reznick, vice president of systems marketing for Headland Technology, the price of a 16-inch monitor bundled with a 1024 by 768 board will drop to the magic \$1000 mark "by the end of 1990"—and many other industry leaders agree. Headland, Western Digital Imaging, Chips and Technologies, and Integrated Information Technology are all working the board side of the equation by developing low-cost chipsets compatible with IBM's 8514/A.

The monitor in the hypothetical \$1000 bundle is, like IBM's 8514, an *interlaced* monitor. This means that its electron guns first draw the even scan lines of a video image and then go back to fill in the odd scan lines, instead of the faster single pass executed by the guns in a *noninterlaced* monitor. Interlacing drastically reduces the cost of monitor electronics, but the trade-off is either flicker or streaking, depending on the type of screen phosphor used.

Unlike IBM, NEC Home Electronics doesn't believe you should accept the compromise of interlacing. The company's new MultiSync 4d and 5d monitors offer 1024 by 768 (or better) resolution without interlacing, and they should be shipping by the time you read this. The 19-inch MultiSync 5d targets CAD and desktop publishing applica-

tions, but the 16-inch 4d is clearly aimed at the PM environment. Unfortunately, the noninterlaced circuitry drives the 4d's price \$250 higher than that of IBM's 8514.

Along with its new monitors, NEC is also offering the MultiSync Graphics Engine, a 1024 by 768 board that centers on the 34010 graphics coprocessor. Although software written directly to 8514/A hardware won't run on the board, the resolution and color selection match those of IBM's 8514/A. The board also provides special speed-up logic for PM.

Forging an Interim Standard


The universal software/hardware compatibility offered by PM—known as device independence—is still a long way off. Robert Dickinson, vice president and general manager of WDI, hazards that "we're a generation or two away—say, late 1991."

Meanwhile, in the transitional period before PM takes hold, people considering a 1024 by 768 display must determine whether their favorite software can drive it at full resolution. Thanks to the Video Electronics Standards Association (VESA), which recently published the 8514/A's hardware specifications so programmers could write to it, boards compatible with IBM's 8514/A should have better support from today's software than 34010 boards do.

Of course, software vendors may still take their time supporting either standard. That's why NEC added a complete VGA chipset to the MultiSync Graphics Engine, making it backward compatible with software written for the VGA, EGA, Hercules, CGA, and MDA boards. All that logic raises the price, though, to a whopping \$1499.

IIT is also following this one-size-fits-all strategy, but on the chip level. The company claims its Integrated Graphics Controller chip will be register-level compatible not only with the 8514/A but also with the VGA, EGA, Hercules, CGA, and MDA. "Our objective is to drive the 8514/A market," says Gene Parrot, vice president of sales and marketing. "We believe our customers will be able to sell backward-compatible 8514/A boards for \$799 or less." These boards could be sold as VGAs for as low as \$599; to upgrade to 8514/A capability, you would merely add the RAM necessary for 1024 by 768 resolution.

That's an affordable solution as far as the boards go, but the biggest cost will be the monitor, and here we have a classic catch-22. The manufacturing cost of 16-inch CRTs will plummet only when vendors sell a lot of them, but demand won't peak until the prices fall.

The industry is banking on PM users' lust for elbow room: Only then will they feel compelled to upgrade to the bigger screen. As with so many other things—including device independence—the next step in graphics depends on how many of us find PM irresistible.

AMI GOES PROFESSIONAL

Powerhouse word processing comes to Windows.

The gap between word processing and desktop publishing is growing paper-thin. High-end programs like *Microsoft Word 5.0* and *WordPerfect 5.0* offer graphics integration, fonts, and page preview modes that edge onto *Ventura Publisher*'s turf. But tapping these features takes some doing. If you need high-test word processing seamlessly merged with facile desktop publishing tools, the answer may lie with *Windows* programs such as Samna's *Ami Professional*.

Although it matches *Word* and *WordPerfect* feature for feature, *Ami Professional* is often much easier to use. Thanks to its typographic tools, point-and-drag graphics manipulation, and *Ventura*-like frames and style sheets, it could be the only publishing program you'll ever need.

The prerelease copy examined here was about 95 percent complete, offering a solid look at what's to come. As you might expect, *Ami Professional* preserves *Ami*'s menu- and icon-driven interface, keyboard shortcuts, formatting aids, spelling checker, and easy graphics handling, supplementing them with a panoply of heavy-duty word processing features. The mail merge feature now lets you insert field names from a menu instead of having to type them into a mail merge letter. Need to build a table of con-

tents or an index? Just mark the desired text with the mouse and select a single menu option. A complete document summary sheet plus pop-up Post-it—style notes allow easy group editing and tracking of revisions. And unlike Word, with its cumbersome style sheets, Ami Professional's formatting is applied by simply highlighting text and selecting a style from an on-screen box.

Like any advanced word processor, *Ami Professional* lets you record keyboard macros (and mouse-selected commands) and play them back. Boilerplate text can be stored in glossaries, and there's a 40,000-word thesaurus that even provides dictionary definitions.

Two hot features you won't find in most word processors will win many converts. The first is a table generator that Samna claims will take typed data or 1-2-3, Excel, or dBASE files and transform them into a 1-2-3-style table you can drop into a document. The second is a snazzy built-in business charting function that offers six types of graphs with color and 3-D variations. You can also import .PCX, TIFF, .PIC, and Windows Paint images and import and export formatted Word, WordPerfect, and WordStar files.

Ami Professional supports one-way DDE links to other Windows applications. You can easily create a sales report

with numbers tied to a range in an *Excel* worksheet; change the worksheet, and the document will be updated automatically.

Samna's new *Ami* could be one of those programs that spurs users to move to *Windows*. Just remember that the package will cost \$495 and probably require a *fast* 80286 computer at the very least. A run-time version of *Windows*/286 will be included with the program when it ships at the end of 1989.

COMMUNICATIONS, THE MAC WAY

A popular Mac communications program comes to Windows—and may find the going rough. Judy~Getts

In the Mac world, Software Ventures' *MicroPhone II* gets high marks for its slick background file transfers, powerful script language, high-speed modem support, and a learn mode that lets novices build log-on scripts easily. These features will now appear in the *Windows* version of the product, but they might not be enough. Established competitors like *DynaComm* offer a complete set of modem controls and protocols, while newcomer *Crosstalk for Windows* assembles *Mk.4*-like powers behind a friendly face. Will *MicroPhone II* be able to compete?

Not right away. Based on our examination of a prerelease version and interviews with the company, the first release of *MicroPhone II* will be short on error-checking protocols and terminal emulations, and it won't support *Windows'* DDE. According to the manufacturer, no planned version will include a text editor or on-line help.

Some users may also chafe at the lack of a central dialing directory, but sending and downloading files is rather simple. As in *DynaComm*, related functions are grouped under a handful of menus. Flip open the Phone menu, for example, and you can dial, wait for a call, or run scripts with a few mouse clicks. Toggling from a *MicroPhone II*

MicroPhone's Watch Me feature is a telecommunicator's blessing. It will "watch" as you log on to an on-line service, then replay your keystrokes to automatically log you on to the service the next time you call.

session to another application takes a single click; *Micro-Phone II* will neatly perform file transfers in the background while you work away.

Configuring *MicroPhone II*, however, won't be so simple. Phone numbers are stored in "documents" that are shackled to a single set of communications parameters. Thus, if you wanted both 1200-bps and 2400-bps settings for MCI Mail, you'd have to create two documents. Changing modem settings is even stickier. You must select the Import Script function, choose from a list of inscrutably named modem drivers that control specialized functions, such as hanging up the phone, and import the script.

MicroPhone's Pascal-like script language is likewise geared for skilled users—and you'll have to master it to do more than basic file transfers. Once you're proficient, you'll find that scripts can fetch MCI mail, automate file transfers, run unattended communications sessions, and turn your PC into a BBS. If you mostly log on to on-line services, you can turn to MicroPhone's Watch Me function, which will record your keystrokes (complete with a remote system's responses) for easy playback. MicroPhone will also include prefab scripts for CompuServe, MCI, Easy-

Link, and other services.

But such powers may not satisfy bread-and-butter communications users when *MicroPhone II* is released at the end of 1989 for \$295. The program will include only XMODEM, 1K XMODEM, YMODEM, and YMODEM-G error-correction protocols, and VT-52 and VT-100 terminal emulations. *Windows* buffs will be disappointed as well, since DDE support is down the road. Software Ventures plans to beef up the program in future releases. When it does, *MicroPhone II* could be a strong contender.

BRIDGE/386 AND TOOLKIT 1.1

Batch language

PROS: Integrated editor, excellent debugging support, can control Windows and non-Windows applications

CONS: No on-line help, can't develop custom icons, expensive

The BRED editor lets you craft custom dialog boxes by mixing and matching elements such as buttons, list boxes, and icons, then generates the Bridge code. If you change your mind, you edit the dialog box itself, not the code.

"You press the button, we do the rest." Kodak's old slogan aptly sums up the appeal of *Bridge*, a batch language that lets you perform complex *Windows* operations with push-button ease.

The *Bridge/386-Toolkit* combination goes far beyond DOS batch capabilities. (The stand-alone *Bridge/386* and /286 products are underpowered versions that aren't recommended.) A reasonably experienced user can easily add a custom menu system to *Windows* or write a short batch file that loads, sizes, and places applications on screen. If you've written heavy-duty DOS batch files or 1-2-3 macros, adding fancy touches like dialog boxes is child's play.

Those with programming experience can easily create turnkey interfaces that transparently tie different *Windows* applications together. Using *Windows*' DDE facility, a *Bridge* file could gather user input with a custom data entry form, pour the data into *Excel* for calculation, then paste the result into an *Ami* document and print it out. The user would deal only with the custom input screen.

Since the *Bridge/386-Toolkit* combination works under *Windows/386*, it can even manage DOS programs in their own windows and pass data using the Clipboard.

(Bridge/286 is limited to passing commands at the DOS prompt.) If you're really ambitious, Bridge can even link applications on networked PCs.

The key to such easy batch file development is BRED, *Bridge*'s integrated editor. Functions and commands can be pasted directly into a file from pulldown menus. There's a RUN command for testing files on the fly, single-step and line-by-line tracing, and even a way to monitor variables and change them midstream. BRED can also spit out code for *Windows*-style dialog boxes with list boxes, radio buttons, and icons. *Windows* developers take note: *Bridge* will save code in *Windows SDK* format, making it easier to quickly prototype *Windows* applications.

Bridge batch language resembles BA-SIC with its IF...THEN...ELSE, GOSUB, WHILE, and FOR...NEXT constructs. You can work with arrays, pass parameters to subroutines, and transfer control to another Bridge file. Version 1.1 can also incorporate bit-mapped graphics, but you can't create custom icons.

Developers won't find on-line help in *Bridge*, nor does it include a facility to build custom help for end users. BRED and a new demo provide some help with the first problem, but *Bridge* is still largely a tool for advanced users and developers. But if you're after total control—and then some—this pricey utility can do the job.

WINDOWS MANAGER 1.0

Windows desktop utility

Windows Manager provides a vivid and more detailed view of memory than other Windows utilities, using bar or ple charts. You can attach the Manager menu to the Windows menu bar or place it anywhere on the screen.

hDC's \$79.95 Windows Manager is a nifty little package, but it doesn't quite live up to its ambitious name. This is no super batch language or even a front end for the MS-DOS Executive, but rather a smorgasbord of seven utilities that fills certain gaps in the Windows environment. With it, you can automatically load, size, and place predefined groups of applications ("worksets"); rearrange windows in a flash; view available fonts and system memory usage; and even call on a screen blanker.

Of course, Windows Manager isn't the first program to provide such tools—either the powerful PubTech File Organizer or the \$35 shareware Command Post will do the job. But Manager makes some tasks pretty easy. For example, if you regularly use Excel, PageMaker, and the Windows calculator together, you can take a snapshot of this workset with Manager and load them (and specific data files) with a single command thereafter.

Just remember that *Manager* isn't a DOS shell; you're still stuck with MS-DOS Executive's eye-blurring file list. But if you also buy hDC's \$79.95 *Windows Express*, you can mask the Executive with custom menus and create worksheets, and still beat *PubTech*'s \$199.95 price tag.

Still, hDC's pair can't match *PubTech*'s file-management clout. You don't get total Mac-style icon control of the *Windows* environment, much less the ability to copy, move, delete, or print files. And neither hDC program offers *PubTech*'s text-search and file-viewing functions.

But what *Manager* does, it does well. For example, *Manager* will display samples of available printer and screen fonts; *Pub-Tech* merely lists them. Wonder how much system memory is available? *PubTech* notes only active applications and remaining memory, but *Manager*'s memory viewer pinpoints which applications are loaded, how much RAM each occupies, and how much free space is left, using colorful bar or pie charts. hDC also tosses in an autosave feature and a digital clock with three alarms.

So is Manager worth the price? It depends. If you don't need font or memory viewers, Command Post is a better bargain. If you want total control, the premiumpriced PubTech File Organizer offers the most punch. But if you don't need PubTech's file-management functions, the Windows Manager/Windows Express combination is a slick way to clean up your windows.

Desktop utilities

DeskTop Set's phone book/dialer features a speed-key pad with room for 21 preset phone numbers. You can also call up an area code directory and automatically log outgoing calls.

DeskTop Set is clearly a labor of love. Instead of being designed by committee, it's the brainchild of Konstantin Monastyrsky, émigré programmer and owner of Okna (Russian for "windows") Corporation. And like a labor of love, DeskTop Set is both inspired and flawed. It's not a great little product, but with some fixing, it could be.

DeskTop Set admirably replaces Windows' wan collection of desktop utilities, but it lacks some key features, and it occasionally crashes. The program's most innovative contribution is a file viewer. Unlike in Windows' Notepad, which is limited to ASCII text files, the viewer snoops through almost any formatted text file. Better still, you can split the screen and view different parts of the same file, search for characters, insert bookmarks, print files, and even specify margins, line spacing, and headers and footers.

DeskTop Set's calculator isn't a quantum leap in innovation, but if you're a Windows number cruncher, the on-screen tape may be worth the price tag—especially when a tape can be annotated, globally edited, and saved for later reference. DeskTop Set even displays the most recent session when you call up the calculator.

The calendar is also head and shoulders

above Windows'. Both programs let you post daily appointments, set alarms, view months, and so on, but only DeskTop Set's calendar includes a daily expense log. This isn't just a list with an addition function—you can precode expense categories such as "meals" and note which are deductible. Later, enter an expense, its code, and any notes, and they're posted automatically. Unfortunately, you can't issue reports by expense categories yet.

What cripples the calendar, however, is its inability to automatically schedule regularly recurring appointments such as weekly staff meetings, or to search for text strings. If you're managing anything but a very simple calendar, you'll find these flaws fatal.

The phone book, however, is superb, and it does more than simply store numbers and addresses in a familiar manual format. You can set up multiple phone books and automatically maintain a log of outgoing calls. The dialer can call any number on screen, has room for 105 preset phone numbers, and will supply area codes for major American cities. One flaw: Phone calls sometimes disappear into the modem and can't be switched over to your phone.

DeskTop Set isn't quite ready for prime time, but Okna is constantly improving it. Once a few bugs are squashed and gaps filled, DeskTop Set could be the SideKick that Windows users have been waiting for.



TAXVIEW 2.00

1040 tax-preparation program

PROS: Mimics Form 1040 on screen, includes many federal forms, produces legal-size dot matrix and laser printer output, cheap

CONS: Data not always passed to related forms, few state schedules, no multiple tax scenarios

TaxView can create a supporting Itemization schedule for virtually any line item on the return—in this case, for personal interest on Schedule A. TaxView's designers believe that imitation is the easiest form of data entry. Instead of gathering tax information in Q. and A. fashion, TaxView reproduces IRS forms in toto on screen. You just fill in the familiar blanks, then print out a signature-ready tax return on a dot matrix or a laser printer. It's so simple you won't even need the manual.

This literal approach is dandy if you're doing only one relatively straightforward tax return. But if you're preparing complicated, multischedule returns, you'll go mad scrolling past reams of IRS descriptions and waiting for the screen to redraw. Worse, in some situations, *TaxView* doesn't automatically post data to related forms, a defect likely to foul up even experienced tax preparers.

Installing *TaxView* is a prompt-driven affair, but adding the supplied downloadable laser fonts for printing the tax forms means fiddling with *Windows'* control panel. Once you pick the desired 1040 form, *TaxView* pops it onto the screen. You fill in the form as you would its paper equivalent and jump to supporting forms and schedules by double-clicking the appropriate input field.

As you move through TaxView, you'll

find it surprisingly powerful for the price. It handles all depreciation methods and computes passive loss limitations. Keeping track of supporting detail for partnership income and capital gains is a breeze with *TaxView*'s predesigned statements. And you can create free-form itemization schedules to back up any line item on a return.

But *TaxView* has some irritating potholes. If you have multiple business schedules, the program won't automatically limit your total Section 179 deduction to the statutory \$10,000. And Schedule C net income does not automatically generate a Schedule SE. Sophisticated real estate investors with interest expense or passive losses should definitely steer clear of *TaxView*, since the program does not transfer certain critical computed amounts from one tax form to another.

TaxView does a nice job with detailed personal returns—even for two or three sole proprietorships. But watch out if your return touches on complex tax issues. The problem is, most nonprofessionals can't identify these situations. When TaxView solves its shortcomings, it will be well worth recommending. Note: Future versions of the program will be sold as Macintax for Windows.

Superbase's feature-rich queries can be built and modified by clicking through dialog boxes. Data in related files can also be accessed with a click of the mouse.

Data management programs still have one foot in the programming world. Superbase 2 tries to pull a toe out of the muck. Instead of presenting users with an arcane command language, Superbase lets you store and manipulate information using menus and dialog boxes. To build a query or report, you click through a series of dialog boxes that ask you to specify fields, sorting order, filters, and subtotals. Then Superbase assembles a command string that you can execute and save.

Click an icon on the VCR-like control bar at the bottom of the screen, and you can spin through data in a table view (spreadsheet-style rows and columns), a record view (field names alongside data values), or a form view that lets you arrange fields anywhere on screen. (You can't edit data in a table view.)

Setting up data validation based on a lookup table is short work; enter the wrong value, and up pops a list of proper responses. Multifield index keys and multiple indexes are supported, although creating a multiple-field index requires you to define a virtual concatenated field in your file—not the most intuitive approach to the problem.

Superbase has a built-in Write-like word processor that ties into an easy mail merge


facility. The program also imports and exports *dBASE II* and *III*, *Excel*, 1-2-3, and delimited and fixed-field-length ASCII files. You can even display images as fields in a record.

Sounds good, doesn't it? But in practice it's clear that Superbase can't beat Alpha Four and Q&A 3.0 on their own turf. Q&A's tightly integrated word processor and simple forms-oriented query system are more powerful than Superbase's approach. Alpha Four's custom data-input screens and report capabilities make data management chores much easier for most users.

Even if you prefer the *Superbase* way, be prepared for some quirks. Changing a query means slogging through the dialog boxes again or modifying a huge command string by hand. Order a query differently from the current index, and you'll gaze endlessly at *Windows*' hourglass icon.

If you must have a Windows-based data manager, hold out for Xerox's long-awaited FormBase; otherwise, exit Windows and check out Q&A or Alpha Four. You might also consider Precision's forthcoming Superbase 4—which promises a BASIC-like command language, DDE support, presentation-quality forms output, and multiuser hooks.

Take Center Stage

NEED AN EDGE ON THE COMPETITION?

BEHIND-THE-SCENES VISIONARIES ARE DISCOVERING

THAT LAN APPLICATIONS CAN MAKE THEIR BUSINESSES

RUN FASTER, CHEAPER, AND SMARTER.

This is where we process billions of dollars every day," says the financial services executive, looking toward the networked PCs that stretch across a floor of offices a few blocks off Wall Street. "This is the lifeblood of our business."

PC local area networks (LANs) didn't start out in such starring roles. Instead, they infiltrated organizations as costsaving mechanisms for sharing resources like hard disks and printers. The cost/benefit arguments only grew more per-

suasive as net adapters fell in price, cabling schemes became faster and more flexible, net system software gained maturity, applications began to exploit net capabilities, and nets gained solid links to other computer environments.

Now the advantages of net applications are crystallizing. Electronic mail is an instant hit, even for messages that never leave the department. Job-specific packages for traveling professionals are tightening their links with LANs, helping automate the flow of information to and from home base. E-mail packages like Enable Software's *Higgins* add support for client tracking. Upcoming group productivity packages like Lotus's *Notes* will offer greater help; one bank already employs a beta version to quickly assemble a portfolio of customer information—including personal details like name of spouse—before important visits.

But most payoffs have come from unglamorous work in the trenches, where in-house developers painstakingly customize data base applications. These systems target specific jobs within a single organization and knit them together with related tasks—often with favorable impact on the bottom line.

RESHAPING THE BUSINESS

Shearson Lehman Hutton's Taxable Fixed Income division is one of the largest bond trading operations on Wall Street. The division's Trading Services group processes thousands of transactions each day on a Novell LAN that links 300 PCs.

"Several years ago, our business began a period of explosive growth," recalls Mark Rufeh, senior vice president. "The accounting and operations staff worked 12-hour days." After Shearson's senior management initiated a strategic push for automation, "Trading Services brought PCs to the back offices, networked them, and wrote custom applications to support specific business needs," says Rufeh. "This decentralized approach accelerated application development and allowed application design to be closer to the user."

LANs "have greatly improved the timeliness, capacity, and accuracy of transaction processing," Rufeh says. "For example, over the last two years, our business in money market securities has more than doubled, yet we haven't added one employee." And employees are working normal hours again.

United Parcel Service turned to PC LANs to lower costs, boost productivity, and permit more flexible communications, says Marc Dodge, a UPS LAN network support manager in Paramus, New Jersey. "With 12 million packages a day, our logistics are pretty staggering," Dodge says. "We've installed 200 LANs in the United States and Canada." While standard word processing and spreadsheet packages are offered on the Novell nets, "what drives us is applications we do ourselves," Dodge says. As new applications appear, his group evaluates cost of delivery on PC LANs versus traditional minicomputers.


First for UPS came accounting and data entry—"Data entry was a great place to start," Dodge says. Faster data entry produced a 10 percent boost in productivity. With employees making 500 million keystrokes a month, "ten percent is a nice piece of change," he notes. Nets also gave managers better tools for optimizing daily operations.


Next on line was delivery information. Employees can digitize the delivery record with a hand scanner and store that data on the LAN; if the customer wants proof of delivery, an image of the receiving signature can be merged into a letter and printed out. UPS also employs the nets as routes to mainframe hosts and is stringing together multiple nets at its big district offices. And the company's telecommunications group is linking district offices across the U.S. through high-speed leased lines.

Wells Fargo's Wholesale Loan Systems group depends totally on PC nets, notes Kingsley Mar, systems vice president for research and development in San Francisco. More than 1400 PCs are networked at 40 offices in California and 6 out of state; the Novell and 3Com nets are connected by an IBM mainframe net. Users get standard word processing, file manager, spreadsheet, and E-mail packages. Wells Fargo also writes proprietary software, primarily with Nantucket's *Clipper*, for credit analysis and other tasks. Mar reports that a pilot LAN test in one large office worked so well that the unit reduced its staffing budget even before installing the net, allowing the employee count to adjust through attrition.

"There's no question that networks changed how we do business," says John Good, manager of distributed systems at Turner Construction in New York City. The worldwide construction firm has placed over 30 Banyan Systems LANs, he says, and he expects that number to triple in the next two to three years. "We're now starting to see a number of [construction] projects themselves putting in nets," Good adds.

Turner is tapping PC nets to replace minis as front ends for mainframes and has been eliminating costly leased phone lines in favor of dial-up lines. In addition to generic applications, the net hosts packages that cover project/cost forecasts and management detail in great depth. Many of these programs were brought down from the mainframe and are more functional and easier to use than their predecessors; they often give faster results as well. Overall, Good sees "a lot of user enthusiasm, although users have been almost overwhelmed by the number of things that have to be assimilated."





While UPS networks provide familiar packages to users, "what drives us is applications we do ourselves," says Marc Dodge.

"The network has revolutionized us," declares July Verdon, who aided a network project at Treatment Alternatives for Special Clients (TASC) in Chicago. The nonprofit agency acts as an intermediary between criminal courts and drug treatment facilities. Tracking clients all the way through parole takes "six months to six years, sometimes longer, and there's paperwork every step of the way," she says.

"Everything that would go into a client file now goes on line," into custom DataFlex applications, Verdon explains. TASC's Chicago office has about 60 PCs on a Novell LAN; other offices around Illinois have been equipped with smaller nets. Employees can quickly find needed information—even if it's at other offices—because the nets are connected. "If someone in Peoria needs information on a case that's in Springfield, it takes just minutes," she says. "Before, it took days." TASC also taps Higgins for E-mail, which has proved particularly helpful for immediate agencywide notification of new laws or regulations.

TECHNICAL TOUCHSTONES

Users emphasize the need for careful net planning. Along these lines, Wells Fargo's Mar calls for hardware and software standards (for instance, a limit of five machine configurations). He also stresses careful, step-by-step moves into production. "If you take shortcuts, you just get burned." Turner's Good adds that even a system that's been extensively debugged may break down later as components are updated.

As LAN applications become central to an operation, service and support prove essential. "Service has to be figured in as a fundamental cost," Mar says. Even so, finding effective service isn't always simple. "The tough part is, there's not a single vendor that can get everything working and keep it working," he maintains. That mandates in-house expertise.

But the greatest barriers to leveraged net investments aren't unmet product and service needs—they're cost and organizational issues. Take the National Education Association, the union of 1.8 million teachers in public education, which handles office automation via 200 PCs on a Banyan LAN at its Washington, D.C., headquarters. With nets, the NEA has slashed the cost of connecting to its mainframes, and its state affiliates are doing likewise, says Brice Bonwill, system specialist. Potentially, NEA locals could dial into a state's net and get everything available at state and national levels, Bonwill notes. However, expense is a deterrent, he says, "and the state doesn't want to lose control of the information."

Another hurdle: "A majority of people think you need a big box to do big processing," says one network advocate. "The main battle we're still waging is in changing people's thinking."

REMEMBER THE END USER

In large organizations, mission-critical applications running on a PC LAN (or anywhere else) are written by professional inhouse developers. But the professionals need to observe the first law of applications: Pay serious attention to end users.


Shearson Lehman Hutton's band trading group ensures that this is done, via an organizational approach, notes Mark Rufeh, senior vice president. The PC development group that supports the back office reports to him rather than to Shearson's central information systems group. "The people who

build the system and the people who use the system are the some, and they're all married to the process," Rufeh says.

Once the software is built, user training becomes critical—particularly since many more employees are working on PCs than the handful who once stared into dumb terminals. "And as you mave from a centralized environment, with everything pretty much controlled from one point, to a highly decentralized environment, the responsibilities also shift," says John Good, manager of distributed systems at Turner Con-

struction. "If you forgot to back up your data, don't call me and start mouning."

Wells Fargo created an aggressive onsite training program that lets emplayees "walk away with something directly relevant to their jobs, not just with 284 spreadsheets," says Kingsley Mar, systems vice president far research and development. While some veteran employees dreaded the LAN, "it really didn't impact any of them." The net provided a complete but controlled environment, so experienced PC users didn't enjoy much of an edge. —E. B.



dBASE owes much of its popularity to the thousands of third-party utilities that support it. The vast majority of them are aimed at programmers, but this Buyers' Guide focuses on utilities designed for the average end user: report generators, search utilities, and other programs that either help users work more efficiently with dBASE III Plus and compatibles or provide some

In the dBASE world, the line between what constitutes a programmer and a casual user isn't always clear, and some tools will be used by both. For example, the query builders presented here are also helpful to programmers. By the same token, application generators aren't covered here, though some target end users.

missing functionality.

All the products listed in the guide are *dBASE III Plus*—compatible. Many also work with



clones such as Foxbase and dBXL and compilers such as Quicksilver and Clipper, and some work with dBASE IV. Look over the symbols at the end of each product description to make sure the utility works with your program.

This guide focuses on commercial products, but alternative shareware products abound. Check your favorite BBS, or buy EMS's "dBUtility Directory," which lists hundreds of public domain, shareware, and commercial *dBASE* utilities (available from EMS, 4505 Buckhurst Ct., Olney, MD 20832; 301/924-3594, 301/963-2708 [fax]).

This guide covers products in eight categories: report generators, graphics utilities, query builders, file conversion utilities, data compression utilities, search utilities, data salvage utilities, and memory managers. Some are stand-alone programs, able to read .DBF files directly; others are TSRs that pop up or work transparently from within dBASE.

There are several key features to look for. Thirdparty report generators greatly improve on the limited reporting skills of dBASE III Plus and its clones. Most offer enhanced layout tools and better font and printer support. Some supply canned formats and let you interactively fine-tune a report on screen without having to print it out at every stage. Band orientation-a Paradox-style report interface-makes it easier to format discrete portions of your document.

If you've already spent \$500 on a generic graphics program that can use dBASE data, all well and good. But if you want a cheaper alternative just for dBASE, you'll find utilities that build business graphics from .DBF files without tedious conversion. A dBASE graphics package lets you graph either whole .DBF files or selected data. Other graphics utilities covered here are primarily scanner control packages that let you tag records with scanned images to turn dBASE into an image data base.

dBASE IV introduced both query by example (QBE)-a helpful tablebased querying methodand structured query language (SQL) to the dBASE world, but III Plus and its compatibles offer only limited tools for selecting and analyzing data. A third-party query builder can help you get a better view of your data using QBE. One product, dQuery, also provides SQL queries.

If you need to pass dBASE records to another data manager or a word processor or pull in data from 1-2-3 or another program, a file conversion program is indispensable. A good file converter supports numerous format conversions and automatically formats data and adjusts field lengths. You should also be able to convert selected fields or records as well as whole files.

Data compression utilities reduce the amount of disk space taken up by data and program files, an especially useful option if a data base holds many empty fields. Some can squeeze data as you enter it, and some also encrypt data.

Can't find that missing record? Need to purge your data base of duplicates? A search utility can help. Most can find the right record using a single word, and some catch typing and spelling errors by recognizing approximate matches.

If a data base becomes corrupted, you'll need the help of a salvage utility. dBASE files can be damaged in two ways. Internal damage happens when file headers get overwritten, records are offset, or spurious characters appear. Lost clusters of data and DOS-level damage to directories or file allocation tables can also spell catastrophe. A good salvage utility diagnoses such problems and lets you decide whether to repair them automatically or use built-in tools to correct the problem manually.

While you're running dBASE, you can use the Run command to load another program—but only if you've got enough RAM.

If you strike out, a memory manager can ease the crunch by temporarily moving *dBASE* files to disk without closing them down.

Finally, we cover a few utilities that defy categorization. If you need on-line help or *dBASE* just isn't fast enough, the solution could be here.







ith WordPerfect macros. you work hard at first to save time later. Nearly every new WordPerfect user is dismayed to learn that you have to press at least seven keys just to move a block of text. Even with a recorded keystroke macro, you can only pare the process to six. But if you edit that macro with WordPerfect's built-in macro editor, you can add a block-copy capability, create a custom menu, and learn a lot about WordPerfect's powerful macro programming along the way.

WordPerfect 5.0's 39 new macro commands and functions remove most of the program's previous limits. Now the macros can respond flexibly to keyboard input and let you design your own WordPerfect-style prompts and

menus. In this article you'll create a recorded block-move macro and then soup it up with the macro editor, using variables, subroutines, and nine basic programming commands.

Raw Material: A **Recorded Macro**

To start, you'll record a keystroke macro summoned with <Alt>-M (for Move) that moves a block of text.

1. You need sample text to build this macro. On a clear WordPerfect screen, type Sample, then press <Home> <Cursor Left> to position the cursor under the 'S'. Now press <Ctrl>-<F10> <Alt>-M, type Block Move to name the macro, and press <Enter> to begin recording keystrokes. The words 'Macro Def' flashing at

the lower right corner of the screen show that your keystrokes are being recorded.


- 2. Press <Ah>-<F4> to turn the Block function on.
- 3. Press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>P to insert a pause in the macro. When you use the macro, this pause will let you highlight the block.
- 4. Press <home> < Cursor Right> to highlight the text 'Sample', and press < Enter> to end the pause.
- 5. Press <Ctrl>-<F4>BM<F1> to cut the block.
- 6. Finally, press < Ctrl>-<F10> to finish macro recording. The flashing 'Macro Def' prompt will disappear.

To use the macro, press <Alt>M, highlight the desired text,
and press <Enter> to cut the
block. To paste the block elsewhere, press <Shift>-<F10>
(Retrieve) and <Enter>.

Programming Builds a Better Macro

While useful, the initial version of the <Alt>-M macro is fairly limited. It includes only two block functions—move and delete—and doesn't tell you how to recall data from the delete buffer. And to automate copying a block, you'd have to record a second similar <Alt>-key macro. But with WordPerfect's macro editor you can improve <Alt>-M with a copy feature and a prompt instead.

You can't build a macro from scratch with WordPerfect's builtin macro editor; you can only modify an existing macro. You insert most regular WordPerfect

commands by pressing the keys they're assigned to. Pressing <Alt>-<F4>, for example, enters the Block command. (Note that you can't just type in the command names.) To insert any of WordPerfect's 39 macro programming commands, you use the editor's pop-up list. Just scroll through a list (or jump to a command by typing its first few letters) and press <Enter>. (In the macro editor, all commands are enclosed in braces.)

► Building a Macro Step by Step

To begin modifying the <Alt>-M macro, press <Ctrl>-<F10>
<Alt>-MEA to load it into the editor. Now take a deep breath, and type in the following keystrokes to duplicate the macro command listing in FIGURE 1. We'll explain the steps later.

- 1. Position the cursor under the {Move} command and press <Ctrl>-<End>. This deletes the previous macro commands, leaving only {Block}{Pause} on the screen. Press <Enter> to move to the next line. Note that hard returns only make the macro easier to read; they have no effect on what it does.
- 2. Press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>
 CHAR<Enter> to bring in the
 {CHAR} command from the popup list, type 1~, and press
 <Enter>.
- 3. Press <Ctrl>-] 1 <Ctrl>-\
 <Space> <Ctrl>-V <Ctrl>-VM <Ctrl>0, type ove;, press <Space>, and then press <Enter>.
- 4. Press <Ctrl>-] 2<Ctrl>-\
 <Space> <Ctrl>-V <Ctrl>-VC <Ctrl>0, type opy:, press <Space>~,
 and press <Enter>.

10. To remind yourself how to retrieve the block, type the message Shift+F10 and Enter to retrieve block.~, and press <Enter>.

11. Press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>0 <Enter> to insert the {Quit} command. Press <Enter>.

12. Press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>L
<Enter>. Type move~m and press
<Ctrl>-<Page Up>RET<Enter>
<Enter>.

13. Press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>L
<Enter>. Type copy~c, and finally, press <Ctrl>-<Page Up>RET
<Enter> <Enter>.

Now compare what you've entered with FIGURE 1. Make any necessary corrections, then press <F7> twice to save the macro.

To use this macro, press <Alt>-M and highlight the block. Press <Enter>, and WordPerfect displays a two-choice menu. After you make a selection, the macro reminds you to press <Shift>-<F10> <Enter> to paste the block.

What Makes This Macro Tick

So what's going on in the macro, and what can you learn from it? Let's take a look at each of the macro commands we've used.

There's nothing new in the first line: The macro turns the block command on, and {PAUSE} suspends the action until you highlight the block and press <Enter>.

Lines 2, 3, and 4 create a WordPerfect-style prompt line that appears as '1 Move; 2 Copy:'. This is done with the {CHAR} command, whose syntax is {CHAR}variable~prompt~. Basically, {CHAR} displays a prompt, waits for you to press a key, assigns that character to a variable, then continues running the macro.

Line 2 is the "{CHAR}variable

number~" part of the command. Macros use up to ten variables, {VAR 0} to {VAR 9}, to store keystrokes. The number 1 tells the macro to assign the character you type in response to the {CHAR} prompt to {VAR 1}.

Lines 3 and 4 make up the "prompt" portion of the {CHAR} command, which generates the on-screen menu '1 Move; 2 Copy:'. WordPerfect displays menu choice numbers in boldface; {^]} and {^\} toggle boldface, and {^V} and {^Q} turn the menu-letter display attribute on and off. How menu letters appear on screen varies according to your graphics board and default settings, but using {^V} and {^Q} ensures that your macros' menus match WordPerfect's. The tilde at the end of line 4 marks the end of the {CHAR} command.

{DISPLAY OFF} in line 5 speeds up macro execution by not updating the screen. The block function is on at this point in the macro, so {Move}b activates WordPerfect's Move menu and selects b for block. (Since the display is turned off, you don't actually see the menu.)

Lines 6, 7, and 8 represent the {CASE CALL} command, which teams up with the {CHAR} command to search for and run the subroutines "move" and "copy" on lines 12 and 13 in this macro. The syntax for the {CASE CALL} command is: {CASE CALL}value~case1~ label1~case2~label2~...~~

{CASE CALL} reads the variable value recorded by the {CHAR} command and checks it against a case statement (casel, case2, and so on). If it finds a match, {CASE CALL} reads the corresponding subroutine label (label1, label2, and so on), jumps to the subroutine, and runs it.

In line 6, {CASE CALL} reads the character that {CHAR} has stored in {VAR 1} and searches for a match among several case statements.

Lines 7 and 8 define {CASE CALL}'s case statements and identify the corresponding subroutine labels. To duplicate *WordPerfect 5.0*'s mnemonic menus, you need three case statements for "move" and three for "copy": a number, a lowercase letter, and an uppercase letter.

For "move," the possible choices are 1, m, and M (line 7); for "copy" the choices are 2, c, and C (line 8). Each case statement has a label that corresponds to a subroutine—in this case, either line 12 or 13. The double tildes (~~) at the end of line 8 mark the end of the {CASE CALL} command.

The {LABEL} command (whose syntax is {LABEL} subroutine name~) specifies two simple subroutines that start WordPerfect's move and copy functions, respectively. {RETURN} marks the end of a subroutine.

After the macro has run the subroutine, it continues with the command that follows the {CASE} statement, beginning at line 9 in this macro. {DISPLAY ON} lets you see on-screen information. The {PROMPT} command (whose syntax is {PROMPT}message~) displays a message at the WordPerfect status line. Line 10 contains the text for the {PROMPT} message, the block-retrieve reminder.

The {QUIT} command on line 11 ends the macro and also separates the main body of the macro from the subroutines.

To Learn More About Macros

For a discussion of WordPerfect 5.0's macro programming lan-

guage and the built-in macro editor, look at the Advanced Macros section of the program manual's appendix. If that section of your manual begins with a discussion of the macro command keys rather than the macro editor, call WordPerfect at 800/321-4566 and ask for the free Advanced Macros supplement.

As you become more macroliterate, you may start to feel hampered by WordPerfect 5.0's built-in editor. It lets you view only 13 lines of a macro at a time and lacks block, cut-and-paste, search-and-replace, and printing functions. Fortunately, the recently upgraded WordPerfect Library Macro Editor provides all these missing functions, plus full-screen editing and its own internal macros. Anyone with more than a casual interest in WordPerfect macros should get the \$15 Macro Editor 5.0.

An Easy Way to Find DOS Subdirectories

When you're working in a directory packed with data, it's difficult to see the subdirectories among the files. Instead of typing DIR, which lists a mélange of subdirectories and files, try the DIR * command, which lists only subdirectories and any files without a file name extension. It'll save you time and frustration during a sudirectory hunt.

Here's the structure of the data base used in this mail merge example. You may want to add fields to your data base to enhance it for mail merge. For example, the DEARXXX field could be the first name, a nickname, or the last name preceded by Mr. or Ms. The MAILED field keeps track of who has received a mailer, to prevent duplicate mailings.

This article explains how to work around these problems as it takes you step-by-step through a typical mail merge operation. All the tips assume you have given the command SET INSTRUCT OFF, or put INSTRUCT = OFF in the CONFIG.DB file, to turn off prompts.

Prep Work

To install printer drivers and fonts, run the DBSETUP program from the directory where your mail merge data is located. Select the appropriate printers, and enter the control codes for the fonts you want.

Next, run dBASE IV from the same directory. First you'll open the data base. FIGURE I shows the data base structure used in this example. The structure assumes a flat file data base, but you can just as easily work with a relational model; just use QBE to select the fields you want, and use the resulting view when you cre-

ate your report. Here's how you begin:

- 1. To open the data base, highlight its name in the Data column of the Control Center and press <Enter>.
- 2. Cursor to the Reports column and select < create >. The report screen appears.
- 3. Select Quick Layouts, then Mailmerge layout.

This will open the detail band of the report form, leaving the other bands closed. Here you'll type in the body of the letter and enter the mail merge fields. Before you begin, you can format the letter by opening the print menu (<Alt>-P) and selecting margins, fonts, and other settings. However, the default settings should do the trick for most users.

► Set the Date

Before you start the letter, put some blank lines at the top to accommodate your letterhead by making sure <Insert> is on and pressing <Enter>. Then insert a date field. To print the date in the MM/DD/YY format, you would press <Alt>-F to bring up the Fields menu, choose Add field, select Date from the Predefined column, and press <Ctrl>-<End>. For the more formal format that prints the month name, the day number, and the 4-digit year, add a calculated field as follows:

- Press <Att>-F, choose Add field, and select <create> in the Calculated column.
 - 2. Select Expression.
- 3. Type the following:

 TRIM(CMONTH(DATE())) + "" +

 STR(DAY(DATE()),IIF(DAY(DATE()) <

 10,1,2)) + "," + STR(YEAR(DATE()),4)
- 4. Press <Enter>, then <Ctrl><End>.

► Adding Fields

Now add the name and address fields that correspond to your data base fields:

- 1. Insert a few blank lines, press <Ait>-F, and select Add field.
- 2. Select *TITLE* (for Mr., Ms., etc.) and press <Enter> and <Ctrl>-<End>.
- 3. Insert a blank space after the TITLE field (indicated by *X*'s on screen).
- 4. Press <Alt>-F, select Add field, choose FIRSTNAME, and press <Ctrl>-<End>.
- Insert a blank space and repeat the process to add the LASTNAME field.

At this point you could press <Enter> to start a new line, add the CORP_TITLE field, add COMPANY on the next line, and then move on to the address.

This is all the space you need to operate Microsoft Mouse.



However, if some clients lack a title or company, dBASE IV will print two blank lines between the name and the address, and the personal touch—or illusion thereof—will quickly be shattered. Here's the solution:

- 1. Instead of placing the CORP_TITLE field on a new line, move the cursor to the end of the LASTNAME field. Don't leave a blank space.
- 2. Press <Alt>-F and select Add field.
- 3. Select < create > in the Calculated column.
- 4. Select *Name field*, and type in a name that's slightly different from the original field name (CORP_TITLE), then press <Enter>.
- 5. Choose Expression, and type the following:

 IIF(LEN(TRIM(CORP_TITLE))>0,

 CHR(13) + CHR(10) + TRIM(CORP_
 TITLE),"")
- 6. Press <Enter> and <Ctrl><End>.

This blank-line fix first checks the CORP_TITLE field to see if it's filled. If it is, the Immediate IF (IIF) evaluates the first expression as true and places the TRIM(CORP_TITLE) expression on a new line [CHR(13) is a carriage return, and CHR(10) is a linefeed]. If the CORP_TITLE field is empty, a null string ("") is output, so no blank lines are printed. On screen, the result should be another row of X's directly following the LAST-NAME field.

Next, at the end of the same line, without adding a blank space, go through the same process for the COMPANY field, but replace the two references to CORP_TITLE with COMPANY in the expression.

Finally, go ahead and enter

the address fields in the usual manner, selecting the fields from the Add field menu and placing each field on a new line. Keep CITY, STATE, and ZIP separated with the appropriate commas and spaces on screen. For the salutation, press <Enter> twice, type Dear, skip a space, and insert the DEARXXX field followed by a colon. Then press <Enter> twice, and type the rest of the letter. dBASE IV provides word wrap and lets you change fonts on the fly from the Words/ Style menu. (You can import an ASCII file if you want, but you'll have to strip the carriage returns by hand.)

You may encounter a sporadic bug in version 1.0: After you press <Enter>, you may lose the right margin from the ruler line. In this case, you'll have to reset the margin before starting the next paragraph.

When you're done, press <Ctrl>-<End>, and enter a report name at the prompt. The code generated by your mail merge report will scroll by on screen.

To print the report from the Control Center, highlight the report name and press <Enter>. A print menu appears, providing options to preview the report on screen and change settings before printing. To modify the mail merge report, highlight the report name in the Control Center and press <Shift>-<F2>.

With solid, built-in mail merge, you can forget about lengthy conversions and keeping duplicate lists. Learning dBASE IV's mail merge can save a lot of time. —Tony Lima

Eight Tips for Taming Ventura

A pair of Ventura Publisher veterans share their secrets for avoiding crashes, solving baffling formatting glitches, moving pagefuls of text, and more.

What you need: Ventura Publisher 1.1, 2.0, or Professional Extension

may be the best choice for desktop publishing on the PC, but it still has some rough edges. Here are eight ways to fix some of the things that inexplicably go wrong—and avoid getting into jams in the first place. The eight tips range from tricks for steering clear of program crashes to solutions for common formatting errors.

Escape That Crash

Ventura Publisher is no stranger to crashes. Suddenly, your keyboard freezes, or you find yourself staring at a lonely DOS prompt. Crashes frequently occur when you load a document that's bigger than available memory. Ventura then swaps out the excess portion to a spill file, sometimes freezing the screen. The simplest solution is to limit chapters to about 20 pages. You can also free up memory by re-





moving TSRs or reducing buffers specified in CONFIG.SYS.

Professional Extension largely eliminates this problem by taking full advantage of EMS memory. An EMS board can also help with the base version of Ventura 2.0, which can use up to 108K of EMS.

If a chapter crashes frequently, delete the VP.INF file (or VPPROF.INF in the Professional Extension) from your Ventura directory. This file. which stores display defaults such as whether to show ruler lines, is corrupted when Ventura crashes, and continuing to use it can lead to more crashes. The display will revert to Ventura's defaults after you delete VP-.INF, but it's easy enough to reset them. The next time you save the chapter, Ventura will create a new VP.INF.

Thawing Frozen Error Messages

Sometimes when *Ventura* crashes, it displays a dialog box,

as shown in **SCREEN 1**. Clicking the Quit button usually has no effect, but if you click it 20 or 30 times, you might mysteriously be granted clemency—the dialog box will disappear, and you'll be free to resume working.

Vanishing Screen Fonts

One of Ventura 2.0's most enticing features is the ability to display large screen fonts—72 points or more—at their actual size. Occasionally, though, the program won't display them, usually due to a lack of memory in the screen buffer. If this happens, delete the VGAFSTR.INF, EGAFSTR.INF, CGAFSTR.INF, or SD_HERC.EGA file (depending on your display) from your Ventura directory.

If that doesn't help, increase the size of Ventura's screen font buffer: Load the VP.BAT file (VPPROF.BAT in the $Professional\ Edition$) into a word processor, and add F=x to the end of

the line beginning DRVRMRGR. The x specifies the buffer size in kilobytes and can be any number between 68 (the default) and 128. The trade-off to increasing this buffer: You reduce the RAM available for loading large documents.

Waking Up a Sluggish Cursor

If the text-editing cursor refuses to respond when you press the arrow keys, you probably pressed <Shift>-<Ctrl> by mistake, putting *Ventura* into its "no mouse" mode. In this mode, the arrow keys control the mouse cursor, so the text editing cursor is disabled. To return to mouse mode, press <Shift>-<Ctrl> again. Note: Only the <Shift> and <Ctrl> keys on the right side of the keyboard toggle this mode.

Disappearing Formats

Sometimes after you load *Ventura*, you'll find that text formatted in italic or bold has mysteriously lost its formatting. In this case, an index or anchor mark is usually hidden in the text, causing everything after the mark to lose its formatting. Removing the markers alone won't restore the formatting; you'll also have to retag the text. To avoid this problem, don't place such marks within formatted text.

Eliminating an Isolated Paragraph Mark

After you load text into *Ventura*, you may notice an unwanted line with nothing on it but the paragraph sign. This occurs when a space follows the period in the last sentence of a paragraph. To eliminate the unwanted line, select text-editing mode, place the



cursor in front of the paragraph mark, and press <Backspace>.

Stubborn Text Attributes

Sometimes when you apply text attribute tags in the Text Mode Selection box, the attributes won't take effect. In this case, try highlighting the text in question, choosing Normal from the list, and then selecting your attribute again.

If that doesn't work, hidden attribute settings are probably preempting your new selections and need to be deleted. Say you've highlighted a passage and selected Bold, for example, but text remains italicized. Place the cursor in front of the text (you'll know you're in the right location when 'Attr. Setting' appears in the Current Selection box in the lower left corner of the screen), and press < Delete > to delete the attribute marker. The text is returned to normal, so you'll have to retag it with bold.

Moving Large Blocks of Text

What if you want to move a block of text that spans more than one page? Ventura won't let you highlight more than one page of text at a time. The solution is to temporarily change the Body Text tag to a tiny point size, such as 2 or 3 points, so that you can highlight the entire passage and move it. You can then reset the tag to its normal font size. —Ted Nace

DJN/R is an essential source of investor information, but watch out for those steep charges! Our on-line expert offers tested advice for getting top value from your Dow Jones dollars.

What you need: a Dow Jones News/Retrieval subscription

f you're an active investor,
Dow Jones News/Retrieval
(DJN/R), the on-line information
service from the publisher of the
Wall Street Journal, is virtually
indispensable.

DJN/R's collection of 35 data bases provides current and historical stock quotations; full text of *The Wall Street Journal*, *Business Week*, and *Barron's*; and selected stories from the *Washington Post*, *Forbes*, and more than 150 other publications. You also get access to company profiles, earnings estimates, insider trading filings, balance sheets, and much more from such companies as Dun & Bradstreet.

Unfortunately, DJN/R has never been particularly easy to use, and experimenting on line with the meter running can result in high monthly bills: DJN/R charges by the minute; some data bases are more expensive than others; and special services involve costly surcharges. For instance, should you accidentally order a full company report from Dun's Financial Records, you'll be billed an additional \$89.

Fortunately, there are a number of expert techniques—such as getting stock quotes directly from the system prompt and using QUICK reports, TRACK portfolios, and the new DOW-QUEST search function—that can save you time (and therefore money) on line. (We'll assume you're familiar with standard stock symbols; if not, you can access the Symbols data base by typing //SYMBOLS and pressing <Enter>.)

Prompt Quotes

If you want historical stock quotes fast, you don't need to plough through the DJN/R HQ data base; you can save time and keystrokes by getting quotes directly from DJN/R's main system prompt (either a blank line, or 'ENTER REQUEST'). Just key in a semicolon followed by a stock symbol and a "P" code specifying a certain time period. For instance, typing ;IBM P1 will give you quotes for IBM for the last 12 trading days. (The P codes work in increments of 12 days; P2 gets you quotes from days 13 through 24, and so on.)

Quick and Comprehensive

The fastest way to get a broad selection of information on a given company is to use the QUICK feature. For example, entering //QUICK IBM from the system prompt will produce a menu of items pertaining to IBM drawn from eight DJN/R data bases,



including current quotes, news stories from multiple sources, a financial overview, and more.

If you accept all the menu items, a complete QUICK report costs \$39. It will still save you money if you need a complete company background, though, since without it you would have to delve into eight separate data bases. If you choose only selected items from the QUICK menu, of course, the cost drops.

Saving Time With TRACK

If, like most investors, you follow more than one stock, you can save time by using the TRACK feature to get up-to-the-second news and quotes on selected portfolios. TRACK is a menudriven function that draws its information from two data bases: Dow Jones Enhanced Current Quotes and Dow Jones News (which includes stories from the Wall Street Journal, Barron's, and Dow Jones News Service).

With TRACK you can create up to five "portfolios." Each one lets you specify up to 25 stock or security symbols for companies you want to follow, plus DJN/R category codes to specify the kinds of news stories you want to read on those companies.

(DJN/R will charge you \$8 a month to use TRACK, regardless of the number of portfolios you create.)

A portfolio you name Compute, for example, might contain the stock symbols IBM, AAPL, CPQ, plus category codes I/EDP (for computer industry news) and I/OFF (for office-equipment industry news). Then, when you type in //TRACK COMPUTE from the system prompt, DJN/R will retrieve quotes and relevant

news stories—as recent as 90 seconds old—for each company in your profile and display them on screen. You can limit retrieval to quotes and news added since you last ran the profile by using the NO switch (//TRACK COMPUTE NO).

The DOWQUEST Revolution

The most precious jewel in the DJN/R crown is its collection of full-text data bases, containing more than 150,000 articles. There are three access codes you can use to conduct searches: //TEXT, //TEXTM, and //DOWQUEST.

DOWQUEST, introduced only a few months ago, is a giant step forward in text-search software. Not only does it let you conduct a keyword search with simple, English-like queries, but its advanced algorithm is clever enough to assign a higher priority to text in which keywords are grouped together. For example, if expansion board is your area of interest, text in which that phrase appears is likely to yield better results than an article in which the words expansion and board occur separately.

- 1. To begin using DOW-QUEST, type //DOWQUEST <Emer>
 from the system prompt. You
 will be asked to enter words that
 describe the subject you are interested in. Simply type in a series of keywords, separated by
 spaces. For instance, if you were
 curious about IBM's latest expansion boards, you might enter
 IBM expansion board new.
- 2. DOWQUEST will present you with a list of 16 numbered article headlines, ranked according to how closely they match your query. To view an article, simply enter its number and proceed to step 3. However, if you key in BEST n, where n is the

number of an article, DOW-QUEST will take you directly to the page in that article that best matches your search query.

- 3. In either case, the displayed paragraphs on the page will be numbered, and you will be invited to pick the "best" paragraph or paragraphs to further refine the search. This time when you type SEARCH n <Enter>, DOWQUEST uses every word in paragraph n to search its files again, looking for the best match.
- 4. When you have located the most useful articles, you can display the full text by using the **PRINT** command and capture the data to a disk file with your communications package.

DOWQUEST can cost more than twice as much as TEXT or TEXTM, but its ease of use and advanced search features are worth it. For active investors, Dow Jones News/Retrieval is a necessity, not a luxury—which means it's important to keep your bills from reaching luxury levels. That means playing it smart, not cheap. —Alfred Glossbrenner

Black Box, White Text in Ventura

White text in a shaded box makes an eye-catching presentation, but if you tried to produce that graphic with early versions of *Ventura Publisher*, all you got was a plain black box. Here's a simple technique that works for release 2.0.

Select the Box Text tool, and then draw a box; it needn't be in its final place on the page since you can position it later. Enter the Graphics menu, and set Fill Attributes to Opaque and Black. Then type the text into the box. Now use the Set Font option to change the color of the text to white, and then print the box.

Easy Indexing for PC-File:dB Clones

You can speed up *PC-File:dB* searches by tagging data base fields and copying them to an index file. The program will then search only the indexed fields. This handy feature hits a snag, however, if you want to clone an indexed data base format and store the copy *and* its new index in the same subdirectory as the originals. When you try to open either data base, the program forces you to rebuild the original index, which erases the clone's.

One way around this dilemma is to create different index field names by renaming the data base fields when you clone the original data base. First, make sure the clone doesn't contain any records, so *PC-File:dB* can open it without finding bad index entries. [For a good *PC-File* cloning technique, see "Cloning PC-File Plus Data Base Formats," *User Group Tips, PCW*, October 1989.]

Then, open the clone and display the Utilities menu. Select the Name function, and press <F10> to edit the field names that appear in the index. Simply adding a single lowercase letter to the field name, as in AD-DRESSa or COMPANYb, allows the program to distinguish between the two indexes without obscuring the real field name. The extra letter also serves as a marker for indexed fields. Just remember to change the name of each field you subsequently add to the index.

Cut Down Those Program-Loading Batch Files

Most people create several short batch files, each of which logs on to a directory and loads an application. For example, this one loads *Microsoft Word:*

C:

CD\WORD WORD

These batch files work fine, but because of the way DOS stores files on disk, a few small files can eat up a lot of space. If your disk space is at a premium, here's a single general-purpose batch file called GO.BAT that uses DOS's replaceable parameters to load instead of specifying a directory to log on to and an application to run:

C: CD\%1

%2 %3 %4 %5 %6 %7 %8 %9

To switch to the \WORD subdirectory and load WORD. COM, for example, type GO WORD WORD at the DOS prompt. GO also lets you enter an application's optional parameters. For example, GO WORD WORD BIKE /G will load Word in graphics mode and open the file BIKE.



Advice and information for the computer consumer

As the dBASE industry struggles out of its state of confusion, here's practical advice for business buyers on how to cope with the proliferation of competing standards.

Who's Minding the Store?

A few years ago, the standardbearer for the dBASE language was unquestionably Ashton-Tate. But now many users and developers aren't so sure.

Contrary to expectations, the release of *dBASE IV 1.0* has failed to put Ashton-Tate back on top. The industry is buzzing with controversy over whether *dBASE IV* is a useful product, given its problems with memory management and buggy SQL. Although Ashton-Tate originally

promised a corrected version 1.1 sometime in the third quarter of 1989, it's uncertain when the company will deliver this fix.

As a result, Ashton-Tate may have permanently tarnished its image among developers. "Ashton-Tate is no longer perceived as a leader in dBASE technology," claims Mike Masterson, head of the Silicon Valley dBASE Society. "The company rested on its laurels with dBASE III Plus, and the only thing that kept it going was the clones."

Two significant competitors, Fox Software and Nantucket, have taken leadership roles in dBASE language technology development. Fox Software's Foxbase + is a broad-based, inexpensive product that surpasses dBASE III Plus with better performance and extensions to the dBASE language; Nantucket's Clipper provides a superior highend application-development environment. WordTech's dBXL, while slower than dBASE, offers an easy interface (see Five Against IV, PCW, May 1989).

Faced with this competition, Ashton-Tate has moved aggressively to regain control of its most valuable commodity, the dBASE language. Ashton-Tate's suit against Fox Software, for example, is widely perceived as an effort both to monopolize the language and to squash an embarrassingly successful competitor. Ashton-Tate has also formed the dBASE Language Advisory Board (dLAB) and selected 15 members to provide input on the

language's future direction.

Even some of dLAB's members, who refer to themselves as thorns in CEO Ed Esber's side, believe that Ashton-Tate's position hurts the language more than it helps. "Big thorn" Russell Freeland, a dLAB member and president of Synergy, a consulting firm in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, says the dBASE language is becoming too diversified. "There is no defined center and no defined standard. mostly because one vendor-Ashton-Tate-claims to own it," says Freeland.

As a result, other vendors are charting alternate courses with their dBASE-language products to avoid lawsuits and provide users with needed enhancements. Nantucket is moving *Clipper* toward object-oriented programming. Fox's new product, *FoxPro*, is expected to depart slightly from *dBASE IV* compatibility in its report writer and template language system.

Clearly, having many different dBASE language products to choose from benefits developers. "As a programmer, I love having a choice," says dLAB member Tom Rettig, president of Tom Rettig Associates in Beverly Hills, California. "Consultants should know all the languages so that they can develop the best solution for each client."

But others would prefer more coherence. "In an ideal world, I'd (continues)

like to see good stuff from a single vendor," says dLAB member Candy Prince, a staff engineer for Union Carbide Corporation. "Mixing 57 varieties doesn't always work," because nuances crop up even between compatible products.

Some people feel that developing an industrywide dBASE language standard, at least for such basic conventions as windowing, would help arrest the fragmentation of the language. But so far, standardization efforts have fallen apart. An IEEE committee, which succeeded in agreeing only on dBASE III Plus as a basic standard, has temporarily disbanded "due to lack of interest," says Martin Rinehart, former chair of the committee and founder of Wallsoft Systems. "My distinct impression is that some vendors feel it's to their advantage not to have a standard," says Rinehart. "The user community should reject these vendors' monopolistic solutions."

Ashton-Tate has set the tone by insisting that it is the only legitimate custodian of the language. "Our view is that Ashton-Tate offers the best solution," says company vice president Eric Kim categorically. But Nantucket isn't keen on the standards idea, either. "We just don't care about meeting some arbitrary list of standards," says Nantucket president Larry Heimendinger. "This may sound snobby, but we suggested once that we might try to be compatible with somebody else's products, and we got shouted down by our developers."

Even Fox Software is lukewarm. "If all the companies decided they were interested in a standards effort," says Richard Ney, director of marketing, "then certainly we would be, too. But with the lawsuit and the fragmented market, it doesn't make a good deal of sense."


On the other hand, WordTech's Mike Gardner, vice president of research and development, says his company supports the standardization efforts wholeheartedly. "I think all the vendors should forget their selfish selfinterest and promote the dBASE language," he says.

Despite the industry's fractiousness, Mark Schnapp, an International dBASE Users Group member and representative for the now-dormant IEEE committee, says he's optimistic about getting vendors together, even Ashton-Tate. "Ashton-Tate is going to become a lot more responsive-or dead," says Schnapp. But he says the standards committee lacks the infrastructure right now to organize interested parties.

Meanwhile, the market will decide which product becomes the next data base leader. Many analysts are betting on FoxPro; others think Ashton-Tate has a good chance of regaining its reputation with a corrected dBASE IV. But while the industry is making up its mind, what should the business buyers do? Cary Prague, a dLAB member and assistant director for corporate finance at The Travelers' Companies, offers this advice: "Stick with what you've got until the market shakes out."

WordTech's Mike Gardner offers two interim suggestions: "If your applications aren't too ambitious, try to use dBASE III Plus code because it's easy to (continues)

move from product to product." Another option, he says, is to modularize the code so that a windowing procedure, for example, can easily be rewritten in another dialect.

To help users cope with multiple-product environments, David Kalman, editor in chief of Data Based Advisor, has written a 1000-page reference guide called The dBASE Language Book (\$27.95 from Microtrend Books: 800/336-6060), which cross-references all the linguistic variations on dBASE III Plus in Clipper, dBXL, Quicksilver, dBASE IV, and Foxbase +.

Code converters, which translate code from one dialect to another, are another helpful option. Ashton-Tate's \$49.95 Step Forward, for example, converts code from competing products into dBASE IV syntax.

In the future, data base vendors and server companies offer the promise of SQL access to data bases on multiple platforms. As these solutions become more clearly articulated, business buyers will have a better shot at developing sensible strategies for managing precious data.

The new policy is as follows: Computers returned within 30 days are fully refundable (no restocking fee); so is any unopened hardware and software. A 15 percent restocking fee is charged on opened hardware and software (the seal on the software disk package must be intact).

Refunds don't include shipping costs, and consumers must obtain a return authorization number before returning a product.







Automate infrequent commands, check for existing files and directories, make temporary additions to PATH, access multiple LAN printers from MultiMate, archive deleted dBASE records, and improve WHEREIS.

4, 3, 2, 1...Backup!

Since I use my computer infrequently, I figured I might forget to perform regular backups. So I added commands to AUTO-EXEC.BAT that back up the PC's hard disk automatically every fifth time it boots [see LISTING 1].

You initially create a zerolength file named COUNT5. When you reboot the system (or turn it on), COUNT5 is renamed COUNT4, and AUTOEXEC.BAT ends; the next time you restart the PC, COUNT4 is renamed COUNT3, and so on. When you boot the system and COUNT1 exists, the backup begins, and you're prompted to insert the first backup disk in drive A:. When the backup is done, the next command resets the count by renaming COUNT1 COUNT5.

Before running this AUTOEX-EC.BAT file, log on to your system's boot drive and create a zero-length file named COUNT5 in the root directory by entering TYPE COUNT5 \ COUNT5. Ignore the 'File not found' error message.

Editor's note: You can change the BACKUP command to any other command you want to execute every fifth time you boot. You can also change the frequency. To use an 8-step countdown, for example, add appropriate IF statements (use the others as guides), and change COUNT5 in the last command to COUNT8.

C Directory/File Detector

There's no easy way for DOS commands—or batch files—to determine if a certain directory already exists. So I wrote CHECKFOR.C [LISTING 2], which checks for the existence of the directory or file name you specify. CHECKFOR returns an errorlevel of 0 if the specified name is not an existing file or directory, 1 if it's a directory, 2 if it's a file, and 3 for syntax errors. Now vou can use IF ERRORLEVEL and IF NOT ERRORLEVEL in your batch files to branch to appropriate routines.

Beating Out New Paths

When I try out new software, I often need to add directories temporarily to my PATH environment variable. To simplify matters, I wrote AP.BAT [LISTING 4], which lets you add directories such as C:\MYWORK to the current PATH by typing AP C:\MYWORK. You can also add two or more directories by separating them with semicolons. For example, you could add

C:\WORD and C:\123 into
PATH by typing AP C:\WORD;
C:\123. To reset PATH to its
previous state, type AP- and
press <Enter>; type AP- to
display brief instructions.

Multiple Printers for MultiMate LANs

MultiMate LAN doesn't allow access to more than one printer on a Novell network. When the (N)etwork Printer Type is called, documents are sent to network printer 0 regardless of the device number. MultiMate's technical support personnel agreed this was a problem but could offer no solutions.

By experimenting, I have found I can use Novell's CAP-TURE command to redirect output intended for my local LPT2 and LPT3 to network printers 1 and 2. I just issue the following two commands before entering MultiMate:

CAPTURE P=1 L=2 NB TI=2 CAPTURE P=2 L=3 NB TI=2

The P = parameter selects the desired network printer, L = (continues)

specifies the local port that will have its output redirected, NB means no banner page, and TI = sets the number of seconds that the network should wait before issuing a printer time-out.

Network printer 0 can still be accessed in the normal fashion. To select network printer 1 or 2, open the Document Print Options screen, enter the appropriate Printer Action Table (PAT)

file name for the network printer you want to use, choose (P)arallel Printer Type instead of (N)etwork, and enter 002 (for LPT2) or 003 (for LPT3) in the Device Number field. To print to a locally connected LPT1 printer, use the (P)arallel Printer Type and Device Number 001 (assuming, of course, that a CAPTURE command has not redirected your local LPT1 output to a net-

work printer).

CD ROMs for Developers

If you purchased Microsaft's Programmer's Library 1.0 CD ROM, you should have received your free 1.1 upgrade by naw. The new CD ROM is stuffed to the gills with facts about OS/2, MS-DOS, Windows, networking, and PC hardware. Included also is a three-user version of Opti-Net networking software, making this the ideal on-line library for small pragramming teams (you can add more users at \$65 a pop).

Pragrammer's Library is by far the most impressive PC technical reference ever assembled. Sharing one CD ROM disk is the complete text of the MS-DOS Encyclopedia along with programming references for C, Macro Assembler, BA-SIC, Pascal, and FORTRAN. The disk stores the contents of several books, including Peter Norton's Programmer's Guide to the IBM PC and PS/2, Microsoft QuickC Programming, and Ad-

vanced OS/2 Programming, plus volumes 1 through 4 of the Microsoft Systems Journal. There's also 15MB of sample code ready for cutting and pasting into your own programs. The list goes on ond on.

Best of all is the superb browse program. After searching for keywords, I just click a reference line to view the full text and then click special charocters to scan cross-references and study sample code. The browser is so engaging, I often have to force myself to stop reading and get back to work.

Unfortunately, anly a few other CD ROM publishers cater to developers.

One good CD ROM source is the Bureau of Electronic Publishing. Another is Alde International Publishing, which praduces several titles including the Ada ROM and the 20MB C CD-ROM of public domain C programs—a real find

far C source-code collectors. Some of the C programs date back to CP/M days, but I was able to compile much of the code with QuickC and Turba C.

I wish one of these companies would consider publishing the remarkable Moby Words on a CD ROM. This tendisk set from Illumind compresses over 500,000 words and phrases plus such extras as 21,400 common names and a file of 9000 star positions. Despite the 7MB of disk space required to hold the uncompressed files, Moby Words is a great data source for sort and index benchmarks. And now that I've got the words at hand, I can get to work on that super spelling checker I've always wanted to write.



Improving WHEREIS

Jeff Richards's WHEREIS.BAT ["Seek and DOS Shall Find," Star-Dot-Star, PCW, July 1989] works well, but for DOS 3.3 users, there's an easier file search technique that supports wild cards and works with uppercase and lowercase file names:

echo off echo Searching for %1... attrib %1 /s | more nause







NETWORK Q&A

Tips and strategies for departmental networking

Downloading fonts across the LAN with WordPerfect, speeding up your server with extra memory, getting around workstation RAM limitations, installing remote printers on a server-based LAN, and choosing the right disk-caching system for your net.

David Ferris

Q. We have a seven-node Novell NetWare LAN. Can we use the single-user version of WordPerfect 5.0 to download soft fonts to our network LaserJet?

Kevin Shannon Huntsville, Alabama

A. You're in luck—WordPerfect 5.0 is fairly well behaved on a LAN. To redirect output from your printer port to the network spooler, you'll need to issue a

NetWare Capture command from the command line (or a batch file) before loading WordPerfect.

Once you have redirected the printer output, you can employ the same *WordPerfect* commands you'd use to download fonts to a local LaserJet. Keep fonts to a minimum so you don't use printer memory. Mark seldom-used fonts with a plus sign so they'll be cleared from memory after printing.

Q. We are running NetWare 286 on a first generation (16-MHz) Compaq 386 server. How can we make workstation applications run faster? Specifically, how critical is it to have a lot of memory and an 80387 math coprocessor in the server?

T. J. Miyoshi Denver, Colorado

A. Speeding up network performance is complicated. While you can't do anything to your server to affect how fast applications run on your workstations, you can definitely speed up server disk I/O and network traffic.

It is important to have plenty of memory in your server; *Net-Ware* uses it to set up disk buffers, which can speed up reads and writes on the server disk significantly. Three to four megabytes of server RAM should be sufficient for a 300MB hard disk. If you have a gigantic hard disk, you might need as much as 8MB.

Adding an 80387 will not improve performance; today's net-

work operating systems do not use floating-point arithmetic. In the future, as server-based applications like SQL data bases become more common, floating-point arithmetic will probably play a larger part, but until then you can forget about installing this chip in your servers.

One excellent and relatively inexpensive way to speed up LAN performance (regardless of topology) is to install two network boards in your server. You don't need complicated bridging hardware or software; simply connect the boards in series using your standard network cabling. When the server is heavily loaded, this can cut the time it takes to service a disk request from a workstation by 30 to 40 percent.

Q. I'm running NetWare on an AT-compatible file server with 1MB of memory and 2MB of expanded memory, and I have set up my CONFIG.SYS to run Windows' disk-caching program, SmartDrive. I want to run PageMaker 3.0, which has Windows built in. But when I try to load it, a message comes up saying there isn't enough memory. What should I do?

Frank Schmidt Frankfort, Kentucky

A. You're running into a classic case of RAM cram. Typically, with DOS, *NetWare*, NETBIOS, assorted device drivers, and a *(continues)*



LANSpace puts Novell's NetWare shell into extended memory and allows you to swap NETBIOS in and out as needed.

TSR loaded, you can end up with only 520K of usable workstation memory. PageMaker needs a minimum of 550K.

Until network software takes better advantage of operating systems like OS/2 that can access more than 640K of RAM. there are only two solutions to your problem. The simplest is to log off the network and reboot (using a different set of AUTO-EXEC.BAT and CONFIG.SYS files that load a minimum of RAM-hungry TSRs) before running PageMaker. You'll be disconnected from the network printer, so you'll need to connect a printer to your PC. After your PageMaker session is finished, you can reboot with your normal AUTOEXEC. BAT and CONFIG.SYS.

Another choice is to try an excellent new utility called LAN-Space that provides two memory-saving options: It moves the NetWare shell into extended

memory, and it lets you load and unload NETBIOS without rebooting. This can give you up to 56K of additional RAM.

Q. We run Net Ware on a thinwire Ethernet LAN with a centrally located file server. Users in remote sections of the building can access the LAN via a repeater, but they have to walk a long way to get printouts from the network printer, which is attached to the server. Is there any way to provide a remote printer for them that will attach directly to the network cable without a PC?

A. If you are running NetWare 2.15, which supports AppleTalk, you can connect an Apple Laser-Writer directly to your network (continues)

via a LocalTalk cable; NetWare can then send output to the LaserWriter.

Otherwise, your best bet is to turn an inexpensive PC into a remote print server via products such as PS-Print and LANSpool (see Network Q&A, PCW, October 1989). Take your oldest, slowest PC, place it close to your remote users, install a network board, and plug the PC into the network. Now you can simply connect a printer to the new server and run PS-Print or LANSpool. Your remoter users will need to run the TSR component of these programs on their workstations, but their printing problems will be solved.

Q. I have read that Novell Net-Ware is "hardware independent." How does this statement apply to disk caching? In particular, if a system has an Intel 82385 cache controller, will it be used by NetWare? Is there any particular cache system (hardware or software) that performs particularly well with NetWare? Jack Goodell

Talent, Oregon

A. You are referring to two different types of caching: memory caching and disk caching. Both stash data, but otherwise they serve different purposes.

A memory cache is a special section of high-speed memory that sits between the CPU and the system RAM. The CPU can access instructions and data in the cache much faster than from regular RAM. The Intel 82385 cache controller sets up and manages this memory cache; NetWare doesn't know anything

about it and doesn't need to. In this sense, it is "independent" of the 82385 cache controller.

Disk caching is another story. The disk cache sits between the hard disk and system memory. The CPU can access data in the cache much faster than it can read it from disk. Disk-caching software tries to anticipate what disk-based information will be needed next and place it in RAM before the CPU needs it.

Disk caching is especially important on a network, where multiple users make simultaneous disk requests. NetWare sets up its own disk cache; the more memory your server has, the more NetWare devotes to disk caching. For instance, although 3MB or 4MB of RAM is recommended for a NetWare server. NetWare code requires only (continues)

about 500K of that; the rest is used for disk caching.

A number of third-party disk subsystems employ their own caching, so you may end up running several disk-caching schemes on top of one another. Since Novell goes to great lengths to "train" disk manufacturers about how its caching works, conflicts are rare—and in this sense, NetWare's disk caching is hardware independent. Nonetheless, make sure any disk subsystem you buy is Novell "certified," or at least designed to work with NetWare.

Law of the Jungle?





Software publishing pachyderms should pay less attention to the law of the jungle and more to life in the jungle—or the way it could be if the biggest would leave a little something in the watering hole for their fellow inhabitants.

Consider what high school biology taught us about symbiotic relationships between animals. For example, look at the yellow-billed oxpecker, a diminutive hitchhiker that keeps ticks and other nasty insects off the backs of rhinoceroses, elephants, and hippopotamuses.

There once was room on Ashton-Tate's broad back for such simpatico passengers as Fox & Geller. The late George Tate knew these small fix-it companies could make ticks more bearable and increase customer devotion to his data base language. When Jeff Fox and Jake Geller cobbled together *Quickreport*, dBASE reports improved. When programmers needed a tool to make sense of their swelling applications, Wallsoft gave them dFlow.

Everyone was fruitful and multiplied.

Last year, I remarked to the NY Metro Clipper User Group how helpful mouse support would be for navigating a data base with a lot of fields-think how many taps of the <Enter> key we'd eliminate if we could move the mouse cursor past 30 to 40 fields and click on the one we wanted. A few months later, one group member gave me a shrink-wrapped box containing FUNCky, which among its 500 or so features included mouse support for Nantucket's dBASEderived compiler Clipper. Dirk Lesko's package is helping me make my corporate clients much happier.

This is one reason dBASE language developers like myself have become so devoted to Nantucket's compiler. Whenever I need a feature that dBASE or Clipper doesn't provide, I simply consult the PC publications or my user group colleagues for a lead on products. We Clipperites can always find a nifty add-on from some small entrepreneur. In this environment, users and developers alike have thrived.

But into this cozy habitat, Nantucket has chosen to introduce *Clipper Tools One*, a product of debatable merit that directly challenges the company's add-on industry. This could be a case of poisoning the well—if Nantucket kills off a thriving market of add-on tools, it may also stunt its own growth. And what benefits does Ashton-Tate's dBASE File Recovery provide that Paul Heiser's dSalvage Professional doesn't—other than a brand name and a marketing budget that lets the rhino roll over the smaller company?

Will the big boys, already hard-pressed to keep their flag-ships afloat, provide the same quality and support as their smaller but more focused counterparts? Or will quick "revenue enhancers" lead to consumer dissatisfaction, ultimately harming the behemoths' own balance sheets?

Software publishers don't owe add-on vendors a free ride, but are the yellow-billed oxpeckers of the data base market really so threatening? The thick-skinned rhinos of the African continent may lack grace and beauty, but they know better than to roll over on the little creatures that make their lives more bearable.


