Frankly, we're not used to seeing Assistant Editor Susan Lusty and Editorial Assistant Cathy Smith looking like this. Sure, the smiles are familiar. The energy and enthusiasm are no surprise. But where are the boxes? Where are the packing slips? And why aren't they asking questions?

By their own count, our two product specialists work the phones for a combined total of better than 48 hours every week. That's what it takes to keep up with *PC World*'s voracious appetite for new hardware and software. For a typical issue, Lusty and Smith make dozens of calls—researching a new product category; ordering review units and getting them safely into reviewers' hands; checking prices, specs, addresses, and phone numbers. Lusty also does the footwork for our *Consumer Watch* investigations.

"The hardest part of the job," says Lusty, "is just getting people on the phone—and voice mail makes it nearly impossible. You can trade messages eight or nine times without ever talking to a human. These days, people are shocked when they don't get my voice mail."

This month, we asked the pair to run up an extralarge long-distance bill, putting together our annual list of user groups from all over North America. And true to form, they turned up an impressive and eclectic collection, ranging from Alaska's Polar PC User Group to Florida's Hog Town Hackers. (The finished product appears in this month's expanded *Consumer Watch*.) You'll find the vital statistics for mega-groups like the Boston Computer Society side by side with those of Ohio's some-

what smaller Lake Ashtabula IBM PC Users Group. The odds are good there's a helpful organization right in your backyard.

Assembling and fact-checking the list was an unusual challenge, one that called for some long hours, Lusty reports. "Virtually all of these groups are volunteer organizations," she says. "We couldn't call the presidents at their day jobs, so we had to make most of our calls at night. Fortunately for us, most user group leaders are accustomed to getting after-hours calls."

Smith was most impressed by the boundless stores of energy common to user group leaders. "These people are *enthusiasts!* Practically every one had a story to tell, and they were all genuinely convinced their group was the best."

Would either staffer care to head up their own society? No, thanks, says Lusty. "The president of a PC user group has to deal with finances, field technical questions, arrange meetings, and coordinate guest speakers. That's just too much work for a volunteer."

Judging by this issue, no one can accuse our crack product team of being allergic to work. There's our largest-ever computer roundup ("14 SX Systems: Big Deals in Small Boxes") plus a full-sized Buyers' Guide to affordable tape backup drives. We look at four low-cost desktop publishing options. Our previews focus on two new and very different PCs: IBM's family-oriented PS/1 and Compaq's strictly business 20-MHz SX system. And as usual, *Product Outlook* turns the spotlight on nearly two dozen fresh hardware and software introductions.






INTEL RAKES IN CACHE

Chip Will Cut System Costs but Not Performance

Intel Corporation has introduced a 16K cache subsystem for 386s, claimed to equal the performance of system vendors' proprietary 128K cache assemblies—but at one-third the size and



70 percent of the cost. The single-chip 82395 lowers costs mainly by incorporating fewer expensive static RAM (SRAM) chips. It will add \$360 to \$440 to the average system price of 25-MHz and 33-MHz 386 machines, compared with \$500 to \$600 for a proprietary 128K solution.

The successor to Intel's 82385 cache controller, the 82395 is derived from the 486 processor's cache architecture and is especially equipped to handle large programs and multitasking applications. It

speeds reads from main memory by keeping four sets of the most commonly used data (even from multiple applications) and accelerates CPU writes to memory by exploiting four buffers. The controller has two separate buses, which enables an 82395-equipped system to read or write from cache memory to main memory (or vice versa) while the CPU simultaneously executes instructions held in the cache.

"The architecture is clearly superior to what is out there now," says Instat market researcher Mike Fiebus. "Call it the first of the second-generation cache controllers." Instat calculates that more than 60 percent of all 386 and 486 machines ship with an external cache and that that figure should grow to 95 percent by 1993. Intel's 82385 cache controller enjoys the lion's share of today's market—about 50 percent, compared with 5 percent for other third-party suppliers and 45 percent for system vendors who implement their own solutions.

Compaq and IBM already employ Intel's 82385, and Fiebus expects that many vendors like ALR that have been marketing proprietary caches will switch to third-party controllers. But Dataquest's Bart Ladd adds that the 82395 will pose a credibility problem for those vendors, which have advertised for years that a larger cache boosts performance. Systems equipped with the 82395 should debut this fall, says Intel marketing manager Sheila Cardno.

NOVELL SHIPS NETWARE 386

3.1

Update Lacks Features Promised a Year Ago



NetWare 386 customers can look forward to faster network

performance and server enhancements in version 3.1, due in July, but will have to wait for Novell or third parties to provide many crucial features promised when version 3.0 was introduced in May 1989.

Most noteworthy by its absence in 3.1 is support for mixing Macintosh and UNIX workstations on the DOSbased network. Novell laid the groundwork for itself or third parties to provide that support through NetWare Loadable Modules. But what was promised as standard in 3.1 will now cost users thousands of dollars extra. Also missing are the ability to "mirror" servers for fault tolerance and certain network management and message-handling services. "All NetWare 386 has been so far is an expensive file and print server," says Jamie Lewis, executive vice president and editor of the Clarke Burton Report.

On the upside, Novell says that disk access is 25 to 30 percent faster under 3.1 and server volume preparation three times quicker. Users can put still more storage and mirrored drives in a server under 3.1, and support extends to many more network adapters.

Although IDC research indicates NetWare 286 licenses still outsell those for NetWare 386 almost three to one, analyst Lee Doyle says NetWare 386 will steadily succeed 286-based versions.

COMPAQ JUMPS TO 20-MHZ SX

Laptop Offers Desktop Speed and Storage



Other vendors were quicker off the mark with no-com-

promise 386SX-based portables, but Compaq aims to leapfrog them by offering a faster SX machine with the largest, fastest hard disk found in a battery-powered laptop.

The SLT 386s/20 has the same form factor, backlit VGA screen, 14-pound weight, and 3 hours of battery operation as Compaq's office-away-fromthe-office, the SLT/286. But Compaq made the 386s/20 nearly twice as fast as the 12-

MHz SLT/286 and up to half again as fast as competitors' 16-MHz SX laptops by including the 20-MHz 386SX CPU and innovative cached-memory architecture of its new Deskpro 386s/20. The 386s/20 can be configured with a 19ms 120MB hard drive for \$7499.

With the SLT 386s/20, Compaq retakes the technological lead (at least temporarily) in the small but fastgrowing market for full-featured battery-powered SX laptops, now contested by Toshiba, NEC, and others. International Data Corporation

(IDC) projects that shipments of these machines will almost quadruple from 20,000 in 1989 to 75,000 this year. But these numbers understate the potential, analysts say. This will become the middle of the portables market as prices fall and shoppers move up from 286-based equivalents.

Compaq's SLT/286 already dominates sales of battery-powered 286-based portables, which IDC says will enjoy a healthy 40 percent rise to 335,000 units this year. The SLT/286 accounted for 60 percent of such PCs sold through U.S. computer dealers during April, says JoeAnn Stahel, president of StoreBoard/Computer Intelligence in Dallas.

POSTSCRIPT GETS A FACE-LIFT

A Speed Boost and New Features Answer Competitors



Hoping to bounce back from a stock market buffet-

ing and decreasing revenues, Adobe Systems has announced PostScript Level 2, the first major upgrade to its page description language since it was introduced more than five years ago. Long in the works, Level 2's unveiling comes at a time when PostScript faces mounting competition from the Apple/Micrósoft TrueImage alternative and from Hewlett-Packard's PCL5, which has many Post-Script-like features at a considerably lower cost.

"Adobe is under a lot of pressure" because its infrequent enhancements have let others take aim at PostScript, says Dataquest analyst Bob Fennell. "With Level 2,

LOTUS ACQUIRES NEW PARTNERS

Smaller Users Targeted After Failed Mega-Merger



Although its merger with network leader Novell fell apart

at the altar, Lotus Development is going ahead with less dramatic business deals, several designed to reach out to individuals and small businesses rather than its usual corporate clients, says Lotus chairman Jim Manzi.

Lotus has bought Alpha Software's AlphaWorks, an entry-level integrated package with more than 300,000 copies installed. The only immediate change to the \$149 program will be a new name, LotusWorks. But that should aid its struggle against Microsoft Works and Software Publishing's First Choice. Lotus's backing already has helped land bundling deals—notably one with home market leader Packard Bell. The package will provide individuals with a cheap entry point to the Lotus product line.

Lotus is arming 1-2-3 3.1 against Microsoft's Excel by building in PC Publishing's *Impress* spreadsheet publisher. It's also enhancing the

small business appeal of 1-2-3 2.2 by collaborating with Great American Software on the \$795 Financial Manager. The bundle includes Great American's One Write Plus accounting package, 1-2-3 2.2 (with several predefined worksheets), and a custom link between them. Finally, Lotus launched a venture with IBM and the Association of Small Business Development Centers to advise small-business owners on ways to exploit information technology.

Manzi's bold move to forge a software superpower rivaling Microsoft failed at the eleventh hour when Novell chairman Ray Noorda demanded equal representation on the new board rather than the Lotus majority he had accepted. Analysts say the demand grew out of Novell's dissatisfaction with its share of the \$1.5 billion stock swap. The failed merger presents no financial problems for Lotus, says David Marshak of Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group, but it does sideline Manzi's plans to counter Microsoft's growing dominance.

though, it's a moving target."

Level 2 includes new features that respond to the most common criticism: slow performance. Adobe addresses the speed issue through a faster interpreter, more efficient memory use, and data compression schemes that accelerate transmissions between PC and printer. Adobe declines to quote numbers, but observers suggest that Level 2 could be 3 to 12 times faster, depending on the type of output.

Level 2 introduces deviceindependent color, so users can get exact color matches—even between different types of PostScript output devices. Adobe will help developers with their least-favorite task by writing faster PostScript drivers for *Windows 3.0*, OS/2, and the Macintosh as well as a "generic" DOS driver that can be enhanced by third parties.

The first Level 2 printers won't hit the streets until first quarter 1991, according to Adobe. The company claims applications written for today's printers will also work with Level 2 printers. In other product moves, Adobe will ship a long-awaited \$495 Post-Script Cartridge for HP's LaserJet Series II in August. The following month, the \$99 Adobe Type Manager for Windows will provide Windows 3.0 users with matching PostScript screen and printer fonts for on-the-fly font scaling from within applications.

DISPLAYWRITE TURNS XYWRITE

IBM Licenses XyQuest's Word Processor



Some 600,000 customers of IBM's DisplayWrite will

be able to use their favorite word processor under *Windows* and OS/2 Presentation Manager sooner rather than later. But the upgrade path will lead them into *XyWrite*, not IBM, technology.


To accelerate its move into the nascent graphical word processor market, IBM has tapped tiny XyQuest to provide Windows and PM versions of DisplayWrite. The graphical products will be backwardly compatible with current DisplayWrite versions, says Fernand Sarrat, head of IBM's Desktop Software Group, who declined to give a delivery date.

Known for flexibility and speed, *XyWrite* has an installed base of over 60,000 and an equal number of installations under other labels. Sarrat won't say if *XyWrite* eventually will replace the charac-

ter-based *DisplayWrite*. But IBM plans to up its R&D investment in the DOS version, first introduced in 1984 and frequently under fire for its backwardness.

In addition to the graphical interface and multitasking capabilities, the new releases of *DisplayWrite* will offer advanced page layout and formatting, features in which Xy-Quest has been an innovator.

Neither party will say whether this deal precludes XyQuest from introducing its own Windows and PM word processors. XyQuest says that it will continue to market its character-based XyWrite 3+ through its 300 authorized resellers, with version 4.0 due in the fourth quarter. "This is a very big deal in terms of the overall health of the company," says Jeffrey Clark, senior marketing specialist. As Clark points out, despite good reviews, XyQuest has trouble matching its larger competitors' marketing dollars.



f you've been following the PC platform wars for the last few years, then you may have started to believe we've finally achieved peace in our time. 386SX PCs with *Windows 3.0* are in, OS/2 is out, and 8088- and 286-based PCs are quickly fading into history. Other choices, like UNIX, haven't made it past the wishful-thinking phase. The PC world is settling in for a long stretch where *Windows*—the new DOS—will smoothly tap the power of the systems most people are buying today.

But not so fast! A whole new generation of PC hardware and software is springing up, filling the gaps *Windows* leaves in price, size, and ease of use. This wave of products, backed by some of the biggest guns in the industry, is proof that *Windows*-based 386s aren't likely to conquer either the home or the executive suite soon. And that's encouraging news for the innovators and PC powerhouses who are building better mousetraps to capture these important audiences.

IBM: Worried About Ease of Use

When word first leaked that IBM was preparing to take another stab at the

home market (seven years after the infamous PCjr debacle), Big Blue watchers thought the company would launch something akin to a clone of Commodore's Amiga: a 386SX machine running *Windows* and capable of handling multimedia software with the help of add-on hardware. Instead, everybody got a surprise in the form of the PS/1 (see the preview in this issue).

Rather than worry about creating a super educational and game environment to hook the Nintendo generation, IBM went straight to the heart of a different problem: how to make an inexpensive work-at-home PC that could double as an easy and fun information resource for the whole family. The PS/1 isn't a high-powered 386 but rather a simple, basic 286 with a built-in interface that sports large icons and list boxes like those found on an electronic marquee at a shopping mall. IBM thought *Windows* would be too hard for

the average home-office user to master, so it borrowed the PS/1's interface from its *Prodigy* information service and built some special PS/1-only services into *Prodigy*. The result is a tight marriage of home-office computing with telecommunications and on-line infor-


mation—a breakthrough in ease of use by any standard.

But rumbling beneath the PS/1's slick exterior is a confusing clash of interface styles among the other programs that makes the computer's ease of use more promise than reality. It also leaves the door wide open for IBM's nemesis in the home market: Tandy. Tandy has quietly built a reputation for ease of use that rests on its DeskMate interface and the programs that run in that environment. Tandy's not likely to surrender that reputation to IBM simply on the strength of the PS/1. Instead, we'll probably see new Tandy computers with DeskMate software that can hide even basic operations—like opening and saving files from the user.

The Pen: Mightier Than the Mouse

Big Blue's going to battle with Tandy in another important arena where Windows doesn't seem to fit: notebook-sized PCs that accept handwritten input rather than keystrokes or mouse actions (see Industry Outlook in this issue). Here again Tandy leads the way into a new market by emphasizing ease of use rather than brute force. Tandy's Grid division sells the GridPad, a pen-based PC that's geared toward the millions of factory and service workers who spend a big chunk of each day filling out forms. GridPad software makes using a computer just about as easy as using a piece (continues)

of paper. But since information is captured electronically rather than on paper, it can get to managers more quickly, and companies can provide a higher level of customer service.

Working with the start-up Go Corporation, IBM is reportedly ready to stand this strategy on its head with a notebook PC designed for managers who need information at their fingertips but wouldn't be caught dead lugging a laptop into a meeting. Like most developments associated with IBM, it's wrapped in a heavy shroud of secrecy. But insiders who've seen the machine say its software easily beats Windows in ease of use. And it's reportedly a lightweight, compact device designed to be carried around all day, leaving little room for the large hard disk and gobs of memory that Windows currently requires.


You can tell a hot idea by the company it keeps. Software leaders who have jumped into the pen-based PC game include Vern Rayburn, veteran of Microsoft and Symantec; Dan Bricklin and Robert Frankston, codevelopers of VisiCalc, the first PC spreadsheet; Jerry Kaplan, codeveloper of Lotus's Agenda; and Robert Carr, father of Ashton-Tate's Framework.

Waiting for Windows

There's no doubt that 386 technology will soon find its way into home PCs and executive notebooks, and Microsoft promises that Windows will eventually fill the software gap in both markets. But that day will arrive only when Windows itself undergoes a transformation, becoming simpler in concept, better capable of hiding its DOS roots from the average user, and more suited to different kinds of input devices. There's room for improvement everywhere especially in a brand-new standard.



Nix on UNIX

In response to Richard Shallberg's May letter and the same month's Industry Outlook piece "UNIX on the Desktop?" I would say that neither UNIX/Xenix nor OS/2 is the answer for multiusers or multitasking on the PC. UNIX is difficult, lacks DOS's advanced software, and requires 1MB or more of RAM just for itself. OS/2 is still more fantasy than fact and has a large RAM overhead. As a systems project manager, I administer a 19-user system. I chose CCI's Concurrent DOS 386 3.02. With this operating system, our users run NetWare, compiled Clipper applications, Word 5.0, 1-2-3, dBASE III Plus, Quick-BASIC 4.0, and a host of other DOS applications. The operating system requires only 300K to 350K of RAM, permits each terminal to run up to four tasks, and provides every other benefit of UNIX without the difficult interface.

Still Out of Memory

I found your April review of seven spreadsheet programs very useful. The presentation is concise, in-depth, and easy to grasp. But I still have questions about DOS limitations. As a network (continues) administrator, I have users who work in 1-2-3 releases 2.01, 2.2, and 3 with worksheets as large as 800K. These users have 4MB of expanded RAM (allocated as extended RAM for release 3 when necessary). They also have Novell Ethernet drivers loaded into conventional memory. Because 1-2-3 reserves 4 bytes in conventional memory as a pointer to each cell in a worksheet, a large worksheet soon pushes memory to the max. What's the use of having expanded and/or extended RAM if the limits lie in conventional memory? And how can we best handle worksheets that are up to 1MB or more?

Carleen D. Mejza New York, New York There should be no problem in using 1MB and greater worksheets with 1-2-3 3 if you have extended memory. However, when 1-2-3 2.1 or 2.2 puts cell data in expanded memory, it stores a pointer to that data in conventional memory. The general rule is that the more room you have in conventional memory, the more access you have to expanded RAM. Your best bet for working with really large worksheets if all you have is conventional and expanded RAM is to break up your worksheets and use 1-2-3 2.2's and 3's cell-linking capabilities or 2.01's File Combine (/FC) command to pull in totals. —Karl Koessel, technical editor



I was glad to see your How To column on spreadsheets in May, but I have to say that using Allways is not without its frustrations. When I attach Allways to a spreadsheet, I have to be sure that I am finished entering and manipulating data in 1-2-3. If I switch from Allways back to 1-2-3 and move something, and then find that the change is wrong, I cannot use Undo; I get an error message: 'Undo is blocked by add-in'. For this reason, I also have to be careful to detach Allways when I retrieve a worksheet or create a new one. It's too bad Lotus couldn't do something about this.

The Wrong IDEa

In May's Help Screen, you say that if an IDE drive is cabled directly into a computer's expansion bus, a slot is wasted, and that IDE drives are used only in PS/2s and other systems providing an IDE connector on the motherboard. Actually, since the components required for the IDE interface take up so little space, it is possible to put the IDE interface, floppy controller, serial port and optional second serial port, printer port, game port, and bus mouse port all on one half-length AT card. 

Phoenix Technologies' Phoenix Page PostScript interpreter is found in Pacific Data Products' PacificPage cartridge for the LaserJet Series II—one of the PostScript "clones" you reviewed in your May article "PostScript the Hard Way." We felt the image shown on page 118 of the article cast the cartridge in an unjust light. I've enclosed a listing of a file that produces a similar, PostScriptgenerated image, along with output from both the Apple LaserWriter IINTX and the PacificPage cartridge. The output shows just how compatible with the Adobe standard the Pacific-Page cartridge is.

We retested the PacificPage using our original test file and found that the cartridge printed the curve without the flaws shown in May. We apologize for the error. The test page, however, still contained minor imperfections not present in the LaserWriter-generated page, and the cartridge still had difficulty producing smooth curves in tests with common graphics applications. The PacificPage—like virtually every software emulator or PostScript interpreter, Adobe licensed or not—is unable to correctly interpret all Post-Script code. —Ed.

Flip-Flop WordStar Menus

WordStar 5.0's pulldown menus provide a convenient way to learn the program, but the classic WordStar menus are faster once you master them. Although switching from classic to pulldown menus is an easily remembered 4-key-stroke process—<Ctrl>-JJ4—switching in the opposite direction is an awkward 6-keystroke affair. Here's a macro that automates the change from pulldown to classic menus.

Press < Esc>? to display the Shorthand menu. Assign the macro to the H key by pressing H, and type a brief description of the macro at the prompt. Press < Enter> to begin recording the macro keystrokes. Press <Ctrl>-P <Alt>-O to pull down the Other menu. Next, press <Ctrl>-P<Ctrl>-X three times to move the cursor down to the help level prompt, press <Ctrl>-P <Ctrl>-M, and hit 3. Finally, press < Enter > < Ctrl > -U to exit the Shorthand menu, and press Y to save the macro. Now, whenever you want to switch from classic to pulldown menus, just press < Esc> H.







A. By default, <Print Screen> supports 80-column, 25-line text-mode screens only. Pressing it causes code stored in your system's ROM BIOS to send *character* codes to the printer. Running GRAPHICS.COM supplants that BIOS routine with one that gener-

ates Epson-compatible graphics codes.

LaserJets are not compatible with either the BIOS or GRAPHICS.COM routine. What you need is a replacement for GRAPHICS.COM that speaks Laser-Jet. Using its default character set, the LaserJet prints letters, numbers, punc-

tuation, and other standard characters of text-mode screens just fine; but it produces foreign and italic characters instead of the PC's line-draw and other special symbols. And because the LaserJet does not understand Epson com-(continues)

mands, GRAPHICS.COM can't tell it how to print a graphics screen. Besides, the high-resolution images of VGA and full-page monitors beg for sophisticated screen printing capabilities not available from GRAPHICS.COM. Furthermore, the abundant colors in today's screens demand that you be able to assign different black-and-white print patterns to various screen colors so you can, for example, read a printout of "red" text on a "yellow" background.

All the products listed in TABLE 1 except for the Windows-only Tiffany Plus will dump DOS text and graphics screens to the LaserJet or to any of more than a hundred other printers. All but Pizazz will print Windows screens (though some are less capable than others). Only HotShot handles OS/2 Presentation Manager screens. HotShot is also the only package here that includes a data base for tracking images.

All the programs let you rotate, resize, and position the image on the page. Most enable you to modify the gray scaling, crop the image, and print from DOS (enabling batch print jobs). Pizazz and Pizazz Plus even smooth the rough edges of enlarged printouts. As the table shows, many can save screen images in various file formats for use with graphics and desktop publishing software. Most of these packages support CGA through VGA (including Hercules) and some AT&T 6300 graphics adapters.

Batch-file menus made with Norton Utilities' Batch Enhancer (BE) can be very slow if there are many BE commands, because BE.EXE must be read from disk for each one. To speed up the process by loading BE.EXE only once per screen, place the Window, Rowcol, and other BE commands for a given screen without the be before each one—together in a separate file. Then, in your batch file, use the command be filename to launch the screen.



A. There's a great screen blanker for Windows called Fireworks, which was written by Kim Levitt of Synergistic Enterprises. FIREWORK.EXE and its accompanying dynamic link library file, FIRELIB.EXE, comprise a Windows program that, after a specified interval of time, displays a fireworks simulation. (The current version, 4.3, seems to work fine under Windows 3.0 but produces two error messages warning that you may encounter compatibility problems and should upgrade to a 3.0-aware version.)

Fireworks is a shareware program, and registration is only \$5. It can be found on The Business BBS, an electronic bulletin board service in Los Angeles that believes it has the largest library of Windows programs in the world. Set your (300-bps to 2400-bps) modem to N,8,1, and call 213/477-0408. Synergistic Enterprises also operates a 24-hour BBS from which you can download Fireworks and the company's other Windows shareware programs. The Synergistic BBS supports 300-bps to 2400-bps modems (N,8,1) and can be reached at 213/653-6398.



IBM vendors and causes problems for some disk caching programs. Furthermore, applications that do not use DOS function 67H cannot open more than 20 files per process. Hence, Mr. Reilly strongly recommends that users upgrade to MS-DOS rather than to PC-DOS.

However, users can purchase legal upgrades to MS-DOS only from their system vendors. And in the volatile PC industry, being tied to a vendor means that someday you may find yourself without a place to buy an MS-DOS upgrade. Microsoft is aware of this problem; perhaps one day there will be a solution.

Nixing Num Lock

Q. I've been using IBM and compatible PCs for years. Unlike the PC and the XT, the AT turns Num Lock on when it boots. I prefer to have it off and so would press < Num Lock > every time I started the AT. Nowadays I'm using an IBM PS/2 Model 50 and a 386 clone, both of which come up with NumLock on. Do you know how I can get them to leave Num Lock off?

A. Turning Num Lock on—that is, activating the numeric keypad—at start-up was intended to be a positive feature, since the AT's new 101-key keyboard provided a separate set of cursor keys. However, many users accustomed to the old keyboard found it easier to turn Num Lock back off than to adjust to a new cursor-key layout.

Some systems let you set Num Lock's default status with a setup disk. For those that don't, here's a program, LOCKKEY2.COM, that will turn Num Lock off. If you put LOCKKEY2 in your AUTOEXEC.BAT file, you may never notice that Num Lock is on when your system boots.





of Caps Lock and Scroll Lock. Thus, LOCKKEY2 has six valid parameters: Num Lock: on, Num Lock: off, Caps Lock: on, Caps Lock: off, Scroll Lock: on, and Scroll Lock: off. The command is not case sensitive, and spaces are optional. As a matter of fact, parameters consisting of just the first letter of the Lock key followed by: on or: off (n:off, for example) are acceptable. You can use any combination of parameters, and the status of a key that is not specified is not changed.

You can use DEBUG.COM (from your original DOS disks) to create LOCKKEY2.COM. Because it's so easy to mistype, use an ASCII editor or the text mode of a word processor to record the necessary keystrokes, instead of directly inputting DEBUG commands. When the file is complete and correct, you'll "feed" it to DEBUG.

Type in the seven lines shown in FIG-URE 1A, pressing <Enter> at the end of each line and to create the fourth (blank) line. Be careful not to confuse l's with 1's, or to add or omit any characters or spaces in the last three lines. (continues)

Repeating Text in WordPerfect 5.0

If you want to repeat a block of text several times throughout a WordPerfect document, highlight the desired text by using <Alt>-<F4>; then hit <F10> to save the block and press <Enter> instead of typing a block name. When you want to retrieve the block, press <Shift>-<F10> (Retrieve), then just hit <Enter>. The block remains in memory until you exit WordPerfect.

Notebooks: How Small Is Too Small?

Portables Reach the Limit

Tiny PCs Still Have to Be Usable

way back before the lambada, there was the limbo-another rum-and-cola dance whose enthusiasts asked that musical question, How low can you go?

As notebook PC makers gird themselves for yet another round of products, enthusiasts ask: How low can you go in size? Don't look for "subnotebooks," major suppliers respond.

Since the Osborne 1 first popularized computer schlepping, vendors have been trying to stuff a full-function computer into an ever-smaller boxwithout an AC umbilical cord. For most of the 1980s, the effort was constrained by screen, storage, and battery technology, observes Jim Bartlett, director of strategic marketing for NEC Technologies in Wood Dale, Illinois. Now manufacturers have broken through most of those barriers; portability is being driven by what Bartlett calls "ergonomic minimums."

The minimum footprint is

one that can accommodate a full-sized keyboard and an adequate-looking screen - about 81/2 by 11 inches. The upper limit is roughly 10 by 12 by 2 inches, about half the size of an average briefcase.

NEC defined that footprint in fall 1988 with the 4.4-pound 8086-based backlit UltraLite, but its restriction to RAM card storage was an unacceptable compromise. So was the 2-inch floppy in Zenith's MinisPort, which debuted in June 1989. Four months later, the Compaq LTE and LTE/286 attained the first minimum acceptable functionality, with standard 3½-inch floppy and 20MB hard drives.

Sales figures indicate that users agree with Compaq's logic. The 80C86-based LTE and the 286-based LTE/286 have vastly outsold the Ultra-Lite and MinisPort since their introduction, reports JoeAnn Stahel, president of Store-Board/Computer Intelligence in Dallas.

Notebook shipments will

soar 149 percent to 566,000 during 1991, projects InfoCorp analyst Peter Teige. This category should realize a combined annual growth rate of 61 percent through 1995, he says.

Technology Shifts

Compaq's competitors take comfort in the quick turnover of technology. While Compaq promotes the LTEs as a nocompromise solution, Toshiba feels that the CGA screen and the keyboard are compromises. It has been conducting a hard-hitting advertising campaign that highlights its machines' 25 percent larger, double-scan CGA display and more desktoplike keyboard.

Notebook leaders are about to launch a new generation of products that will make VGA screens and 20MB hard drives de rigueur. Just over the horizon are 386SX notebooks. Altima Systems in Concord, California, touts its Altima NSX as the first "notebook computer combining 80386SX technology, VGA display, and a 20MB hard disk drive." But with a footprint of 11 by 14 by 2 inches, the NSX takes up a bit too much room.


Hitting the Limits

Advanced battery technologies like nickel-hydride eventually will open the notebook to 486 processors and color LCDs, predicts Tom Sherrard, director of PC marketing at Toshiba Information Systems in Irvine, California. For now, power management is the most important delimiter of performance.

Here Poget Computer's Poget PC excels: With 16 power management patents pending, it can be driven for 100 hours on two penlight batteries. Unfortunately, the Houston firm tailored its unit to fit into a suit coat's inside pocket. That requirement dictated the unlit 3-by-7-inch display and a keyboard that is too cramped for even hunt-and-peck typing. "If human beings were about half the size they are, that keyboard might be something they could use," allows Info-Corp's Teige.

But through such experimentation, vendors have found the sweet spot in portability and full functionality-somewhere between the human fingertip and the briefcase. -Mike Hogan

Will a Pen Replace the Keyboard in Your Next PC?

Start-Ups Have High Expectations

N ewcomers and longtime PC players alike are rushing to build next-generation devices that put the power of a PC in your hand—power accessible via a pen or stylus.

Grid Systems of Fremont, California, was first on the scene last September with its 4½-pound GridPad. Relying on a pen alone, unassisted by mouse or keyboard, the \$3000 portable is targeted at mobile workers such as delivery people for whom the clipboard already is the primary means of gathering information.

But work under way at two Silicon Valley start-ups—Go Corporation of Foster City and Momenta of Mountain View—promises to be even more tantalizing. While both companies refuse to discuss their plans, they're expected to provide PC capabilities not just in stylus-based notebooks but across a broad spectrum of electronic devices.

Meeting Specific User Needs

For the time being, Momenta and Go executives will say only that they want to reach far beyond the PC users that the GridPad targets. "Grid's vertical market approach is a tremendous opportunity but potentially too limiting," says John Rizzo, Momenta's marketing vice president. Momenta's systems, he explains, focus on "alternative input strategies," and its efforts aren't necessarily limited to penbased PCs. "We're not build-

ing our product around handwriting recognition," says Rizzo. "That's one element of many."

Of course, neither are Momenta and Go overlooking the so-called clipboard market, which is the most immediate opportunity and the easiest to identify and serve. The advantages of computerizing this market are straightforward: When field personnel enter data directly into a computer, companies eliminate the extra data entry step and the errors associated with it.

Beyond mere data entry, Go and Momenta want to reach an estimated 65 percent of the work force that either can't or won't use a computer just because of its keyboard, as well as executives looking for an electronic datebook and note keeper. The pen's familiar interface makes computer technology that much more accessible for keyboardphobes and executives alike. It also enables them to work in situations where standard laptops aren't appropriate, such as business meetings.

"The challenge for the industry is to pick the right computer for the right task," says Vern Raburn, chairman of Slate Corporation in Scottsdale, Arizona, which is writing software for pen-based systems.

Hardware and Software


Go and Momenta are keeping their planned systems under wraps, but the GridPad offers a glimpse of how the technology will shape up. The sleek system looks like a high-tech Etch A Sketch tablet. To stay small and light, it employs battery-backed RAM cards for storage.

While the GridPad is a DOS machine, Microsoft plans to create an environment for such systems around ROMbased versions of DOS and Windows. Other players envision more ambitious graphical environments that not only make these systems easier to use but reduce memory demands through a tighter coupling with applications. "Our view is broader than hardware," says Dan'l Lewin, Go vice president of sales and marketing. "The value is in the software in the long run."

A Recognition Problem

One of the biggest challenges continues to be handwriting recognition, which Lewin calls "a very slippery slope." Rizzo agrees, noting that Momenta avoids the term handwriting (see Pen-Based, p. 76)




Managers Turn to Grammar, Style Checkers

Better-Writing Software Hits the Best-Seller Lists

Thanks to the PC, the business world today is awash in memos and letters with elegant fonts and stylish layouts. Beneath the medium's glossy overcoat, however, often lurk messages every bit as sloppy as in the era of the typewriter.

That's why PC users are turning in droves to so-called grammar-checking programs to improve or repair their writing. The leading products—Reference Software's Grammatik IV, RightSoft's RightWriter, and Lifetree Software's Correct Grammar—list for just under \$100 each. They serve as reproachful schoolteachers by flagging long sentences, passive-voice construction, clichés, and jargon. They also gently rap your knuckles for straightforward errors of grammar, such as sentence fragments and lack of subject-verb agreement.

Despite almost unanimous scorn from the professional writers who review software, these products sell extremely well. Reference Software in San Francisco claims more than 300,000 users of its

grammar-checking products. *Grammatik IV* has been one of the top ten PC packages for both Softsel/Microamerica and Egghead. Reference's sales have doubled every year for the past three and should hit \$10 million this year.

RightSoft claims 300,000 users for *RightWriter*. Sales

for the Sarasota, Florida, firm have grown from \$1.5 million in 1987 to \$4.1 million last year. Lifetree of San Francisco declines to give out any figures for *Correct Grammar*, which was introduced only last year.

Giving the Write Advice

The growing popularity of grammar checkers stems partly from their improved quality and flexibility. Early versions were stern, uncompromising, and wrong often enough to make them more nuisance than help. The newer releases are smarter. They recognize parts of speech within a sentence and thus know when to employ there instead of their or they're. And users can modify program rules; with legal documents, a lawyer can tell the program to allow lengthy sentences.


As PCs penetrate the managerial ranks, professionals are producing documents on their own—without the once-

common editing services of a literate secretary. Users see the software as one more way to make themselves look good in their organization. "My manager is a very scholarly individual, a real stickler for grammar," explains *Correct Grammar* user Robert Spain, a production supervisor at CAD vendor Evans & Sutherland in Salt Lake City.

Grammar-checking products help users avoid embarrassment. "I had lost the ability to write simply and concisely," admits Robert Collins, chief compliance officer at UNUM Sales in Portland, Maine. Collins must make sure that his firm obeys the complex web of laws regulating the securities business. He estimates that he spends half his time writing, and once won a tongue-in-cheek company award for his prolific output. Grammatik proved a chastening experience: "The first document I put through came out with something like 171 errors."

Many users appreciate the value of strong writing and don't know how to achieve it. "I've been out of school awhile and have lost touch with all those rules," says RightWriter aficionado Jim Klosinski, development secretary at St. Mary's Hospital in Blue Springs, Missouri. Klosinski writes direct-mail pieces to raise funds. "I used to ramble a lot," he says. "RightWriter makes my writing more concise."

Like spelling checkers and thesauri, grammar checkers will inevitably become part of word processing programs. Ashton-Tate is the first major vendor to take this step; users of *MultiMate 4.0* can invoke *Grammatik* without leaving a document. Software Publishing seconded the motion this spring, including *Grammatik* in *Professional Write 2.2*.—*Herb Brody*




ALR Takes the Fast Track

Public Offering Spurs Sales Growth

When a tiny engineering outfit called Advanced Logic Research entered the PC market in 1986, it didn't sneak in with the usual "metoo" clone. It launched itself with a bang by shipping the first desktop built around Intel's 80386 chip.

This brassy, aggressive supplier is still on the leading edge, but it's also garnering laurels for technical prowess—*PC World* applauded the recently released PowerCache 4 as the "first true 486" PC. And now ALR systems can be found in about 1200 U.S. resellers, a number that the supplier hopes to boost to 3000 by year-end. ALR "has done surprisingly well, even shockingly well," says Richard Shaffer, an industry analyst and editor of

Technologic Computer Letter in New York City.

In April, ALR moved from adolescence to adulthood by going public. Cash reserves had been about \$2 million, but the oversubscribed offering raised a respectable \$38 million. At the same time, ALR has steadily gained shelf space in computer stores. Ingram Micro D and Softsel/Microamerica, the two giant distributors, now carry ALR products. In April, Intelligent

Electronics—the largest computer reseller in North America, with 850 stores—signed on as well. This is no fluke, says ALR sales vice president David Kirkey: "We've risen in an industry that's hard, and we haven't lost any money in the process."

In the quarter that ended March 30, ALR reported record revenues of \$44.8 million and a \$3.2 million profit. Staff has risen to roughly 400 employees worldwide. About 40 work at a sales and service subsidiary in Singapore—the home of Wearns Brothers, the holding company that has been ALR's main financial backer.


Innovative Engineering

How did ALR get on this fast track? Primarily by building extremely fast PCs, taking a creative approach to matching very-high-speed cached memory architectures with speedy disks. "Our machines will always be unique," says ALR president and cofounder Eugene Lu. "We don't just make copies, we do first-class engineering.

"We're not IBM or Compaq, but we want to offer a better price," Lu adds. In general, say industry experts, ALR's 386 machines run a wink faster than similar IBM or Compaq models but cost 10 to 13 percent less. "You can't find any other computer that can compete with what ALR can do for its price," declares Bob Rezaian, manager of Socrates Computer Systems in Rockville, Maryland.

ALR's market share remains tiny. The firm sold about 60,000 machines overall in 1989, while Big Blue and Compaq sold 477,000 and 277,000 386 machines respectively, says analyst Bill Lem-

pesis of Dataquest in San Jose. "It's still the IBM and Compaq show in the 386 market," he says. "ALR is certainly vulnerable to any pricing moves by IBM and Compaq. And its status in the marketplace can always be challenged by Korean manufacturers."

Some dealers believe that ALR's sales could improve if its memory cards weren't so costly. A 1MB card from ALR costs \$300 to \$400, compared with about \$100 per megabyte of memory for other brands, like AST. "It sometimes loses the advantage of being a reasonably priced computer," says Michael Erfani, manager of


PC Concepts in Arlington, Virginia.

In earlier years, PC World and others blasted ALR for cutting corners in manufacturing. Complaints still crop up about its technical support. Less seriously, ALR raises eyebrows by often announcing products long before they ship in volume. "I wouldn't be surprised if these guys announced [an Intel] 586 machine tomorrow," jokes one observer.

Still, its big bankroll leaves ALR strongly positioned for further growth. Foreign sales accounted for 30 percent of its business last year, and a major expansion plan is under way. The company recently signed up distributors in Australia, the United Kingdom, and Canada. But Lu plans to continue to choose niches very carefully—ALR won't necessarily jump into laptops, for instance. "It's important for us to stay focused," he says. -Patrick Cole

NextStep Wins Andrew Fluegelman Award

cation software, the Next Computer is struggling hard for commercial acceptance. But Steve Jobs's brilliant NextStep environment continues to rate very high in the software community, and it edged out some impressive


competition to win this year's Andrew Fluegelman award.

In the future, all desktop systems will include a unified imaging model (which gives true what-you-see-is-whatyou-get integration between display and printouts). They'll also feature an object-oriented development system, a welldesigned user interface with enhancements like 3-D buttons, aids for end user programming, support for voice annotation, and other advances. "NextStep is the first complete, commercial system with all of this," notes developer Dan Bricklin, a Fluegelman judge. "It's a milestone."

"NextStep shows what the interface of the future should look like," adds the Association of PC User Groups' Jerry Schneider; another judge. "It's a dream for developers. A lot of people are talking about

what we need to be doing. Rather than talking about it, NextStep is implementing it."

Bud Tribble and the Next software team received the \$5000 prize for the Fluegelman award, which recognizes programmers for excellence in personal computer software design. It commemorates Andrew Fluegelman, founding editor of *PC World* and *Macworld*, author of the first *PC* communications package, and a leader in the creation of shareware software distribution. —*E. B.*

recognition. "It conjures up an image in the consumer's mind that we are going to be hard-pressed to meet," says Rizzo.

What users want is recognition of cursive writing, which vendors agree is years down the road. GridPad accepts only block characters. Grid claims a 95 percent accuracy rate, which climbs as users adjust their writing style, says Anne Marie McGee, marketing manager for the GridPad. Other products, such as the Portable Reference System, a laptop from Scenario of Boston, feature "trainable" software, in which the machine rather than the user is forced to adapt. Based on neural network technology, the Scenario software becomes more adept over time at recognizing a user's hand-writing style.

Standard Versus Custom

One of the most hotly debated industry topics concerns the trade-offs between creating an operating system for penbased PCs and employing standard DOS. Go is expected to develop proprietary system software that will be licensed to other players.

By contrast, the GridPad is a DOS-based system. "We'll be able to get the applications out there more quickly," explains Ken Dulaney, Grid's director of advanced systems marketing. "It's one less hurdle to overcome when we go to software developers."

Microsoft is expected to push DOS and *Windows* hard. Russ Werner, group manager for DOS and *Windows*, promises that his company "will be a big player in the next couple of years."

Momenta's Rizzo argues that the operating system doesn't have to be an all-ornothing proposition. "Our feeling is that users would prefer a little of both," he says. In any case, a pen-based PC must be able to exchange data with standard PCs (both ways) in order to succeed in corporate America.

Gentle Takeoff?

Plenty of money and distribution power are about to be thrown into this market as some of the biggest names in computing jockey for position. Sony and Canon have introduced such systems in Japan. IBM has invested in Go, and Apple and other major vendors are busily researching the technology.

Although the GridPad is currently the lone player, the

market should heat up in the fall if the Go system enters as rumored. Momenta says only that it intends to join the battle by 1992.

InfoCorp projects exceptional growth: The combined market for portable and desktop units will jump from 22,000 units sold in 1990 to nearly 3.5 million systems sold in 1995.

In the meantime, suppliers are busy lining up software companies to write applications. Grid, the most public, claims that over 150 software companies have attended its training classes.

High expectations could both help and hurt response to pen-based systems. Go's Lewin cautions that it will take time for the technology to evolve to a level that will match early expectations and for applications to come to market.





IBM's Half-Step Toward Home

Is it a work-at-home PC or a new-wave consumer information appliance? The Personal System/1 tries to strike a balance.



An unambitious combination of basic AT hardware with built-in modem and simple software tools, the PS/1 is meant to lure families into buying their first PC.

Someday, friends who know little and care less about PCs will come to you for advice on buying a home computer. You'll suggest one that they can simply take home and plug in. "It's just like a VCR or a microwave oven," you'll say.

not that machine. But it does show that IBM is deadly serious about smoothing the path between consumers and their first PC. IBM hopes the PS/1 will become a true family appliance, handling everything from job-related tasks to homework to games. IBM brought little innovative technology to that quest; the PS/1 is based on conventional ATstyle components. Instead, IBM reserved its most innovative efforts for novel customer service-and-support policies.

Plug-and-Play Platform

The PS/1's technology is plain

vanilla. It's basically a revamped Model 30 286 with a VGA display, a 2400-bps Hayes-compatible modem, a mouse, a 3½-inch 1.44MB floppy drive, a parallel port, and bundled software—but no standard expansion slots. Like the Model 30 286, it's a onewait-state, 10-MHz 286-based system whose performance lags a little behind most AT compatibles (see "12-MHz ATs: Home-Office Alternatives," December 1989). The footprint is a relatively small 103/4 inches wide, 17 inches deep, and 141/4 inches high with display. The keyboard is

equipped with the standard PS/2 keys and the standard spacing between keys but measures a compact 173/4 by 61/4 inches.

Four configurations are differentiated by monitor and storage options, starting with a \$999 single-floppy model that includes a monochrome VGA monitor and climbing to a \$1999 system with color VGA and a 28ms, 30MB hard disk. Floppy drive models come with 512K of memory and hard drive versions with 1MB.

The PS/1's monitor is a 12-inch, .37mm-dot-pitch VGA display, which puts a headphone jack and controls (including the on/off switch) up front. It has two tilt angles—full vertical or slight recline—and houses a 2-inch speaker. It also contains a power supply that provides 90 to 105 watts to the system unit as well, making it a requirement. The power is in the monitor, so you can open up the system box without exposure to AC current.

Configuration is quick enough, although mistakes are possible (like plugging the mouse into the keyboard port). But as with setting up any PC, the big challenge comes when you add software or more esoteric options.

A Bundle of Support

IBM gives you a hand by storing the DOS 4.01 kernel and a custom DOS shell in ROM, so you can start computing as soon as you turn on the machine. Also bundled are *Microsoft Works* and two online offerings: a kit for becoming a PS/1 "users club" member on Prodigy, and a kit for other services (including software libraries and on-line PS/1 classes) offered by Quantum Computer Services.

Turn on your PS/1, and you're greeted by a screen divided into a four-part image menu. You can click on one or

another of the images to access system information and on-line services; Microsoft Works; a simple file manager that uses an office-folder metaphor; or DOS. But click your way through all these offerings, and you have to contend with six distinct user interfaces. Why didn't IBM create a well-integrated environment based on Windows 3.0 instead? The company maintains that Windows is still too complex and that it lacks applications.

The Prodigy-based users club offers a data base containing answers to common support questions plus bulletin boards that let users exchange messages with IBM technical personnel or each other. The club is free for 90 days; then you must pay Prodigy's \$9.95 monthly fee. IBM hopes users will try the bulletin boards before calling the 800 number, although the same IBM personnel will handle both.

Hands on the Hardware

While conventional service options will be available, generally the user is responsible for making repairs or upgrades, with help from IBM. IBM prefers that resellers never open up the PS/1 box, even to make repairs or add options. The theory is that if the hardware fails, you call the 800 number and an IBM representative

helps you isolate the problem and then swap out the bad component. You return it to IBM in a custom overnight envelope and receive a working part within 48 hours.

This is a bold experiment—possibly too bold for some novice users. At first blush, the PS/1's design seems sensible. For example, you can remove the hard drive without tools: Just slip off the cover, remove the front panel, disconnect the drive's cable, and pluck out the drive. But you're right in the guts of the system—scary territory for the PS/1's intended customers.

The customer is expected to install all PS/1 hardware options—an upgrade to a total of 1MB of memory for floppy drive models, an expansion box, an external 51/4-inch floppy drive, and an audio card. The PS/1's unique \$199 512K memory card is a breeze to install, but other upgrades aren't. To get add-on slots, you must fork out \$169 for an expansion box that holds three 8/16-bit slots and replaces the PS/1's lid. To hook up a 51/4-inch drive, you must buy a \$299 box that slips in underneath and draws power from the modem. (IBM's portable PS/2 Model P70 offers a classier way to hook up a floppy: a dedicated port.)

The PS/1's upgrade path doesn't take you far. The sys-

tem doesn't accept drives larger than 30MB, a math coprocessor, or more than 1MB of CPU-speed memory—although IBM might well craft a 2MB version of its card later, and you can add up to 16MB of memory on the bus. Similar expansion difficulties helped to doom IBM's first home entry, the PCjr.

Beyond the Basics?

In this age of Nintendo, speech-quality sound is a must if you want to attract children to a computer. Unfortunately, IBM didn't build such capabilities into the PS/1. Instead, optional audio cards hook up to a dedicated slot in the system unit. The \$129 base card includes standard 8-bit audio circuitry, a joystick connector, a microphone jack, a MIDI music port, and a game. A \$249 card adds a joystick, MIDI cable, and two more games. Current PC packages that support audio must be rewritten for the PS/1.

Unlike Tandy, IBM doesn't offer the option of a built-in CD ROM player, although one could easily be attached underneath as with the external floppy drive. Nor has IBM announced an accompanying printer, which would be a logical development.

The PS/1 will compete with conventional compatibles, many of which now bundle Windows 3.0. It also will slug it out with first-generation home information appliances like Tandy's entrant, upcoming notebook computers that fit into a home electronics suite, and other products. Born more from customer surveys than from a vision of home computing, the PS/1 doesn't aim as high as some of its rivals. But it does formally kick off the race for home in the 1990s.

WHY IBM WANTS TO GO HOME: IT'S STILL A STRATEGIC OPPORTUNITY

IBM is a \$63 billion supplier whose traditional business markets are growing rather slowly. The giant has long coveted opportunities in the home, where more than a quarter of personal computers end up.

IBM first attempted to sell a computer designed specifically for homes (and schools) in 1983. Big Blue had high hopes for its new system, but the PCjr had nonstandard features and was hard to expand. IBM straightened out most of the snags and sold a few hundred thousand. But by then, the ir had earned a reputation as an intentionally crippled machine. IBM was forced to pull the plug little over a year after the jr shipped in volume.

In the fall of 1988 IBM executives reexamined the market and were encouraged by what they found. Studies indicated that 54 percent of those planning to buy a home computer expected

to buy from IBM—although once they got to the store, they typically picked up something else. LINK Resources of New York City estimates that only 15 percent of all home computers in the United States carry the IBM logo.

The latest surveys show consumers spending an average of \$1598 on their home systems, sans soft-

ware, "which indicates that they're not buying the cheapest model," notes
Thomas Miller, LINK vice president. "Working at home and job-related activities remain the largest reasons for purchasing," he adds. IBM is well positioned for the home market in terms of both pricing and intended use. And the potential in that market is healthy: LINK estimates that

4.5 million personal computers will be bought for U.S. homes this year.


The PS/1's target market is well-heeled families who are only slightly acquainted with PCs and have schoolaged children. "Our goal is to attract people who are sitting on the sidelines," says Skip Gladfelter, marketing head for IBM Entry Systems Division's new-business development group in Lexington, Kentucky.

IBM will make its biggest push through nondiscount department stores like Sears that already peddle PCs and other expensive consumer goods for the home. These retailers have the right customers, support policies, and hours. As Gladfelter points out, "You can't buy most brand-name PCs after 5 p.m. or on weekends, which is when most people shop."

IBM will introduce the PS/1 through 900 outlets in the Chicago, Dallas, and Minneapolis metropolitan areas this summer and will offer this system nationally in September. —E. B.

These days, the conservative buy isn't IBM, it's Compaq. You pay top dollar for Compaq systems, but their design, quality control, and dealer support are among the best in the business—and you don't have to worry that Micro Channel slots will make your AT or XT boards obsolete.

For Compag fans, the Deskpro 386s/20 is a big event. Built around Intel's new 20-MHz 386SX chip, this latest entry costs only \$500 more than Compaq's 16-MHz SX, the Deskpro 386s, and should offer approximately 25 percent better performance. The \$3299 base price of a Deskpro 386s/20 without a monitor is fairly high, but this 20-MHz unit remains an attractive midperformance purchase for those willing to pay for top quality.

Besides the Model 1 base system, the 386s/20 comes in two hard disk flavors: the

\$4499 Model 60 (with a 60MB hard disk) and the \$5299 Model 120 (with a 120MB unit). All the models have 2MB of RAM and will be shipping by the time you read this.

Same Box, New Design

The Deskpro 386s/20 has the familiar small-footprint chassis most Compaq systems use. From the outside you can access one half-height and two third-height devices—say, a tape backup and two floppy drives.

The 386s/20 sports a new motherboard that uses ASIC (application-specific integrated circuit) chips to reduce the component count and increase reliability. Compaq has nixed the usual proprietary slot for memory, which means you won't need a special board to add RAM.

Instead, four sockets on the motherboard hold either 1MB, 2MB, or 4MB SIMMs (single in-line memory modules). This setup lets you install up to 16MB of RAM, all accessible at CPU speed. You can even mix and match SIMMs, enabling you to upgrade in 1MB increments all the way to system maximum. Unfortunately, Compaq's RAM is expensive—between \$650 and \$700 a megabyte, depending on which SIMMs you use.

Compaq also engineered a new cache memory architecture for the Deskpro 386s/20. As with all such schemes, the CPU accesses frequently used data in a small cache of highspeed RAM, avoiding the wait states that can be incurred by accessing slower main memory directly. The cache is a mere 4K, but Compag claims that for most applications, it should deliver speeds approaching those of systems with caches eight times the size.

Integration Plus Expansion

Most users will be happy with the Deskpro 386s/20's built-in features. VGA and serial, parallel, and mouse ports all reside on the motherboard, as do the floppy controller and hard disk interface. That leaves four standard 8/16-bit slots free, plus an internal connector to the VGA that lets you add a high-resolution graphics board without sacrificing built-in VGA capability.

You can load the small box with a whopping five drives, a stall two floppy and two hard drives without adding a controller card. A socket for a 20-MHz 80387SX math coprocessor is also provided.







While WordPerfect 5.1 has a mother lode of features, you need a hard disk to run it—which rules it out for many laptop owners. LetterPerfect, a half-price (\$229) version of the best-selling word processor, fits on a 720K floppy yet retains the essential features.

LetterPerfect's friendlier interface improves on Word-Perfect 5.1's pulldown menus, but WordPerfect aces can switch to the familiar "clean screen." LetterPerfect also offers better on-line help via the <F1> key. You can cursor or search through help titles and even execute a command from the help screen.

While many of WordPerfect 5.1's advanced features are simplified or missing, most core features are duplicated. The line formats, speller, thesaurus, font support, and print preview are identical, as are file format and support for 700-plus printers.

LetterPerfect simplifies merge, graphics, and page for-

matting and exports only text files. It forgoes footnotes, mailing labels, styles, soft keyboards, sorts, equations, line numbering, text boxes, and the ability to edit two documents at once—although you can cut and paste blocks and retrieve documents.

Nor can you create, view, or print columns or tables, although you can edit those you import from WordPerfect. LetterPerfect lacks WordPerfect's built-in macro recorder and editor, so you can't use WordPerfect macros. But you can write macros by starting LetterPerfect from its DOS shell, which has a sophisticated macro facility.

Takeover

Scripts Add to Remote Possibilities

If you've ever been computing at home or on the road and needed files from your office system, you're a candidate for remote communications software. Programs like Soft-Klone's *Takeover* let you dial your office PC to swap files and run applications on it. But *Takeover* goes other remote packages one better with a powerful script language that lets you automate complete remote sessions and log-ons.

Takeover includes both Host and Guest modules. Host uses a mere 55K to 70K on your office PC and features security measures that include password protection, automatic dial-back, and the ability to lock callers out of subdirectories. It also works as a TSR. Guest runs as an add-on to the bundled Mirror III communications program and takes a 480K bite out of the calling PC's RAM—about twice the RAM competitors require.

But then, you need only dial from a *Guest* PC to run hefty applications like *Framework* on the *Host* PC. You can transfer files, perform DOS commands, take screen shots, print files remotely or locally, and record keystrokes. File transfers use SoftKlone's proprietary error-checking protocol, which has built-in data compression.

While you lose memory running *Takeover-Guest* under *Mirror III*, you gain the PRISM script language, which is more powerful than those found in competitors. PRISM lets you automate not only logons but a series of commands to an application running on the *Host* PC and the capture of data from its screens. *Takeover's* most obvious limitation is that a PC running *Host* cannot accept calls from a PC using communications soft-

ware other than Mirror III.

Takeover, which supports full color graphics including EGA and VGA, requires DOS 2.0 or later and a modem. Host is \$150; Guest (with Mirror III) is \$195; and Host and Guest together are \$295. In EGA and VGA systems, you can free up 96K to 124K of above-640K memory when not in graphics mode. If you also avoid loading TSRs in a sepa-

rate block, you can make up to 920K of conventional RAM available to your applications.


What's more, you can easily turn graphics back on again. One of *Memory Commander*'s best features is its flexibility—you can change memory configurations on the fly, resetting memory addresses for your expanded memory page, video and hard drive adapter ROMs (to the extent allowed), and TSRs. In fact, you can preset configurations for different programs so that these changes happen automatically when you load them.

The program's other tricks include locking out a memory block for diagnostic purposes, transferring BIOS ROM code into high-speed RAM, and turning extended memory into the more widely supported EMS 4.0 expanded memory. 



Haves throws in software for the CheckFree electronic bill-paying system and 2 hours of time on the PC-Link information network. The hardware and software are not locked to each other—you can run other communications packages on the 2400 plus, and Smartcom EZ works with other standard modems. To celebrate the third birthday of its VGA and 8514/A products, IBM has introduced a crisp display that handles both graphics standards (as well as the earlier EGA and CGA, if the adapter supports those). The \$950 Color Display 8515 offers more viewing area than most 14-inch monitors: 9.8 by 7.4 inches. The analog monitor supports up to 1024 by 768 resolution, with 256 colors from a palette of 256,000, when hooked to IBM's 8514/A adapter.

That makes it ideal, IBM says, for the Windows and OS/2 graphical environments. And with its medium-persistence phosphors and .28mm dot pitch, the display shows fonts more clearly than does IBM's earlier .31mm 8514 monitor. The 8515 has screen refresh rates up to 70 Hz (43 Hz interlaced for 8514/A operation). IBM does not, however, support 800 by 600 super-VGA operation.

SoftType

Cheap, Well-Behaved Windows Fonts

Until recently, the LaserJet soft font-generation market belonged almost exclusively to Bitstream's Fontware, thanks to innovative deals that bundle the program with Ventura Publisher, PageMaker, Microsoft Word, WordPerfect, and other type-oriented software. But while the font-generation program and a handful of typefaces may come gratis, additional Bitstream typefaces are expensivetypically you pay \$195 for one typeface in four styles.

Enter Z-Soft's SoftType, a \$199 Windows-based program with 62 high-quality URW typefaces, including such favorites as Bodoni, Futura, Garamond, Palatino, and Univers. You can generate fonts for Windows applications or Ventura Publisher in .01-point increments from 1 to 72 points—SoftType automatically installs screen and printer fonts in Windows and generates Ventura font metric files. The program produces fonts for both PostScript and

LaserJet laser printers and some dot matrix printers. And because it's a Windows application, SoftType can build fonts in the background, a boon to desktop publishers who must frequently generate one or two fonts but can't always afford the concomitant finger tapping.

SoftType makes it easy to manage fonts without having to memorize cryptic file names. But its most remarkable feature, unique among font generators, is that it lets you generate your own custom type styles from standard URW designs by adding preset drop shadow, gradient, condensed, expanded, outlined, slanted, and rotated effects—or create combinations of effects. equally accessible for right-handers or lefties.

Intel NetPort Print Server, Microtest Lanport

Network Printer Service—Sans PC

Want to avoid dedicating a computer as a NetWare print or modem server? Both Intel's NetPort Print Server and Microtest's Lanport let you hook one or two printers or plotters to your LAN's ethernet cable, and Lanport lets you share modems.

Intel's NetPort is a modemsized (4-by-7-by-1-inch) box with three ports (parallel, serial, and thin ethernet). It includes all necessary software, so you don't need to load anything on the NetWare server or workstations. Once the LAN administrator identifies a NetPort-attached printer to NetWare's Pconsole utility, it can act just like a printer attached to a NetWare server.

The Lanport fits in the same footprint as the NetPort, but you must choose your configuration—either one or two serial ports or a single parallel port (but not one of each), and either an ethernet connector or a DB-15 (for use with an external transceiver). Like the NetPort, the Lanport contains all the software for the print server. Unlike the NetPort, the Lanport doesn't support Novell's NetWare Print Server utility.

The Lanport's modem support is a significant advantage—the two-serial-port model can even handle a printer and a modem. Before you can access the shared modem, you must load a 14K memory-resident utility so that the modem can work with *Procomm Plus*, *Crosstalk Mk.4*, or *pc-Anywhere*.

The \$695 Intel NetPort requires NetWare 2.1x or a later version and thin ethernet and comes with a 3-year warranty. Microtest Lanport costs \$495 to \$695, depending on port configuration. It requires Net-Ware 2.1x and thin ethernet or

an external transceiver for thick or twisted-pair ethernet, and it has a one-year warranty. —Robert Lauriston

Is That a PC in Your Pocket?

Your BMW has been stuck in rush-hour traffic for an hour, you've called everyone you can think of on your car phone, and the radio reports that they won't get that truckload of molasses off the road for another hour. What to do?

How about running the quarterly earnings spreadsheet one more time on your Poqet PC? This go-anywhere,

full-powered PC aims to cure executive boredom wherever a Brooks Brothers coat pocket can be found.

The Poqet PC has DOS 3.3, a well-implemented DOS shell, a file transfer program, and five standard utilities including calendar and calculator ensconced in 640K of ROM. It also has 512K of RAM on

board and ships with another 64K RAM card. Software for this diskless PC is loaded via ROM cards in one of the two RAM/ROM card slots; only a few ROM applications are available, but Poqet predicts others by summer's end. Meanwhile, you can swap files and some applications between the Poqet PC and your desktop using the accompanying serial cable at 115,200 bits per second.

But if you're going to use the Poqet PC in your car, better learn to steer with your knees; you need to hold the Poqet with one hand while you hunt and peck with the other. Even on a desktop, there just isn't enough PC to stay in one place when you really get typing. But you can only use one hand at a time anyway; the Poqet's tiny keys are bunched so closely on its tiny keyboard (2 inches narrower than an average notebook) that not only is touch-typing out of the question, your fingers will have trouble hitting one key at a time. And the keys' short travel means that you may leave more letters out of words than you put in them.

The screen makes a better mirror than a display. It could benefit from a nonglare surface, but that would further diminish the minimal contrast between the dark gray background and the tiny black letters. Configuring for block cursor mode is a must with this nonbacklit display.

The good news is that you can enjoy the Poqet PC for about 100 hours on just two AA batteries. This palmtop benefits from 16 pending powermanagement patents, which means you'll have literally days' worth of people coming up to you in airports and coffee shops to admire your executive toy. Most of them will have to be content with merely admiring though; at \$1995, the Poget PC is definitely not for the hoi polloi. Poget Computer Corporation, 650 N. 

New Power for Small Novell Networks

Novell's 2.12 upgrade of its low-cost Entry Level System (ELS) NetWare Level 1 has been a long time coming, but it's improved in form and function. Many features are ported over from big brother Net-Ware 286 version 2.15.

Novell claims that version 2.12 runs twice as fast as the old version. You can now use IBM PS/2 Models 30 286, 50 Z, 55 SX, and 70 as file servers, and NetWare runs faster still if you don't use the servers as workstations. Many of NetWare 2.15's handiest administration features, such as re-

source accounting, disk use restrictions, and password encryption, have been added to the entry-level product. Unfortunately, you'll need third-party products to allow peers to share each other's printers, as they can with NetWare 286.

Installation for the fouruser network operating system has been significantly simplified. With fewer decisions to make and only 7 disks to shuffle (instead of 14), you should be able to install the new NetWare ELS in 7 minutes, according to Novell. A new SETUP command lets you create a basic four-user net—including user accounts, security files, and log-in scripts—with one keystroke.

Upgrading from older versions is relatively painless. User files and bindery security files can be used as is in the new environment. The software works with the same broad range of hardware as its more powerful NetWare kin. Upgrades from 2.0a are \$380, while first-time purchasers will pay \$795—a bargain compared to configurations of Advanced NetWare, which start at \$3000. 14 SX Systems: Big Deals in Small Boxes

Looking for a space-saving entry-level workstation? Our exclusive street-price comparison points out the standout Best Buy.

hanks to local area networks, there are very few stand-alone PCs left in corporate offices; a desktop computer is either a network server or a workstation. Servers are high-powered, super-reliable (and expensive) systems that hold enough hard drives to satisfy the mass storage needs of a work group. Workstations—machines that actually sit on people's desks—can get away with offering far less.

How much less? Without the ability to run 386-specific applications on your workstation, you'll miss out on a whole new generation of powerful software—so a 286 is out of the question. On the other hand, you might not need to buy a full-fledged 386. They're expensive, and most will grab the lion's share of your desktop.

Enter the 386 SX machine, today's entry-level workstation par excellence. Although far lower in price and somewhat slower than 386 systems, SXs still run 386-specific software like *Windows 3.0*, *Paradox/386*, and (probably) whatever else the next five years have in store.






A small chassis means less room for drives, but that shouldn't be a problem for networked users who can access the server's hard disk subsystem. Of course, SXs also make perfectly adequate stand-alone systems, especially if the manufacturer can sell you a high-capacity hard drive.

Processing performance is the biggest SX trade-off. Throughput on the average 16-MHz SX system is roughly 10 percent slower than on the average 16-MHz 386. Moreover, most 386 systems run at 25 MHz or faster these days; buy one of those and you'll get approximately twice the performance of a 16-MHz SX. But as always, you'll pay for what you get: Within one product line, a 25-MHz 386 generally costs between 60 and 70 percent more than a similarly configured SX.

To help you find the best SX values, *PC World* put 14 16-MHz SX systems through their paces: Acer's 1100SX, Arche's Rival 386SX, AST's Bravo/386SX, Blackship's 386SX-16, Compaq's Deskpro 386s, CompuAdd's 316s, Dell's 316SX, Epson's Equity 386SX, Hyundai's Super-386S, IBM's PS/2 Model 55 SX, Mitsubishi's MP 386S, Packard Bell's Force 386SX, Tandy's 4016 SX, and Wang's PC 350/16S. In addition, we tested the brand-new Dell 320LX (see the sidebar "Dell Breaks Another Speed Barrier With the First 20-MHz SX").

The Best Buy? Acer's 1100SX takes this high honor by virtue of its excellent performance, good expansion slot capacity, and low street price. Epson's Equity 386SX came close to sharing the glory, but a couple of hardware problems and unexceptional technical support left us reluctant to recommend it. Finally, only the lack of a nationwide onsite service option kept us from awarding a Best Buy to the Blackship 386SX-16, a budget-priced mail-order clone.



Acer's Best Buy 1100SX is one of the fastest systems tested, and at \$3078 on the street, it's also one of the least expensive. Thanks to an integrated motherboard, you get four free 16-bit slots; you also get four months of free on-site service.

The SX Challenge

As always, price and performance loom large in our system comparisons, and our new street price listing gives you another resource in the search for your best deal (see the sidebar "The Word on the Street"). In addition, several requirements are especially pertinent when comparing SXs: Due to these machines' small footprint (averaging 16 inches square), space for boards, drives, and even memory is at a premium. Consequently, we give extra points for a high ceiling on CPU-speed RAM, generous expansion board capacity, and the availability of a high-capacity drive.

Performance SX performance varies widely from system to system. What's more, these variations are more noticeable with 16-MHz SXs than with, say, 25-MHz 386s, since a given percentage difference in performance has a larger impact at slower CPU speeds.

Our performance test suite includes both DOS and OS/2 benchmarks. When a system did not come with its own version of OS/2, we used IBM's OS/2 version 1.1 for testing—but due to potential compatibility problems, we don't recommend running a computer with any version of OS/2 but its own.

CPU-Speed RAM Capacity All the SX systems have two buses running at two different speeds: an 8-MHz expansion bus, and a CPU-speed memory bus, which is at least twice as fast. How much memory you can install on the memory bus, either on the motherboard or in a special CPU-speed slot, directly affects the longevity of your system. For example, a system that can hold only 4MB of CPU-speed RAM may be fine for current applications, but future programs and operating environments could need as much as 16MB, OS/2's maximum. We think you have a right to expect at least

8MB of high-performance memory; only 9 of the 14 systems offer that.

Expandability You cannot expect a small chassis to hold as many expansion boards and drives as a full-sized system. However, it's reasonable to demand four free slots—with video, a floppy controller, a hard drive connector, and at least one parallel and one serial port installed as expansion boards or built into the motherboard. A big plus—especially for systems that will stand alone—is a 300MB (or larger) hard drive available as an option from the manufacturer; 6 of the 14 systems offer one.

Design and Construction Good looks and a sleek profile aren't everything. The important things to watch for are secure mechanical connections, a solidly constructed chassis, and easy access to peripherals (including the math coprocessor). A crisp, clear monitor and a durable keyboard with good touch are must-haves. Up-front on/off and reset controls make life easier, as does software-driven setup and configuration (no DIP switches or jumpers to set).

Service and Support Even the best-designed systems break down. A one-year warranty is absolutely essential, and on-site service can save your business lots of downtime; mail-order vendors especially should offer it as an option if it isn't included in the price of the system. In the tech support area, look for long support hours, quality documentation, and speedy response to problems. Our tests of technical support quality involve blind calls to both manufacturers and dealers.

To help you compare prices on a level playing field, all the machines are set up and priced as closely as possible to the standard *PC World* SX configuration: 4MB of RAM, one 1.2MB (or 1.44MB) floppy drive, an 80MB to 110MB hard drive, at least one parallel and one serial port, a VGA video controller and a color monitor, a 101-key keyboard, and DOS 3.3. All but five systems reviewed come with disk caching software; we note those five in text, along with all other

significant departures from the standard configuration.

Acer 1100SX


Acer's Best Buy 1100SX is the second-fastest machine in this roundup, tying with the Epson for top honors under DOS and maintaining a high position in OS/2 tests as well. Moreover, at a \$3078 street price (in the *PC World* configuration) it's one of the least expensive. The 1100SX comes with four months of onsite service and enjoys the backing of one of Taiwan's largest computer manufacturers.

The 1100SX holds a respectable 8MB of CPU-speed RAM. And like all but three of the systems in the roundup, the Acer comes standard with a built-in, high-speed IDE (Integrated Drive Electronics) connector designed for IDE hard disks that include all control-

ler electronics. In addition, the highly integrated motherboard holds a VGA board, a floppy controller, one serial port and one parallel port, and a mouse port. That leaves all four 8/16-bit expansion slots free.

The Acer 1100SX holds up to four drives—no mean feat for a small-footprint box. The unit comes set up for two half-height 3½-inch drives in the upper bay and one half-height 5¼-inch drive in the lower—all externally accessible. It's possible to pull the 5¼-inch drive and replace it with two more 3½'s, but only one of them will be accessible from the outside.

Acer's free on-site service is limited to four months, but that's not bad when combined with a year's carry-in dealer service. We called the toll-free tech support number three times and got through to a live technician with minimal delay every time.



If price is paramount, Blackship's 386SX-16, with the lowest street price in the roundup, will pique your interest. But expandability is its biggest plus: There's room for five boards and five storage devices—in three half-height external and two 3½-inch internal bays.

FEATURES EVALUATION

Street Price, Size, Support—Acer's Winning Hand

Since these SXs are all small-footprint boxes, expansion room is critical. Acer's high-performance 1100SX scores strongly on capacity for CPU-speed RAM, boards, and drives and delivers a fine service-and-support package as well—all for a low street price. Four systems that rate nearly as well: Arche's Rival 386SX, Blackship's 386SX-16, Compaq's Deskpro 386s, and Epson's Equity 386SX.

Dell's low-profile 316SX comes with the company's famous one-year on-site service-and-support package, but performance is merely average, and you get only three free slots. And for once the Dell price is only fair.

There are a few nice extras: The 1100SX comes with a mouse, and unlike with most systems in this roundup, you use software instead of switches and jumpers to set up the system. But the main draws are top speed, generous expansion capacity, and a good price, making the Acer 1100SX a sweet deal—and a clear Best Buy.

Arche Rival 386SX

The Rival 386SX is a reasonably priced system (\$3138 on the street in the *PC World* configuration) with an excellent slot count and an outstanding two-year factory warranty. However, its performance is less than breathtaking, and the lack of an Arche version of OS/2 makes using the system as an OS/2 workstation inadvisable. If you want to run OS/2 on the system, you'll have to take your chances and use IBM's, the only version

you can buy separate from a system.

As with the Acer 1100SX, the mother-board can hold up to 8MB of RAM. There are eight slots to start with; after you install all necessary boards, two 8-bit and three 8/16-bit slots remain open. The system unit holds three vertically stacked half-height 5½-inch drive bays. The top two bays are externally accessible, and you can use the two bottom ones to hold a full-height drive.

Arche's two-year factory warranty is a valuable extra, there's a toll-free tech support line, and although there's no free on-site service, Arche will sell it to you for only \$128 per year. All three of our tech calls were answered promptly.

While the Rival 386SX could be faster, it offers strong expansion capability, a comfortable ceiling for CPU-speed RAM, an outstanding warranty, and a painless price. If it provided better performance and a native version of OS/2, it

would win Best Buy status for sure; as it is, it's still a very fine value as a DOS system.

AST Bravo/386SX

While not quite as fast as the Acer 1100SX, the AST Bravo/386SX is still a comer, taking fourth place overall in a closely packed bunch of front-runners. And with a street price of \$3164 (in the *PC World* configuration), it's quite reasonable. Unfortunately, its capacity for CPU-speed RAM and expansion boards is a bit low.

The Bravo/386SX holds only 4MB of CPU-speed RAM—enough to quickly switch between four or five active 640K Windows programs, but no more. The integrated motherboard includes all necessary ports and controllers, but you'll still need a VGA board, which cuts you down to three free slots. There are three half-height drive bays: two externally accessible 51/4-inch bays and an internal bay designed for the 31/2-inch IDE hard drive.

AST service and support could be better. There's no on-site service available and no toll-free tech support phone line for end users, and support hours end at 3 p.m. PST. On the bright side, all

our tech support calls were answered promptly, and the company's BBS makes tech queries easy. You might need support for configuration, since some jumper setting may be required.

The Bravo/386SX's high speed and reasonable price are big pluses. But its limited RAM and board capacity, short support hours, and toll phone line make it an also-ran.

Blackship 386SX-16

An amazingly low \$2406 direct-sale price (in the *PC World* configuration) makes Blackship's 386SX-16 the least expensive system in this roundup. Moreover, it's fast, offers a huge 1.2GB hard disk option, and has ample capacity for expansion boards. But its low price precludes much in the way of extras: There's no disk caching software or Blackship OS/2, and on-site service is for local customers only.

The motherboard (made by Mylex, not Blackship) holds up to 8MB of RAM. Of the system's eight slots, five remain free—a fine count for a small-footprint box. In addition to three externally accessible half-height bays, there's space inside for two full- or two half-height $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch drives.

Blackship is a mail-order operation, so if your system needs service, you'll need to mail it in for warranty repair (unless you live close by). There's a toll-free tech support line, and when we tested it, two of our calls were answered right away; on the third we had to leave a message, and no one ever called back.

On-site service and an implementation of OS/2 with Blackship's name on it would make the 386SX-16 a more attractive buy. Even so, thanks to high speed, excellent price, and great expandability, this system is one of the best bargains in the roundup.

Compaq Deskpro 386s

Compaq systems have always stood out in a crowd, and the Deskpro 386s is no exception, from its good performance (top score under OS/2, third place under DOS) to its large capacity for CPU-speed RAM. Too bad the street price is also exceptional. At \$5076 (in the *PC World* configuration) the 386s is the second most expensive system in the roundup.

The Deskpro 386s supports up to 13MB of CPU-speed system RAM, and thanks to a highly integrated mother-board, you get four free 8/16-bit expan-

sion slots. Three 5¼-inch drive bays are built into the front of the chassis. The top two bays are third-height, and the bottom bay is half-height. There's also an internal half-height, 3½-inch drive bay for the IDE hard disk.

Compaq prefers to handle service and support through highly qualified dealers, so features and quality may vary from one location to another. A random sample revealed that weekend technical support was available from about half the dealers, and all provided a fax machine for technical queries.

Compaq's reputation for excellent design, construction, and support is un-

rivaled, but it's no secret that quality doesn't come cheap. The Deskpro 386s is one of the safest buys you can make, but its high price keeps it from being a Best Buy.

CompuAdd 316s

If you're a bargain hunter, CompuAdd's 316s will make your heart beat faster. With a direct-sale price of \$2638 (in the *PC World* configuration), it's one of the cheapest machines in this roundup. And (in what seems like an unbelievably cool deal) for only \$17 more CompuAdd will throw in a Panasonic dot matrix printer,

THE WORD ON THE STREET: REAL-WORLD PRICES FOR REAL-WORLD BUYERS

Michael Goodwin

There are at least three kinds of prices in the computer business: list prices, mail-order prices, and dealer prices. While they're all "real," some are more real than others. Starting this month, PC World will base its system reviews and buying recommendations on street prices (an average of up-to-the-minute dealer prices drawn from an extensive phone survey in eight major cities from coast to coast) or direct mail-order prices.

Up to now, PC World has based its price/performance comparisons on manufacturers' list prices and modest estimates of how much less than the retail price you'll actually pay. Unfortunately, this puts vendors that offer steep dealer discounts at a significant disadvantage.

To resolve this problem and to provide you with the most useful real-world prices for making the smartest buying decisions, we conducted a telephone survey of PC dealers in Boston, New York City, Atlanta, Chicago, Dallas, Houston, San

Francisco, and Los Angeles. For every SX in this roundup (except those sold by direct mail order), we had our researcher call as many as five dealers in each city, identify himself as a local customer, and ask for a quote in the standard *PC* World configuration. Results were averaged to arrive at the price in each review.

Of course this process isn't perfect. Street prices are volatile and may change by the time a review is published. Moreover, we have no way of verifying the accuracy of dealer quotes, nor of evaluating the quality of peripherals a dealer may install to reach the standard configuration. Even so, we feel the results are a big improvement over a tally of list prices. Now when we tell you which PC is the best deal, you can rest assured we've backed up that opinion with street smarts.

PC WORLD TEST REPORT

Acer, Epson Are 16-MHz SX Speed Champs

In overall DOS and OS/2 performance, Acer's 1100SX and Epson's Equity 386SX are almost impossible to separate. AST's Bravo/386SX and Compaq's Deskpro 386s are close behind the leaders, with Compag's well-crafted OS/2 pushing its machine to the top in that category.

Methodology

All machines were tested with a 256K extended memory disk cache (program supplied by the vendor when possible). We were unable to obtain disk caching software from Arche, AST, and Epson; Blackship, Hyundai, Packard Bell, Tandy, and Wang don't offer disk caching software. All these systems were tested with Multisoft's Super PC-Kwik. Each computer was tested with 4MB of RAM. Tests were conducted with the vendar's version of both DOS and OS/2 1.1 when possible. Arche, Blackship, and Hyundai didn't supply a version of DOS; their systems were tested with Microsoft DOS 3.3. Arche, Blackship, CompuAdd, Hyundai, Mitsubishi, Packard Bell, and Tandy did not

Hyundai's Super-386S addresses a whopping 16MB of CPU-speed RAM. It boasts five free slots, a generous 18-month warranty, and a good \$3005 street price. But performance is unimpressive, and Hyundai does not offer OS/2.

a mouse, and a copy of *Windows 3.0!* Before you reach for the phone, though, note that RAM capacity is cramped and that the 316s placed dead last in three of our performance tests—and did poorly in most others.

The system accommodates only 4MB of CPU-speed RAM. There are five horizontal expansion slots on its integrated motherboard; you'll need to install a video board, but that still leaves four slots free. Unfortunately, because the two 8-bit slots are located behind a drive bay, you'll only be able to squeeze in half-length boards. There's space for two half-height floppy drives (one 5¼ inch, one 3½) and one internal half-height 5¼-inch hard disk. The largest hard disk you can buy from CompuAdd is only 110MB, which limits the 316s's appeal as a stand-alone system.

With only 4MB of fast RAM, you wouldn't want to run OS/2 on this sys-

tem anyway, but the lack of a native OS/2 version makes the prospect even less attractive. On-site service is not included, but a toll-free tech support line is. We called three times and were stuck on hold for 10 minutes every time.

While the CompuAdd falls flat as a business machine due to its limited RAM capacity and poor performance, its low price and amazing \$17 SX Success Kit make it an ideal machine for someone with light computing needs. Got a kid going off to college?

Dell System 316SX

Dell systems have always rated high in our roundups, but the 316SX seems a bit less impressive than some. With a direct-sale price of \$3349 (in the standard *PC World* configuration), Dell's 316SX is not cheap. And while that includes Dell's famous on-site service-and-sup-

port package, the 316SX's performance is only average, and you may find its slot count limiting.

The 316SX can address up to 8MB of CPU-speed RAM, but due to the slim 4-inch-tall profile, there are only three horizontal expansion slots. Fortunately, an integrated motherboard ensures that all three remain free.

You'll find room for three drives: two externally accessible bays (one half-height 5½ inch, one third-height 3½ inch) and a half-height 3½-inch bay inside. Furthermore, Dell's biggest hard drive option, a 190MB unit, could eventually cramp your style if you mean to use this system off a network.

The 316SX comes with a full year of free on-site service, and the tech support number is toll free. We called three times, and the worst thing that happened was one 3-minute journey to Holdland.

Nonetheless, given Dell's reputation, the 316SX is surprisingly underwhelming. Its board capacity is relatively stingy, its performance is only average, and its price is nearly \$300 higher than that of Best Buy Acer. For once, Dell hasn't delivered a Best Buy.

Epson Equity 386SX

With a streetside price tag of \$3275 (in the *PC World* configuration), the Epson Equity 386SX falls firmly in the midrange of our SX price spectrum. The money buys you generous headroom for CPU-speed RAM and top-place performance. Unfortunately, hardware problems developed during testing.

The Equity addresses up to 14MB of CPU-speed RAM, and its highly integrated motherboard lacks only a video controller; after you install one, four slots remain free. The Equity provides three half-height 5¼-inch drive bays, the top two of which are externally accessible. The biggest hard disk you can get from the manufacturer is only 100MB.

As we ran the system through its paces, two components failed: the key-

Only one system in this review rated a Best Buy—the **Acer 11005X.** Its strong performance and low street price (only \$3078 in the standard PC World configuration) were the most important factors, but its four free expansion slots, comfortable 8MB capacity for CPU-speed RAM, and excellent service-and-support package were big pluses, too. Recommended second choices include the **Arche Rival 3865X**, the **Blackship 3865X-16**, and the **Compaq Deskpro 3865**.

Haw we rate 386SX systems

We rate 386SX systems based on information in the Features Evaluation table and PC World Test Report, cambined with aur apinions of quality, reliability, and user benefit. Because space is limited inside these small-footprint systems, we put significant weight on expansion capacity for CPU-speed RAM, boards, and drives.

Performance has a big impact an user praductivity at slower CPU speeds, so it's an important factor in evaluating these 16-MHz SXs. We double the weight of the pracessing-only 1-2-3 results and decrease the weight of the AutoCAD results by 20 percent to better reflect our readers' typical usage patterns. The standard deviation of these sums determines the ranges far the Executive Summary ratings.

CPU-speed RAM capacity refers to the amount of RAM installable an the motherboard and in any special fast slat. This is a primary criterian because low capacity can degrade memory-hungry programs' performance. Only those with a 13MB or higher capacity receive an Excellent rating.

Expandability applies to the number of free slots and the number and density of mass storage devices supported. Ta receive an Excellent rating, these small-footprint SX systems must have at least four slats open and room for a total of four half-or third-height drives (five slots and three bays will also do), and must affer at least 300MB of hard disk starage (from cambined hard drive options).

Design and construction includes quality of

manufacture, accessibility of contrals, and ease af setup. Excellent ratings are awarded to well-designed and -manufactured systems with switchless setup, quality monitors, and durable keyboards.

Service and support includes the length of warranty, quality and availability of phane support, documentation, support haurs, and other support services. At least one year's full worranty, free onsite service, toll-free tech support, long support hours, and prampt, effective response are required for an Excellent rating.

Price ratings are broken down by calculating the standard deviation fram the overage price.

Overall value averages all the abave criteria.

board and the VGA board. Epson's replacements worked fine, but two component failures in one new machine was enough to raise eyebrows.

Moreover, service and support are unimpressive. Although a 24-houra-day voice-mail system lets you leave questions off-hours, there's no on-site service or toll-free tech support line. On the upside, response was fine: Each of our calls was returned within 1 hour.

The Epson Equity 386SX is quite fast, boasts an excellent fast-RAM capacity, and sports a reasonable price tag. Were it not for the video and keyboard problems, we wouldn't hesitate to recommend it as a Best Buy.

Hyundai Super-386S

Hyundai's Super-386S is an impressive package. It provides 16MB of CPU-speed RAM, an excellent slot count, a generous 18-month warranty, and a low \$3005 street price (in the *PC World* con-

figuration). However, questionable dealer technical support, merely average performance, and the lack of a Hyundai OS/2 deny the unit Best Buy honors.

The system's integrated motherboard holds five standard expansion

slots, plus a special slot to hold CPUspeed RAM beyond 8MB; when not being used for memory, the memory slot accepts a standard 8-bit adapter card. In the *PC World* configuration, the system ends up with five free slots. The chassis has three stacked, externally accessible 5½-inch drive bays. The top one is one-third height; the other two are half-height and together can hold a full-height drive.

Hyundai uses its dealer network to provide service and support—and the results are only so-so. A national sampling turned up only two out of seven dealers that offered weekend support, and only one with a toll-free tech support number for buyers in another area code. Support hours averaged 9, and only four dealers had fax machines for tech inquiries. If you're having major problems getting tech support from your dealer, Hyundai will let you call its toll-free dealer tech support line—at least for now.

Hyundai's Super-386S comes very close to scoring a Best Buy thanks to its high RAM capacity, five free slots, long warranty, and low street price. Only unexceptional performance, lack of OS/2 and disk caching, and chancy tech sup-

DELL BREAKS ANOTHER SPEED BARRIER WITH THE FIRST 20-MHz SX

Dell's 320LX is the first production system bosed on Intel's new 20-MHz SX chip to hit the street, and olthough it's a desk hog, it's o prize package in both price and performance. At a direct-sale price of \$3799 (in the PC World configuration), this hot new Dell actually costs less than four of the 16-MHz SXs in this roundup. True, it costs \$450 more than Dell's own 16-MHz SX system, but it delivers up to 30 percent better performance.

The 320LX is housed in o full-sized AT cobinet that can hold four holf-height or two full-height 5½-inch drives. There are eight expansion slots, and since the integrated matherboard provides all the omenities except video, you end up with seven slots free. You should expect more CPU-speed RAM as clock speed

increases, so it's too bad the system tops out at 8MB.

It's no surprise that o 20-MHz SX will beot o 16-MHz SX. Whot is surprising is that the 320LX runs only 20 to 30 percent slower than Dell's own System 320, a full-blown 20-MHz 386.

Merely foir capocity for CPU-speed RAM limits the 320LX's usefulness os o server or on OS/2 workstation, ond you trode some desk spoce for excellent exponsion copocity. If you need o workstotion with room to grow, however, this system's high performance and low price spell on ottractive deal. —TJB

port keep it from the winner's circle. But it's still a pretty sweet low-end deal.

IBM PS/2 Model 55 SX

For true-blue fans who want an SX with the three magic letters, IBM's PS/2 Model 55 SX will fill the bill—but it will also put their IBM allegiance to the test. This machine carries a high street price (\$4833 in the *PC World* configuration), limits you to a 60MB hard disk, is extremely stingy with drive bays and RAM capacity, and delivers performance that's below average.

The Model 55 SX holds only 4MB of RAM on its highly integrated mother-board (another machine that barely qualifies as a *Windows* workstation). The motherboard includes all controllers and I/O ports, so all three 16-bit MCA slots remain free. Drive bays are in short supply, with room for two devices: a 1.44MB floppy and the half-height $3\frac{1}{2}$ -inch 60MB hard drive.

IBM lets its dealers handle service and support, and their reputation for service stands with the best. We surveyed a number of IBM dealers coast to coast and found that tech support hours averaged 9 a day and that everyone had a fax machine for support queries. Better still, you can buy on-site service from any IBM dealer for only \$25 a year.

Of course, the Model 55 SX comes with all the PS/2 amenities, such as switchless setup, disk caching, and password protection—and IBM's impeccable reputation for quality workmanship. Nor is the company likely to disappear any time soon. Nonetheless, you can do much better for the money.

Mitsubishi MP 386S

The MP 386S comes to bat with two strikes against it: The largest disk option is a puny 40MB unit, and the system is slow (next to last on both DOS and OS/2 tests). Its \$3271 street price (in the *PC World* configuration, but with the 40MB hard drive) nearly matches that of the Epson Equity 386SX.

The MP 386S can handle up to 8MB of CPU-speed RAM, and its mother-board has all but the IDE hard disk connector and a VGA board built in—leaving you with four free slots. There are two externally accessible half-height 51/4-inch drive bays, plus one internal 31/2-inch bay.

Service and support are mixed. While there's no weekend support or free on-site service, there is a toll-free support number. We made three test calls, and on two we were connected to a technician right away; the third time we had to leave a message, and no one ever called back.

With unimpressive performance and no large hard disk option, the MP 386S clearly is not a system for the serious business user.

Packard Bell Force 386SX

The Force 386SX is a problematic machine with three tempting features: a good slot count, two standard floppy drives (a 51/4 and a 31/2 inch), and the second-lowest street price in the round-

up: \$2591 (in the *PC World* configuration). However, overall it finished in the bottom third of the performance tests, and the 4MB limit on CPU-speed RAM is paltry.

Everything you could ask for is built into this motherboard, including a mouse port and VGA controller. There are five horizontal expansion slots—one 8-bit and four 8/16-bit—and all five remain free. The Force 386SX can hold up to four half-height drives, three of which are already installed. On one side are three half-height 5½-inch drive bays,

stacked vertically. On the other side, resting on its side, is a 3½-inch, 1.44MB floppy drive. The 100MB IDE drive that came with our review unit is the largest one in Packard Bell's catalog.

The software bag is mixed. You get *Microsoft Works*, *SideKick*, Spinnaker's *DOS Manager*, and a very nice 15-minute videotape that walks you through the system setup. However, Packard Bell does not offer its own OS/2, and there's no free disk caching software, either.

At first glance, service and support look better than average. You get four months of free on-site service, and toll-free tech support operates 16 hours a day during the week. However, our three calls met with scant success: two busy signals and a "full mailbox" voice-mail message.

The Packard Bell Force 386SX is not without its appeal, but the Best Buy Acer 1100SX delivers much better value for only \$487 more.

Tandy 4016 SX

Despite Tandy's reputation for popular pricing, its 4016 SX sports one of the higher direct-sale prices in this round-up: \$4847 in the *PC World* configuration. Moreover, its capacity for CPU-speed RAM is unacceptably low. You don't get disk caching software; you don't even get a tilt-and-swivel monitor stand.

The 4016 SX came in near the bottom in the DOS tests. Tandy sells its own OS/2, but it's version 1.0 (without Presentation Manager). Because no one will ever use this version, we tested the system with IBM's version 1.1 instead—and the 4016 SX came in dead last.

The 4016 SX tops out at a claustrophobic 4MB of CPU-speed RAM. And while the integrated motherboard is loaded with goodies, you still get only three free 8/16-bit horizontal expansion slots. There's space for three half-height drives: one 5¼-inch device and two 3½-inch drives, all of which are externally accessible. (One of the 3½-inch bays will

to discover that four out of six dealers offered only a 90-day warranty (the rest of the year's coverage is through the factory). On the bright side, everyone had a fax machines for tech queries, and weekday support averaged 9 hours. Also, Tandy has a national tech support line. It's a toll call, but our calls were answered immediately.

Still, with scant support for fast RAM, poky performance, and a steep price to boot, this is hardly the most compelling value in the roundup.

Wang PC 350/16S

The PC 350/16S is Wang's first new PC in nearly a decade, and it proves that old dogs can learn new tricks—except when it comes to pricing. The PC 350/16S is reasonably fast and offers excellent board capacity, but at \$5735 (in the PC World configuration) it's by far the most expensive system in the round-up. Wang's dealers tend not to give hardware discounts, bundling systems as part of value-added packages instead. You don't even get disk caching software.

Wang's SX can address up to 8MB of CPU-speed RAM. There are four 8/16-bit and two 8-bit expansion slots, and thanks to an integrated motherboard, five of them remain free. You get three drive bays: two externally accessible 51/4-inch bays hold half-height drives, and there's space inside for a 31/2-inch drive (either half- or full-height). However, the biggest hard disk you can get

for this machine is a 100MB unit.

Wang's service-and-support package lacks free on-site service, but there's a toll-free technical support number, and response is excellent. We called three times; we had to leave messages, but technicians called back within the hour every time.

This machine is well suited for serious business computing, and Wang's dealers may be able to offer you an attractive deal that includes application software and special configuration. But by itself, the PC 350/16S is too high-priced to stay in the running.

The Affordable Choice

It's rare to have such a clear Best Buy. The Acer 1100SX presses all the right buttons—price, performance, expandability, and support—and comes up a winner.


For those who can live with a bit slower performance and mail-in service, the Blackship delivers a comparable chunk of hardware for almost \$700 less. We also recommend the Arche and Compaq systems, but only Epson's Equity 386SX has the specs to merit a Best Buy—though the defective VGA board and keyboard in our review unit keep us from recommending the system. If you anticipate running OS/2, Arche's lack of a native OS/2 version leaves you with a choice between the Acer 1100SX and the Compaq Deskpro 386S.

The SX is the entry-level piece of the puzzle you need for an office full of PCs. Choose a top-rated system from this roundup, and whether you hook it to a LAN today or in a year or two, you'll have enough power to stand you in good stead for most of the decade.

Acer 1100SX



Desktop Publishing Light

If you covet professional page layout capabilities but your budget's on a diet, a low-cost desktop publishing package can serve up big helpings of features for less than \$300.

ungry for good-looking pages but can't stomach the hardware requirements and complexity of *Ventura Publisher* or *PageMaker?* Try a low-end desktop publishing package. Today's budget-priced programs let you quickly produce snappy-looking reports, newsletters, and fliers—without a lot of high-end hardware.

This review looks at four of the best low-cost DTP packages: Unison World's *Avagio 1.0*, Logitech's *Finesse 3.1*, Software Publishing's *PFS:First Publisher 3.0*, and our 1989 Best Buy, *Publish-It 1.13* from Timeworks.

All four programs let you easily import text and graphics, set up multiple columns, and mix and match

fonts. And, unlike *Ventura* or *PageMaker*, they don't require a 386 with 2MB of RAM to run at an acceptable speed; an AT with 640K will do fine. But only *Publish-It* provides the style sheets a business user needs for fast and easy document production. Once again, *Publish-It* is the Best Buy.

These low-cost programs are meant for the occasional user, not the daily desktop publisher. They lack refinements like fractional point sizes, fractional leading, and color output. And without such features as indexing, table of contents generation, or footnoting, they're impractical for documents of more than a 12 pages.

Given these limitations, are you better off using a high-end word processor like *Microsoft Word* or *WordPerfect?* The answer is no. While such programs let you lay out pages with multiple columns, fonts, and graphics, you can't edit their tiny page previews—and that means a lot of trial and error. A low-end DTP package lets you design pages without all the hassle.

Graphical word processors such as *Ami* and *Word for Windows* perform most DTP tasks as easily as low-end packages. However, they cost a lot more and need at least a 386 to run acceptably fast. They also lack basic drawing tools, clip art, and extra fonts—items included in the \$150 to \$300 packages reviewed. If you're on a budget, a bargain DTP package is for you.

The Basic Feature Groups

A good low-end DTP program gives you everything you need to produce attractive documents *and* is easy to use. Here's what to look for:

Layout Demand master pages, frame linking, a snap-to grid, and style sheets. All the programs except *First Publisher* let you create true master

pages containing elements such as margins, headers, and graphics that repeat on each page. And all but First Publisher let you manually link frames, so text can jump from one document page to another. But only Avagio provides both manual links and an automatic text-flow feature that creates frames and pages as needed. And Avagio offers the best snap-to guides—horizontal and vertical lines that let you snap page elements into place as if they were magnetically attracted. More important, however, only *Publish-It* offers style sheets, which let you make global style changes, insert style tags into word processed files for instant formatting on import, and save the formats you've defined for use with other documents.

Text Handling Insist on full hyphenation and tab functions, plus control over type style, type size, and leading (line spacing). Also, look for functions like cut, copy, paste, and search and replace. *Publish-It* has the best typography, thanks to its complete letterspacing and word-spacing controls.

Graphics Tools You'll want the basic drawing tools—lines, squares, and circles—plus a variety of line styles and

weights. *Avagio* is tops here, offering high-resolution vector output, line patterns, and a feature that lets you control the look of overlapping graphics.

Starter set of fonts and support a range of dot matrix, ink jet, and laser printers. But when it comes to high-end printing, these programs are limited. Avagio, First Publisher, and Finesse give you access to scalable fonts, but only Publish-It supports all resident fonts on laser and PostScript printers. And while Avagio wins kudos for its condensed, expanded, and outline font effects, it won't let you add third-party fonts.


File Support At the minimum, a program should support the big four text formats—WordPerfect, Word, Word-Star, and ASCII—plus PCX (PC Paintbrush) and PIC (1-2-3) graphics files. A big plus is support for TIFF, the popular file format for scanned images, and EPS, a common format for high-quality clip art. All programs reviewed support the essential text formats, though Publish-It 1.13 won't work with WordPerfect 5.0 files. But only Avagio imports the full range of text and graphics files.

make it easy to get started and easy to repeat the results. Avagio, Finesse, and Publish-It offer intuitive frame-based interfaces: Simply set up a master page, and draw frames in which to pour text or graphics. Publish-It's style sheets make it the only practical choice for producing multipage documents or creating reusable designs.

Avagio 1.0

Unison World's \$300 Avagio is a bit schizophrenic. It pushes dot matrix printers to the max but doesn't support a laser's resident fonts. It offers font effects and graphics tools you won't find in PageMaker or Ventura yet lacks such essentials as style sheets. Avagio lets you create visually impressive documents, but to repeat the effect, you have to start from scratch.

Like the other programs, Avagio of-

multiple page views and seven levels of magnification. You can pull out its ruler guides and extend them like cross hairs over any part of the page, making it easy to align objects. An automatic text-flow feature frees you from drawing frames on every page. But while you can define paragraph style tags inside documents, you can't save groups of tags as style sheets, nor can you pretag paragraphs in a word processor.

Avagio's graphics tools are impressive but inconsistent. You can choose from a variety of line styles and patterns, fill objects with patterns and gray shades, and group objects so they behave as a single unit. Yet Avagio lacks curves, polygons, and freehand drawing tools. However, you can use one of 150 clip-art images, or import graphics in PCX, TIFF, and PIC formats. You can also import simple EPS files via an included conversion utility.


Avagio's text handling is first-rate. Its four typefaces are scalable in 1-point increments from 6 to 500 points, and it offers unique effects such as condensed, expanded, and extra-bold fonts. Avagio scales fonts on the fly, then downloads them as bit maps—a great way to get top-notch output from a dot matrix or ink jet printer but slow with a laser or PostScript printer. Although Avagio converts Hewlett-Packard Soft Fonts to its format, it doesn't support resident LaserJet fonts.

Avagio is promising, with flashy graphics effects and a knack for handling type. But for basic business documents, *Publish-It* is easier and cheaper.

Finesse 3.1

Logitech's \$179 *Finesse* is a bare-bones program suitable only for short documents. It includes a separate program for running a scanner, but this doesn't make up for its deficiencies in layout and text handling. For an extra \$20, *Publish-It* provides much more.

Like *Publish-It*, *Finesse* offers a friendly, GEM-based interface. A chain tool links frames to accommodate long-

er files, but it's not automatic—you must create the frames and pages in advance. You can view the file names and links, enabling you to assemble complex, multifile documents easily.

Building anything longer than a twoor three-page document can be torturously slow. To create headings in 24point italic, for example, you go to each heading, select it, and change it. If you later decide you want them all in 30point bold instead, you must change each one individually.

When it comes to layout, text, and graphics tools, *Finesse* has the basics and little else. You get only left and decimal tabs, not centered or right-justified. And its graphics tools are minimal: You can draw lines and boxes, but not polygons, freehand lines, or even circles.

Finesse will accept graphics files in a variety of formats, including GEM and IMG, but not PIC. To capture spreadsheet graphs and charts, you must use a supplied screen-capture program. And its clip-art library is the slimmest of the bunch, though a built-in scanner interface lets you add images using Logitech's \$339 hand-held ScanMan.

Finesse offers five starter fonts and bundles in the Bitstream installation

kit, giving you access to Fontware's scalable font outlines. But LaserJet owners will be frustrated by its failure to support the printer's resident fonts or HP Soft Fonts.

With minimal layout and graphics tools and no style sheets, *Finesse* is clearly an also-ran. It may look like *Publish-It*, but that's where the similarity ends.

PFS:First Publisher 3.0

Software Publishing's \$149 PFS:First Publisher is not for serious business users. Its good graphics and font support are offset by deficient layout and text handling, and its layers-based approach and lack of style sheets make it hard to use.

Novice users may appreciate *First Publisher*'s selection of predesigned formats, which you can customize. But since the program uses layers instead of frames and provides no column guides, positioning text and graphics is a hassle. To import clip art and wrap text around it, you must manipulate the image in the graphics layer, then switch to the text layer and adjust each line individually. Even worse, the program lacks

style sheets, making multipage documents impractical.

raphy features are also inadequate, lacking such features as tabs, indents, automatic hyphenation and page numbering, and any form of kerning control. The program's master page support is minimal—you can set up column margins, but you can't add graphics or headers. On the plus side, the program creates as many pages as needed to accommodate long files. But since it won't let you "jump" articles from, say, page 1 to page 8, constructing newsletters with First Publisher would be a nightmare.

Graphics is this program's strong suit. First Publisher has a good complement of drawing tools, plus the ability to capture screens and edit, crop, flop, and invert bit-mapped graphics. It comes with a big selection of clip art, including high-resolution vector images, and accepts PIC, PCX, and TIFF files.

First Publisher offers good output support, especially for low-end printers. It works with HP Soft Fonts and comes with 35 low-resolution fonts for dot matrix printers. The program incorporates font handling, so you don't have to exit to add new typefaces, and includes two scalable Speedo fonts from Bitstream. At the high end, however, it supports only a handful of PostScript fonts.

First Publisher's dearth of layout tools, style sheets, and frame links makes it impractical for all but the simplest documents. If you need to create newsletters or business reports, stick with Publish-It.

With its industrial-strength style sheets and *Ventura*-like power, Timeworks' \$200 *Publish-It* offers all the DTP essentials in an easy-to-use package. Its only serious flaws—no Bitstream font installation kit or support for TIFF or EPS files—aren't enough to tarnish its value. Once again, *Publish-It* wears the Best Buy crown.

It uses the same GEM interface, and its style sheets are nearly as powerful. For instance, to format a headline, you simply highlight the text, pull down a menu to select attributes like alignment, font,

and spacing, and name the style tag. Once you define a tag, all text using that tag instantly formats. To make global changes, just redefine the tag. Best of all, you can save style sheets for use with


other documents, and insert tag names into files with your word processor for instant formatting inside *Publish-It*.

The program has all the layout essentials: text wrap, multiple views, and rulers in any units you choose. Text handling is also strong, with automatic hyphenation, complete size and leading controls, plus control over letter and word spacing and kerning. However, it lacks an undo command and won't automatically flow text across pages.

Publish-It has the polygon and freehand drawing tools Avagio lacks, but it can't match Avagio's grouping, patterns, or overlap control. To draw graphics on the master page you must create a separate frame for each item, so creating intercolumn rules is harder than it should be. But cropping graphics is painless: Just draw a square around the desired part of the picture.

Publish-It supports a host of printers and comes with seven built-in typefaces, plus support for resident fonts and Bitstream's Fontware—but you must purchase the installation kit separately. And Publish-It won't accept WordPerfect 5.0 text files or TIFF or EPS graphics files; if you want to print complex gray-scale or high-resolution images in your documents, you're out of luck.

Version 1.2, due out at press time, will add an undo function and support for TIFF, EPS, and the latest versions of *WordPerfect*. But even without these features, *Publish-It* is an excellent value

for anyone who needs to produce attractive documents in a hurry.

Place Your Order

To produce short, good-looking documents quickly and easily, a low-end DTP package is fine. But *PFS:First Publisher* and *Finesse* lack layout features business users need. And while flashy graphics and fonts make *Avagio* tempting, its lack of style sheets disqualifies it. Only *Publish-It* has everything in one package.

A Handful of Scanner

A perfect match for entry-level desktop publishers, low-cost hand scanners are great for integrating logos, spot art, and other small elements into your documents.

and scanners offer an inexpensive way to incorporate paper-based images into your PC documents. They also offer OCR (optical character recognition) options for translating printed text into editable electronic form, but with today's limited OCR software, their chief purpose is to help desktop publishers import graphics.

Ranging from \$300 to \$350, hand scanners are half the cost of entry-level flatbed scanners and a fraction of the price of professional (\$2000 to \$3000) gray-scale scanners (see "Gray-Scale Scanners Enter the Mainstream," November 1989). Resembling an oversized mouse, a hand scanner takes up very little room. Since you roll the scanner over the image instead of placing the image inside the scanner, it can more easily handle oddly shaped media.

Nonetheless, professional desktop publishers will probably want a flatbed. The hand scanner can't capture images wider than itself—about 4 inches—and image quality is acceptable only for laser printer output. You also need a steady hand—if you wiggle too much, you must clear the screen and start over. Line art especially shows the ill effects of an unsteady hand.

For other users, though, low prices make hand scanners too good to pass up. Top 400-dpi contenders include The Complete PC's Complete Half-Page Scanner/400, Logitech's Logitech ScanMan Plus, and DFI's Handy Scanner 3000 Plus. The following discussion lays out the features to look for and refers to these scanners as examples.

Scanning the Features

When buying a hand scanner, the prime consideration is image quality. You'll also want numerous scanning options and post-scan editing tools to polish images. Other issues include the scanner's ease of use.

Image Quality The quality of the image is largely determined by resolution and number of gray scales. Most hand scanners provide a respectable resolution of 400 dots per inch (dpi), which is more than is required for out-





put to a 300-dpi laser printer. Usually, a higher resolution means a finer, more detailed image; but if the original is large, 400-dpi resolution may result in an image that's too big to fit on screen. Also, a higher resolution reveals flaws from an unsteady hand more readily. For these reasons, a hand scanner should let you shift to lower resolutions.

Image quality is hampered by the limited number of gray scales hand scanners provide: 16 to 32 levels compared to 64 to 256 for flatbed scanners. In theory, the more gray-scale levels a scanner can reproduce, the better photographs and other gray-toned images should look; however, the difference between 16 and 32 is barely noticeable. Gray scales have no impact on line art.

Because of their limited gray-scale capabilities, hand scanners rely on *dithering* patterns to reproduce grays. Dithering is the process of applying a screen pattern that translates a gray



No hand-scanned image can pass for a real photograph. level into a series of dots. Most hand scanners offer a choice of three dithering settings. As the sample output shows, the illusion of true grays is less than convincing, but the output is sufficiently attractive for most newsletters.

Software options also help improve the captured image. Look for features like brightness control and the ability to limit the width of a scan.

produces smoother scans. In particular, the placement and operation of the scan button affects how easily you can scan in a straight line. Some scanners make you hold down a button while scanning, but the Complete Half-Page Scanner/400 offers a better approach: You click the button when you start and again when you stop. The Half-Page also provides large rollers underneath, making it easier to stay on course. Unlike its rivals, however, the Half-Page lacks a speed

indicator light that warns you when you move the scanner faster than it can handle.

Post-Scan Options When you scan an image, you'll invariably get some "garbage" pixels around it, and you'll need a pixel editor to clean them up. In addition, most scanners bundle paint programs such as *PC Paintbrush*, which enable you to flip, stretch, enhance, crop, and otherwise embellish the image.

Since you'll want to incorporate scanned images into your desktop publishing, word processing, or graphics packages, the scanner needs to support the most popular graphics formats. Most desktop publishing programs support PCX and TIFF (Tagged Image File Format) files. Other useful formats include MSP, IMG, and CUT.

Scanners often differentiate themselves by the extra software they include. The Half-Page, for instance, comes with a utility for merging 4-inch scans into a combined image to let you capture graphics larger than 4 inches. The Handy Scanner comes with tools for displaying images in programs written in dBASE, BASIC, Pascal, and C. The Scanman Plus includes a *Windows* version of its scanning utility.

Accelerates Applications

Improved memory management and other touches will aid Windows packages of every description.

he news is in about *Windows*3.0: Not only does its enhanced memory management scheme make programs faster, it also lets you effectively run multiple applications together. And the rebuilt interface isn't just better looking: It can speed your work.

What do these changes mean for *your Windows* applications? Plenty. Virtually every product category will benefit both cosmetically and functionally from the improvements in *Windows 3.0* (see "Windows Makes the Grade," July 1990).

The new look will quickly carry over into applications. Most of the latest releases support proportional fonts and the new 3-D look of both windows and buttons. The result is a "nicer-looking screen that's easier to read," says Mark Winter, engineering products manager for Crosstalk Communications of Roswell, Georgia. Applications are also tapping the new on-line help.

So Long, Memory Barrier

The most dramatic change for all Windows applications is removal of the 640K memory barrier that plagued prior versions. Unhampered by memory constraints, applications will be faster because they'll do less swapping to disk. They'll include more features and will take greater advantage of some of the environment's powerful capabilities, such as Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE).

"All developers were bumping up against the memory limitations," says Paul Grayson, chairman of Micrografx Corporation, of Richardson, Texas. "The sky's the limit now."

The story is the same from one developer to the next: Features that would have meant an ugly performance hit now can be included without any drop in speed. Moreover, that change, together with the increased interest in *Windows*, has brought many new PC and Macintosh developers to the *Windows* market, expanding the range of products available.

Boosting the Data Exchange Rate

Memory limitations in prior *Windows* releases made multitasking applications a pipe dream for most users. Not so any longer, say developers. Enhancements to *Windows*, coupled with a simultaneous enhancement to the DDE specification, will improve support for DDE among a variety of applications.

In the past, says Grayson, "you could put [support for] DDE in your application, but if a user tried to run it with *Excel*, there was never enough memory for both to work."

"We'll be looking for ways to improve the way we work with multiple applications," says *Excel* product manager Rich Tong. Tight links already exist between *Excel* and *Word for Windows*, and Microsoft is likely to write similar hooks between its other *Windows* applications.

However, to really enjoy the benefits of multitasking and push DDE, you'll need more than a 286 with 1MB of memory. Most developers agree that with *Windows 3.0*, you can now have three applications loaded and working, but you'll need a 386 and 2MB of memory.

Graphics Come of Age

Users of graphics applications will enjoy some of the greatest benefits under 3.0, including a host of features that prior

releases did not support.

Integration of high-resolution bit-mapped images is made feasible under Windows 3.0, largely due once again to the additional memory access. Previously, you couldn't manipulate high-resolution color images in memory, Grayson explains, since a single 8½-by-11-inch color image at 640 by 480 VGA resolution takes about 1MB of RAM. Bob Romney, president of Zenographics in Irvine, California, expects the enhanced support for bit-mapped images to foster a market for scanning and paint programs that can manipulate highly detailed images.

Presentation graphics products will also profit. Users of charting programs

Dwarcoming Mac Envy

hen it comes to providing an easyto-use, full-featured graphical environment, the Macintosh has had the PC beat hands down. Until recently, that is.

Developers of Macintosh and PC applications alike say *Windows 3.0* will finally give the Mac a run for its money. "The PC will be in direct competition with the Mac now that the 640K memory barrier is removed," says Bob Romney, president of Zenographics.


And it's not just the interface improvements that give rise to such claims. By year's end, most leading Macintosh business applications will also be running under Windows. These include desktop presentation packages such as PowerPoint from Microsoft and Persuasion from Aldus, as well as Wingz, the snazzy Macintosh spreadsheet from Informix in Lenexa, Kansas. In most cases the *Windows* and Macintosh products will offer a nearly identical interface and feature set.


Will the changes to *Windows* make diehard Macintosh fans switch to a PC? Probably not. Even though the environments will be roughly equal on the surface, the Mac still has some clear advantages. It does a better job of masking from the user the complexity of the operating system, says Doug Edwards, executive director of software marketing at Informix. "And you never have to exit to DOS on a Mac." He adds that the PC still doesn't have the characteristic "plug and play" of the Macintosh. "With an Intel PC running *Windows*, there's still a lot of configuring and customization to

do," he says.

Nonetheless, the PC has one great advantage: cost. PC users can outfit themselves with a 386SX, 2MB of memory, and an HP LaserJet IIP for half the price of a comparable Macintosh system, says Zenographics' Romney.


So while you may not see many Macintosh converts running *Windows* applications, *Windows*' powerful features and comparatively low price may eliminate some of the Mac envy suffered by PC users who've longed for a truly workable graphical environment. When it comes to new sales, there's little doubt that the PC's low price, together with corporate America's skeptical view of the Mac, will make it the graphical system of choice for many businesses. —*R. F.*

DTP Products to Battle It Out



hat Windows 3.0 means to desktop publishing can be summarized in one word: competition.

Were it not for the improvements in Windows 3.0—particularly in memory management—Ventura Publisher might never have found its way to the environment, says John Meyer, developer of the program now owned and marketed by Xerox subsidiary Ventura Software Inc. Now desktop publishing enthusiasts can sit back and watch the two top packages, Ventura and PageMaker, battle it out.

Ventura Publisher Windows Edition, due this spring, will require Windows 3.0, says Meyer, adding that a robust DTP package would be hampered in prior versions (see the preview "Ventura Publisher Joins the Windows Club" in this issue).

Archrival Aldus has introduced an upgrade to *PageMaker* (version 3.1) that leverages the new memory management scheme but lacks the new storybook editor, search and replace, and index feature included in *PageMaker 4.0* for the Macintosh, announced earlier this year.

"The memory improvements shouldn't be underplayed," says Mike Sherwood, PageMaker product manager. "Desktop publishing applications require several applications, ideally running at the same time," Sherwood says, noting that wasn't possible under prior versions of Windows. "Running PageMaker, Excel, and De-

signer or Corel Draw would bring the system to its knees," he says.

The first difference *Ventura* and *Page-Maker* users will notice under *Windows 3.0* is a snappier response. In *PageMaker*, Sherwood estimates that screen redraw will be 40 percent faster and the system more responsive to typed commands. Importing text and printing will also be significantly faster, he says.

DTP users on a net will see great improvement when running *PageMaker*, says Sherwood. In earlier releases, Aldus recommended that *PageMaker* run off local workstations, with the server used only to store common documents. Users can now run *PageMaker* off the server without suffering a significant loss in performance.

Users of the *GEM* version of *Ventura* will be struck by the interface change—a complete make-over in line with the upcoming OS/2 Presentation Manager version. The *Windows* version has features not possible in *GEM* including the ability to move styles between style sheets. It's also less mode oriented. A toolbox, similar to *PageMaker*'s, has been added, with all editing and page layout functions always available.

The battle won't begin in earnest until the major upgrade to *PageMaker* ships later this year, but the first glimpse of DTP under *Windows 3.0* speaks well of what's to come. —*R. F.*

like Micrografx's *Graph Plus* or desktop presentation programs like Microsoft's *PowerPoint* now can pick from 16.8 million colors and display 256 colors simultaneously. That means that with a high-end VGA board, *PowerPoint* users can create slides with smooth shaded backgrounds without dithering, says Connie Clark, *PowerPoint* product manager. The re-

sults, she says, are truer colors and more professional-looking slides.

Other Categorical Improvements

Communications packages now can support comm ports 3 and 4—earlier versions of *Windows* supported only ports 1 and 2. The boosted capability has already

been added to Crosstalk for Windows.

In spreadsheets, says Tong, the biggest limitation under prior *Windows* releases has been the inability to bring in large worksheets because of memory constraints. Because that barrier is eliminated with *Windows 3.0*, Microsoft can incorporate new features into *Excel* without worrying about performance. Tong adds, however, that the emphasis is likely to be on offering a more robust spreadsheet rather than an all-in-one application. "We can now expect that there's a word processor around, rather than having to rely on a complete text processor in *Excel*," he explains.

In data base management, Windows 3.0 is spurring product debuts, one prominent example being Borland's Paradox. It's also helping existing applications. Superbase 4, from Precision of Irving, Texas, for example, supports Dynamic Link Libraries in its 3.0-compatible release. Users will gain access to DLL addons that will provide access to SQL data bases and greater functionality in areas like charting and graphing.

Even interface developers such as hDC Computer and Publishing Technologies, which have made a living by improving the now-extinct MS-DOS Executive, are finding opportunities. "We look a lot better under *Windows 3.0*," says Marshall Spires, president of Publishing Technologies of Austin, Texas. The company has introduced *CBM Desktop Office*, a superset of its earlier *File Organizer* (see the preview "CBM: Icons and More Icons" in this issue).

Only the Beginning

While users will be impressed by the many enhancements made to their favorite *Windows* applications, all indications are that the best is yet to come. *Windows* 3.0, developers declare, opens up a world of new possibilities. Says Rick Parsons, manager of engineering for Corel Systems, of Ottawa, Ontario, "It will allow our imagination to run wild."





Ventura Publisher Joins the Windows Club

Ventura steps onto PageMaker turf and spruces up with Windows 3.0's memory management and interface enhancements.

entura Publisher gained its reputation and success by delivering no-nonsense document publishing tools for corporate America. If you wanted to finesse a newsletter, you were usually better off with Aldus's artsy PageMaker, but for churning out long, complex reports and catalogs, Ventura was the answer.

Many users avoided the program,

though, because it had hitched itself to the fading star of the *GEM* graphical environment. Now, with the arrival of Xerox's *Ventura Publisher Windows Edition*, the critics should give *Ventura* another look. Thanks in large part to *Windows 3.0*, *Ventura Publisher Windows Edition* is faster, more powerful, and easier to use. It's still more of a document publishing package than a graphic arts tool, but it's picked up a few artful steps from *Windows* (and *PageMaker*) that make it a better-balanced desktop publishing program.

Like the new Ventura 3.0 GEM ver-

sion and an upcoming OS/2 Presentation Manager edition, Ventura Publisher Windows Edition combines the base product, Professional Extension, and Network Server into a single \$895 package. An upgrade from Ventura 2.0 is a hefty \$250. All three editions—which together are called the Gold Series—add longer footnotes and new import filters for HPGL (a plotter standard), Microsoft Word 5.0, and Macintosh PICT II files. The Windows and OS/2 editions go bevond the GEM version, providing better scrolling, new color schemes, more predefined styles for ruling lines, a faster hyphenation dictionary, and support for more printers and displays.

But new features aren't the big story. The real benefit of *Ventura Publisher Windows Edition* is its improved memory management. Thanks to *Windows 3.0*, you can now run *Ventura* with other applications and quickly switch among the programs. In a 4MB system, for example, *Ami Professional* and *Corel Draw* can run alongside *Ventura*, allowing you to quickly edit text and graphics without exiting *Ventura*. This type of integrated environment is just what users have long sought.

Ventura is still mode oriented, but its improved RAM management begins to break down the walls between modes. Unlike with PageMaker, you still must select a paragraph icon before you can tag a paragraph with a style, and click on the frame icon before resizing a frame. However, you no longer select a graphic icon before drawing: You can now create squares, circles, and lines at any time.

Bye-Bye Sidebar

Ventura Publisher Windows Edition fully incorporates the new colors, push-button icons, and menus of Windows 3.0 and supports Windows' long list of printers and displays. Other welcome 3.0-spe-


cific improvements include easier on-line help (just press <F1>) and the addition of <Alt> hot keys for commonly used functions.

Ventura has yet to achieve full Windows citizenship, however. You can't open two document windows at once, and because the program lacks support for Dynamic Data Exchange, you can't, for example, create a hot link between Ventura and Excel files. Another limitation: Although Ventura supports Windows' Clipboard for text and vector graphics, you can't import bit-mapped graphics via the Clipboard. (You can, of course, still use the file menu to import bit maps.) In addition, you must save vector graphics as Windows metafiles when importing them via the Clipboard. On the plus side, you can use the Clipboard to copy and paste tags between style sheets.

In the old *Ventura*, a sidebar on the left side of the screen displayed icons for switching between modes (such as Paragraph and Frame) and provided other information. No longer. Replacing it are three windows that jut out from the right. Because they overlap the work area, the new windows are sometimes more intrusive than the sidebar, but you can always move, resize, or hide them. At the upper right, a PageMaker-style window called the Toolbox lets you click on the frame, paragraph, text, and table mode icons and select various drawing tools. Under that, a Tag List window shows a scrollable list of style sheet tags, and below that the File List displays associated text and graphics files. All this information was available on the old sidebar, but only if you first selected the proper mode. Now it's always visible, letting you change modes less often and decreasing the time lost redrawing the screen.

Ventura's top-line menus are largely the same, but a few have been revamped to good effect. The old Options menu is banished, for example, and its contents have been distributed among other menus. There are also two new menus: Text harbors formatting attributes, and Table contains table-editing functions.

Most of the dialog boxes have been

retooled to conform to *Windows 3.0*'s 3-D-style buttons, scroll bars, and dropdown lists. They're much easier to use than the old *GEM* screens, but the design isn't perfect. In some dialog boxes, *Ventura* stacks the new scrollable list menus one on top of another, making the list items difficult to distinguish from the options they overlap. Although some functions let you hold down a scroll arrow until the right number appears, too many force you to enter numbers.

Ventura borrows a few helpful tricks from PageMaker—it now offers automatic screen scrolling, which causes the screen to shift over as you type. Also, you can now define any color using RGB (red, green, blue) and HLS (hue, lightness, saturation) color schemes for more precise control of color output devices. In addition, a new set of predefined style choices for lines, circles, and boxes goes beyond the options offered in PageMaker.

Moving Up on PageMaker

Whether these improvements are enough to make *PageMaker* users switch is unclear. Most will await the *Windows 3.0*–specific *PageMaker 4.0*, due out later this year.

Ventura gains ground on PageMaker

3.0, but it fails to deliver a knockout punch. Only *Ventura* offers table and equation editors, vertical justification, and the ability to anchor graphics. It also stands out with long-document features such as cross-referencing, section numbering, and table of contents and index generation. However, only *PageMaker* wraps text around irregular shapes automatically and can import bit-mapped graphics via the Clipboard. *PageMaker*'s image controls for changing lightness and contrast are also notable.

Desktop Presentations Reach the PC at Last

PC graphics packages usually emphasize charting. Microsoft's PowerPoint encourages you to work with the entire presentation, from concept to slides to handouts.

hether a presentation is made up of color slides, overhead transparencies, or ordinary handouts, its images should be as consistent as the pages of a well-designed newsletter. Each image should contain the same fonts, a standard layout, and repeating graphic motifs. Unfortunately, most PC graphics packages make it tough to apply all of these principles throughout an entire presentation.

Microsoft PowerPoint has all the usual PC data-charting features, but its real purpose is to help you create unified presentations quickly—without graphic arts expertise. Global control over fonts, colors, and backgrounds ensures graphical consistency, while the ability to produce speaker notes, generate handouts,

and easily shuffle images meets presentation needs that most PC packages ignore. This constellation of features pegs *PowerPoint* as a typical "desktop presentation" package—typical for Macintosh users, that is.

Until now, CA Cricket Presents (formerly Xerox Presents) was the only PC program to offer a full set of desktop presentation features; like PowerPoint, it debuted on the Mac. But a late beta version of PowerPoint appeared to avoid Cricket Presents' major pitfalls: poor performance and weak data charting. Moreover, the \$495 package, due to ship by the time you read this, offers better control over color than any other business graphics package for the PC.

PowerPoint works with Windows 3.0

only, and it clearly benefits from the environment's enhanced look, performance, and device support. It employs 3.0's attractive push-button icons and scrollable menus, and separate charting and presentation modules use the new, richer Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) spec to keep data charts tied to data, no matter how you modify them. Double click on a chart you've copied to a slide, and up pops the charting module. According to Microsoft, new versions of Excel and Word for Windows will incorporate the new DDE spec; drop a chart into a Word for Windows document, for example, and you'll get the same integration.

Painless Productions

The key concept behind *PowerPoint* is one that originated with desktop publishing: the master page. *PowerPoint* calls this the *master slide*, a background layer that holds the elements to be repeated throughout a presentation. Once you've created the master slide, you switch to the individual slide layer and begin working image by image, while the master slide stays visible but uneditable. Creating the same show with most other packages would require copying backgrounds from slide to slide—and you couldn't make global changes.

PowerPoint comes with a dozen blackand-white templates for overhead transparencies and two dozen color ones for 35mm slides. Each template includes a master slide—with placeholders for the company name plus rules and other background graphics—and seven suggested formats for individual slides.

Type over text in any of these samples, and your input immediately matches the supplied font; word processing features like word wrap, search and replace, and a spelling checker further ease text handling. You can click and drag, delete, or size text and graphic objects easily.

The templates are so well designed, most users will probably stick with them and perform only minor edits. A library of over 400 high-quality clip-art images makes additional enhancement easy, and a Bitstream *Fontware Starter Kit* and

support for PostScript and Hewlett-Packard's PCL 5 page-description language add up to excellent control over fonts. However, skilled users accustomed to the strong drawing features of *Free-lance Plus* or *Windows Graph* will be disappointed: You can't draw freehand or flip or rotate objects, and there are no Bézier curves.

As partial compensation, *PowerPoint* imports graphics in nine formats, including Encapsulated PostScript, which is exported by such high-end drawing packages as *Corel Draw*. You can also import TIFF files to spice up output with scanned images.

Consummate Color Control

When you want to view final output, market leaders *Harvard Graphics* and *Freelance Plus* serve up an uneditable display in preview mode. But *PowerPoint* gives you a dynamic view as you work, showing the effect each change you make will have on your final output. And if you have a super-VGA board specifically supported by *Windows 3.0* (such as Headland's Video Seven V-RAM VGA), you can display 256 true, simultaneous colors on a VGA monitor.

This multiplicity of colors enables you to create shaded backgrounds that approximate the continuous tone of color slides. Best of all, each of *PowerPoint*'s 5000 or so recommended color schemes uses the background color as the starting point—and then supplies a complementary foreground color and six suggested accent colors. You can edit a color scheme or select a new one and apply it to an entire presentation with just a few mouse clicks. If none of the default colors appeals, you can mix your own.

Once you've fine-tuned color slides, you can use *PowerPoint*'s built-in communications module to send them directly to Genigraphics, a leading slide service with which Microsoft has a special arrangement. Genigraphics designed *Power-Point*'s color schemes, clip art, and many of the templates, which should ensure good color matches. Most of the log-on parameters are preset to make transmis-



sion a one-button affair.

Load the same presentation file and select other output options, and you can print black-and-white handouts and speaker's notes that include facsimiles of the slides. Creating handouts is pretty much automatic (you can fit two, four, or six slides on a page), and speaker's notes benefit from word processing features and room for half a page of text.

Capable Charting

Anyone who's used *Excel* will find *Power-Point*'s data-charting module familiar. Not only is the spreadsheetlike data entry form reminiscent of *Excel*, but the menus for selecting chart types, colors, line

styles, and so on are quite similar. This interface is exceptionally easy to use, and the selection of charting options is a cut above average.

You can import entire 1-2-3, Symphony, and (naturally) Excel worksheets, or import cell ranges by address or range name. PowerPoint's data sheet stretches to a capacious 128 rows by 128 columns, but you won't find number-crunching functions of the kind offered by Harvard Graphics or Windows Graph.

Once the data's in place, you pull down the chart menu, select a scatterplot or an area, bar, column, line, or pie chart, and choose from a subsidiary screenful of miniature chart variations. *PowerPoint* offers more permutations, and you get 3-D effects and a few more editing options, but otherwise the program thoroughly mimics *Excel*'s charting module.

PowerPoint's charting module includes such all-important formatting controls as the abilities to skip labels and to set minimum and maximum axis values. Oddly, the charting module limits color options to 8 and patterns to 16; you must copy the chart to a slide to exploit Power-Point's superb color control and full set of 22 patterns.





Project for Windows: A Manager's Tool

The interactive, customizable Microsoft Project for Windows promises to put project management into the hands of everyday users.

Microsoft Project for Windows lets you build and save your own custom views of a project. This view shows the resource histogram for one person's schedule, together with a Gantt chart that shows the person's activities in the same time period.

ollowing a trend toward more graphical interfaces in project management packages, *Microsoft Project for Windows* goes further than either Symantec's *TimeLine 4.0* or Scitor's *Project Scheduler 4.2.0* in the realm of graphics-based project management. Like those rivals, *Project for Windows* is aimed at the average business user more than the professional project manager. If you're a business manager wrestling with a small project—say you're relocating your company or coordinating a PR event—*Project*'s prompted, point-and-click approach could be the answer.

Designed for Windows 3.0, Project for Windows takes full advantage of that environment's new colors, push buttons, and drop-down lists. More important, it

uses Windows' memory management tricks to improve performance. Two products provide Project's Windows competition: Kidasa Software's Milestones, Etc., which was recently updated to a 3.0 version, and Project Outlook from Strategic Software Planning. But both Milestones, Etc., and Project Outlook are primarily scheduling and Gantt chart programs, whereas Project for Windows is a full-fledged project manager on a par with Microsoft's character-based Microsoft Project 4.0 and other midrange programs such as TimeLine.

Working with project management in a graphical environment has clear advantages. Instead of forcing you to flip through menus to enter task data in a generic form, *Project for Windows* lets you click directly on a task in a network logic diagram or a Gantt chart and add or change information on the spot. For example, to assign a resource to a series of tasks, you highlight each task in the Gantt chart and enter the resource in an on-screen form. If the resource doesn't exist, you're asked if you want to define it. Need to create another, similar project? Just highlight the tasks from an existing project and copy them into the new one—all of the interdependencies are maintained.

This interactive approach makes it simple to update a project, and novices can easily grasp the logic of resource assignment and connections between tasks. Another bonus: The user manual and context-sensitive on-line help are clear, precise, and especially helpful to neophytes.

At the same time, Project offers



enough analytical sophistication and flexibility to satisfy most project veterans. *Project* is not a true PERT system like *Primavera* and other heavyweights—it doesn't calculate the probability of completing a task. Unlike such high-end packages, it can't handle thousands of activities or meet all of the U.S. government's Cost/Schedule Control Systems Criteria (C/SCSC).

But Project is a complete Critical Path

Method (CPM) program for analyzing resources and costs. You can assign a cost to a resource, assign that resource to several tasks, and then arrive at labor expenditures versus budget. The program accommodates everything from overtime labor rates to multiple resource leveling strategies, and it even deals with advanced concepts such as earned value.

or a resource histogram next to a network diagram. Change a task duration on the Gantt chart, and the impact on any other view is automatically calculated. Once you build a custom view, you can save it as a menu option, in effect creating your own ad hoc screen writer. Since you're working in *Windows*, you can even run several copies of *Project* to view a number of

labor hours in *Project* could instantly update a cost versus budget graph in *Excel*. For the present, you can either pull in data via the Clipboard (an unsatisfactory solution) or import 1-2-3, dBASE, Excel, MPX, and ASCII files directly.

Project's network support will probably be limited to file locking and readonly options. Note, too, that *Project* lacks a macro facility.

Scheduled for May release, *Project* will list for \$695, making it competitive with leaders such as *TimeLine* and *Harvard Total Project Manager*. Given its innovative approach to a dreary job, *Microsoft Project* just might win over frustrated professionals—and give amateur project managers a more intuitive, visual way to plan and monitor projects.

All the connectivity logic that the market leaders support is here, such as lead/lag relationships (delayed and parallel start and finish), selective resource leveling, leveling across multiple projects, filtering, and more. And unlike the DOS version, this *Project* automatically updates subprojects whenever you change the master project.

One Project, Many Views

But *Project*'s main appeal will likely be its interactive, graphical approach to project building, maintenance, and analysis. You can enter task data directly or port it over from *Excel*; point, click, and drag to create and connect interdependent tasks; and add resources or new "percent complete" information to a group of tasks with a sweep of the mouse. Best of all, you can display and save different side-by-side views of project data.

This last feature gives *Project* an edge over all project management competitors because it lets you easily monitor the critical relationships between a project's elements. Make a few quick menu selections, and you can split the screen and display any two project views at once—a Cost Table next to a Gantt Chart, for example,

custom views at the same time.

As you might expect, *Project* can save these custom views as reports and print them out on any Windows-supported printer. First-time users, of course, can also choose from a number of prefab reports ranging from project summaries to periodic resource analysis. Anyone familiar with Excel can enhance a report in minutes. To add fonts, colors, shading, and so on, just highlight an area and pick what you need off a menu. To add footers, page numbers, and the like, fill in the onscreen page setup form. Since you can manipulate the position of activities pixel by pixel, you can squeeze more readable activities onto a page than with any other project management package.

Two Steps Forward, One Step Back

For all its charms, *Project* misses some obvious opportunities. According to Microsoft, this first release won't support Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links for automatically swapping data between supporting *Windows* programs. This is a keen disappointment when you consider what a natural pairing *Project* and *Excel* would be. For example, changing actual

CBM: Icons and More Icons

Does Windows really need another front end? Can CBM Desktop Office (aka PubTech File Organizer) survive in the Windows 3.0 era?

Desktop Office can display folders (directories) in a tree diagram. File names appear with icons attached, but because you can't display the file names without the icons, large directories make for a cluttered screen.

n the pre-Windows 3.0 era, many Windows users considered PubTech File Organizer a godsend. Compared to the much-maligned MS-DOS Executive file system, PubTech was a knight in shining icons. Recently upgraded and renamed CBM Desktop Office, the product still offers an appealing icon-based interface, capable file management features, and a host of other helpful tools, including a top-notch text editor.

But the MS-DOS Executive has been supplanted by *Windows 3.0*'s impressive Program Manager and File Manager, and *CBM* has lost some luster. Although it still outshines *Windows 3.0* in some areas, it can't justify its \$199.95 price or \$75 upgrade cost.

Like *Windows 3.0*, the latest update of *CBM* is visually more appealing. You can edit the multicolored icons, move them around, and link them to files.

They're more Macintosh-like—even down to the trash can icon.

The latest version also makes it easier to set up multiple desktop configurations and switch among them. For example, if you like to have a particular suite of utilities open when working with your spreadsheet, you can configure the applications as a desktop (DSK) file and load them all with a few mouse clicks. However, you can't assign each application a size and location on the screen, as you can with hDC's *FirstApps*.

CBM's file manager adds some new twists to the typical tree list of files and folders—every file is represented by an icon. If you drag an *Excel* worksheet file icon and drop it on the *Excel* application icon, the worksheet will load along with *Excel*. To print a file, simply drag it to a printer icon. Similarly, you can "lasso" a group of icons and move them to another

directory folder.

Although the icon system has its pluses, the icons themselves take up valuable screen space. Each one appears above its file name, and there's no command to turn them off. Another limitation: To display details such as size or date, you must open a separate view-only window.

Advanced users will prefer the Windows 3.0 File Manager. You give up the fancy icons, but you get more in return: a file list that lets you select the desired detail level; a better help system; and a more concise file listing. For example, File Manager saves space by placing icons on the same line as file names. And CBM's "drag and drop" techniques are available, as long as you don't mind dragging file names instead of icons.

CBM's main benefit is no longer its file manager but its utilities. You get a simple but capable backup-and-restore utility and a text-search utility that lets you search for text strings, locate file names that match a specified wild card, and even restore erased files. Windows 3.0 has none of this.

You also get a text editor that greatly improves upon *Windows*' Notepad. It works with files of any size and offers remappable keys, an appendable clipboard, multilevel undo, and macros. It won't double as a word processor, however, as it lacks formatting features like the ability to handle multiple fonts.

CBM Desktop Office still has a lot going for it, even considering Windows 3.0's improved file management. CBM needs to add some new tricks, however, before users will agree to make the added investment.



verybody knows the benefits of buying PCs from a top manufacturer.

Compatibility is almost a given. If something goes wrong, you can be confident there'll be a dealer nearby who can fix the problem. When you buy a system from IBM, Compaq, or any of the dozen or so second-tier PC manufacturers, you get security. And, of course, you pay for it.


Therein lies the lure of no-name clones. You save money on the purchase price—in some cases lots of it—when you select a brand that isn't nationally known.

For us, it was a choice between paying \$4000 for a no-name or \$10,000 for a 33-MHz Compaq 386," says Rob Tagg, vice president of Herbert Engineering, a San Francisco marine software development company. After weighing its options, the company chose the clone, buying both 286s and 386s from HIMS (Hardware Information Management Systems), a Milpitas, California, manufacturer.

No-name clones are available from hundreds of manufacturers and resellers, both retail and mail order. Prices run the gamut from slightly below the cost of their brand-name counterparts to rock-bottom. "I get two clones for the price of one [IBM] system," says Charles Holt, owner of Holt Auto Sales in Kissimmee, Florida. "You pay a premium when you buy IBM. Every time they add something new, they

charge you an arm and a leg." But system cost isn't the only factor to consider. As does Holt, some business buyers think the brand name price differential isn't justifiable. Others, though, say buying from clone makers can be risky: The potential for incompatibilities can be high, and support isn't always a given.

NO-NAME VERSUS BRAND NAME

When deciding whether to buy no-name equipment, "you have to ask yourself, do I need basic technical advice?" says John McHugh, a systems consultant and value-added reseller of clones based in Hudson, New Hampshire. "How much do I need to lean on a vendor? At

one end of the spectrum, there's a brand name dealer with DOS classes and a technical support staff. At the other end, there's the guy operating out of a second-story room, with three guys in the garage putting his equipment together." The point you choose on the spectrum depends on what you'll be using the system for, and on how technically inclined you are.


Charlie Clavadetscher, a motion-control cameraman with a special-effects studio in Northern California, says he wouldn't consider buying a brand name PC. He'd rather save the money.

Clavadetscher sets some guidelines as to which clone makers he'll buy from, however. "The smaller the ad and the more gimmicky, the less trust I'll put in a company." Moreover, he says, "I simply won't buy a product that hasn't been reviewed."

Earlier this year, Clavadetscher bought a no-name PC from a mail-order company whose price included a 30-day money-back guarantee. A one-year parts-and-labor contract was available at extra cost, says Clavadetscher, but he didn't buy it. "I figured computers don't fail that regularly."

As it happened, there was a problem with his computer (the case covered up the ports at the back of the advertised expansion slots), but Clavadetscher didn't discover it until after the 30-day trial period was up. He fixed the prob-

Following a few guidelines can help eliminate some of the uncertainty of buying a no-name PC.



BEFORE BUYING A NO-NAME CLONE

- request references from corporate customers
- if buying for business, ask whether evaluation units are available
- deal only with companies that have been operating under the same name and from the same location for at least one year
- buy only systems using industry-standard components, particularly with the motherboard, BIOS, video card, and hard disk
- shop around for companies that offer comprehensive after-sales support such as third-party maintenance contracts, a one-year warranty, and a technical support line
- buy from companies that offer an unconditional
 30-day money-back guarantee
- check with the local Better Business Bureau for a record of any complaints filed about the company
- get a written explanation of all warranty information and service policies before paying for anything
- check that the power supply has been tested and approved by either the Underwriters Laboratory (UL) or the Canadian Standards Association (CSA)



THEN, IF BUYING FROM A LOCAL DEALER

- visit the store several times before purchasing a system. The busier the store, the more likely that it's doing a good job servicing customers
- talk with staff. Will they be able to assist you if you encounter problems down the road?
- check with the local PC user group for references
- test any equipment before leaving the store



MAIL ORDER SHOPPERS SHOULD

- confirm all phone orders in a follow-up letter or fax
- find out when and how products will be shipped
- ask to be notified if items are out of stock
- pay only with a credit card or a company purchase order (see Consumer Watch, May 1990)

lem himself by rewiring the PC, but he lost an expansion slot in the process.

Clavadetscher's biggest complaint, however, concerned the documentation. His computer came with generic documentation that dealt with the company's entire product line in one booklet. Clavadetscher was unfazed, however. "I can slog through anything," he says.

Clavadetscher's experiences point to an important consideration when buying a no-name clone: Will you be able to roll up your sleeves and fix the system yourself? If not, make sure that your vendor is among those who offer comprehensive service and support plans.

Service options are just one element to think about. Although a clone's basic components may rival those in its brand name counterparts, no-name clones may lack certain extras—such as the proprietary memory architecture built into a Compaq or AST Research machine—that can boost their overall performance.

There's always the issue of compatibility to consider. Given the wide variety

HOUSE CALLS: ON-SITE SERVICE CONTRACTS PROMISE FAST RELIEF

hen Rab Tagg bought a clane fram Milpitas-based HIMS, he gat the stondard 30-day money-back guarantee. Far na extra charge, he received a ane-year on-site repair and service cantract with Autamated International, a maintenance arganization with 414 service centers acrass the United States and Canada.

Increasingly, no-nome clane manufacturers are bundling in such repair cantracts supparted by third-party service organizations. If the equipment breoks dawn, sameone cames ta your hame ar business (usually within 24 hours of your call), diagnases the problem, and repairs the system. Farget having ta send the PC back to the monufocturer. Farget days ar weeks af dawntime.

Needless ta soy, service quality varies by campany. Cansider the case af Charles Halt, awner af Halt Auta Sales in Kissimmee, Flarida. Halt baught a 386 system fram Prateus Technalagy af Cliftan, New Jersey, in large part because of the campany's pledge of 15 manths af free an-site service and support. When he experienced prablems with the system, he telephaned Prateus far help. But when telephone technicol

suppart foiled to solve the prablem, Halt waited twa weeks far the pramised ansite visit. Once o technician fram a lacol service campony (contracted far on-site service by Prateus) did shaw up, he was unable ta fix the system. "We had to send the PC back ta Prateus," says Halt. The system was down far five months and still hasn't been satisfactarily repaired.

Halt had relied on the company's advertisement, rather than an a written cantract. Far your awn pratection, get the detoils af ony support plan in writing, including the name and a cantact person at the local repoir center, befare you place on arder.

Same clane makers cantract with nationwide mointenance companies such as Bull HN Infarmatian Systems' (farmerly Honeywell) Custamer Services Organizatian in Newtan, Massochusetts, and General Electric in Narcrass, Geargia. Others ga with smoller regional firms. In either case, technicians should know how to service your system and, barring unusual circumstances, be able to carrect a problem an-site.

If your PC vendar daesn't affer on an-site repair plon, you con purchase ane directly from either a lacal ar a notianal arganization. Ellen Ferrata, account monager of service cantracts with Serviceware, af San Jose, California, says the lure of repair cantracts is clearly canvenience. "We come on-site and da the repair, as well as preventive maintenance. All ports and labor are included; it's a fixed budget cost with na surprises."

If your campony is smoll or you want to caver the PC you use at hame, you may hove no choice but to sign up with a local firm, since nationwide service argonizations tend to restrict direct service contracts to large corporations.

"We cansider a custamer who spends \$50,000 o year ar less on maintenance a small custamer," says General Electric camputer services representative Harry Williams.

GE will service "just about any brand of PC," according to Williams—if o custamer has enough of the brand to justify any additional training that GE technicians may require. After oll, soys Williams, "PCs all have the same integral parts."

Befare signing up with a particular company, ask far referrals, particularly fram custamers whose mointenance needs are similar to those of your argonization.

of hardware components and software packages on the market, glitches are inevitable. Although most peripherals companies test their products with the best-selling PCs, few guarantee that those products will also run on a noname clone. And if a problem does arise, neither vendor may be much help.

MAIL ORDER VERSUS RETAIL

Once considered a mine field for unsuspecting PC shoppers, mail-order PC purchasing is gaining more respect. In

the "old days" (five to ten years ago), mail-order houses offered 30-day warranties, or, at best, a whopping 90-day warranty. Today, one-year parts-and-labor warranties are the norm, and some companies offer repair contracts with local vendors. Toll-free technical support lines aren't uncommon; some operate around the clock. Although each increment of service is likely to be reflected in a no-name clone's price, many buyers find the extras well worth the added cost.


Still, everyone's heard stories about incorrect systems being shipped, computers showing up dead on arrival, and PCs never arriving at all. Such reports prompt some buyers to shy away from the mail-order channel, opting instead for the feeling of security that can go with face-to-face contact.

The main advantage of buying a clone from a local dealer is that you can see the system and the company you're dealing with before committing any funds. And if something goes wrong

You'll want to ask the company a few basic questions: Is there a guaranteed response time? How many technicians are on call? Where's the nearest service center (in case a problem can't be resolved on-site)? Does the company have a toll-free number for technical support? How about a 24-hour answering service for emergencies? Can the contract be renewed annually?

And then there's the most important question of all: Is the service contract cost-effective for your business, your budget, and your time constraints? The security of third-party maintenance isn't cheap: Expect to pay about 10 percent of the PC's original price, each year.

"If you're considering a long-term service contract, compare the cost of the contract with that of simply replacing components," advises systems consultant John McHugh. "If you have a 286 PC with something less than an 80MB hard drive, for example, the most ex-

pensive component—the drive—will cost you less than \$500 to replace," he cautions. "If you're spending that

amount within two years for a service contract, you may not be coming out ahead." -M. H.

(and you aren't able to fix it yourself), taking a computer back to a local dealer is typically easier and less expensive than making a series of calls to a distant mail-order house and perhaps ultimately packing up the computer and sending it back.


Another big difference between mail order and retail: With mail order, it can be difficult to determine a company's size and resources. Recommendations from satisfied customers can help alleviate concerns, but for some buyers nothing replaces the chance to walk into a store and see what you're dealing with.

Then there's the issue of price to consider. Mail-order firms don't require as much overhead as retail stores, and prices usually reflect that savings. For Herbert Engineering's Tagg, however, choosing a local vendor over a mail-order one wasn't a matter of price so much as getting fast repair. "I want somebody to yell at if my PC breaks down," he says.

Whether buying retail or mail order,

purchasing a no-name clone calls for a caveat emptor policy, says Brian Camenker, recently retired as executive director of the Boston Computer Society. "A lot of these little companies go to COMDEX, make deals to get bulk parts, and then literally assemble the parts in a garage." He says he has a rule for purchasing no-names: "Have the retailer assemble it for you in the store and show it to you working."

There's one drawback to Camenker's rule, though, says Eric Boutwell, man-

ager of applications development with the San Francisco Unified School District. "You never know how a PC is going to operate until you get it into your own working environment."

BUSINESS VERSUS HOME USE

Boutwell flat-out advises against buying no-name clones for business. "If you're buying a PC for business, you can't afford to have it not work. You can't justify saving several hundred dollars on a device that will cost you thousands in lost productivity if it goes down."

Boutwell speaks from bitter experience. In 1988 the school district bought three AT clones from a local store that has since gone out of business. "We needed to get the PCs on budget for a

project," says Boutwell. The systems worked fine at first, but compatibility problems started popping up when it came time to install tape drives and hook the PCs up to the network. "The units also lost their setup information about once a month, so you'd have to reconfigure them," says Boutwell.

That wasn't all. One of the PCs worked erratically, showing repeated disk error messages. By swapping components with a machine that did work, Boutwell's staff discovered the problem was a faulty power supply. Boutwell believes small manufacturers are likely to scrimp on quality components. "Small places buy the cheapest power supplies they can," he says. "Brand names deliver much cleaner power to the rest of the

system. But unless you're an electrical engineer, you're not going to know what to look out for.

"You end up with more for your money when you buy a brand name," asserts Boutwell. "You go to the top of the scale to a reputable dealer who will service the PC in your area, because when you need something fixed or replaced, you can't afford to wait."

Camenker echoes that sentiment. But for personal use, he bought a 386 system from "a little place run out of a garage in an industrial park—a real back-door operation," he says. "If you have company funds at your disposal, buy from a retail store and buy a brand name. But if you're buying it yourself and you need to save money, buy from a

local place that has a storefront, so you know they'll be there. That way, if anything breaks—and it always does, brand name or otherwise—you can take it right back."

Tagg, a veteran clone buyer for business, sees a remarkable difference between the attitudes of big corporations and small companies toward no-name clones. In the corporate world, he says, "you only get in trouble when things go wrong—it's not as important to save a little money. Corporate buyers are put in a position of not being able to try anything with any amount of risk. Big companies don't recognize the amount of money they can save."

George Sandoval, vice president of L & W Microcomputing, a no-name clone manufacturer in Nashua, New Hampshire, agrees. "Popular wisdom says if you buy IBM you'll never get fired," he says. "But as users become more technically knowledgeable, that theory becomes less relevant."

Dennis Clark, the data processing manager for CMS East, a cemetery management company in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, says his experience buying mail order soured him on no-name equipment entirely. Clark purchased four PCs via mail order from Wells American of Columbia, South Carolina. He put one-third down and placed a rush order in March of last year but didn't receive the machines until early June. "That's a long time to wait when you're a business," says Clark.

His problems weren't over when the PCs arrived. One of the machines didn't work, thanks to a bad CPU board. Wells American had a 30-day money-back guarantee and a one-year parts-and-labor contract, says Clark, but "we didn't know you'd have to send the machines back when you needed them fixed." Pressed for time, Clark returned an 80-pound machine to its manufacturer by Federal Express, an experience he doesn't recommend duplicating.

More headaches lay in wait. Clark needed to add memory to the systems and ordered and paid for memory modules from Wells American—which went out of business shortly thereafter. "I'd never before bought non-IBM equipment," says a chastened Clark. "This experience underscores the theory that you can't go wrong with IBM."

PICKING A VENDOR

There are ways to minimize the risk of buying no-name clones—whether through the mail or from a local dealer. The guidelines aren't that different for the two channels, according to consultant McHugh.

BEFORE BUYING, LOOK FOR A COMPANY WHOSE SERVICES MATCH YOUR NEEDS.

How long has the company been in business? Is a client list available? "If they've been selling PCs for the past three years and have 200 clients who are pretty satisfied, that's a good sign, especially if they're selling to larger buyers," suggests McHugh.

If you're considering a local retailer, check for references with the local PC user group. "No-name dealers don't have the budget for national advertisements, necessarily," says McHugh, "but they'll put an ad in the local PC user group newsletter. If the dealers are good, most of the techies in the group will know about them."

Look for a company whose services match your needs. If your PC were to break down, how fast would you need it back up and running? Are there other PCs to fill the gap while this one is being repaired? Some retailers and mail-order companies have a guaranteed turnaround time for repairs (usually ranging from 24 to 72 hours after the companing from 24 to 72 hours af

ny determines what's wrong). Some will also provide replacement units while PCs are being repaired.

Do you need an on-site service contract? Would it cost less in the long run to have a service contract with a local third-party provider, or even to retain a systems consultant?

Most clone makers offer technical support, but how easily can you reach the company? Fifteen minutes of Muzak on the line before your call is answered, or calls that aren't returned within a day, could portend frustrations to come (not to mention hours of lost productivity). "They always answered the phone when I wanted to buy something," Clark recalls about the now-defunct Wells American. "But technical support would take two or three days to get back to me."

To minimize potential compatibility problems, look for systems that are built with brand name components, preferably components that are included in systems that have gotten good reviews. If you're planning on using the clone as a network server, remember that networks breed incompatibility problems. For your protection, make sure compatibility with your network system software is guaranteed.


KNOW YOUR VENDOR

Above all, say clone buyers, go with a company you trust. Recommendations from other business users are the best guarantee of getting quality systems from a company that will be there for you after the sale.

Fortunately, says McHugh, clone makers are realizing the importance of repeat business. And that means better systems and better service. "The noname clone market isn't as risky as people think," he suggests. "It tends to be a market where cost savings outweigh risk." As long as you know what you're getting, and who you're getting it from. \clubsuit



Backing up with tape is almost effortless compared to using floppies: Since you don't have to change disks every 2 minutes, your entire hard disk can be saved while you're fighting commuter traffic or having a leisurely dinner. And because it's more likely to get done, an easier backup means more secure data.

At first used primarily with file servers, tape backup drives have become practical for individual use, thanks to smaller sizes and lower prices. This Buyers' Guide surveys internal tape drives that list for less than \$1000 and range from 40MB to 152MB in capacity. Not included here are external drives, which you might consider if all of your drive bays are occupied or if you need to move a tape drive from one PC to another easily. However, because external tape drives cost between \$100 and \$200 more and clutter up your desktop, most users prefer internal models.

In deciding which tape drive to buy, you need to evaluate both the drive itself and the software that comes with it. Because the backup doesn't require your presence once it's set in motion and can therefore be run during your lunch break or at night, speed isn't as important as with floppy-based backup. However, when you need to archive a few files before getting them off your

hard disk, or when you need to restore an overwritten file, performance counts. Price and warranty are also important; the drives here range from \$399 to \$995, and most of them come with one-year warranties.

INSIDE THE DRIVE

One of the first things to consider when buying a tape

backup system is how much you can put on a tape. If you want to start a full backup and walk away, a tape drive that holds the contents of your hard disk is the bare minimum you'll require. If the drive holds more, you can put multiple backups on a single tape and keep a large archive of past work without wasting cartridges. Many drives advertise a "compressed" capac-

ity of twice their standard volume, but these figures should be regarded with skepticism. The capacities listed here are without compression.

You'll probably want your drive to be compatible with a variety of cartridges and other drives. Almost all low-cost tape drives use 3M's DC (Data Cartridge) line of 1/4-inch cartridges, formatted in one or more of the QIC (Quar-

ter-Inch Committee) standards. 3M licenses DC technology to other manufacturers, so cartridges are available from more than one vendor. The most common formats are QIC-40, which has a


capacity of 40MB with some cartridges and 60MB with others, and the QIC-80, with capacities of 80MB and 120MB. In theory, any backup done on a QIC-40-formatted DC2000 should be restorable from any drive that supports DC2000s and QIC-40, even if the drive is from another vendor. In practice, however, few vendors guarantee that a backup tape made by one of their drives can be read by

another drive of the exact same model. The older QIC formats, such as QIC-24 and QIC-36, are even less compatible. Note also that compressing data will make the tape incompatible with other ven-

dors' products.

Some drives use Teac's CT cassettes rather than DC cartridges. Similar in design to audio cassettes, CTs lack the complex inner workings of DCs, making them less likely

to be physically damaged and therefore more reliable. But CTs aren't as widely accepted as DCs, nor do they have a standard format. If your CT tape drive and hard disk go up in flames but your cartridge is

safely stored elsewhere, you'd better make sure the replacement drive is from the same company.

About half of these drives fit in a 3½-inch drive bay, and all of them will go into a standard half-height, 51/4-inch bay; 3½-inch drives require a special mounting brace to go into a larger bay, but these braces either come with the drives or are available at nominal cost.

QIC-40 and QIC-80 drives can work off a standard floppy controller; unless your controller has reached its limitmost can handle two floppy drives, some up to four-you won't need to give up a slot. Tape drives using earlier QIC versions or proprietary formats usually require you to install their own interface cards. The card may increase speed but requires an extra slot. Even if you're using the floppy controller, because of hardware differences, you should specify whether you have a standard AT or Micro Channel bus when you buy a drive.

You'll want a dependable drive, of course. A drive's mean time between failures (MTBF) is the average number of hours the drive can run before breaking down. The MTBFs listed in the accom-

panying table are based on the manufacturers' claims and have not been tested by a third party.

SOFTWARE: THE DRIVE BEHIND THE DRIVE

A tape drive is useless without backup software. Every listed drive comes with a menu-driven program for backing up selected files or your entire hard disk. Some basic features to look for are error correction and an alarm to warn you if you're about to overwrite a previous backup. Data compression may be desirable if you want to increase your cartridge's capacity, but it slows down tape backups even more than it does floppy ones. Furthermore, compressed data can be restored only by the program that compressed it. You may also want security features such as password protection and the ability to erase data so that it cannot be restored.

The more options you have for choosing files to back up or restore, the better. All of these drives can back up and restore by directory, file name, and date, and all are capable of restoring a specific file that you just wrote over. Most can also back up by archive bit, which will be on if a file's been changed since it was last backed up.

Most packages provide image backup—the ability to copy a disk drive sector by sector rather than file by file. This feature is useful if you have copy-protected software or other files that must occupy a particular sector, but it prohibits you from doing incremental backups or restoring a particular file.

You may not be limited to the software that comes with your drive. Some commercial backup programs support some tape drives, including recent Best Buy PC Tools Deluxe (see "No-Excuses Backup Software," July 1990). The selection isn't wide, however. A word of caution: Several commercial backup programs, intended mostly for floppy use, claim to be compatible with tape drives. When you read the fine print, however, you'll discover they work only with the very few tape drives that can act as DOS devices (appearing to DOS as disk drives).

If your tape drive acts as a DOS device, you can back up

with any floppy-based backup program or even a simple XCOPY. But because tape lacks the random access abilities of disk, tape access is excruciatingly slow.

If you're using OS/2 or plan to switch to it in the near future, you'll want your drive and its software to work with that operating system. If you're going to be using OS/2 1.2's optional High Performance File System (HPFS), you'll need a drive that can support that as well.

A good tape drive can save you the trouble of shuffling floppies through a backup. Without that nuisance, your data stands a better chance of survival.



Upgrades

hen your underpowered PC chokes on sophisticated new software, you're likely to find performing basic hardware upgrades much more costeffective than replacing your system. It doesn't take an expert to do most upgrades. Not only will you save money, you won't be without your PC while it's in the shop.

But be aware that safety hazards abound for both you and your computer anytime you pop the hood, and small mistakes can spell big trouble for delicate electronic parts. Read on for insiders' tips on how to perform four typical under-the-hood tasks: adding an expansion board, upgrading RAM, adding a math coprocessor, and installing either an internal floppy or a tape drive.

Getting Off to a Safe Start

Don't unplug the system or remove the cover yet-first you must discharge yourself of static electricity, because a spark from your hand can damage sensitive chips. The power cord has the necessary ground line, provided it's in a grounded outlet, for static discharge. Touch an unpainted metal part of the PC's chassis, such as the fan grill. Now you're ready to pop the lid, which brings us to the number one safety rule: Always unplug the machine before removing the cover. This eliminates your risk of electrical shock and protects your computer from power arcs and short circuits.

To reduce static buildup while working, don't wear polyester clothes, avoid opening your PC on very dry days, and don't wear rubber-soled shoes if you have wool carpets. Hold expansion boards by their edges, and don't touch the gold-plated connectors—even clean, uncharged hands can leave a film that may spoil the connection (if you do notice any tarnish, you can remove it with a pencil eraser).

Any of the four upgrades covered in

this article may involve setting jumpers or DIP switches on the motherboard (see FIGURE 1). Always write down the original settings before making changes to ensure you can back out of an unsuccessful installation. Some standard PC-, XT-, and AT-compatible systems—and all Micro Channel and Extended Industry Standard Architecture (EISA) systems—let you use menudriven configuration software instead.

Your PC's user manual should detail upgrade procedures, but some manuals are confusing. If you're not sure of which switch to switch, call the manufacturer's technical support line (or your dealer) first; if you don't get results, contact the person who sold you the upgrade product.

Adding an Expansion Board

Whether you're upgrading monitors, adding RAM, or hooking your PC to a LAN, most upgrades mean installing a new expansion board. The procedure seems easy enough: You just remove the PC's cover, locate an empty expansion slot, and plug in the board. But there's a little more to it than that.

First you need to make sure the slot

and the board match (consult FIGURE 2 for examples of slot types). Note that PC- and XT-compatible computers contain standard 8-bit slots, while AT compatibles (a category that includes all standard 286, 386, and 486 systems) usually contain both 8-bit and 8/16-bit slots.

Ideally, you would install an 8-bit board in an 8-bit slot and a 16-bit board

in an 8/16-bit slot, but scarce slots, handme-down boards, and such sometimes make this match impossible. An 8-bit board will work in an 8/16-bit slot, provided the bottom of the board is designed to clear the remainder of the slot connector. Even though an increasing number of 16-bit boards work in 8-bit slots, you should avoid this situation if you can: You'll pay extra for the 16-bit



Systems with Micro Channel slots—that is, IBM PS/2s (Model 50 and up) and compatibles—accept only Micro Channel boards. EISA systems, on the other hand, contain 32-bit EISA slots, which accept both EISA boards and standard 8-bit and 16-bit boards. The same rule that applies to standard boards goes for Micro Channel and EISA boards: If you must install a board in a slot connector of a different size, it's best to choose a connector that's too large rather than too small, even if the board works in either case.

Like motherboards, expansion boards usually have DIP switches or jumpers that may require adjustment. All boards come with specific configuration instructions, but when motherboard adjustments are required, you'll have to consult your PC's owner manual. Be sure you have the necessary manuals and utilities before you start swapping boards, and write down all current switch and jumper settings before making changes.

Micro Channel and EISA boards are self-configuring; with a standard board, though, you may follow the instructions exactly and still find that the device doesn't work. If the manufacturer's technical support can't help, you may be able to resolve the problem yourself.

First, remove all memory-resident software from memory; if the board works, add the programs back one at a time to identify the culprit. If the board still doesn't work, the problem is probably a conflict over one of three parameters, in descending order of likelihood: the interrupt, the I/O address, or the ROM address. You don't really need to know what these system-level assignments mean. But you may need to know the interrupt, I/O address, and ROM address of the board you just installed and to change settings if two devices have the same assignment(s). These specifications should appear in the documentation for both your board and your system.

FIGURE 3: SIMMs, which are used by most high-end systems, provide a much easier way to add memory than chips. To install a SIMM, insert it at a 45-degree angle completely into the connector and push it down until it snaps into place.

To help you ensure that each board's assignment is unique, on-board DIP switches, jumpers, or utilities generally provide a wide range of settings. Simply changing the interrupt on the board you just installed often solves the problem.

Boards without such flexibility, however, can be a pain. You may have to dig up the manuals for all the other boards in your system and change their settings instead. First write down the current and alternative interrupts, I/O addresses, and ROM addresses for all boards in your system. Then find the conflict-free group of settings that requires the fewest changes.

In PC-, XT-, and AT-compatible systems with many expansion boards, resolving such conflicts is not always possible. If that's the case, return the incompatible board for a refund and try another board that offers different settings.

Upgrading Memory

RAM comes in two basic types: single chips and multichip single in-line memory modules (SIMMs). Each is available in various speeds and capacities, which must match your PC's processing speed and memory specs. Your user's manual should tell you which chips or SIMMs to use, where they fit, and whether you need to set any jumpers or DIP switches on the expansion board or the motherboard.

When adding memory, always fill any open SIMM or memory-chip sockets on the motherboard first. If your system

runs at 10 MHz or faster, it may also have a dedicated memory slot—the second-best place to add memory, using a special high-speed memory board (usually available only from the system manufacturer). The third choice is to add a memory board to the expansion bus, where (depending on the type of system) standard, Micro Channel, or EISA slots are located.

As you can gather from **FIGURE 3**, popping in a SIMM is a breeze, whether you install it on the motherboard or on an expansion board. But chips can be tricky: A chip installed backward will fry on power-up, and bent pins break easily, rendering a chip useless. A chip insertion tool (available for around \$5 from any supply house) can protect against bent pins. If you're without one, carefully follow the instructions in **FIGURE 4** for installing an 8087 or 80287 math coprocessor.


Adding a Math Coprocessor


Spreadsheets and CAD packages are the most common applications written to take advantage of a math coprocessor, a chip that plugs into a special socket on the motherboard. Once it is installed, the coprocessor can speed up these programs' numeric-intensive operations dramatically.


Which type of math coprocessor you install depends on both the type of CPU that is in your system and the type of coprocessor that your software supports; **FIGURE 5** provides a general guide. In the majority of cases, the math copro-









cessor's speed matches the CPU's (a 12-MHz 286 uses an 80287-12 coprocessor chip, and so on). As usual, you should consult your system's documentation to make sure.

The 8087 and 80287 chips are the most difficult to install, and there's no economical insertion tool available. To straighten the pins, lay the chip on its side on a hard, flat surface, and gently tilt and press until the leads are perpendicular to the body. If you press them too far, gently bend them back with a pencil or ruler. Then follow **FIGURE 4** closely.

The 80387SX, 80387, and Weitek chips are square devices with pin-filled underbellies that look like beds of nails. These chips are easier to install than 8087s or 80287s, but four possible orientations—only one of which is correct—triple the chance of error. One corner of the chip is beveled. Point the beveled corner at the white dot or raised corner of the math coprocessor socket, align the pins, and press into place.

After the chip is plugged in, you must set a DIP switch (or run your system's setup utility) and reinstall your applica-

tion for a math coprocessor in order to reap the benefits.

Installing Floppy and Tape Drives

Adding a 3½-inch floppy disk drive to your PC makes exchanging data with laptops or PS/2s quick and easy. Tape drives that run off floppy controllers are an inexpensive and convenient backup method. You follow the identical procedure to install either one.

Most PCs support only two floppy drives, so if your system already has two 5½-inch floppies, remove the B: drive before proceeding. Most disk drives are held in place by two screws on the front of the chassis and one on either side of the drive. Once the screws are removed, slide the drive forward and disconnect the four-wire power plug and 34-pin ribbon cable. Owners of IBM PCs and XTs must remove two screws on either side of the bay.

If your PC has never before had a second, externally accessible drive, you'll have to remove the drive bay's cover plate before you do anything. In addition, check your system manual to see if you need to reset motherboard jumpers or DIP switches or to run your system's setup software.

Slide the new drive into the empty bay and secure it with the supplied hardware. Then plug the power cable into a socket on the rear of the drive (the plug is keyed to fit only one way). On the ribbon cable attached to the A: drive, find the unused 34-pin connector (the one you just removed, if you took out the B: drive), and attach it to the matching tab at the rear of the new drive. Some connectors are keyed and will fit only one way; otherwise, match pin 1 of the cable (marked with a red stripe on the cable or a mark on the socket) to pin 1 on the drive's tab (labeled or marked by a notch).

If you can't fit your hand in to attach the connectors, reverse the preceding steps: Attach the connectors first, and mount the drive afterward. If you're adding a tape drive, remember that you'll probably have to install the software provided with the unit before you can get it up and running.

Money in the Bank

You can save a lot by installing a hard-ware upgrade yourself, but you may lose money if you do it wrong. It's safest to buy your upgrade from a reputable firm with good technical support. If you have any problems or doubts during installation, someone knowledgeable will be only a phone call away.





Words Into Print



Word Processing

Tips for getting the most out of your word processor

This month: Accelerate word processing chores with Word's glossary files, change the case of Word text, and turn WordPerfect into a calculator.

George Campbell

icrosoft Word's glossary feature lets you set up hot keys to summon macros and boilerplate text, saving countless keystrokes. You can even create a custom glossary file for each directory, so you load only those entries you need for a particular type of document.

When Word runs, it loads a glossary file, NORMAL.GLY, that lets you insert page numbers, dates, times, and footnotes. For example, to insert the date at the cursor, type date and then press <f3>. But glossaries are most useful when you add your own entries. These can be macros or text of any length, and they can include formatting and graphics. Likely candidates include memo forms, logos, letterheads, address blocks, and boilerplate text. This col-

umn explains how to create *Word 5.0* glossary entries and how to set up a customized glossary for each type of document you create.

Create a Closing Signature

First, let's create a typical glossary entry. To create a signature block short-cut, follow these steps:

- 1. On any *Word* screen, type the signature block you normally use.
- 2. Highlight the block, and press < Esc > c.
- 3. At the 'Copy to:' prompt, type an abbreviation such as yrs, and then press <Enter>.
- 4. To save the abbreviation in NOR-MAL.GLY, press < Esc>tgs < Enter>.
- 5. To insert the block at the end of a letter, type yrs and press < F3>.

When naming a glossary entry, con-

sider how often you'll use it. Frequently used entries should have short, mnemonic names. Give macros a MAC extension to avoid confusion. To summon a glossary entry, type its name and press <F3>, or press <Esc>i<F1> and pick an entry from a list.

Managing Multiple Glossaries

Many users wisely set up separate directories for each document type. If you do this, you may want some universal macros and abbreviations to be available in every directory and others available only in certain directories. FIGURE I shows a typical system of *Word* directories and related glossaries. No matter what directory you're in, *Word* automatically loads NORMAL.GLY. As a default, it loads this file from the main *Word* directory, but if you have saved

Instant Calculator

WordPerfect 5.1 includes a popup calculator macro, but you can build a better one using 5.1's new Table feature. Follow the steps below:

- 1. Press < Ctrl>-< F10> to begin macro recording.
- 2. Press <Alt>-c, type calculator, and press <Enter> to name and describe the macro.
- 3. Press <Alt>-<F7>tcl <Enter> <Enter> mf to create a one-cell table.
- 4. Press < Ctrl>-< PageUp>p < Enter> < Enter> to insert a pause and simulate a calculation.
 - 5. Press <F7><Home>

<Home><Cursor Left> < Backspace>y to remove the table's box.

6. Press **<Ctrl>-<F10>** to end macro recording.

To do a simple calculation, press <**Alt>-c.** (If you're working with Reveal Codes on, press <**Alt>-<F3>** before running the macro to turn this mode off.) A box will appear on the screen. Enter a formula, using +, -, *, and / as operators. You can also include parentheses for complex calculations. Press <**Enter>** to paste the result into the text.

Merging Word Glossaries




FIGURE 1: Here's a typical Microsoft Word directory system. You can set up glossaries full of custom macros and boilerplate text for each directory. Keep macros that you want to use in all directories in the NORMAL.GLY glossary and keep specialized glossaries in each directory.

copies of NORMAL.GLY in other directories, *Word* loads the copy saved in the current directory, which can lead to confusion. To make this system work, delete all copies, leaving only the master NORMAL.GLY file in the main *Word* directory.

When you have just one NOR-MAL.GLY, you're ready to set up specialized glossaries. If you have a \LETTERS directory and want to set up a special glossary for it, for example, do the following:

- 1. Start *Word*, then use the Transfer Options command to change to your \LETTERS directory.
- 2. To save a copy of NORMAL.GLY under a new name, press < Esc>tgs, type letters, and press < Enter>.
- 3. Press < Esc>tgc< F1> to begin deleting any unwanted entries one by one. Highlight an entry, then press < Enter>y to delete it. Repeat as necessary to clean up the new glossary.

You can now add entries designed for writing letters, without affecting the default NORMAL.GLY glossary. Save your additions by pressing <Esc>tgs <Enter>. If you forget, Word prompts you when you exit.

The new glossary remains active only

until you quit *Word*. The next time you start the program, it will again load NORMAL.GLY. To load LETTERS-.GLY instead, press < Esc>tgl, type letters, and press < Enter>.

Merging Glossaries

Now you have universal entries in NOR-MAL.GLY and individual entries in LETTERS.GLY. How can you access both? *Word*'s Transfer Glossary Merge command lets you temporarily merge another glossary into NORMAL.GLY.

If you use the Glossary Merge command instead of the Glossary Load command, you'll have access to the entries of

both glossary files. For example, when you enter the \LETTERS directory, you would press < Esc>tgm, type letters, and then press < Enter>.

If you adopt this system, however, keep these points in mind: If you merge two glossaries, then change directories and want to merge a separate glossary with NORMAL.GLY, use Transfer Glossary Load to reload a fresh copy of NORMAL.GLY. Otherwise, all three glossaries will merge. Also, when you quit *Word* after merging glossaries, answer no when prompted to save glossary changes. Otherwise, the LETTER.GLY entries will be saved permanently in NORMAL.GLY.

Don't create new macros or text entries while glossaries are merged. If you want to create a universal entry, load NORMAL.GLY on its own. To create an entry just for letters, load LETTERS.GLY by itself. Finally, remember that an entry in a merged glossary that has the same name as one in NORMAL.GLY temporarily replaces NORMAL.GLY's version.



Practical tips for building better worksheets

This month: Name that range!

Richard Scoville

n large spreadsheets it's easy to forget where you put things, and deciphering complex formulas can be tough. One reason is that people don't naturally think in terms of cell addresses, but in terms like "data for 1987." Using range names, you can replace cumbersome addresses with easy-to-remember nicknames.

In this month's column, I'll show you how to replace addresses with range names of your own choosing and use them in formulas and commands and for quick navigation of spreadsheets. We'll also generate a table of all named ranges in a worksheet, which is handy for debugging and general reference.

Range Name Basics

Naming ranges is a snap. We'll use the simple 1-2-3 spreadsheet in FIGURE 1 for this exercise. First, enter all of the labels and data in the area from A1 through E18. To create the first range

name, position the cell pointer at A6 and execute /Range Name Create, type months, and press <Enter>. Then highlight the range A6..A17, and press <Enter> again. Use this method to create

the other range names, shown in **FIGURE 1** starting at cell H6.

Follow these basic range name rules: Names can have up to 15 characters, but it's better to keep them short. Don't in-

EXCEL SHORTCUT

Speed Up Your Macros With ECHO

Ralph Soucie

By default, *Excel* continuously displays a macro's progress on screen. Lengthy macros operate much faster when you use the ECHO(FALSE) function to stop these time-wasting screen updates.

Don't use ECHO(FALSE) while debugging a long macro, or you won't know when it hits a

snag. When you know a major section of the macro or subroutine is reliable, however, you can surround that section with ECHO(FALSE) at the start and ECHO(TRUE) at the end. When you're through debugging, use Formula Replace to strip out the scattered ECHO statements.

Get the Big Picture With Flash-In

What can you do when you're confronted with a disorganized spreadsheet and have to make sense of it? *Flash-In*, a \$99.95 add-in, can help.

Flash-In's bird's-eye view displays your whole worksheet at once, automatically reducing the used portion to fit your screen. With each cell reduced, you can spot your major work areas at a glance. A movable pointer indicates the current cell, whose contents are shown at the top of the screen. To revert to normal

view, press < Enter>.

Flash-In also lets you search WK1 files on disk for text or range names. If it finds what you ask for, it pops up a window showing an excerpt of the file. You can copy the found data into the current worksheet or retrieve the whole file into memory. —Richard Scoville

clude spaces or the characters + * -/> < ; , & { @ or # because 1-2-3 may interpret the name as a formula. Don't use a number for a range name (formulas will see it as a value, not a range) or create names that match a cell address (commands and formulas will act on the cell address, not on the range). For example, YEAR90 is a safe name, but 1990 (a number) and FY1990 (a valid cell address) are not.

Working With Range Names

Every time you assign a range name, 1-2-3 adds it to a menu. When you're entering a command and need to indicate a range, pressing <F3> displays the menu (pressing it twice gives you up to a full screen of names). In 1-2-3 2.2 and later versions, you can also use this menu when building formulas.

Formulas Range names make formulas clearer and easier to build. @SUM(YEAR87) is more understandable than @SUM(B6..B17), especially if B6..B17 is off the screen. To construct the formula displayed at the top of FIGURE 1, position the cell pointer at B19, type @sum(, press <F3>, select YEAR87 (in version 2.01, type YEAR87),

type), and press < Enter>.

Commands Range names make commands quick and accurate, especially when you perform a series of commands on a range. To format the values in column C to fixed format with one decimal, select /Range Format Fixed, type I, and press < Enter >. Then, instead of painting the range, just press < F3 > and select YEAR87.

Moving Around the Worksheet Using range names simplifies navigating large worksheets. Assign a special "landmark" range name to the upper left corner cell of each important worksheet area. Begin landmark names with a colon, as in :MACROS, and 1-2-3 will sort them to appear conveniently at the beginning of the range name menu (as in FIGURE 1). To move around the worksheet, press <F5><F3>, select a range name, and press <Enter>.

bles Errors result when ranges are damaged by careless use of Move or Worksheet Delete. To see how this happens, /Move the blank cell B4 to B6. Since Move deletes target cells from the worksheet, and since B6 is the top left cell of the range YEAR87, YEAR87 is

now an invalid range. Formula references to an invalid range are replaced with ERR, so the formula in cell B19 changes from @SUM(YEAR87) to @SUM(ERR).

When such an error cascades down a chain of formula references, pinpointing the original source can be difficult. Building a range name table like the one shown at H6..I13 will expose the culprit. Here, position the cell pointer on H6 and execute /Range Name Table. The damaged YEAR87 range will display ERR. To fix the problem, redefine the range, and rebuild the formula in B19. (In releases 2.2 and 3, you can also search for ERR in formulas with /Range Search.)



One Step to PageMaker and File

Data Management

Tips and techniques for managing your data

This month: Data validation is a valid concern—make sure the data you get is the data you want.

ata entry is tedious work, and mistakes often creep in. If misspelled names, wrong dates, or invalid codes aren't caught on the spot, they will gnaw at your data foundation like termites.

The art of catching entry errors is called validation. This month I'll cover general methods for validating data as well as validation tools found in—and missing from— $dBASE\ III\ Plus.$

Before you invest time entering data, consider the reports and summaries you'll need later. Now is the time to identify and protect against incorrect dates and inappropriate text.

Numeric and date fields frequently have implicit boundaries, and entries beyond those limits can be readily identified. For instance, you could designate all invoice dates more than a year old or in the future as incorrect. As the data base designer, you must decide where the boundaries are and prohibit users from crossing them.

Text fields may have only a few correct answers. A data base for Acme Home and Garden Tool Rental might limit tool types to Garden, Construction, and Woodworking. If your data manager allows, let users pick valid choices by pointing and clicking. Otherwise, have your application check user input against a list.

Your program can check entries for errors field by field or one screen at a time. Field-by-field validation is quicker and usually more efficient, allowing the user to correct a mistake immediately. However, some types of validation require data from multiple fields and can't be performed until an entire data entry screen is completed.

Entries that violate the rules should trigger clear error messages and let users type new answers immediately. Be firm but friendly. 'Invoices dated before today are not correct: please reenter' is better than 'Invalid input' or some other curt or impolite message.

dBASE Validation

Unfortunately, dBASE III Plus is weak in field-by-field validation. One technique is to use a RANGE clause in the @...SAY...GET command that accepts specified upper and lower boundaries for dates and numbers. But RANGE won't let you define an error message: When a user violates a range, dBASE beeps and displays something like

dGE 3.0

If you have numeric data, someone's going to want you to make a chart out of it. That's when a program like dGE comes in handy. dGE is a graphics library that produces many kinds of graphs and charts from data in your DBF files.


dGE's stand-alone graph designer uses clearly arranged pulldown menus to lead you through the process of specifying colors, shading, legends, and the links between data fields. When you're done, dGE generates dBASE code for you to embed in your programs or do from the dot prompt. Thus, graphs will always reflect current data.

You can display the graphs from any flavor of dBASE, although a 44K TSR is required with all except *Clipper*. *dGE 4.0*, due out this summer, will allow *QuickSilver* users to forgo the TSR as well.

dGE lists for \$195, but it will go to \$295 with the release of 4.0. You can freely distribute the display module with your applications. The stand-alone designer requires 512K and DOS 2.1 or a later version. —A. S.

Validating a Field Entry



The VALID clause gives you a simple replacement for an otherwise complex routine and lets the user return to an already entered and validated field.

'RANGE is 04/30/89 to 04/25/90', and the user has to press the <Space> bar to reedit the entry—a fact *dBASE* may or may not reveal. Users who have set SCOREBOARD and BELL off to control their environment will get no feedback whatsoever. Novices, convinced that the system is frozen, may reboot in panic, trashing files. RANGE is best

PARADOX SHORTCUT

"Copying" a Calculated Field

Celeste Robinson

When you're designing a report with a number of similar, complex calculated fields, it's handy to copy a formula from one field to another. Unfortunately, *Paradox* has no commands for doing this. You can get around this shortcoming by creating an Instant Script macro when you first enter the formula.

While designing a report, before creating the first calculated field, press <**Alt>-<F3>** to start recording your keystrokes to an Instant Script. Then press <**F10>** and select *Field Place*

Calculated. Next, type in your formula, and press < Enter> < Alt>-< F3> to end recording. Place the field as prompted.

When you want to place a similar calculated field in another location, simply press <Alt>- <F4> to play the Instant Script. You will soon be prompted to place the field. Press <Esc> <Ctrl>-F, edit the formula, press <Enter>, and place the field as prompted.

avoided.

It's better to validate data in dBASE III Plus with rule-checking routines, usually DO WHILE loops. For example, to ensure users enter only invoice dates that fall within the past year, you might convert a simple '@ 8,3 SAY 'Invoice date: 'GET In_date' statement into the routine shown in LISTING 1.

This approach, however, is awkward for field-by-field validation because it requires several READ commands per screen. The problem with READs is that until each one is processed, the fields below it are invisible, and afterward, the ones above it can't be edited.

dBASE IV and most compatible pro-

grams have a VALID clause for @... SAY...GET, letting you define an expression that's true or false depending on the entry. You could replace the code in LISTING 1 with @ 8,3 SAY 'Invoice date: 'GET In_date VALID In_date > (DATE() - 365) .or. In_date > DATE() ERROR CTOD(In_date) + 'is not within the past year.'. If the verdict is false, the cursor stays in the field until a change in data makes the expression true. The result is less work for you and your users.



Expert advice for creating high-impact documents and presentations

This month: tips for successful presentations, and how to produce outline fonts in Ventura

Richard Jantz

Business graphics packages like Freelance Plus and Harvard Graphics make it easy to produce professional charts, but they don't help you plan presentations. This month we offer tips on creating winning presentations and designing slides and transparencies.

Most presentations rely on overhead transparencies or 35mm slides. Transparencies are better for informal meetings with smaller groups. A 35mm slide presentation offers the best image quality and can be used with audiences of any size, but since slides are shown with the lights off, there's little opportunity for group discussion.

No matter which method you use, you should approach the presentation as a whole. Start with an outline containing an introduction, body, and conclusion,

and decide which points require text charts and which need data charts. Focus on the key points you want the audience to remember, then choose graphics (such as clip art) to make them memorable. Finally, match your speaker notes with printouts of your slides and transparencies, and give the presentation a dry run.

Effective Slides and Transparencies

The most important rule to remember is, keep it simple. Your audience doesn't want to be overwhelmed with information, so use data charts only when you need evidence to support your argument. A well-designed word chart can

be worth a thousand points of data. Here are some of the keys to creating effective visuals:

- Use *templates* for a consistent look. Like master pages in desktop publishing, templates contain colors, fonts, and graphic elements that repeat on each image. Templates ensure that background colors remain consistent and that rules, bullets, or company logos appear in the same place every time.
- Use light-colored text against a dark, neutral background for slides, and dark type on a light background for transparencies. Use brighter colors to emphasize key elements, but no more than six colors per image.
 - Use no more than two typefaces in

Creating Outline Type in Ventura

If you've got a PostScript printer and *Ventura*, you can produce outline type (hollow characters) for eye-catching logos or headings. Simply use a special Post-Script prologue (a file that defines PostScript subroutines) that's provided on the *Ventura* utilities disk.

- 1. Go to your VENTURA directory and copy the file PS2.EFF from the POSTSCPT directory on the utilities disk. For example, type copy a:\
 postscpt\ps2.eff c:\ventura and press <Enter>.
- 2. Now rename the regular PostScript prologue (PS2.PRE). Type ren ps2.pre ps2.reg and press <Enter>.
 - 3. To make PS2.EFF the

active PostScript prologue, type copy ps2.eff ps2.pre and press <Enter>.

- 4. Start *Ventura* and open a chapter.
- 5. In Paragraph or Text mode, select the text you want to make outline type. Use the Font menu or Set Font button, respectively, to assign the color *Magenta* to the text. Click *OK*.

Any text or font assigned the color magenta will now automatically print in outline form, while all other text will print as normal. Of course, if you later use a color PostScript printer and want to use the actual color magenta, you'll need to rename the PS2.REG file as PS2.PRE.

the presentation. Text characters should be at least 18 points (approximately ¼ inch high) and printed in upper- and lowercase for better legibility.

- Use *serif* typefaces only for headlines and other display type. (A serif typeface, such as Roman, features cross-strokes at the end of a character.) A sans serif face like Helvetica is easier to read at small sizes.
- To avoid surprises at print time, use fonts and graphics you know your printer or slide service supports.
- Avoid complete sentences. Use text charts to stress key words, and use no more than six lines of text per chart.
- Normally, you should bullet key items in text charts. However, you can use boxes or other graphics to set off especially important items.
- Use a *build series*, in which a new line of text is added or highlighted with each successive image, to introduce new topics or outline a presentation's main points (see **SCREEN 1**). To ensure a consistent look, create your final image first, then delete items one by one to create the images that will precede it.
- Make graphs consistent, employing the same colors, dimensions, and placement in each image.
- Use pie charts to show proportional relationships such as market share. Place the slice you want to emphasize in the upper right quadrant.
- Use bar charts to compare totals or show data that changes over time, such as quarterly profits. In general, use no more than 12 bars per chart to avoid visual clutter.
- Use line graphs to plot cycles or trends, such as sales figures. Use no more than three lines per chart, giving each a unique color or line style.
- Save your flashiest graphics to illustrate your main points. Scanned photos or custom backdrops (see "Desktop Presentations Toolbox") can be particularly effective.





On-line resources for business and professional users

This month: SprintMail delivers all the benefits of LAN E-mail—without a LAN—and ABA/net helps solve legal problems 24 hours a day.

magine linking up all your employees—not only locally but around the world—with an on-line system that's every bit as powerful as the latest LAN E-mail package but doesn't require complicated installation or expensive network cabling.

SprintMail (formerly Telemail) is a 350,000-user, full-featured dial-up E-mail service with a big extra: the ability to set up private bulletin boards for you and your employees free of charge. Originally aimed at Fortune 500 companies, it's designed to reward the large-volume user. How does SprintMail define "large volume"? Well, that's open to negotiation, but if you qualify you can get dedicated high-speed phone lines

(which reduce connection costs) plus free on-site employee training.

SprintMail runs from a commandline interface and provides all the usual E-mail amenities. You can send carbon copies, create mailing lists, and request receipt notification; and fax, telex, and hard copy options are available. Not-socommon features include the ability to attach binary files without using special software. Thanks to its support of multiple network protocols, SprintMail can send and receive mail via MCI Mail, AT&T-Mail, and Bell Atlantic's mail system—although the address line may require you to enter X.400 syntax-and can connect with a wide range of networks and message services. Sprint-Mail can also print messages on dedicated print stations—remote systems with an attached printer.

SprintMail's ability to set up and administer private bulletin board services

at no extra cost is its key advantage over other E-mail systems. Businesses can use these private areas to share messages or even post frequently updated data base files, which can be downloaded by offices around the country—client mailing lists, for example.

SprintMail lets you designate a system administrator who can set access rights, including specifying which groups and individuals can write to a bulletin board and which can only read it, who can send messages to whom, and who can use the fax, telex, and X.400 options to send mail to remote E-mail systems. A detailed bill is provided for use in internal charge-backs.

Unfortunately, SprintMail's prices are steep—especially for users with moderate E-mail requirements. While \$10 a month buys a mailbox on MCI Mail and about 60 messages, the same ten-spot covers only half an hour on

ON-LINE TOOLBOX

Check the Headlights

If your external modem is having trouble making a connection, you might want to check the headlights. Here's what you should look for.

When the modem is powered on, the modem ready (MR) light should shine. The terminal ready (TR) light tells you that the modem and your PC are communicating and are ready to make a call. If you've set the modem to answer the phone, the auto-answer (AA) light will be lit. And whenever the modem "picks up the phone," the off

hook (OH) light should go on.

Once your modem and the remote system make a connection, the carrier detect (CD) light is supposed to flash on. While the modem is sending and receiving data, the receive data (RD) and send data (SD) lights will flicker. As soon as the connection is severed, the carrier detect lamp should go out.

If your modem lights behave differently, you may have a hardware problem. Call the tech support line and report the light show. — *J. G.*

SprintMail, with enough credit to send about 12 memo-sized messages. For one thing, SprintMail (unlike MCI) charges a connection fee in addition to a character transmission fee.

But for large corporations with megabytes of data to send and highspeed modems to send it with, the combination of volume-user benefits (discounts, dedicated lines, and surchargefree 9600-bps access) brings the price down. Moreover, SprintMail's transmission costs are only 37.5 cents per 7500 characters, compared with \$1 on MCI. There are so many variables that it's impossible to come up with a cut-and-dried cost comparison, but somewhere in the vicinity of 200,000 characters a day, SprintMail becomes less expensive than MCI.

Although you can log on to the service using any communications package, special software for automating the log-on, up/download, log-off process is available for \$135: *PC SprintMail*. It's pricey, but busy users may find the convenience worth the extra cost.

ABA/net Is Essential for Lawyers

It's past midnight in Phoenix, you've just finished that all-important brief, and you need to get the file to your local counsel in Atlanta in time for a court appearance at 8:30 tomorrow morning. Unfortunately, counsel needs it in *WordPerfect* format, and you've written it in *Word-Star* format.

So you dial ABA/net, an online service operated by the American Bar Association specifically for attorneys, where a file conversion utility can translate text to and from more than a dozen word processor file formats. Then you can have ABA/ net forward the converted file to your Atlanta counsel.

ABA/net offers access to nearly 1000 legal and general interest data bases such as Westlaw, Lexis, Dialog, and Dow Jones—most of which can be searched via the same easy-to-use, menu-driven interface. In addition, ABA/net is equipped to handle E-mail, faxes, binary files, telexes, and hard copy mail, with connections (E-mail only) to MCI and Western Union EasyLink, among others.

With a few simple commands, you can go from looking up patent numbers and ownership to reading offerings from the American Bar Association itself (including meeting minutes, ethics notes, law news, and notes from Capitol Hill).

The only other on-line service that offers a remotely comparable package of services and data bases is CompuServe. Even with CompuServe you'd need separate subscriptions to Westlaw, Lexis, and Dialog, and you'd lose access to ABA forums, not to mention the on-line file conversion feature.

ABA/net costs \$18 an hour during prime time, \$8 an hour at other times—with a minimum monthly charge of \$20. And there's a small additional Telenet charge for access at speeds over 1200 bps. Still, for the attorney who needs file conversion and transfer, instant access to those data bases, or simply inexpensive access to Lexis and Westlaw (ABA/net requires lower monthly minimums), not subscribing to ABA/net is downright foolhardy.





Dating Your Spreadsheet Reports

If you use a 1-2-3 template for monthly reports, you may want the month of the report—often the one before or after the month the report is actually printed—in a particular cell. The process can be automated with the @NOW function, which returns the current date and time every time you recalculate or retrieve your worksheet. If you place the formula @NOW-30 in a report template, a date from the previous month will appear in reports made from that template. @NOW+30 will produce a date in the next one.

Since 1-2-3 treats dates as numbers (with January 1, 1900, equaling 1.0), you must format the cell to show its contents as a date. Select/Worksheet Range Format Date, and pick the 3 (MMM-YY) format so that the day is not shown.

Be aware that these formulas are not always accurate. For instance, 30 days after May 1 still falls within May.

WordPerfect Box Drawing and Proportional Fonts

WordPerfect's Line Draw feature (<Ctrl>-<F3>2) produces lovely text boxes on screen, but they print out as a mess if you use proportional fonts. With WordPerfect 5.0 or 5.1, you're better off using the Graphics menu.

The Graphics Text Box Options menu (<Alt>-<F9>bo) allows you to select borders, shading, caption formats, and inside and outside box margins for all

your text boxes. To set up an individual box, you use the Graphics Text Box Create menu (<Alt>-<F9>bc). From this menu, you can anchor a box to a page position or to text, adjust its size and shape, and have outside text flow around it or through it. The text in the box can be a separate file, or you can type it in through the Create menu's Edit option.

Printing a Paradox Table Structure

None of Paradox's interactive functions prints a listing of a table's structure. The script STRUCT.SC [see LISTING 1]

prompts you to select a table, then prints that table's structure and the number of records.

STRUCT.SC can be typed in with either *Paradox*'s own editor or another one. Use the Scripts Play command to run it.





Print running page numbers with a WordPerfect 4.2 macro, know when you've doubled back to DOS, calculate 360-day-calendar dates with 1-2-3 and Quattro, print marked blocks with WordStar, repair a QuickBASIC function, correct a Paradox script, and dig into a toolbox of amazing widgets.

Perfect Page Counter

It's easy to print page numbers in *WordPerfect 4.2*, but it's not so easy to print them in the form "Page 3 of 20," which requires calculating the total page count in advance.

I found a way to accomplish this with a macro [see FIGURE 1] that tricks *Word-Perfect* into counting the number of pages as though it were preparing a table of contents. The macro inserts the page count into a footer that will print on each page.

Editor's note: Create this macro by loading a sample document, then typing the FIGURE 1 keystrokes. To print a document that has running page numbers, first load or enter the text as you normally do, then press <Alt>-<F10> and type pagexofy<Enter><Shift>-<F7>1.

If you have WordPerfect 5.0 or a later version, you won't need this macro, thanks to the Cross Reference option on the Mark Text menu. To use this feature, simply place a Cross Reference target at the end of the file and a reference to that target in the header. Before printing, use Mark Text's Generate option to make sure the page numbers are up-to-date.

Doubling Back to DOS

Many programs have a Shell-to-DOS or System command that lets you double back to the DOS prompt. Most of those programs let you issue multiple DOS commands and then type exit and press < Enter> to return to the program. The trouble is, if you scroll or clear the display, there will be nothing on screen to remind you that your program remains idling in RAM. If you turn off your computer, you might lose changes to files you were editing.

This bugged me until I discovered a neat trick that I use with 1-2-3 and that should work equally well with other programs. Instead of running 1-2-3 directly, I use 123.BAT [see LISTING 1]. In this

batch file, the first PROMPT statement inserts a message into the DOS prompt, which is always visible after you've exited temporarily to DOS. A second PROMPT resets the prompt string to normal when I quit 1-2-3. This way, I always know when a program is hiding in RAM.

Editor's note: Create a separate batch file for each program that lets you exit (continues) to DOS. Replace '123' in the sample listing with the necessary commands to change directories, and run your programs.

You can name the batch files anything you like, but it's probably best to use the same names as the programs; for example, WORD.BAT for Microsoft Word, Q.BAT for Quattro, TURBO.BAT for Turbo Pascal, and so on. To run the batch files from any location, store them in a PATH command's directory. Then enter a program's name to run.

On my system, because I prefer a shorter prompt, I changed the first PROMPT argument to \$p\$g\$g. This places a double greater-than symbol

(>>) after the current directory, letting me know when I've doubled back to DOS.

Hath 30 Days, Will Calculate

Our company uses a financial calendar, with a 360-day year of 30-day months, to calculate future values for municipal bond projects. Because many of our users prefer to use 1-2-3 release 2.1 or *Quattro*, both of which lack 1-2-3 release 3's 360-day @D360 function, I wrote my own formula [see FIGURE 2].

The expression calculates the difference between two dates in a 360-day year. To use it, insert the starting date into cell A2 and the ending date into A1,







I like to brawse as much as anyane, but I frequently don't have the
time. That's why I need tools like
Quantasm Power Lib, a tool kit of assembly language subroutines that's
especially useful for cading textbased windows and menus. This
package has same of the slickest pragramming I've seen in any tool kit.
The documentation is good, too.

Power Lib works with Turbo Assembler, Microsoft Macro Assembler, or OptASM. Far an example af what the tool kit can do, check out Ward-Science Corparation's Definitions Plus, the disk-based American Heritage Dictionary. Power Lib's author, Mike Schmit, wrate that program using these same subroutines.

When not coding assembly language, I usually prefer Turbo Pascal, which can handle just about any task I devise. But it daes have one majar shortcaming—a limitatian of 32K an arrays and other large structures.

Now, Turbo VMM (Virtual Memary Manager) by Syntax has sent that limit sky-high.

Written to replace Turba Pascal 5.5's overlay unit, Turba VMM has the unique ability to swap cade and data to and from disk, in effect making a portion of a hard drive available as data storage for a memorystarved program. If your arrays are too large, ar if your linked lists have came to the end of their chains, Turba VMM is the answer. With this package, no pragram has to run out of room again.

A Print off the Ol' Block

I sometimes need to print a marked block of text in *WordStar*, which lacks a feature for doing so. I therefore wrote a macro [see **FIGURE 3**] that does the trick by copying a text block to a temporary file, TEMP.\$\$\$, printing that file, and then deleting it.

After entering the macro, move the cursor to the beginning of the text you want to print, and press <Ctrl>-KB.

Next, move the cursor to just after the last character to print, and press <Ctrl>-KK. Make sure the printer is on line, and press <Esc>K.

Editor's note: Start WordStar and type the macro keystrokes to create the macro, pressing <Enter> only where shown. For WordStar 4.0, instead of 'pptemp.\$\$\$', use pntemp.\$\$\$. Instead of '<Ctrl>-P<Ctrl>-K' on the ninth line, enter <Ctrl>-P<Esc>.

WordStar 5.x users must enable classic menus. To do this, return to DOS, go to the WordStar directory, and enter wschange ws. Type dbhi, answer y or n to turn on 'Classic commands', and type xaa3<Enter>xxxxy to change the help level to 3 (2 for abbreviated menus).

For all versions, if you receive the error message 'Background printing is off' or something similar, at the DOS prompt enter wschange ws. Then, for WordStar 5.x type beca (for WordStar

4.0 type bida), and answer y or n to permit 'Concurrent printing'. Finish with xxxy to save the changes to disk.

VALuable Repair

Small differences between Microsoft *QuickBASIC* and interpreted BASIC can drive programmers batty. For example, I believe I've discovered a bug in the VAL function, which is supposed to return the value of digits in a string.

The problem is, in BASICA and GW BASIC, the expressions VAL("100.0"), VAL("100.0 %"), and VAL("100.0 &") return 100, just as they should. But under *QuickBASIC*, the last two of these functions produce 'Type mismatch' errors. This makes VAL anything but valuable for extracting numbers from

strings that contain the common characters % and &.

To get around the problem, I wrote a new function XVAL [see LISTING 2], which changes the offending characters to spaces before passing a string to VAL. The function is useful for converting old BASIC programs to *Quick-BASIC*. Just replace every use of VAL with XVAL.

Editor's note: Mr. Yang is correct that VAL doesn't give identical results under different BASICs. In BASICA and GW BASIC, VAL ignores the % (integer) and & (long integer) symbols because it stops looking for digits in "100.0%" and "100.0 &" upon reaching the blank after 0. When used with interpreted BASIC, VAL strips leading "white space" from strings—it doesn't remove blanks inside.

But, under QuickBASIC and com-

piled BASIC, VAL strips all white space from strings before searching for digits, not just those at a string's beginning; thus it treats "100.0 %" as "100.0%" and "100.0 &" as "100.0&". The result is a type mismatch error because, in effect, the expressions ask VAL to convert floating-point values to integers.

Technically, this is not a bug. It's the result of QuickBASIC and interpreted BASIC implementing two different specifications for the same function. But it is an annoying quirk, for which Mr. Yang has provided a useful solution.

Don't Brace Yourself

I liked the PRSTRUCT.SC script in "Printing Paradox Table Structures" [Star-Dot-Star, April 1990]. But there's a mistake in the listing. The symbol {1} on line 11 should be {1}. A right parenthesis, not a right brace, should follow the 1.

TAKING IT HOME

The practical guide to home/office computing

Have it your way.

Lawrence J. Magid

Burger King popularized the slogan "Have it your way." The company was talking about hamburgers, but I just built myself a 386 clone and, unlike with off-the-shelf PCs, I'm having this one my way.

I learned a lot about computers building one, but it was much more work than I'd expected; and, to be honest, I had to get some last-minute help to attach the motherboard to the case. I didn't save that much money over an off-the-shelf PC, but then I used only top-of-the-line components and ended up with a dream machine that can best even so-called premium PCs from major vendors.

My goal was to put together a Windows-capable 25-MHz 386 with a large, quiet hard disk. It also had to have a quiet power supply; as I said in my May column, I hate noisy computers. I began my buying spree at JDR Microdevices, a mail-order house in San Jose, California, that attracted me because of its longevity (more than ten years in business), its 30-day "no questions asked" money-back guarantee, and its toll-free technical support line.

Tim Daughters, JDR's director of engineering, helped me select a 25-MHz

"mini 386" motherboard (\$799), an AT-style case (\$89.95), a 1.2MB 51/4-inch TEAC floppy drive (\$99.95), a 1.44MB 31/2-inch Mitsubishi floppy drive (\$129.95), 4MB of RAM (\$500), and an I/O card with one parallel and two serial ports (\$85). I already had a \$450 multiscan monitor, a \$169 VGA card, and a very quiet \$149 power supply (PC Power and Cooling's Silencer 220).

JDR's selection of hard disks didn't suit me, so I went to a local electronics store, where I bought a Conner 80MB 3½-inch hard disk with controller (\$660). It was fast and very quiet, but after installing the Windows 3.0 multitasking environment, I realized that the drive wouldn't be large enough for the needs of a software reviewer. I turned it in for Conner's 212MB SCSI drive (\$900), which I paired with a \$249 Future Domain SCSI hard disk/floppy controller to create a fast subsystem. Using DOS 4.01, I was able to configure it with three logical drives: C is 34.5MB; D and E are each 87.3MB.

For my keyboard, I selected Datadesk's new customizable Switchboard (\$175). I prefer to have the <Ctrl> key set just to the left of the A rather than below the <Shift> key as it is on IBM's 101-key keyboard. The Switchboard also allows for a trackball, a calculator, and various other options. What's more, the same keyboard can be used with both a Mac and a PC.

Taking into account the components I recycled from my old PC, the total street value of my system is just over \$3300 with an 80MB drive and just under \$3800 with the 212MB. It would have cost me twice as much for a comparable machine from IBM or Compaq, and that system still wouldn't have given me the same combination of compo-

nents without wasting some stock items. I could have saved a few hundred dollars more on a no-name clone, but then I wouldn't have gotten a complete selection of top-of-the-line components.

If I had to do it over again, though, I don't think I'd build my own PC. It was too much work. I have since discovered that there are any number of "system integrators"—clone builders—in San Francisco (and most big cities) that would have been happy to deliver almost the same system within a couple of hundred dollars of my cost. Even mail-order kingpin Dell Computer would have configured a system especially for me. Of course, Dell's would have cost around \$5000 (with an 80MB Conner drive), but it also would have come with a 32K memory cache and a one-year, on-site service contract. I also could have bought my system from Domino Computer, a San Francisco Bay Area clone builder, for around \$2800 (with an 80MB Maxtor)—less than I paid for my parts. I would have had to sacrifice my Conner drive, but I would have gotten a one-year walk-in warranty.

And service can be an important issue if you're thinking about a new PC. If you call around, you should be able to find a computer dealer or consultant or even a reputable mail-order house willing to build from scratch or to customize a clone to your specifications. You'll get not only helpful suggestions on how best to configure your system but also a warranty in the bargain.

Don't be afraid to ask. In today's competitive marketplace, plenty of computer sellers are willing to let you "have it your way." €
