Contributing Editor Scott Spanbauer contemplates the meaning of long-lasting PCs.

Spanbauer, the author of this month's cover story, has been working under the hood long enough to know. In the mid-eighties, he was part of *PC World*'s tech support MASH unit, transplanting disk drives, replacing power supplies, curing memory problems, swapping video boards. He learned that today's shiny new PC is tomorrow's doorstop, unless it's been designed with the rising demands of future applications in mind.

Scott's review spotlights nine 386 systems powerful enough to stay useful at least five years—the optimal PC life span. These machines run at 33 MHz, the 386's top speed, delivering enough zip to make a full suite of Windows applications sit up and beg. No matter how Windows changes and its applications evolve, 33-MHz 386s should be able to handle it.

A 33-MHz 386 sounds a little extravagant for the desktop, you say? Then you might consider one as a file server. Scott took out his calculator and discovered that the average 25-MHz 486—that dynamo most people think of as an ideal server—costs about one-quarter more than the average 33-MHz 386. But in the disk-heavy operations that file servers dine on, there's virtually no difference in the performance.

Scott says "it pays to dig" when shopping for one of these babies, and he offers an excellent place to start. "Once you identify a few good candidates," says Scott,





#### **IBM ENDORSES NETWARE**

Expands Corporate Net Options, Moves Away From Dependence on Microsoft LAN Manager

Breaking free of its exclusive local area network alliance with Microsoft, IBM is bringing Novell's Net-Ware into its enterprise-wide network strategy. IBM now becomes a single source for



both its own OS/2-based *LAN*Server and the leading network system software.

Big Blue will market, service, and support NetWare and work with Novell to integrate it into the IBM corporate networking scheme. Next year Novell will offer versions of NetWare that run atop OS/2 and AIX (IBM's UNIX).

For four years IBM has heavily promoted its *LAN Server* derivative of Microsoft's *LAN Manager*, and it

has recently worked to converge the two. But given Net-Ware's overwhelming market share and IBM's recent falling-out with Microsoft over OS/2, Big Blue has changed strategy. "The vast majority of our customers will have both in their shops," says personal systems head Jim Cannavino. "We will not bias sales in either direction."

The two products offer different strengths, explains Lee Reiswig, assistant general manager for programming. LAN Server fits smoothly within OS/2 development environments and is a linchpin of IBM corporate networks. Net-Ware is faster, connects non-IBM platforms, and offers high-end features such as fault tolerance.

Freed from its reliance on Microsoft, IBM gains more control over its network strategy, points out Craig Burton, CEO of the Clarke-Burton Report. Meanwhile, Microsoft loses important backing: LAN Server accounts for about a quarter of LAN Managerbased installations. LAN Manager has fared poorly in reviews (PC World's review in March 1991 judged it "close to unusable"). Still, "Microsoft will have a lot to say about where networking goes," notes David Marshak of Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group. Among Microsoft pursuits is a plan to move many LAN services into future operating systems.

#### COMPAQ IS

Nod to Users Implements Direct Telephone Support



After years of insisting dealers are the best source for tech-

nical support, Compaq has decided to provide direct phone support to end users. Customers can now call Houston for answers to both run-of-themill and in-depth networking questions.

The plan "neutralizes any real or perceived advantages of other PC companies," says Doug Johns, vice president of corporate marketing. That's especially true at the high end, where the lack of a support line sometimes cost Compaq sales, concedes Johns.

Compag offers free support via an 800 number to customers with complaints or problems related to stand-alone-PC usage. Those with highend networking questions can get a contract covering ten "incidents" a year for \$3000 and receive Compag's CD ROM data base of technical notes and documentation. Dealers sell the pay-for-support plan, which addresses direct support in a cost-effective manner, says Seymour Merrin, president of Merrin Information Services, who notes that customers with complex networks don't mind paying for high-end support.

Dealers should be mollified by the opportunity to sell support contracts, says Merrin, particularly if that increases network sales. It was Compaq's commitments to dealers that delayed direct support for so long and left the company open to attacks by competitors like Dell Computer.

#### LOTUS DELIVERS cc:MAIL

Jumps to the Lead in E-Mail, Writes New Notes



In a bid to become the premier vendor of network-based

applications, Lotus Development Corporation is acquiring the lead electronic-mail supplier, updating its *Lotus Notes* group communications program, and broadening *Notes*' distribution.

Lotus will buy cc:Mail, Incorporated, for an undisclosed price. With an installed base of 850,000 users, *cc:Mail* has an estimated 35 percent of the fast-growing PC E-mail market. The software runs under DOS, *Windows*, OS/2, and the Macintosh and across all ma-

jor PC networks and most mail gateways.

"Mail is the next big application," declares cc:Mail president Philippe Courtot, who predicts that this year E-mail will explode the way fax did. "It's very important to strike the right alliances so we can stay at the forefront of the marketplace."

The deal coincides with the release of *Lotus Notes 2.0*. The upgrade offers full support for laptops, *Windows 3.0*, and Banyan networks, tight links with other *Windows* and OS/2 applications, boosted security, and many other enhancements. More than 35,000 users

in 75 organizations already run *Notes*, and Lotus hopes to expand that base by slowly opening distribution to valueadded resellers and adding Mac and UNIX versions.

"The market is starting to heat up, and the fit of *cc:Mail* and *Notes* is very good," observes Michael Millikin, vice president of Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group.

Lotus will ensure that cc:Mail and Notes work together more closely on a network, uniting the two packages in a consistent environment that developers can exploit for network messaging—a large and growing field. Lotus archrival Microsoft reportedly plans a similar strategy based on the acquisition of Consumers Software.

Mac, UNIX, Enterprise Connectivity Added



Novell helped cement its new alliance with IBM and ex-

tended its technological lead over *LAN Manager* by introducing a new version of Net-Ware 386 with ties to large IBM nets as well as long-awaited connections to Macintosh and UNIX environments. But some users may find themselves paying higher prices or buying features they don't need.

Version 3.11 of NetWare 386 supports the TCP/IP internet

connectivity protocol and IBM's NetView management services as well as offering internet options for enterprise computing. Of more universal interest, the long-anticipated release of NetWare Loadable Modules (NLM) for Macintosh and UNIX workstations means that DOS, Windows, OS/2, Macintosh, and UNIX users can now transparently share information and resources such as print services between networks. Each type of workstation can maintain its own file-naming conventions and rely upon NetWare to sort out the differences. A new backup/restore NLM supports multiple-server backup and more than 50 third-party devices.

"Mac and UNIX connectivity has been an undelivered strategic component of Net-Ware 386," observes Steve Guengerich, editor in chief of the *NetWare Advisor* newsletter. "This is the death knell of NetWare 286, though it's not clear when that will come."

Still, notes Jamie Lewis, vice president of the *Clarke-Burton Report*, "they've

raised prices and added functionality that smaller networks may not need." The minimum configuration for version 3.11 is a 20-user license for \$3495; most nets are considerably smaller. "Why can't they have a lower-priced version of 3.11 without the TCP/IP and Net-View support for smaller LANs?"

But the new features and the IBM alliance lead Lewis to conclude that "Novell has significantly raised the ante on *LAN Manager*. It's maintained its momentum and extended its technological lead."

#### TANDON CHALLENGES COMPAQ

Notebook, Ad Campaign Head U.S. Initiative



After years of being stymied by the U.S. PC market, Tandon

Computer may have found the key: It promises March shipment of a notebook-sized portable that offers all the features of Compaq's top-of-theline LTE 386s/20—and then some—but is about half the price.

As Tandon's ad blitz points out, the NB/386sx, at 6½ pounds, is a full pound lighter than the LTE; its 2MB of RAM can be expanded to 16MB, compared to Compaq's 10MB; and the 30MB version's \$3495 suggested list price is about \$3000 below the LTE's \$6499 list (street prices may differ drastically). Tandon's NB/386sx also offers a desktop expansion unit like the LTE's, but for \$299 rather than \$1499.

The notebook is only the latest, although the most effective, brickbat in a price-comparison campaign that Tandon has been waging against Compaq since hiring longtime PC

hand Graham Beachum as general manager last fall. Although based in Simi Valley, California, Tandon does nearly all its \$422 million in sales overseas, and its periodic attempts to broaden its U.S. distribution have been largely unsuccessful.

Since he joined the company, Beachum has pursued a strategy similar to one that has paid off for Dell Computer—his alma mater. He has set up toll-free sales-and-support lines for single-PC purchases while using his extensive contacts to expand Tandon's national account sales. He has also landed mass distribution contracts with the INMAC mail-order catalog and 59 Walden Software stores

Tandon's strong overseas base—a 68 percent increase in profits on record sales for the fourth quarter of 1990—makes it an unusual U.S. "start-up." But the notebook could be the star vehicle Tandon needs to bring its success "over there" over here.

#### AMD SHIPS 386s

Second Source Could Augment Supply, Depress Prices, Put 32-Bit 386 on Laptops



Advanced Micro Devices will help to reverse the shortfall in

386-class processors by shipping "millions of dollars' worth" of its Intel 386DX clone in March and "tens of millions of dollars' worth" by July. Although AMD says buyers will be among the "top 20 PC makers" in the industry, analysts predict that many of the AMD parts will find their way to small clone makers that have to scramble for chips on the gray market.

One such manufacturer is Joseph Chan, president of Spear Technology, which ships about 10,000 systems a year. Chan has to pay more than twice Intel's contract prices—more than \$400 for small quantities of 25-MHz 386DX chips and nearly \$200 for 386SXs on motherboards. Supply hasn't equaled demand forever," notes Dean McCarron, vice president at chip market researcher InStat.

The "top 20 PC makers" won't comment on AMD's plans, but AMD counts most of them as customers for its

other motherboard components. They can get a 30 percent power saving simply by plugging AMD's 33-MHz Am386DX into their motherboards and up to 70 percent with a minor redesign, says AMD marketing manager Glen Burchers. Regardless of the outcome of litigation over trademarks and Intel microcode, AMD will offer a still more power-stingy 20- to 33-MHz Am386DXL by April. DXLs in smaller packages could bring a full 32-bit 386 compatible into laptops by summer.

Without committing itself, CompuAdd reports that the Am386DX tests 100 percent compatible with 24 popular software applications and seven operating systems when replacing the Intel 386.

As long as the shortage continues, Michael Slater, publisher of the *Microprocessor Report*, figures AMD prices will match Intel's. "In the long run, it could mean lower prices of 386 systems," he adds, "but in the best case, only \$100 lower because PC margins are already so thin." 



# Where's Big Blue's Big Mo?

Has IBM lost the ability to set the pace of PC development? Here are four steps it can take to regain its leadership position—before it's too late.

The slide displayed two logos: Intel's on the left, Microsoft's on the right. Below them it contained a picture of an unmarked PC that looked vaguely like a PS/2.

It was a small detail at the January meeting where Microsoft unveiled its new *Windows* strategy to an audience of reporters and analysts, but it spoke volumes. (See *Industry Outlook* in this issue.) Microsoft officials didn't flash the slide; it came courtesy of Intel president Dave House, who used it to emphasize the chip maker's close working relationship with Microsoft. The effect was later said to be purely unintentional. Yet IBM itself never took the stage at the meeting, except in that slide.

Why does Big Blue appear to have lost its place as a unifying force in the PC industry and become instead a mere customer of the industry's new leaders—its chip and operating system suppliers? The most astute analysts believe the answer lies within IBM itself.

"IBM's fundamental problem is that it doesn't buy into personal computing," says *P.C. Letter* editor Stewart Alsop. "It doesn't buy into the notion that, in and of itself, having a stand-alone personal computer is a good thing. Instead, it keeps trying to modify the notion of personal computing to fit its worldview."

That problem was clearly in evidence after Microsoft's press meeting. While observers considered the event a major setback for IBM's campaign to popularize OS/2, IBM officials declared it would not affect its most important clients—the small number of large corporations that Big Blue is hoping will continue to purchase OS/2 for industrial-strength applications.

But even in big companies, PC lead-

t's tough for a company that doesn't buy into personal computing to regain its leadership position.

ership isn't measured by the number of OS/2 servers installed. It's measured in the only way that really counts—by the kinds of hardware and software that businesspeople demand and personally use. To win the contest by this yardstick, Alsop says, "IBM is eventually going to have to accept the fact that buyers have spoken and they like personal computing."

How can Big Blue show that it got the message? Here are four simple steps IBM can take to convince everyone it understands and is serious about personal computing.

#### 1. Think Small

When IBM reps use terms like "increased customer function" to promote OS/2 above *Windows*, it makes you wonder whether they're sharing the same planet with the rest of us who want PCs and software that are simple to set up and use.

Simple, elegant design isn't something nice to have but easy to forgo. It enables big companies to put PC power on every desktop without worrying about a crushing burden of support costs. In small companies, it makes the difference between having an officeful of PCs or none at all.

IBM has always geared its PC strategy toward connectivity with its big systems. That's why OS/2 is so big and complicated to use. Why not turn the tables on that proposition? Make the PS/2—not the mainframe—the cornerstone of the IBM computing strategy, and Big Blue's engineers will find a million ways to make its hardware and software simpler and easier to use.

#### 2. Put OS/2 in ROM

Industry pundits are fond of saying that DOS with *Windows* is easier to configure than OS/2. But have you done any disk counting lately? To set up DOS and *Windows*, you will run through 11 3½-inch disks; to set up OS/2 Extended Edition, you will go through about 15. Can anyone honestly say that *either* one of these environments is simpler to con-(continues)

figure than the other?

The solution to this problem is pretty obvious. Put OS/2 in the PS/2's ROM, and users will boot up instantly every time into the most advanced PC operating system around. Then license that capability to every other system maker, and just watch how they will rush to support it.

#### 3. Make Network-Ready **Multimedia PCs**


IBM puts neither networking nor sound capabilities into its PCs, on the premise that users should be able to choose whether they want to pay for these features. But when you consider the economies of scale that Big Blue would achieve by making them standard equipment, those excuses sound rather hollow. If every software developer could bet on the presence of these basic capabilities in every PS/2, then the PS/2 would become the most exciting PC platform for which to develop new software.

#### 4. Pick an Interface, Any Interface


By last count, IBM supports about six graphical user interfaces: Presentation Manager, OSF Motif, NeXTstep, Go's PenPoint, Patriot Partners' unannounced software, and the PS/1's graphical shell. Enough already! Certainly there are plenty of good ideas to be found in all these environments to make Windows look anemic by comparison. Now's the time for action, not more acquisition.

Note that Big Blue doesn't have to go out and buy or invent anything new to instantly distinguish itself from the pack of PC vendors and once again grab the attention of the software community and users. All it takes is a little daring—and the willingness to think like a PC company, at long last.







In many cases, consumers have spent far more on multiple copies of an application than they would have on a network version. We not only advised against violating license agreements, we also gave information on preventing illegal use when the number of workstations exceeds that of licenses. —Ed.

compatible. We recommend disabling Windows' SmartDrive and using Super PC-Kwik for a substantial performance improvement. Super PC-Kwik 3.35 was a Best Buy in February 1990. Today's Super PC-Kwik 4.0 lends memory to Windows and DOS applications and lets Windows switch between cache buffering and program functions as needed.

#### THE HELP SCREEN

#### PC World offers answers and advice at every level

Super-VGA monitors can handle XGA, memory on the cheap, upgrading an XT, PostScript and the HP LaserJet, modifying the keyboard for users with disabilities, and making peace between Net-Ware's system and user log-in scripts.

#### XGA and Super-VGA Monitors

Q. Is the new XGA standard compatible with existing 1024 by 768 monitors like the NEC MultiSync 4d? Although prices on these large-screen, enhanced-resolution monitors are finally getting down to a reasonable level, we don't want to invest in yesterday's technology at premium prices.

**A.** Any 1024 by 768–capable super-VGA monitor can handle XGA's inter-laced 1024 by 768 mode, which, as far as the monitor is concerned, is identical to the 8514/A board's. ("Interlaced" means

the electron beam sweeps across the first of the screen's 768 horizontal scan lines, then the third, then the fifth, and so on down the screen, and returns to the top to sweep the second scan line, then the fourth, refreshing the even scan lines as the odd lines fade and vice versa.) In addition, any super-VGA or standard VGA monitor can handle XGA's 640 by 480 16-bit color mode.

Some other super-VGA boards, like the Video 7 VRAM, have a noninterlaced 1024 by 768 mode (scan lines are refreshed one after another from top to bottom), which some high-resolution monitors can't handle. Most third-party XGA-compatible boards are likely to run noninterlaced (at least optionally) to reduce flicker.

Another consideration is that many new video boards have boosted their refresh rate from 60 Hz to 72 Hz to reduce eyestrain and meet European standards. To keep future options open, look for a monitor that can handle noninterlaced, 72-Hz refresh, 1024 by 768 video. (Check the multiscan monitors Buyers' Guide [December 1990, page 212] to see which monitors can handle which modes.)

#### Can I Use SIMMs?

**Q.** Can I use regular SIMMs in place of the proprietary memory expansion modules from ALR, Compaq, and other companies?

**A.** Unfortunately, you can't substitute inexpensive SIMMs for proprietary memory modules. However, there are compatible third-party memory modules that cost quite a bit less than the system manufacturers' products. There

are also less expensive clones of proprietary memory boards for many popular systems, and some of these will take SIMMs. If your dealer doesn't carry such products, check out the mail-order suppliers that advertise in the back of this magazine.

You could also buy a SIMM-based memory board that slips into an expansion slot, but it's usually a bad idea. In a 386 or an 8-MHz or faster 286, memory installed on the expansion bus won't run as fast as the proprietary modules, which use a special "fast slot" that runs at the same speed as the CPU.

Luckily, this upgrade headache will soon be a thing of the past. Most companies, including ALR and Compaq, are using SIMMs in their new system models.

#### **Upgrading an XT**

Q. As I get more involved in desktop publishing, I find I've outgrown my old Epson XT compatible and its 20MB hard drive. Manufacturers are making programs that come only on high-density disks and require more than 640K of memory. Several people have told me I can upgrade the system by installing a BIOS upgrade, a 1.2MB floppy drive, a memory expansion board, and a math coprocessor. Others say I need to replace the motherboard. Epson sent me an ad for an Intel Inboard. Which way should I go?

**A.** Don't sink more money into your old system. True, a new BIOS, controller, and floppy drive would enable your old system to read high-density disks. And if you also added an expanded memory (continues)

board, you'd be able to use *Ventura* or *PageMaker* to produce fairly large documents. But the XT would run such packages so slowly that you wouldn't

want to use them. You need at least a 286-based system, but we suggest you upgrade to a 386 instead. *Windows* runs better on a 386, and if you buy a 286 you may find you've outgrown your system again all too soon.

Intel's Inboard 386/PC will upgrade your system to a 386—sort of. The board replaces the XT's 4.77-MHz 8088 CPU with a 16-MHz 386 processor, but it uses the same slow, 8-bit XT bus. That means you couldn't use faster 16-bit boards, and your hard disk wouldn't run as fast as in a real AT compatible. The Inboard is also limited to a maximum 5MB of fast RAM. Worst of all, it's not fully AT compatible—for instance, it needs a special version of *Windows*. Consequently, we don't recommend the Inboard upgrade path.

A computer shop may be willing to convert your XT to a 386 via a mother-board swap. You'd also need new floppy and hard drives (40MB is cramped for *Windows*), and (unless the new mother-

board has one built in) a new disk controller, too. We're not enthusiastic about this approach, but if the shop gives you a one-year guarantee on the whole upgrade it's worth considering.

We think you'd do best to buy a whole new system. It wouldn't cost that much more than a motherboard swap, and you could recoup part of the cost by selling your old XT. We recommend a 20-MHz 386SX with an 80MB or larger hard disk and 4MB of memory, plus enough empty SIMM sockets on the motherboard to let you upgrade later to 16MB. And while you probably don't need a math coprocessor (used for floating-point calculations, like redrawing CAD screens or recalculating large spreadsheets), you may want one later if you start using scalable fonts regularly.

A. The greatest benefit of a PostScript printer is that you can proof pages at 300 dpi, then send the file to a laser parlor for 1270-dpi Linotronic output, knowing it will be an almost perfect match. That confidence and the broad selection of PostScript fonts are the main reasons that layout artists and professional desktop publishers use PostScript.

Scanned graphics are bit maps and won't be improved by switching to Post-Script. Bézier curves, produced by draw programs like *Corel Draw* and *Adobe Illustrator*, will print better—sometimes much better—with PostScript.

EPS (Encapsulated PostScript) graphics, exported by some graphics programs, won't print at all on a non-Post-Script printer.

PostScript lets you scale fonts to virtually any point size, but now you can get scalable fonts from various non-PostScript font utilities as well. Some, like *Adobe Type Manager*, can even scale PostScript fonts on a non-Post-Script printer.

On the downside, switching to Post-Script will slow down your LaserJet. Considering the performance hit, the cost of the cartridge, and the extra printer memory required, your best course is to hold off upgrading to Post-Script until it solves a specific need, such as the ability to proof pages for later Linotronic output.





#### **POWER TIP NO. 174**

#### Speeding Modem Dialing Through Office PBXs

If you have a nonstandard dial tone on your office phone system, you may have to tweak your modem's attention (AT) command strings. Go to your communications software setup menu, and under modem setup find the strings that begin with AT. To the modem's initialization string (the longest string), add \$6= and then type a number that's larger than 2 and approximately equal to the number of seconds the modem will have to wait for an outside line. Setting the S6 register forces the modem to stop listening for a dial tone after the specified number of seconds and dial without it. You can further speed dialing after the modem gets an outside line by adding W to the tail end of the command string that begins ATDT: This sets the modem to dial the phone number immediately once it hears a normal dial tone rather than wait the entire duration set by register \$6.





#### NETWORK Q&A

#### Make Peace Between NetWare's System and User Log-In Scripts

#### Keith Nickerson

Q. I am having problems getting my NetWare system log-in script to consistently do what it is supposed to do. For some people the log-in script executes exactly as expected, while for others it doesn't.

For example, I have two lines in my system log-in script: WRITE "GOOD "GREETING\_TIME, "FULL\_"NAME" and WRITE "TODAY IS "DAY\_OF\_WEEK, "MONTH\_"NAME "DAY".

For most users, these commands work fine, producing a result like this: GOOD MORNING, JIM CARROLL TODAY IS MONDAY, MARCH 27

Others using the same system log-in script see the following output: GOOD MORNING, JIM CARROLL TODAY IS MONDAY, MARCH 27 GOOD MORNING, JCARROLL

I understand that NetWare provides a default log-in script that would write a message like the third additional line if no system log-in script were present. But there is a system log-in script. What's going on here?

**A.** You're on the right track when you mention the default log-in script, but you're not exactly right about when it kicks in. NetWare runs the default log-in script (shown in **LISTING 1**) when there is neither a system log-in script nor a user log-in script, or when there is a system log-in script but no user log-in script.

It sounds like your setup fits the second case. If you check to see which users are experiencing the problem, I bet you'll find they don't have individual user log-in scripts.

What's happening is that NetWare first looks for, finds, and executes your

system log-in script. NetWare then looks for the user's log-in script, fails to find one, and, finally, executes the default log-in script instead. As a result, the default script is being appended to your system log-in script just as a user script would be.

The default script can cause problems more severe than a scrambled greeting, however. For example, if your system log-in script MAPped the first search drive to something other than SYS:PUBLIC, that mapping would be overridden by the default log-in script.

So what can you do to prevent the default from executing when a user doesn't have an individual log-in script? The most elegant solution is to create a group of users called something like HAVE\_LOGIN\_SCRIPT, which, log-ically enough, includes all those who have log-in scripts. Then add the line IF NOT MEMBER OF HAVE\_LOGIN\_SCRIPT THEN EXIT to the end of your system script.

Thereafter, when users log in, Net-Ware will check to see who belongs to the HAVE\_LOGIN\_SCRIPT group and who doesn't. The EXIT command will prevent execution of the default log-in script for those who don't belong to the group, while the IF statement will skip over the EXIT command for those who do, allowing their personal scripts to run as usual.

Alternatively, you could create a "dummy" personal log-in script for each user. The advantage of this approach is that users can create their own log-in scripts when needed, without having to contact the supervisor to be added to the HAVE\_LOGIN\_SCRIPT group. This dummy script can be as brief as a single space character (that is, one blank), but it's smarter to use a short WRITE command, like WRITE "USER LOGIN SCRIPT EXECUT-ED." That way, you can see for certain that the user log-in script was executed, which makes any later troubleshooting much easier.

A more radical solution is to place an EXIT command at the end of the system log-in script. This will prevent execution not only of the default but also of individual user log-in scripts. You should use this method only if you want to prevent all users from creating their own log-in scripts.



#### **Are PCs Invading Your Privacy?**

The widespread availability of on-line and CD ROM data on prospective customers is great news for businesses looking to enter new territories or to introduce products or services. But for many consumers, that same free flow of information—personal information about themselves and their families—represents an invasion of privacy.

Consumer anger and concern about this issue reached fever pitch last year when Lotus Development and Equifax announced plans to release *Market-place: Households*, a set of CD ROMs that would provide businesses with names, addresses, and demographic information for 120 million consumers throughout the United States. Individual consumers and privacy groups alike were horrified at the notion that for a

fee, businesses would be able to bombard them with direct-mail solicitations—in most cases using information that consumers had provided for credit purposes.

The concept behind *Marketplace* was not new. For years credit bureaus such as Equifax, TRW, and Trans Union, along with at least 200 smaller bureaus, have been making selective pieces of credit-generated information available to direct marketers. Clients simply specify the type of consumer they want to target—men between the ages of 35 and 40 who have \$10,000 of available credit on their credit cards, say—and for a fee they receive a list of names and addresses that match that profile.

But Lotus was the first PC software company to try to bring that level of information within easy reach of small businesses via their desktop computer. (Although a variety of on-line data bases provide demographic information, few supply users with household-level information.) And it was this innovative—and controversial—plan to broaden the base of potential direct marketers that brought down the wrath of consumers on Lotus and Equifax.

Over 30,000 consumers, in fact.

That's how many calls and letters Lotus received from individuals demanding that their names be removed from the disks. An unknown additional number sent similar letters to the Direct Marketing Association (DMA), which also processed name-removal requests.

In fact, the outcry from individuals and consumer groups was so deafening that Lotus and Equifax jointly decided to cancel the product in January. "Unfortunately, *Marketplace: Households* is at the apex of an emotional fire storm of public concern about consumer priva-

cy," said Lotus president and CEO Jim Manzi. "While we believe the actual data content and controls built into the product preserved consumer privacy, we couldn't ignore the high level of concern."

PC products such as *Marketplace* didn't create the controversy that pits personal privacy against free enterprise. But as on-line and CD ROM demographic data bases proliferate and become accessible to tens of thousands of PC-equipped businesses (see "Know Your Market!" in this issue), consumer anxiety and anger will undoubtedly escalate.



with the creation of a national organization to monitor individual privacy rights. Although credit bureaus have traditionally fought such watchdog committees, Equifax's John Baker says that given the high level of anxiety, "the time might be right for some sort of national policy review board."

Lotus's Manzi adds that as PC hardware and software open up new opportunities, questions inevitably arise regarding the use and misuse of technolo-(continues)

gy. "Balancing the advantages of easier access to information with our individual right to privacy is only the first of many new issues our industry will grapple with over the coming years."

In the meantime, there are some actions consumers can take to minimize the intrusion. The Direct Marketing Association offers a service for anyone who wants his or her name removed from the huge data base of names that are sold to direct marketers, including large mail-order firms, nonprofit organizations, and financial institutions. Requests should be sent to Mail Preference Service, Direct Marketing Assoc., 6 E. 43rd St., P.O. Box 3861, New York, NY 10163.

Lorna Christie, vice president of ethics and consumer affairs for the DMA, also suggests that you inform your credit card companies, mail-order firms with which you regularly do business, and magazines or newsletters to which you subscribe that you do not want your name on subscriber or customer lists that are released to other businesses.


#### ISC Operators Declare Bankruptcy; Orders Unfilled

Through an ad in your magazine, I ordered an HP LaserJet IIP from ISC in Hermosa Beach, California. I was told I would receive the merchandise in seven to ten days. ISC immediately charged \$953.12 to my credit card.

When two weeks went by without my receiving the merchandise, I attempted to contact ISC, but its toll-free number was constantly busy. When I called the other number I was told I needed to speak with Rick Andrews, who could be reached only at the toll-free number. I left several messages, but my calls were never returned. After at least two dozen attempts I finally spoke to Mr. Andrews, who said he would trace the package through UPS and then call me with the results. He never called. I managed to reach him the next day (after 45 minutes on hold), and he told me there had been an "invoice problem," that the printer was "in the Midwest somewhere," and that I would receive it "within 48 hours."

Several days later and still without a printer, I again tried to contact Mr. Andrews. No luck. No one else could help. I even resorted to sending him fax messages, all of which were ignored. When I finally reached him after several more days, Mr. Andrews told me ISC would ship a "second" printer that would arrive "within a week." He requested that if I received two printers to refuse shipment on the second.

When nothing happened, the cycle of busy signals, ignored phone messages, *(continues)*



and faxes began again. More than one week later I spoke with another employee, who promised I would receive a call back from the owner. I didn't. The following day, though, I received a call from ISC and was told my account would be credited immediately for \$953.12. Ten days later I called to see if the credit had been issued. Needless to

say, it hadn't. That day, a full seven weeks after I placed the order, I drove to a local computer store and bought a new printer.

Editor's note: Mr. Rainaldi's letter was one of nearly two dozen complaints

we've received about ISC Power Systems, which advertised in PC World and other major PC publications during the late fall and winter of 1990. Complainants relate a common story: Products were ordered and paid for but never received. Customers were frequently told that the products were shipped, with ISC offering to initiate a trace on the "lost" goods.

Consumer Watch has been unsuccessful in reaching anyone at ISC by phone, but we've forwarded all written complaints to the company. Like many ISC customers, however, we've received no response to our inquiries. We have therefore forwarded the complaints to both the Chief Postal Inspector's Office and the State Attorney General's Office for review for possible action.

According to Detective Lance Jaakola of the Hermosa Beach Police Department, his office has received over 30 phone calls from disgruntled ISC customers. The case has been turned over to the district attorney's office for review.



I have twice attempted to use Packard Bell's 24-hour technical support line. The first time was when I set up the system and the hard drive didn't work. After I'd called the 24-hour line for 10 days and left messages on an answering machine, my call was returned, but I was away from the phone and missed it. I called every day for another week with no response. Finally I paid for a call to the customer service line and reached a technician in 5 minutes. Packard Bell sent a local service agent, and he re-(continues)

#### Buying Mail Order for Overseas Military Personnel? Use the Postal Service

Last year I sent an order to Software Publishing Corporation to upgrade my copy of *PFS:First Publisher*. The charge for the upgrade (\$51.50) showed up a short time later on my Visa bill. When I had not received the product a few weeks later, I sent a letter to SPC's customer service department asking that they check on the status of the order and requesting a demo disk of the new version of *Professional Write*. I received neither an answer to my letter nor the demo disk. I sent another letter to the president of SPC and have not received a reply to it either.

Patrick J. Freel Chief Warrant Officer U.S. Army Editor's note: According to SPC, Officer Freel was sent his update, but the carrier had difficulty delivering the package to his APO (Army Post Office) address. Upon discovering the problem, SPC reshipped the package via first-class U.S. mail. According to a spokesman for the Joint Military-Postal Authority in San Francisco, any mail-order purchases for overseas military personnel should be sent this route. Packages ordinarily should arrive in four to seven days. During peak holiday periods or times of war, the shipping time is considerably longer. Whenever possible, also list a domestic address and phone number that the mail-order firm can contact should any problems arise with the order.

#### **A Quick Response**

In January *Consumer Watch* ran a letter from an Artisoft customer who was having difficulty resolving an ongoing problem with his *LANtastic* network.

The item should have indicated that the problem had been resolved.

Says Mike Gaudreau in a follow-up letter, "I am pleased to inform you that Artisoft rectified the problem shortly after receiving your letter. Since the dealer installed the network using his own cable and the Artisoft representative who worked on the problem is no longer there, we will never know the cause of my problem. Artisoft supplied all new cable, new boards, and one year of technical support at no charge. I am very pleased with *LANtastic* thus far and would recommend the product."


Taking the Pain Out of PC Use

In December of last year, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed landmark VDT regulations requiring employers with 15 or more employees to upgrade or replace workstations and equipment to address the special needs of computer users. Desks, chairs, computer screens and keyboards, even officewide lighting may ultimately need to be replaced as a result of the ordinance.

Although the first of its kind in the nation, the new law indicates a growing awareness on the part of computer users, employers, and government officials of the myriad health problems associated with the rush to automate the office. Eyestrain, headaches, and strain and inflammation of muscles, joints, and tendons in the wrists, hands, neck, back, arms, and legs have all been associated with extended VDT use in improper settings. Horror stories abound about computer users who have been disabled by excruciating pain in the arms, wrists, and hands from carpal tunnel syndrome, and thousands more PC users complain of persistent aches and pains due to extended hours spent tapping at the keyboard.

Given the widespread use of PCs in organizations of all sizes, one point is abundantly clear: This isn't just an employee issue or a management issue. Concerns about health problems resulting from poorly designed PC workstations cut across job descriptions. Workers' compensation and disability claims for computer-related health problems continue to rise, and while data-entryintensive positions are the most likely candidates for such injuries, writers, editors, artists—anyone whose job involves heavy PC use-can suffer injuries that keep them off work for days, weeks, or months.

Many of the musculoskeletal and vision problems associated with heavy VDT use can, however, be prevented





#### Microsoft Sets Stage for Windows Reign

Rift With IBM Over System Software Steadily Deepens

OS/2 is Dead. Long Live OS/2."

Like actors in a royal drama, Microsoft officials in January formally buried OS/2, the operating system that they had hailed as the imminent heir to DOS until last year. In its stead, they unveiled an ambitious and controversial plan to enhance the Windows operating environment with many of OS/2's most significant features and to build an entirely new version of OS/2 with more resemblance to high-performance network operating systems like UNIX than to the current desktop OS/2.

"We want to make Windows the best it can be" for the vast majority of business users, says Steve Ballmer, Microsoft's senior vice president for systems software. Acknowledging that OS/2 sales have come nowhere near predictions made when the operating system was first released in 1987, Ballmer also notes that Windows 3.0 sales have exceeded the company's wildest expectations—2,250,000 copies in the last seven months of 1990, compared with 300,000 copies of OS/2 from 1987 through 1990.

Most of those copies of OS/2 went to support network-oriented programs (such as Microsoft's own LAN Manager), and in-house development efforts in Fortune 500 firms. Meanwhile, Windows 3.0 sales have sparked a boom in offthe-shelf Windows application packages like word processors, spreadsheets, and business graphics. Windows software sales should easily overtake Macintosh software sales this year.

Microsoft, which made about 50 percent of its \$1.5 billion in revenues in applications last year, now will push its ambitious Windows plans one step further-despite the prospect of angering IBM, its long-time development partner. "Microsoft has stopped changing its strategy to mollify other companies," says PC Letter editor Stewart Alsop.

#### Windows on Every Desktop

Microsoft officials outline a three-pronged plan of attack in which DOS and Windows will assume the role of mainstream desktop operating system. OS/2, meanwhile, will be relegated to high-end usesfor example, network server applications and workstationlevel desktop programs.

Sometime around midyear, Microsoft will release Windows 3.1, which will feature some performance and cosmetic improvements, including built-in scalable fonts. More important, DOS 5.0 will appear on the scene around the same time, providing memorymanagement features that will improve the way that Windows runs on today's 286 and 386 machines.

In the second half of 1991, Microsoft will start shipping





lemma: whether to ignore the environment's new 386-specific features in order to maintain compatibility with 286 PCs, or to take advantage of them in their programs and thus begin to part ways with the past. "A lot of companies would prefer to shift into 386 mode," says Russ Werner, Microsoft's general manager of systems marketing. "We'll have to see what the market profile will be."

#### Windows on OS/2

IBM will continue developing the current 286 version of OS/2 as well as OS/2 2.0, a full 32-bit version due out this year. But sometime in 1993 or beyond, Microsoft will concentrate on supporting the 386 chip in Windows and release OS/2 3.0. This version will include a new operating system core (called NT, for "new technology") that will run on 386 as well as next-generation RISC processors. OS/2 3.0 will process data on more than one chip at a time, feature built-in networking, and offer users easy access to all the information on a network, regardless of where it resides.

Windows remains integral to this vision (which Microsoft chairman Bill Gates calls "information at your fingertips"). A next generation of Windows that includes many of the object-oriented concepts found in Hewlett-Packard's New-Wave, NeXT's NeXTstep, and Go's PenPoint environments not only will run on a future version of DOS but will serve as the core interface for OS/2 3.0 as well.

Microsoft plans to let Presentation Manager and UNIX programs run on top of OS/2 3.0 as well. But it may also release a stripped-down version of OS/2 3.0, tentatively dubbed "Advanced *Windows*," that

will include only the NT operating system core and the *Windows* interface. Some observers see "Advanced *Windows*" as Microsoft's trump card in its contest with IBM for control of operating system standards.

#### **IBM Begs to Differ**

Although Microsoft reports that most developers are enthusiastic about its new operating system strategy, the plan also has its dissenters.

First among these is IBM, which points out that the very features Microsoft is trumpeting for *Windows* in 1992 will appear in OS/2 2.0, shipping this year.

Moreover, IBM fundamentally disagrees with an approach that encourages developers to bet all their dollars on the DOS-bound *Windows* interface. "IBM would like to see higher-level programming interfaces that are not so sensitive to the operating system," says Lee Reiswig, assistant general manager for programming at IBM's personal systems group. To that end, Big Blue has invested approximately \$100 million in Patriot

Partners, a joint venture with Metaphor Computer Systems formed to build a next-generation computing environment that will permit developers to create programs that run on both OS/2 and UNIX.

Nor is IBM pleased with the prospect of a Microsoftauthored local area network strategy, even if it purports to ease networking headaches for both users and developers. "If Microsoft tries to force LAN *Manager* as a standard on the industry, there will be a very negative reaction," challenges Reiswig.

#### Will Windows Run Out of Steam?


Other developers think that *Windows* will start showing its age in comparison to innovative work being done by Go, NeXT, and Patriot Partners.

"Windows with DOS will be a victim of its own success," says David Reed, Lotus's chief scientist. "It's an old technology that has to face the issue of compatibility with the past. But within a year or so, Windows will face new technology that will promote far greater ease of use. It will be hard for Windows to change fast enough to support these new ideas. Ultimately, it will lose its lead."

Still, Microsoft is sanguine about a strategy that pulls to-day's *Windows* applications into tomorrow's computing environments. Says Russ Werner: "*Windows* is truly a phenomenon. If we can move that applications base so that it spans all the way from DOS to high-end systems, then that will be a very powerful story." —*Richard Landry* 

#### OS/2 3.0-Windows by Another Name

The next generation of OS/2 will be built especially to run DOS and Windows.



OS/2 3.0 will include a new UNIX-like operating system core called NT (for "new technology"), with "snap-in" support for DOS, Windows, Presentation Manager, and UNIX graphical interfaces. Microsoft may also release "Advanced Windows," a stripped-down version of OS/2 3.0 that includes only the NT operating system core, the Windows environment, and DOS support.



If you think your office can't live without electronic mail, wait until you see what's around the corner.

Meeting scheduling, automatic filing of expense reports, voice mail, group editing, deletion of junk messages, prioritizing of messages, automatic replies to routine inquiries, forms management—you name it, and it's on the way.

Vendors increasingly are crafting modular open-architecture packages that allow E-mail to be integrated closely with other applications and are painstakingly pulling together far-flung nets. Their progress increases the importance of an application that many organizations already describe as lifeblood.

E-mail is as "important to the way we work as the telephone," says Stuart Bard, former vice president for office automation at Balcor, a Chicago real estate firm. When Balcor installed The Coordinator from Action Technologies, Bard designed applications with messaging capabilities at their very core, in effect redesigning the way his company did business. "We were able to reduce our corporate staff from 700 to 450 and still maintain the size of our asset base," he says.

#### A Microsoft-Sized Market

Offering tremendous savings over electronic mail on larger systems plus greatly improved user interfaces and functionality, PC-based electronic mail should grow rapidly. Eric Arnum, editor of the *Electronic Mail and Micro Systems* (EMMS) newsletter in Forest Hills, New York, expects the number of E-mail servers in use—currently 160,000 nationwide—to triple over the

next two years.

To date, only relatively small vendors have seriously pursued this potentially huge market. Novell doesn't sell its own E-mail with NetWare (although it's working hard on E-mail underpinnings). Net leaders 3Com and Banyan lost dominant positions as third parties came up with more feature-laden and flexible products. Among the contenders are cc:Mail from cc:Mail in Mountain View, California; The Coordinator from Action Technologies in Alameda, California; Da Vinci eMail from Da Vinci Systems in Raleigh, North Carolina; Higgins from Enable Software's Higgins Group in Alameda, California; Network Courier from Consumers Software in Vancouver, British Columbia; and TOPS from Sitka in Alameda, California.

However, this fast-growing market now gets serious attention from Microsoft, Lotus, WordPerfect, and other major players.

Microsoft, which has offered *Microsoft Mail* for the Macintosh for several years, should fill the gap in its PC product line soon. The giant firm is "putting together a very impressive desktop strategy" and could well become an E-mail market leader, says David Marshak of Patricia Seybold's Office Computing Group in Boston. It also will help establish crucial software standards.

Lotus Development already offers an E-mail variant, although Lotus Notes is marketed instead as a group communications package. Corporations employ Notes to build in-house applications that knit together communications with other packages. Eric Sall, director of applications marketing at Lotus, claims a "tremendously successful" first year for Notes and says that Lotus is putting many more resources behind it. "This is a very strategic product for us," says Sall.

And WordPerfect Office, a desktop organizer/E-mail package, quietly sold more than 375,000 copies in the second half of 1990 (see "The WordPerfect Office," February 1991).

#### The Corporate Mail Call

In small businesses or corporations where departments are fairly autonomous, support (see Electronic, p. 64)



About 160,000 personal computer network electronic-mail servers have been installed to date, according to the Electronic Mail and Micro Systems newsletter. No vendor dominates sales, although some observers expect Microsoft's share to soar once it adds a PC product to its current Macintosh-only line. EMMS estimates that the number of user mailboxes has risen to 3 million.

for E-mail is not a major problem. But many large corporate users hope for a Microsoft, a Lotus, or a WordPerfect to handle their more complex requirements. Eric Savoldi, a systems engineer with American Airlines in Dallas, notes that "we need every imaginable gateway to every imaginable system."

"The majority of E-mail packages are sold by small companies that don't have anywhere near the support staff corporations need to feel comfortable," says Mike Drips, a PC strategic technical analyst for U.S. Sprint in Kansas City, Missouri. "Many companies want national [or] international support, and that is where Microsoft's offering is going to look very attractive."

John Deere & Company in Moline, Illinois, has over 15,000 employees on an E-mail system that occupies an entire IBM 3090 mainframe. A year ago, the firm tested the top PC E-mail packages. It found "very significant cost savings," says Tom Waldman, project manager, who is expanding the pilot throughout the rest of the company. The E-mail vendors lacked the expertise to tie together John Deere's diverse lineup of computers, however, so Waldman turned to an outside specialist to implement cc:Mail.


#### Moving to Modular Software

PC-based E-mail systems come in three layers: the frontend application, the mailtransport engine (which gets a message from one user mailbox to another), and the connectivity layer (which contains gateways that link up to other E-mail systems).

When you go shopping for an E-mail package, you typically get all three layers from the same vendor. But sometimes one of the layers doesn't answer your needs. (This is likely to be the connectivity layer, which may lack a gateway you require.)

In theory, future PC users will be able to mix and match all these components to come up with the perfect E-mail package for them. That's easier said than done, however. One problem is the lack of a single standard mail-transport device. Novell and many others back the Message Handling System (MHS) that comes with NetWare, but most E-mail suppliers built proprietary mail transports before MHS became a factor. These suppliers say MHS is not robust enough, although they have added gateways to MHS systems.

Other alternatives come through X.400, an evolving set of specifications for writing mail transports, which is being forged by the CCITT international standards body.

Based on Ami Professional, Professional Write Plus for Windows sports the familiar customizable icon bar and floating style-sheet window. The key new feature is a tightly integrated E-mail module. Like most editors, I'm a wordy guy. Put a whole staff of editors on an E-mail system, and the megabytes of verbiage quickly pile up. E-mail has become not only our messaging medium but our routing medium as well.

That's a problem. The simple text editors built into most E-mail packages are fine for short memos, but you usually spend a lot of time switching between E-mail and a sepa-

rate word processor. Once you're in the word processor, it's easy to forget the exact details of the message you're answering. If you do save the message to disk along with many others, you may have trouble recalling its name. Saving a file for E-mail transmission can also be a hassle unless the recipient has the same word processor, you must save the file in ASCII, and duplicate files can waste disk space and lead to confusion. Finally, even if your

E-mail package lets you "shell out" to another application and back, you'll drum your fingers while switching.

Add up these annoyances, and you'll see why Software Publishing's *Professional Write Plus for Windows* makes so much sense. ## A New Breed of Professional

It's based instead on Ami Professional— SPC licensed the code from Samna (before Lotus bought Samna), halved the price, and stripped some features to fit the executive word processor mold. Professional Write Plus  $lacks {\it Ami Professional's mac-}$ ros, kerning, table editor, table of contents, and indexing, and there's no outlining, redlining, drawing, or charting.

Still, the program is markedly more powerful than either *Professional Write* or the


low-end Ami, and most executives won't mind the omissions when they consider the other top features borrowed from Ami Professional. These include style sheets, thesaurus, speller, footnotes, and full Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) support for automating data transfer between Windows applications. Professional Write Plus shares Ami Pro's superb formatting and graphics handling talents—like a desktop publishing package, the program lets you draw frames, import graphics, and then easily manipulate and rescale images.

SPC even adds a few tricks of its own. You can invert graphic images and draw on an extensive list of file conversion routines. Also new: an integrated version of the popular *Grammatik* grammar checker.


The only major interface change from Ami Pro is that pulldown menus have been reorganized slightly. As with Ami Pro, you'll enjoy well-designed dialog boxes complete with graphical examples that reflect formatting changes on the spot. ery time it sees an XLS file, it automatically loads the file in *Excel*. The only key omission is message folders, and you'll miss out on extras like blind copies and return receipt.

MHS compatibility means you can exchange mail with any other MHS package, including Da Vinci eMail, WordPerfect Office, and special MHS versions of The Network Courier and cc:Mail. You'll miss out on a few of your department E-mail system's bells and whistles, however, such as bulletin boards.

But forget features. The

real treat of *Professional Write Plus*'s E-mail module is its tight integration with the word processor. To send the current document, you just select a pulldown menu option, choose a mailing list, and answer prompts asking whether to keep style and graphics or send the file as ASCII text. If you want, you can quickly pop received documents into the main editing screen.

Now that *cc:Mail, The Net-work Courier*, and other major E-mail packages sell in *Windows* versions, you may wonder whether you need

built-in E-mail. After all, with Windows—and a 386 and enough RAM—you can load both your E-mail and word processing packages at once and cut and paste between them. But if you're a little short on PC horsepower, or if you want to add E-mail to Novell sites without any big installation hassles, or if you just crave that extra level of integration, Professional Write Plus looks like a good executive decision.

## **HP's Net-Worthy Improvement**

Big, fast, and built to take a pounding, HP's LaserJet IIISi may set a new price/performance standard for network printers.



Fast printing and brawny paper handling make the IIISi a boon for LAN users.

N ineteen ninety-one may not be the year of the LAN, but it's definitely the year of the LAN printer. Texas Instruments, Sharp, and Kodak have all announced affordable 16-page-per-minute (ppm) lasers with the speed, durability, and paper handling to serve scores of network users. But none is likely to have greater impact than HP's LaserJet IIISi.

The IIISi gives you the scalable fonts and high-quality output of the LaserJet III in a 17-ppm workhorse. At \$5495, it's bound to win the hearts of companies accustomed to printers like HP's \$20,000 20-ppm LaserJet 2000.

Speed, Finesse, and Power The HP's 17-ppm 300-dpi Canon engine is only half the story. Unlike the 16-ppm machines, the IIISi's high-speed interface and fast RISC processor enable it to churn out complex fonts and graphics at near its rated engine speed.

The IIISi's parallel interface sucks in data at 38K per second—twice the rate of standard parallel ports. Optional \$695 ethernet or \$795 token ring boards take in files at a blistering 160K per second and let you install the printer anywhere on the LAN without having to hook it to a PC.

A 16-MHz AMD 29000 chip makes fast work of PCL 5 fonts and graphics (like those found in the original LaserJet III), but its real forte is processing PostScript files. Another \$895 buys you Adobe PostScript's 35 scalable fonts and graphics savvy. However,

the IIISi can't switch automatically between PCL 5 and PostScript; you'll have to do it from your application—and once you switch, you'll lose any fonts you've downloaded.

The IIISi comes with 13 scalable font outlines (plus 14 bit-mapped fonts for emulating the LaserJet II) and two backward-compatible font cartridge slots. The unit's rather skimpy 1MB of RAM expands to a whopping 17MB for downloading fonts and spooling print jobs. You'll need to add RAM, via 1MB (\$139) or 4MB (\$449) SIMM modules, if you want to print full-page graphics or legal-sized documents or to access HP's Post-Script or \$695 duplex options.

## Sharp Text, Low Cost

Neither Kodak, TI, nor Sharp can match HP's patented Resolution Enhancement Technology (RET), which varies the size and placement of toner dots for smoother text and curves. The IIISi's special microfine toner particles enhance RET's effects and lower print costs to about 2 cents a page (8000 pages per \$169 cartridge), a penny cheaper than most lasers.

The printer is built to handle 50,000 pages a month. Two 500-sheet input trays are standard, as are sophisticated collating features and an outputtray-full sensor.

As more companies jump on the LAN-wagon, the office laser will be expected to do a lot more—quickly, and for a reasonable price. The Laser-Jet IIISi meets those expectations, and then some.  $\blacksquare$





The 8.3-pound MT735 fits in a briefcase and gives you 300-dpi output at up to 6 pages per minute on the road.

Anybody who says you can't take it with you has not been paying attention to the PC printer market. The Canon BJ-10e and Seikosha LT-20 prove you no longer have to wait until you get back to the office (or even for your plane to land) to produce good-looking hard copy. Mannesmann Tally goes these offerings one better with a portable thermal transfer printer that offers laserlike performance.

The Mannesmann Tally MT735 is heftier in weight and price than the Canon and Seikosha printers, which weigh less than 6 pounds and cost under \$600. But it's much faster than its ink jet and dot matrix competitors and claims output quality rivaling that of the LaserJet IIP.

The MT735 produces 300dpi output at up to 6 pages per minute—not bad for a machine that still weighs only 8.3 pounds and measures about 11 by 9 by 2½ inches. The \$1295 MT735 is slim enough to fit inside your briefcase or sit between your pencil sharpener and Rolodex. Its built-in NiCad battery is good for 150 pages between recharges.

## **Get Faster Printing and a Copier Too**



The Ektaplus 7016 brings you everything you could ask for in a network printer, plus a 6-ppm convenience copier.

Barely a ripple at COMDEX Fall, now there's a tsunami of 16-page-per-minute printers rolling in to carry work-group users to new levels of productivity. You can find many a worthy offering between trough and crest, with price tags that match some innovative capabilities. (For example, your options extend from the \$3295 Sharp JX-9700 to the \$5495 HP LaserJet IIISi, previewed in this issue.)

Kodak packs its new Ektaplus 7016 with the full range of features and even adds something unique—a 6-ppm copier. Kodak calls it a convenience copier, meaning that it isn't intended to replace your office workhorse; it just lets you whip off a few quick copies now and then without having to leave your work area. It shares the printer's film belt, toner, and developer but uses neither the LED printing element nor the controller of the Ektaplus, so that your work group's spooled print queue can take up where it left off within 60 seconds.

The copier is the crowning touch of a first-cabin printer well equipped for network duty. The first in a line and able to hook into any node, the Ektaplus has a conservatively rated 15,000-pages-per-month duty cycle and two 250-sheet

cassette trays. You can print letterhead and plain paper up to 8½ by 14 inches alternately or have a 500-sheet print run of the same stock. The top tray has a manual single-sheet and a number 10-size business envelope feeder. The single output tray handles 200 sheets. Labels and transparencies feed reliably through the paper path.

The Kodak-designed controller has a 10-MHz Motorola 68010 microprocessor and

2MB of RAM upgradable to 4MB. You can allocate up to 1.25MB of that as a page buffer, enabling the controller to compile a full 8½ by 14, bitmapped page all at once.

The remaining RAM can be used to hold downloadable fonts or macros or as a large print spooler. You'll want a large spooler, because you can configure the Ektaplus with up to four serial or parallel ports in any combination (one of each comes standard) and address all of them simultaneously. The Ektaplus dynamically allocates the right amount of buffer to each port and queues print jobs on a first-in, first-out basis by constantly polling the ports.

There isn't automatic emulation switching between ports, each of which must be set to one of the standard emulations—PCL 4.5, HPGL-2, Epson FX-80, IBM Proprinter, and Diablo. But the environment is preserved so you don't lose any fonts you've downloaded. You also can get Adobe PostScript with the standard 35 fonts on a \$1995

daughterboard. It carries its own Motorola 68020 and 4MB of RAM dedicated to nothing but PostScript.

The basic printer is \$5495 with 30 resident fonts that include the standard 14-font PCL 4.5 lineup and Bitstream portrait and landscape fonts. A PostScript-equipped Ektaplus is \$6995. Both models have a front slot that takes additional Kodak ROM cards. The single cartridge toner/drum results in a 3½-centsper-page cost for consumables. —Mike Hogan

## **Bus Master Boosts LAN Performance**

Since its 1987 introduction, the promise of the PS/2's Micro Channel architecture (MCA) has been its ability to boost overall system performance by offloading certain processor-intensive tasks to bus-master cards. Despite the previous introductions of third-party products, that's been a promise that has gone largely unfulfilled—that is, until now.

MCA comes of age with IBM's new Token-Ring Network 16/4 Busmaster Server Adapter/A, an add-in board that promises to increase throughput on a LAN as much

as 25 percent by letting its onboard processor take LAN management duties off the shoulders of the server's main processor.

Designed to run in the servers of token ring LANs where many users might access the same applications or run multiple applications, the card's bus-master chip controls transmission and reception of data to and from the network, bypassing the main CPU.

The Busmaster Server Adapter/A supports token ring LANs having either 4- or 16-megabit-per-second data transfer rates. Currently, Novell's NetWare 386 version 3.1 and Banyan Systems' VINES network operating systems support the product.

The \$1030 adapter comes with diagnostics that perform a self-test when the server is turned on and off. —*Cheryl Goldberg*



A "portable" cousin of IBM's XP 90 desktop, the P75 measures a substantial 18.3 inches wide by 12.1 inches high by 6.1 inches deep. It comes fully packed with 8MB of 70ns memory (expandable to 16MB on the system board), a SCSI controller, a 10-inch VGA gas plasma screen, a high-resolution XGA adapter with 1MB of VRAM for the fastest possible screen response, and a port for an external XGA monitor.

The P75 comes with the usual 3½-inch floppy drive, as well as serial, parallel, and mouse ports. Not so standard on portables are its full-sized 101-key keyboard, 120-watt power supply, two half-sized 8/16-bit slots, and two full-

sized, 32-bit Micro Channel architecture slots—the latter making this an ideal networking portable. We're not just talking about a node on a network, either; thanks to the P75's SCSI port, you can connect up to six external SCSI devices to it—without using an expansion slot.

Internal storage is equally hefty. You can choose from two fast SCSI drives: a 16ms 160MB drive and IBM's new 11.5ms 400MB drive.

As you might expect, the P75 comes down heavy on pricing, too. The 160MB configuration sells for \$15,990, while the 400MB version is \$18,890. At those prices, the P75 isn't for everyone. But if you need a portable that puts most desktops to shame, IBM has your machine. —Eric Bender

A batch of project- and joboriented improvements, an allnew bank reconciliation module, and a face-lift bring the last and most vertical *Open Systems Accounting Software (OSAS)* modules up to par with those previously enhanced. This upgrade lets you use time billing and so on with the already upgraded 4.0 versions of the general ledger, accounts receivable, accounts payable, and payroll modules.

module so each can be used with the "big four" modules. As with the new time billing module, version 4.0 of CRAFT and fixed assets sports the new windowing interface. CRAFT 4.0 sells for \$1995, fixed assets for \$895.

The all-new *OSAS* bank reconciliation module, which ensures that bank accounts are in line with accounting records, allows for a six-character account identification. The number of accounts is limited only by available disk space. Bank reconciliation can be used as a stand-alone application or linked with other *OSAS* modules. The suggested retail price is \$395.

Module upgrade prices vary depending on the version currently in use. System requirements include DOS 2.0 or later, 640K of RAM (with 512K available), a hard drive, and OSAS Resource Manager, which is \$295 for the single-user version and \$995 for the network version. —Roberta Furger

## **ZDS Aims at Top, Bottom of Windows Workstation Market**

No matter what anyone tells you, to take full advantage of the new graphical *Windows 3.0* applications you'll need more than the average amount of processor speed, memory, and storage. Zenith Data Systems (ZDS) gives you a high road and a low road to full-fledged *Windows* productivity: the Z-486/25E and Z-386 SX/20, respectively.

The Z-486/25E is ZDS's first i486 computer and a compact EISA system to boot for server CAD or the most demanding desktop publishing uses. In addition to a 25-MHz processor and 4MB of RAM expandable to 64MB on the motherboard, the Z-486/25E features a new 64-bit memory bus to accelerate traffic between the two and enhance performance of complex and/ or graphical applications. It can send 32-bit data to the processor and receive from memory at the same time. Three available 8/16/32-bit EISA slots speed I/O bus traffic and give you the option of adding bus-mastering cards.

The two Z-486/25E models offer integrated controllers to manage a standard 3½-inch 1.44MB floppy, another optional floppy, and one of two hard drives; you also get one parallel and two serial ports and support for the Weitek 4167 coprocessor.

The \$8599 Model 80 comes with a 640 by 480 VGA card and has a 19ms 80MB hard disk. The \$9999 Model 170 comes with a 16ms 170MB hard disk and employs a 1024 by 768 VGA-compatible Texas Instruments Graphics Architecture (TIGA) card. The TIGA card improves resolution, and its 60-MHz processor dramatically speeds up redrawing of images for users running graphics-intensive

applications; it can be added to the Model 80 for \$899. An optional 16-inch color VGA monitor handles either 1024 by 768 or standard VGA output and lists for \$1999.

If you have a less demanding application and less to spend, the Z-386 SX/20 is a good, basic *Windows* worksta-

tion with plenty of power from the new 20-MHz version of the 386SX. That processor is bolstered by a 32K memory cache user-expandable to 128K. Included are 2MB of RAM (expandable to 16MB on the motherboard), the same drive offerings as the Z-486/25E, a VGA card, a 3½-inch 1.44MB floppy drive, four open 8/16-bit slots, and one parallel and two serial ports.

You can choose the Model 40 with a 28ms 40MB hard disk for \$3499 or the Model 80 with a 19ms 80MB hard disk for \$3999. The Z-386 SX/20 uses the same compact box as the Z-486/25E. Like all current ZDS 386 and 486 systems, both have a 101-key keyboard, a Microsoft Mouse, and DOS 4.01 and Windows 3.0 preinstalled on their hard disks. —Rex Farrance

The latest release of Scitor's graphically based project management package, *Project Scheduler 5* lets you more easily consolidate independent schedules in your work group and adds expanded project viewing and multiple-report printing capabilities.


Most other project managers allow for some kind of consolidation of different projects by representing each subproject as a task in a master project that is merely a summation of those subprojects. Updating any of the tasks in the subprojects updates the master project, but it doesn't work the other way around. Scitor doesn't force you to make a common change by going through each of the subprojects independently: You simply identify the independent projects that are to be associated, which ensures that changes in the group-level plan stay consistent with each separate project and vice versa.

Project Scheduler 5 gives you new ways to conceptualize all of this, first by enabling you to show multiple milestones and activities on the same line in a standard Gantt chart. This allows you to get a condensed view of the Gantt chart, showing a whole project with its series of activities on a single page. Depending on the level of detail you depict, you may be able to get more than one project on a page.

The update also gives you a new way of viewing and building a project. Many organizations plan their projects by subject area rather than by logical or time sequence, breaking tasks into more detail as departments demand. Project Scheduler 5 enhances this approach by letting you create a "tree" chart called a Work Breakdown Structure

(WBS), which lets you eliminate the time dependency among tasks so that you can get tasks into the system that later can be linked logically in the critical path method.

ent work groups can be rerun every time the tasks change.

Other new features include the ability to add text around the bars in a Gantt chart and to update the status of an activity by dragging the bars in the chart with a mouse rather than by keying in numbers.





Zoltrix bundles Bit Software's *Bitcom* (to handle modem communications) and *Bit-fax* with both ZoFax 96/24P and ZoFax 96/24Plus to let you schedule fax transmissions, direct incoming faxes to printer or disk, and even send multiple files.



With the palm-sized ZoFax 96/24P, you can send Group III faxes from your laptop computer.

ZoFax lets you send and receive faxes in the background using the TSR part of *Bitfax*. But since there's no on-board coprocessor to handle communications chores, you'll notice some slowdown in foreground applications while receiving, and still more while ZoFax sends your faxes. Also, the TSR takes 78K of lower-640

memory and can't be loaded in high DOS memory.

ZoFax is a couple hundred dollars under competitors. Included are an AC adapter, a 9-pin and 25-pin serial connector, a 6-foot phone cord with modular phone jack—even a battery and a carrying case that you can clip on to your belt. —Mark Henricks

## 8514/Ultra, Icon Photo Board

## **Smooth Boards**

Working with the often-tiny design elements of CAD or publishing files can be frustrating, especially if you have less than a jumbo monitor. But new graphics boards from ATI Technologies and Icon Technologies promise to ease your eyes with anti-aliasing methods that smooth the "jaggies" out of curved and diagonal lines, clean up print previews, and make even 6-point type legible.

These boards take different paths to produce that result: ATI uses software fonts to smooth the edges, while Icon uses a special chip from Edsun Labs. The Icon board has more colors and greater legibility; the ATI 8514/Ultra offers more speed.

ATI's 8514/Ultra is somewhat more limited than the Icon board in that it can anti-

alias text under Windows 3.0, but not for DOS applications. Small text is made legible using ATI's Crystal Fonts, which can be scaled "on the fly." The 8514/Ultra bundles 13 PostScript fonts—including Times Roman and Helvetica—occupying as little as 30K per font family.

The 8514/Ultra also includes a proprietary Mach 8 graphics coprocessor that, according to ATI, can increase the speed of CAD applications, desktop publishing, and *Windows 3.0* by a factor of 10. The 8514/Ultra includes both super-VGA and 8514/A 1024 by 768 noninterlaced modes, which refresh screens one line after another to reduce flicker.

If you have an internal VGA connector, you can still use your old VGA card with this board or you can buy the 8514/Ultra + VGA that includes the VGAWonder + adapter built onto the Ultra board. It is \$100 more than the regular 8514/

Ultra, which includes 512K for \$599 or 1MB for \$799.

The Icon Photo Board is a VGA board that uses the new Edsun Labs chip to alleviate jaggies on the rounded edges of letters and graphics. The chip emulates 24-bit True Color displays, offering an effective resolution of 2048 by 1536 with up to 786,432 simultaneous colors out of 16.7 million on a standard VGA monitor.

Selling for \$475 with 1MB of memory, the Photo Board has IBM VGA compatibility and will support a 1024 by 768 noninterlaced monitor and resolutions of 800 by 600 and 680 by 480. Icon's library includes drivers for Windows 3.0, AutoCAD/AutoShade, 1-2-3 and Symphony, and Micro Station PC. As a bonus, the Photo VGA Board allows spreadsheet gurus to take advantage of a 132-column driver for 1-2-3 and Symphony.

If you're a CAD or DTP user, the Icon Photo Board can

give you more color with greater legibility. If speed is what you're after, the ATI 8514/Ultra may be a better choice. —Susan Lusty



MouseMan Cordless Radio Mouse, Cordless Super Mouse

## **Freewheeling Mice**

There's no doubt that a conventional mouse can be pesky at times, taking up space on your desktop and getting tangled with papers and coffee mugs. Both Z-Nix and Logitech take your mouse off its tether, letting you roll it around any part of your desktop that's convenient.

A cordless mouse retains the same basic shape and mechanical principle as a regular mouse, but instead of a cord, the mouse houses a transmitter that sends signals to a stationary receiver plugged into your PC. The Cordless Super Mouse from Z-Nix uses infrared signals; Logitech's Mouse-Man Cordless Radio Mouse uses radio waves.

The Cordless Super Mouse operates like the remote control for your TV or VCR and requires a clear line of sight between mouse and receiver. The receiver takes in signals within a 90-degree arc side to side and up and down from its electronic eye and from as far away as 6 feet. The receiver, which doubles as a mouse stand and battery charger for the mouse's two 8-hour batteries, can be placed on your desktop or your PC. One of the two one-year batteries is being recharged in the receiver while the other is being used by the mouse.

The MouseMan Cordless Radio Mouse is the first radio-controlled mouse on the market. It runs on a frequency low enough not to interfere with other machinery on your desktop and has an operating range of 6 feet in a 360-degree circle around the receiver. Similar to a cordless telephone or garage-door opener, the receiver for a radio-controlled mouse can be located anywhere within its receiving

range, even under your desk, and it doesn't mind clutter; but it has to function at specific frequencies so it doesn't interfere with other equipment in your office or your neighbor's.

All MouseMan units initially are set to the same de-

fault channel within the frequency, but they come with up to eight channels so that if you're operating within one meter of another MouseMan, you can switch channels. The MouseMan runs on a common lithium battery, and it sustains its one-year life by running at lower levels when the mouse is not active.

Both the Cordless Super Mouse and the MouseMan Cordless Radio Mouse connect to a serial port on your PC and work with any Microsoft Mouse-compatible software. Special utilities bundled with the hardware can modify keyboard-based software to work with the mouse. The Z-Nix Cordless Super Mouse retails for \$164.95, while the Logitech MouseMan is \$199.

## Tell It Like It Is, Hear It Like You Tell It

Ever get lost in your spreadsheet formulas or wish that you could point out the critical or overly technical parts of your business reports to your readers in layman's terms? By using the voice annotation capabilities of Voice-It, you can add your perspective to thorny WordPerfect documents and 1-2-3 spreadsheets. These \$99 programs use the Artisoft LANtastic Voice Adapter Board, which is bundled with the Artisoft Handset. If you don't already have this hardware, you can buy it with the software for an extra \$100.

After *Voice-It* is installed, it resides within the utility section of your main application (so far, it supports only 1-2-3 or *WordPerfect*), and you can call it using hot keys.

First, place your cursor on the cell or paragraph that you want to explain, then activate *Voice-It* by hitting <Alt> <F7>. Type R (for record) and talk away into the Handset. When you're finished, type Q, and the utility closes and returns you to your application. Although you can talk all you want, be prepared to pay the piper in kilobytes—expect 480K of hard disk space to disappear for each minute of speech (248K if compressed).

So how do your readers know where to find your pearls of wisdom? In 1-2-3 they can run a search function that will generate a list of the cell numbers in which notes appear. Or they can invoke Voice-It to find the audio notes for them. Voice-It for WordPerfect uses markers within the text to visually aid users in locating and playing the notes. Of course, they always have the option of plowing through the numbers or words sans audio notes or repeating audio notes along the way.

Your Voice-It-annotated files can travel across any local area network as binary text files or be stored on floppies. Voice-It is available for 1-2-3 2.x and WordPerfect 5.x formats. Support for ASCII files is anticipated around midyear. Expect the 1-2-3 version of the utility to take up 40K of conventional memory; the Word-Perfect version will use 75K. Also tack on an additional 6K for the LANtastic Voice Adapter. —Cathy Smith



## **Callers Get Faxes on Demand**

The marriage of fax and voice-recognition technologies has spawned a service that developers describe as unattended fax retrieval. It works like this: Customers call a *VoiceFax*-equipped computer, listen to a computer-generated message, and type in a product code number and their fax number using a phone touchpad, and the desired document is automatically faxed to them—all without a human operator's assistance.

VoiceFax is for you if you're a professional information broker or in any business seeking a more cost-effective means of dispensing data to customers, prospective customers, or even off-site employees. VoiceFax lets a caller select from up to 500 different text and graphic documents using a three-digit PIN that is provided beforehand.

Your documents can be created with desktop publishing software and have multiple fonts and complex graphics. *VoiceFax* can import and export ASCII, Paradox, DBF, and WKS file formats.

VoiceFax lets you customize all aspects of the system, from caller access levels to voice messages. You can limit the number of calls or documents available to each caller per day or confine incoming calls to a particular area code. You can restrict public access to generic product information, while permitting off-site sales staff to receive sensitive corporate faxes. You can change your on-line messages using the telephone handset as a microphone, and any feature of the system can be modified without using programming or scripting languages.

VoiceFax monitors and records all on-line usage, providing valuable demographic data. You can create reports on the number of daily fax transmissions, client account data, and present system configuration.

VoiceFax isn't cheap, and it requires a 386 or 486 with 4MB RAM, an 80MB hard disk, VGA graphics, a voice-recognition board, a fax board, and two dedicated phone lines. A bundle of the voice software, a run-time version of Paradox data manager for managing your fax documents, a Tone-

Talker TT-100 voice-recognition board from BCB Electronic Sales, and a GammaFax fax board from GammaLink sell for \$5895. Full turnkey systems start at \$8995 for a 386/25-based PC with *Voice-Fax*, the *Paradox* run-time version, and ToneTalker TT-100 and GammaFax boards.

VoiceFax supports multiple fax boards for multiple transmissions but is limited to a single incoming voice line, leaving many customers with an "all lines busy" recording. The firm is developing a version for multiple voice lines. —Art Wilcox





## 33-MHz 386s: Survival of the Fastest

When demanding future applications arrive, will you be ready? Buy one of the nine 33-MHz 386s reviewed here, and enjoy power for today and tomorrow at a practical price.

Remember when the 33-MHz 386 was cutting-edge technology? That isn't so anymore, which is good news for the price conscious. On average, a 386/33 costs a full \$1800 less than

an equivalent 25-MHz 486 (\$1200 less if you buy the 386 with a math coprocessor). True, 486/25s are nearly 44 percent faster than 386/33s in CPU-intensive tests, but they're only slightly faster at disk-intensive chores. With power enough to take you well into the nineties, 386/33s are the best bargains in high-end computing.

Many buyers shopping for a file server assume they need a 486, but at today's prices, a 486 is a waste of money. File server performance depends more on the hard disk and the amount and speed of the RAM than on the CPU, and that makes the 386/33 a wiser purchase.

A 386/33 can also make a good workstation, but it's not for everyone. Some users are probably better off buying a 20-MHz 386SX for about half the cost. Because it's a 386, an SX will still run *Windows* reasonably well if you don't do a lot of multitasking or run high-end graphics programs. If you do, the SX's pace will be leisurely, making a full-blooded 386 a better choice.


#### **Putting Technology in Its Place**

We scrutinized nine 33-MHz 386s for your shopping pleasure, everything from small-footprint desktop com-

puters to full-strength floor-standing towers. Our standard system configuration included 4MB of RAM, a 100MB to 150MB hard disk, VGA graphics, a color monitor, a mouse, and the latest available version of DOS. For network testing, we installed the manufacturer's 300MB (or next larger capacity) hard disk. To obtain realistic prices, we polled more than 100 retailers in eight major cities nationwide to find the street prices of systems equipped in our configuration.

As the PC World Test Report reveals, performance scores varied considerably. Before you buy a system, make sure it performs well in your applications—it may be lightning fast in one application but agonizingly slow in another. The *Windows* test is a key gauge of desktop performance, the NetWare test of server performance.

Expandability is key to long-term usefulness, especially in a server. Having plenty of drive bays and expansion slots will ensure that you can give your PC infusions of life-extending technology over the years. Five of the reviewed systems offer an EISA (Extended Industry Standard Architecture) bus, which promises higher throughput and backward compatibility with standard AT-style boards. But the jury's still out on EISA: Few add-on boards exploiting it have arrived, and on the whole, the AT-style systems tested here performed just as well as the EISA systems.



Is it a server or just a supersonic desktop? These two Best Buys can play both roles, but the speedy Arche Legacy 386-33 is better at desktop duty, while the expandable AST Premium 386/33TE is the top server.

Besides speed, RAM capacity is the other advantage that the standard 80386 chip has over the less expensive SX. Yet many of the systems reviewed here support only 16MB of CPU-speed RAM—the SX's limit. For a workstation, 16MB, which is OS/2's and *Windows'* current capacity, will be sufficient for many years to come. But that's not true for a server, where more buffers and a

larger cache translate into performance gains. Novell's NetWare 386 can take advantage of up to 4 gigabytes today, and you can expect other network operating systems to follow suit.

Currently, memory beyond 16MB is probably useful only if your server commands a large, busy NetWare 386 LAN, and it's probably not cost-efficient even then. But

Is ALR kidding? Only \$3796 for a 33-MHz 386? No joke—that's the price for a fully equipped unit, including built-in EISA graphics. It may be the desktop bargain of the roundup, but fairly limited expandability and shaky technical support make it a no-go as a file server.

as the demand on your network grows, you'll be tempted to buy more RAM. And as memory gets cheaper, you'll be glad to have someplace to put it. (See the sidebar "Buying Smart" for more details on buying criteria.)

So what's the verdict? Two systems, both reasonably priced, win *PC World* Best Buy honors in a virtual tie. The blazing Arche Legacy 386-33 is your best choice as a small server or a highend workstation, while the ever-expandable AST Premium 386/33TE can handle any network you're likely to throw its way. With either of these systems, power computing can be within your means.

#### **ALR BusinessVEISA 386/33**

**PROS:** Rock-bottom price, high fast-RAM capacity, upgradable CPU

**CONS:** Poor service and support; no room for full-height drive; obstructed slots

At first glance, ALR's BusinessVEISA 386/33 looks darn near invincible. Its performance is quite good (it came in first in our NetWare test and second in the *Paradox* test), and its \$3796 street price is by far the lowest in the roundup. If not for ALR's below-average service and support, the system might have won a Best Buy. Still, the BusinessVEISA is a good choice for individuals or as a

server for a small LAN.

As you'd expect in a small-footprint desktop, the VEISA's chassis is fairly cramped inside. You can install two third-height and two half-height drives, but this is the only system reviewed that lacks room for a full-height drive. For the time being, that limits you to about 300MB of storage.

Thanks to its CPU-on-a-board design, you can swap the 33-MHz 386 for a 25- or 33-MHz 486. The VEISA has a full six open slots, three of them EISA, but because its CPU board gets in the way, one of the 16-bit slots can take only a half-length board. If you install more than 17MB of RAM, you'll obstruct the other 16-bit slot. Aside from that, the VEISA's chassis and front panel are well laid out and easy to work on.

ALR's support services aren't as well designed: Phone support ends at 5 on weekdays, with no free weekend hours and no toll-free number. Our experiences in calling ALR's technical support were much the same as they've been in the past; we once got through to a technician after a 10-minute wait, but the other times we had to wait for a call back. We once waited until the next day. ALR provides no on-site service, but several of the ALR dealers we talked with offer it at an additional cost, and one provided it free for one year.

Despite its fast NetWare scores, ALR's BusinessVEISA 386/33 is too cramped to serve large networks, and the technical support may deter others. But an unbeatable price makes it a good deal for bargain hunters.

#### Arche Legacy 386-33



**PROS:** Fastest in the roundup, two-year warranty

**CONS:** Flimsy case, additional RAM cards eat up slots

#### **BUYING SMART**

#### PERFORMANCE

The speeds of your processor, hard disk, RAM,

and video controller all affect performance, but to different degrees, depending on the nature of the job at hand.

Poor video throughput will slow down Windows performance but won't affect a file server, and while a sluggish hard disk slows all applications, it doesn't affect 1-2-3 as much as it does dBASE. When examining our test results, keep your applications in mind.



#### **EXPANDABILITY**

A computer should be able to grow with your

needs. Plenty of expansion slots and drive bays will let you continue to enhance your system.

All the systems reviewed here have enough drive bays to make a good workstation. If your system has three front-loading bays for two floppy drives and a tape drive, plus one internal hard disk bay (even if it's only 3½ inches), it will be sufficient.

But you'll want more than that for a server. A full-height bay gives you the freedom to install one big drive or two small ones. Look for at least one full-height bay in your drive server, as well as three front-loading bays.

Workstations and servers have pretty much the same requirements for expansion card slots. In a server, you'll want various I/O cards. In an individual PC, you may eventually want a network card, an internal modem, a printer controller, a fax board, a mouse card, a scanner board, or some combination of these. Either way, five slots will probably be sufficient, and six is even more reassuring. Note the difference between slots and free slots; any slots that are used for standard controllers, VGA boards, or RAM cards don't count.

But what kind of slots should your system have? There are two standards for expansion buses that promise better throughput than the old AT bus: EISA (Extended Industry Standard Architecture), which is compatible with the old bus, and Micro Channel, which isn't. These buses may prove valuable in the future—especially for servers, where bus throughput is a major bottleneck—but they have yet to prove their worth. No Micro Channel models were available for this review.



#### FAST-RAM CAPACITY

You'll probably buy your new system with 4MB to

8MB of RAM, and that's plenty at the moment. But someday you may want more, and that's when your system's capacity for CPU-speed RAM—memory that bypasses the slower bus—may prove too low. For a personal workstation, 16MB of fast RAM is probably all you'll ever need, but for a file server, you'll want support for at least 32MB.



#### DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

A well-designed, well-

built computer will give you fewer headaches in the years to come.

Look for a chassis that gives you easy access to connectors, peripherals, and internal switches—or, preferably, one that has no internal switches at all.

Unless you're buying a server, ergonomics are also important. Ideally, the on/off control and the reset switch should be placed on the front panel. A sharp color display with a tilt-and-swivel monitor is a must, and a comfortable keyboard is also essential.

Also important is an upgradable CPU. You won't have to worry about your system becoming obsolete as long as you can pop in a 486 card down the line.



#### SERVICE AND SUPPORT

Chances are you're going to need some kind of

assistance with your computer. Look for prompt, toll-free telephone support during the hours most convenient to you and free on-site service during the warranty period. For systems with direct manufacturer support, we called at three different times of the day to check on the availability (but not the quality) of help.

As with any high-tech gadget, your 386/33 should come, with a one-year warranty, minimum. If you run a small business, you'll find optional extended warranties that include free on-site service can be a wise investment. Such policies should be available for around \$200 a year. —S. S.

#### Expandability Is the Key to a Winning Server

good expandability and a reasonable \$5612 price (the actual street price should be lower; Arche dropped the list price by \$1795 after we completed our price survey), and you have a clear Best Buy.

An unassuming AT box, the Legacy provides five half-height bays, including two internals that can accommodate a full-height drive. You also get five free slots, but if you want more than 8MB of

RAM, you'll have to sacrifice one of the two fast-RAM slots, which can also take standard 8/16-bit cards. To bring the Legacy up to its full 32MB capacity, you'll have to give up both of these.

The Legacy receives mixed reviews on design. Its thin sheet-metal chassis hardly inspires confidence, there's no front-panel on/off switch, and installing a coprocessor requires removing the motherboard. On the bright side, the Legacy features a front-panel reset button and an LED display that shows processor speed.

Moreover, the Arche Legacy 386-33's motherboard has more than the usual share of proprietary, application-specific chips. These reduce the component count, increasing the machine's reliability.

Support is top-notch. Arche is the only company in this review that offers a

two-year warranty; on-site service for that period is available for a low \$149. There's no weekend support, but all our toll-free weekday calls were answered immediately.

The Legacy comes with generous support, plenty of drive bays, and incredible speed. If EISA is important, look elsewhere. But otherwise, the Legacy is a Best Buy whether you're looking for a zippy workstation or a fast server.

#### **AST Premium 386/33TE**



**PROS:** Excellent expandability and RAM capacity, low price for tower

CONS: None

AST's tower delivers almost everything a server needs: plenty of expandability and 80MB of fast-RAM capacity. The Premium performed well in our speed tests, if unspectacularly. Although the list price is high, AST systems tend to be deeply discounted, and we found this one going for an average of \$6218. It's a great deal as a server, and it's not bad as a workstation, either.

The 386/33TE provides enough elbowroom to take you well into the nineties. In addition to its great fast-RAM capacity, you get eight free EISA slots (more than any of its rivals provide), six

Typically fast and pricey, the state-of-the-art Compaq Deskpro 386/33L exudes fit and finish. Meeting desktop and server needs with equal ease, it delivers the small footprint of a workstation plus one-of-a-kind drive array technology for expanding storage on a server.

drive bays, and an upgradable CPU. The company even offers a 16MB hard disk option for really big jobs.

Solidly built, the Premium has a notably quiet fan. Technical support is toll-free and available during part of the weekend. There's also an automated phone service that faxes you information on request. Response is fast—only once were we put on hold, and only for a minute.

With its relatively low price and superb expandability, the Premium makes a great server. If you want assurance that your new system will remain up-to-date in the coming years, the Premium 386/33TE is for you.

#### AT&T 6386E/33 WGS

**PROS:** Plentiful drive bays and high RAM capacity

CONS: Sky-high price

The best description of this floor-standing monolith from AT&T is "industrial strength." That applies to its overbuilt case and too-high \$10,743 street price. Forget the excellent expandability and RAM capacity—the 6386E/33 WGS is just too expensive to compete.

The 6386E/33 has eight drive bays, the most of any system reviewed. The massive chassis has another redeeming quality: Only weight lifters would be able to steal it. The front panel provides a reset button, but the on/off switch is oddly placed near the floor. Worse, configuring RAM, printer, and serial port settings requires searching for and setting countless jumper pins scattered around the system board.

Phone support is good. It's toll-free, and it's open on weekends, but twice we had to hold for several minutes before receiving help.

The 6386E/33's outstanding expandability is not worth the high price. Other systems are almost as expandable, and for ten grand you could buy a terrific 486.

#### Compaq Deskpro 386/33L

**PROS:** Excellent expandability and RAM capacity; upgradable CPU

**CONS:** Expensive

Like ALR, Compaq shoehorns a lot of computer into a fairly small space, but the Deskpro's superior design gives it a far broader range. The 386/33L features a modular processor board, seven free EISA slots, optional drive array technology, and a whopping 100MB capacity for fast RAM. Performance was good, but we didn't see the lightning speeds we've come to expect from Compaq systems. We did see a Compaq price, though—\$8092 on the street. Still, the 386/33L is a good value, especially as a large-volume server.

Compaq's unique drive array technology is perfect for serving a large, growing LAN. This extra-cost option lets multiple hard drives act as one, either to speed access or to preserve data integrity. For instance, two 210MB drives can perform as one very fast 420MB drive or as a single 210MB drive that backs itself up as it works. Four such drives can provide up to 840MB of storage, 630MB with data integrity features on. Compaq's drive arrays work only with special hard disks distributed by Compaq.

The 386/33L's high RAM capacity is







All the computer systems were tested with 4MB RAM in the single-user benchmarks and 8MB RAM in the Novell NetWare office simulation. Every computer was tested with the vendor's version of DOS, and the systems had the following hard disk canfigurations for the single-user tests: Dell System 333D and Zenith Data Systems Z-386/33E, 100MB; Tandy 4033 LX, 105MB; ALR Business-VEISA 386/33, 106MB; Campaq Deskpro 386/33L, 120MB; AT&T 6386E/33 WGS, 135MB; NEC PowerMate 386/33E, 140MB; Arche Legacy 386-33, 104MB; AST Premium 386/33TE, 330MB. For the office simulation test, each system had the manufacturer's 300MB (or next larger) hard disk.

WordPerfect

Methodology

The time it takes to reformat three WordPerfect 5.1 documents that vary in size from 5K to 55K is measured. The files are basic text with some boldface and underlined text; one of the documents includes a TIFF image.

With the caching feature enabled, the time required to complete an unindexed search for a single record in a 100,000-record parts table is measured. Then the table is indexed, the transaction processing module is run, and 600 records are posted.

1-2-3

The 1-2-3 2.2 test measures the time required to complete the following operations: The application is laaded. Then three separate worksheets (arithmetic, financial, and scientific) are loaded, and various changes are made and recalcs run on each. Subsequently the MAPS add-in fram Management Advisory Services is used to run a number of financial forecasts.

Windows 3.0

Timing begins and ends at the DOS prompt. Windaws is launched, along with a macro that loads both Excel and a financial warksheet and initiates a recalc. Then the macro loads Samna's Ami Prafessional and a 50K document, in which is placed a 500K TIFF image. Finally, the macro launches Micrografx Designer, apens a drawing, displays it on screen, and exits ta DOS.

#### **Paradox**

Starting with an orders table, each recard is compared with an available stock table where the current prices for items are found, and the resulting records are inserted into an invoice table.

NetWare office simulation

Each of 24 warkstations runs one or two of the LAN applications WardPerfect 5.1, 1-2-3 2.2, and Poradox 3.0. Typical files in various sizes are loaded, and operations are performed with delays interspersed to simulate narmal use, but only aperations that access the server's hard disk are measured. Every workstation also occasionally capies files to and from the server. Finally, the times are averaged and totaled.

333D lacks the capacity to serve users on a large LAN, but it will please everyone else.

coupled to a high price: Compaq's proprietary memory modules cost about \$400 per megabyte, compared with \$80 per megabyte for standard SIMMs. You can upgrade to a 33-MHz 486 CPU by swapping processor cards. The system chassis shows the usual Compaq attention to fit and finish, and the case uses thumbscrews.

As we go to press, Compaq has just announced toll-free technical support, correcting a long-standing policy of not supporting users directly. Time constraints prevented our testing the quality of the new support, and we are therefore not changing our original support rating of Fair.

The 386/33L did a bit better than the

AST on our NetWare tests but overall did a bit worse. If drive arrays attract you, the Deskpro is a great buy for a server. Otherwise, the less expensive AST is the wiser choice.

#### **Dell System 333D**

**PROS:** Super support, low price, fast CONS: Limited CPU-speed RAM capacity

At \$4659, Dell's System 333D is one of the least expensive computers in this roundup, yet it outperformed every computer here but the Arche. The D in 333D stands for desktop, so it's hardly surprising that this system lacks the

storage and RAM capacities desirable in a large server. But it's a good choice for a smaller, less-ambitious server and a superb deal as a workstation.

Dell builds almost everything into the system board, giving you six free AT-style slots. The four half-height drive bays and 16MB of CPU-speed RAM are adequate for most workstations but not for many servers. It's the only unit reviewed to include super VGA rather than standard VGA, so you don't have to pay extra for higher-resolution graphics.

The design is superb inside and out. The 333D's small-footprint chassis is sturdy yet light—it opens with thumbscrews and features front-panel on/off and reset switches.

Dell's support is the best in the business. The one-year warranty includes on-site service, the long support hours include Saturdays, and the number is toll-free. On each of our test calls, we held for only 1 or 2 minutes. As with AST, you can phone a machine and get additional documentation faxed to you.

The 333D is a fast, well-supported system at a great price. The 16MB RAM limit and modest device capacity rule it out for serving large LANs, but the Dell System 333D is a nice departmental server and a super workstation.

#### **NEC PowerMate 386/33E**

PROS: Low price, excellent expandability, fast in Windows

CONS: Limited RAM capacity, slow non-Windows performance

NEC's PowerMate 386/33E has a low \$5108 street price and plenty of room for expansion. But it's limited by a 16MB fast-RAM ceiling, and aside from a zippy Windows score, performance was relatively slow.

Designed with Windows in mind, the system comes with the program. NEC says the PowerMate's excellent Windows performance is likely due to a proprietary application-specific integrated circuit (ASIC) chip that controls mem-

We rote these systems based on information in the Feotures Evoluation and the PC World Test Report, combined with aur opinions of quality, reliability, and user benefit.

**Performance** is derived from stondord-deviotion onolysis of benchmork results, with extra weight given to the Novell NetWore office simulation, 1-2-3, and Windows tests.

**Expandability** cavers the number ond kind of free slots available, as well as the number of drive bays and the copocity of available hard disks. An Excellent rating requires five open slots, five holf-height drive bays, and the ability to accept a full-height drive or a second hard disk.

Fast-RAM capacity refers to the amount of RAM installable on system and memory expansion boards that is available to the CPU without wait states. To win an Excellent roting, a system must accept at least 32MB of fast RAM.

**Design and construction** evoluotes the quality of monufacture, occessibility af controls, and ease of use when working inside the computer. To earn on Excellent rating, a system must be built around a sturdy, easily accessible chassis, offer switchless setup af memory, drives, and ports, and be free af major design flows.

Service and support includes the length of worronty and the quality and availability of phone

suppart, documentation, and ather support services. At least one year's full worronty, long support hours, and effective response to aur test calls are required for an Excellent rating. Extro credit is given for tall-free and weekend technical support and free on-site service.

**Price** ratings ore determined by colculoting the standard deviation from the average street price. The street prices used were determined from aur survey of over 100 deolers in eight U.S. cities.

Overall value is averaged from all the abave criterio, with special emphasis placed on performance and expandability.

ory management, a major *Windows* bottleneck. Elsewhere, the system's performance was disappointing, especially at NetWare. By the time you read this, NEC is scheduled to ship a more expensive controller that should improve network performance.

The 386/33E's architecture mixes the old and the new. All five open slots are EISA, but you must flip motherboard switches to set up the system. One nice touch: NEC includes a floor stand so you can use the unit as a tower.

NEC's support is responsive: Each of our calls was answered immediately. Unfortunately, the company offers no toll-free access, on-site service, or weekend support, but some NEC dealers may fill some of these gaps.

With better performance, this roomy, well-designed computer would make a fine server. For now, however, the Power-Mate is a good buy only if you need a *Windows* workstation.

#### Tandy 4033 LX

PROS: Well designed; excellent support

**CONS:** Slow, pricey, NetWare incompatibilities

At first glance, Tandy's 4033 LX looks good: It's a well-designed box that comes with a great support policy. But the \$7072 price is high, there are only four drive bays, and the 16MB fast-RAM limit is unexceptional. Worse, the

The 80386 that powers the 4033 LX sits on a modular board, but no 486 is available, and Tandy remains mum on future upgrades. You get five open AT-style slots, but the system's four-drive capacity is adequate only for a workstation, and two of the slots require third-height drives, which reduces your selection somewhat.

The 4033 LX's fairly compact chassis offers several amenities, including front-panel on/off and reset controls. Tandy's tech support response was adequate: We were on hold from 2 to 8 minutes each time we called.

But a nice front panel and good support don't add up to a good computer. Completely out of the question for use as a server, the Tandy 4033 LX is also too slow and too expensive to make a good workstation.

#### Zenith Data Systems Z-386/33E

PROS: None

**CONS:** NetWare incompatibility, slow, only four free slots

The Z-386/33E's most notable feature is its caching disk controller, which can host a whopping four ESDI, seven SCSI, and two floppy drives at once. But despite the high-tech effort, this \$6728 system from Zenith Data Systems (ZDS) is slow (it came in next to last in our NetWare test) and suffers from NetWare compatibility problems.

If the caching controller makes you think "server," think again. In theory, a caching controller should improve performance, but our tests didn't bear that out. What's more, the three-layered controller sits in one EISA slot, but it's so wide that it takes up space that ZDS could have allocated to another slot. VGA and I/O take up two more slots,

leaving only four open slots—the smallest total in the roundup. Otherwise, the Z-386/33E is a standard sheet-metal AT-clone box with room for five half-height drives.

A bug in ZDS's NetWare 3.0 drivers caused the NetWare DOWN command to hang the system. ZDS provides a work-around if you ask for it, but it's no substitute for well-written drivers. ZDS promises that a 3.1 driver will be available shortly.

As a workstation, the Z-386/33E still suffers from poor performance and a dearth of open slots. And the price is on

the high side for a one-user machine.

ZDS earns a demerit for service and support—it's entirely dealer based. The odd warranty lets you choose between three months with on-site service or a year without it.

It appears that the Z-386/33E was rushed to market a little too quickly. It's not recommended.

#### A 33-MHz for Every Occasion

The Arche Legacy 386-33 is your Best Buy if you're looking for a modest server or a hot workstation. It's affordable, astonishingly fast, and reasonably roomy. But if "reasonably roomy" isn't enough, AST's Premium 386/33TE gives you expandability galore for only about \$600 more. For the money conscious, the Dell System 333D makes a terrific workstation, although it's too limited to serve most LANs.

# More Profits From Personal Finance

Where does all the money go? These personal finance packages let you know—and help you hang on to more of it.

Suzanne M. Colvin



ou spend most of your time trying to make money. Why spend the rest of your time trying to count it? Whether you need to track multiple investments, scrape up the money for a house, or simply balance your checkbook, personal finance software can help you make sense of your dollars.

The four personal finance packages reviewed here let you balance a checkbook, print checks, create budgets and reports, and keep track of income and expenses—without having to sort through stacks of checks or reams of bank statements. Most go further, letting you estimate yearly income taxes and import data into full-fledged tax preparation programs. Some track investments, manage loans and assets, and even let you pay your bills via modem (see the sidebar "Is CheckFree Hassle Free?").

But two packages stand out. For managing checkbook transactions and investments, the \$60 Quicken 4.0 is a steal. Unfortunately, Quicken comes up short in budgeting and loan tracking features. Only Managing Your Money 7.0 gives you everything you'd want in a personal finance package. Though its \$220 price tag puts the biggest dent in

your wallet, its investment savvy and abundance of features easily earn it *PC World*'s Best Buy.

You can also use *Quicken* and *MYM* to manage a home business such as personal consulting or simple property management, thanks to their ability to segregate business and personal expenses and to track accounts receivable and payable. But you can't use these packages to, say, print customer invoices or compute volume discounts, and they

lack the modules needed to compute payroll and manage manufacturing and inventory. Small businesses that require such features would do better with a low-cost accounting package (see "Budget-Wise Accounting," November 1990). But for simple business operations, either is a worthy investment.

MECA's \$220 Managing Your Money has been around a long time, but this is one old dog that's continued to learn new tricks. Version 7.0 adds a smooth menudriven interface, improved reporting and transaction features, and the ability to handle multiple years of historical data. As always, the package is blessed with the pithy expertise of investment guru Andrew Tobias. Though *Quicken* continues to nip at its heels on the low end, *MYM*'s wealth of features makes it the Best Buy.

MYM's check-writing and budgeting capabilities are exceptional. The program maintains budgets for five years, and it keeps up to two years' historical transactions on line. From its checklike entry screen you can summon a list of all transactions with one payee or of all transactions in a budget category. And because MYM comes with the Check-Free electronic checking module built in, you can pay your bills from your PC. Simply enter the check information, mark it as a CheckFree transaction, and send it off via modem.

MYM helps relieve some dread at tax time. Its estimator module includes a summary Form 1040 plus supporting tax schedules, and it's the only program reviewed that gives you an accurate estimate of your tax liability, including exemptions and limitations. You can also import data directly into MECA's Tax-Cut tax preparation package.

Budding Wall Street moguls will appreciate *MYM*'s strong investment module, though it lacks a few of the extra features available in *Quicken*. You can track any type of investment transaction—including purchases, sales, dividends, and interest—and link to MECA's *Managing the Market*, which

#### **BUYING SMART: INVESTING IN PERSONAL FINANCE**

Personal finance packages should make managing your cash flow simpler, with easy-to-use modules for balancing your checkbook, creating budgets, and reining in expenses.

The best programs also help handle your taxes, investments, and personal property, presenting information in a variety of reports. Here's what to look for.



#### CHECKBOOK MANAGEMENT

The heart of any finance

package is its checkbook manager. The best ones have data entry screens resembling a check and search your financial data as you type, identifying common transactions and filling in the rest. Balancing your checkbook is a lot easier when the program displays uncleared transactions and lets you edit them as you go. And since you'll want to print checks using special paper, look for a package that prints multiple checks at once. Better yet, find one that lets you submit payments electronically—a great way to automate recurring expenses like mortgage payments.



#### BUDGETING AND EXPENSE TRACKING

Checkbook manage-

ment alone isn't enough; you'll also need to create budgets and track expenses. Look for a package that lets you assign category names instead of numbers to transactions and link multiple categories (like wages and taxes) to a single transaction (such as your paycheck). It should maintain at least two years of historical data—so you'll always be able to look ahead or behind one month, even at year-end—and automatically determine budgets based on prior budget data. Avoid packages that make you manually enter each month's budget, year after year.



#### INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

Personal finance soft-

ware can help lighten your tax load. The top programs identify tax-related items, such as charitable contributions, and print a report for use at tax time. For even greater help, look for a tax-estimator module that computes exemptions and deductions and can export data to a tax preparation package.



#### INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT

age helps you take stock of your stock, tracking historical investment activity and classifying it as short- or long-term—a key to figuring your taxes. The system should maintain transactions by date, easily update stock prices, and keep a history of stock transactions or prices so you can review trends over time. Make sure the program provides basic reports such as tax and earnings, capital gains, and return on investment.



#### LOANS AND ASSET

A good financial pack-

age tracks other items that contribute to your net worth, such as household goods, property, and loans. Select a package that reduces your loan balance every time you make a checkbook payment. Also consider packages that offer an analysis module for planning your financial future. If you need to manage a home business, look for the ability to track payables and receivables and segregate personal and business transactions.



#### REPORTING

Your program should print a variety of flexible

reports—including budget versus actual reports and net worth statements. Look for a package that prints check registers sorted by date, check number, payee, bank account, and/or expense category. It should also let you prepare custom reports and import data into a spreadsheet.



#### EASE OF USE


If the program you choose doesn't make

managing your finances easier, you've wasted your money. Look for an amenable interface with pulldown menus and context-sensitive help, plus default expense categories for easy start-up. Most important, avoid packages that use accounting terminology—especially if you're somebody who wouldn't know a debit from a credit. —S. M. C.

automatically updates stock prices on line. But unlike *Quicken*, *MYM* doesn't maintain a history of stock prices—information that may interest avid investors—and it can't prepare a return-

on-investment report.

Helpful extras abound. Sophisticated financial analysis features help you decide whether to rent or buy a home, when to refinance a mortgage, and how much to sock away for a college or retirement fund. Another module determines your net worth—useful for filling out credit applications or gauging how much insurance to buy. You also get such



PIM-like utilities as a calculator, a mailing list, and a reminder pad.

But power has its price: MYM's many facets make it more difficult to learn. Each new feature adds menu choices, sometimes forcing users into a complex series of decisions. Fortunately, a menu-driven interface and detailed on-line advice make feature-rich MYM about as easy to use as it can be.

MYM has just about everything you could want in a financial manager, and then some. If you don't want those fancy extras—and don't need to track loans—Quicken is probably your best bet. Otherwise, MYM is top dog in this field.

#### Cheque-It-Out 1.1

**PROS:** Flexible reports, unlimited historical data, strong reconciliation features

**CONS:** Hard to use, can't track investments or other assets, poor check printing

Cheque-It-Out is just a babe in the woods compared to old-timers like Managing Your Money. Unfortunately, Hooper's \$49.95 program is still suffering growing pains. It's not as easy to use as Quicken or MYM, and it won't help you manage sophisticated investment transactions, compute loans, or estimate your taxes. While adequate for simple checkbook management and for producing reports, it's only a fair value.


As with most packages, the program's check-manager screen looks like a personal check: Simply fill in the amount, payee, and date, and assign it a category (such as rent). You can segregate checks into departments, which is useful for, say, managing rental properties. But unlike with the other programs, you must exit the check-entry screen to record recurring transactions or those with multiple categories, like mortgage payments. And you can print only one check at a time—no batch printing allowed.

Cheque-It-Out also comes up short in the budget department. It maintains an unlimited amount of past financial data but only one calendar year's worth of

Whether you're starting a career or a home business, you'll benefit from on-line financial guidance. Your choice depends on how complicated your financial picture is.



#### IS CHECKFREE HASSLE FREE?

In the future, all financial transactions will be electronic—at least, if the CheckFree people have anything to say about it. This \$30 electronic checking program—built into Quicken 4.0 and Managing Your Money 7.0—promises to make your paper checkbook virtually obsolete.

Using CheckFree is simple. Just fill in the amount, date, and payee on a checklike data entry screen and "mail" payments via modem to a local number. CheckFree automatically records payments in your check register and transfers funds from your account to the payee's via the Federal Reserve System used by almost all banks. (Firms unequipped to handle electronic payments are mailed printed checks.)

CheckFree costs about 45 cents per check (less if you send a lot of

checks), comparable to the cost of bank charges and stamps. Its advantages are timely check processing and automatic handling of recurring payments such as mortgage bills.

Promise, however, does not always jibe with reality. Last year, PC World received several complaints about the service, ranging from unposted payments to poor customer support. CheckFree says it solved these problems; to test that claim, we used CheckFree to pay our bills for a month.

In general, payments went through without a hitch, though the gas company payment took about four days to post. We also called tech support several days at different times. Each time the phone was answered by an actual human, who capably handled our questions.

Still, some cautions remain. You should examine bank statements to ensure that payments are posted on time. And if you write a check at the corner store, you must remember to record it on line, or financial chaos will result. CheckFree won't entirely replace your checkbook, but it can help simplify your life—and make paying bills a little less painful.

budgets, so if you're working on January's budget, you can't see what you did in December. *Cheque-It-Out* won't copy budget data from one month to another—you must enter it manually. And because the program displays only one monthly budget at a time, you can't view an entire year's data at once.

Cheque-It-Out's strengths are its reconciliation (checkbook balancing) and reporting features. The program lets you reconcile more than just bank accounts—it can flag medical expenses filed with your insurance company, for instance—but you can't edit account transactions as you go. Flexible report capabilities enable you to sort by date, check number; or entry order and print weekly, biweekly, semimonthly, and yearly reports.

Despite strong reporting and reconciliation capabilities, *Cheque-It-Out* has

too many gaps to earn a recommendation. If you're looking for simple, lowcost checkbook management, *Quicken* costs only \$10 more.

#### MoneyCounts 6.5

**PROS:** Inexpensive, good loan management

**CONS:** No checkbook interface, poor checkbook balancing features, unreliable tax estimator, limited reporting

At first glance, Parsons Technology's \$35 MoneyCounts looks like a bargain. Dig beneath the surface, however, and you'll find flaws. It's the only program that lacks a checkbook interface, and its checkbook balancing and tax estimator are poor. Low price and solid loan management are MoneyCounts' primary virtues, and overall it's only a fair value.

MoneyCounts isn't the friendliest financial companion. Instead of completing an on-screen check, you must fill in an old-fashioned data entry screen. Check numbers are required and must be numeric, which means there's no easy way to identify automated teller transactions. On the other hand, the program searches financial records as you type, filling in the entry screen when it finds a match with previously entered data.

MoneyCounts handles only bank accounts—you can't track non-cash items such as charitable contributions of property, and there isn't a default set of expense categories for easy start-up. MoneyCounts also lacks an electronic check-paying facility; the program accepts CheckFree data, but you must purchase CheckFree separately.

Checkbook balancing is extremely

poor. A good program lists all uncanceled checks at once and allows you to mark canceled checks as you find them. *MoneyCounts* displays transactions one at a time in the order they were recorded; you must search your bank statement for each item to see if it cleared.

MoneyCounts' simple income tax estimator uses annualized actual or budget information to estimate liabilities, and the program links to Parsons' own Personal Tax Preparer. However, it doesn't properly compute certain deductible amounts, such as medical expenses. Don't rely on MoneyCounts to provide an accurate tax estimate.

MoneyCounts offers basic reporting capabilities, but printing the reports proved difficult. The program prints transactions in transaction-number order and can't sort by date or check number or by multiple criteria at the same time (for example, by payee in chronological order).

MoneyCounts' strongest feature is its loan capability, where it bests all but MYM. The financial calculator estimates loan payments and present and future values and, unlike Quicken, correctly reduces your loan balances when you record loan payments in your checkbook.

If all you need to do is manage loans, *MoneyCounts* is a possibility. If you're more than just a loan ranger, however, you should pony up the silver for a more well-rounded package.

#### Quicken 4.0

PROS: Inexpensive, easy to use

**CONS:** Limited loan and budget tracking, no tax-estimation module

Dollar for dollar, there isn't an easier personal finance package than *Quicken* 4.0. Its checkbook manager is first-rate, and its investment manager is the best in the roundup. So why isn't the \$60 *Quicken* a Best Buy? Because it lacks the loan management, budgeting, and tax-estimation panache of *Managing*

We rate personal finance pragrams based on information in the Features Evaluation table, combined with our hands-on evaluation of user benefit and ease of use.

Checkbook management measures the ability to record transactions, print checks, and balance checkbooks. To earn an Excellent rating, packages must perfarm all functions easily, autamate the recording of recurring payments, and provide electranic checking.

Budgeting and expense tracking gauges how well the program lets you prepare budgets and compare them against actual results. Packages with an Excellent rating maintain data for mare than one year, copy data from other budgets, and let you allocate multiple categories to transactions.

Income tax assistance evaluates how programs prepare tax reports and estimate taxes. An Excellent rating means the program provides reports on tax-related transactions, produces a reliable tax estimate, and provides links ta a tax preparation program.

**Investment management** refers to the tracking and analysis of investment transactions. To be rated Excellent, a package must easily update stock prices, track historical transactions ar stock prices, and provide flexible reports.

Loan and asset tracking considers the ability to monage assets other than bank or investment accounts. An Excellent program must accurately track loan transactions, manage accounts receivable and accounts payable, and affer financial planning analysis.

Reporting rates the sorting and printing of financial information. An Excellent score means the package prints reports for any user-defined period in a variety of sorted orders and lets you create and store customized reports.

**Ease of use** is critical. An Excellent rating means the program is easy far novices to use, employing a pulldown menu interface with context-sensitive help, minimal or no accounting terminology, and default categories for easy start-up.

Overall value combines ratings for all criteria, taking into account price and technical support.


Your Money. It's an excellent buy, but not the best one.

Quicken's outstanding feature is its ease of use-it can be installed and running in minutes. Its unique check register screen looks just like the one you fill in manually when you write a check. Like MYM, Quicken also sports a builtin CheckFree module.

The program is a whiz at expense tracking. You can easily maintain one checkbook and segregate business and personal expenses by using more specific expense category names such as Rent/Prop1, Rent/Prop2, or Rent/Personal—perfect for managing multiple rental properties or a home business. Quicken also lets you mark expense categories as tax related, for easy printing of income tax reports. However, there's no tax-estimation module. Instead, you can export the tax data to Chipsoft's TurboTax.

Version 4.0's new investment management module tops MYM's in some key areas. Easy to understand and use, it tracks two items that no other package maintains: historical stock prices and return on investment. Quicken's investment reports are thorough, but unlike MYM, it can't automatically update stock prices on line.

Quicken's weaknesses are in budgeting and loan tracking. It maintains budgets for one year only and can't create monthly budgets based on loan schedules or easily increase amounts for inflation. You can manually allocate loan payments between principal and interest,

but Quicken won't do it automatically.

If you're looking for a simple way to manage your checkbook or track investments, Quicken 4.0 is a fine choice. But users with more sophisticated financial profiles should opt for MYM.

When you need a package that will help you manage your checkbook, look no further than Quicken. But if you want to develop and maintain your personal financial empire, Best Buy Managing Your Money 7.0 is the only choice. No other program combines an accurate income tax estimator and investment module with the ability to track loans and plan for the long term.

You work hard for your money. Personal finance software makes it easier than ever for you to keep an eye on your assets—and make your money work for you. ⊜

# Easier Tools for the On-Line World

A wealth of information can be yours when you install a modem and a communications package. Discover which of 14 programs make the process painless.

he information is out there, just waiting for you: sprawling data bases full of everything from business histories to bowling ball futures; services for home shopping, banking, investing, and travel booking; and thousands of bulletin board systems brimming with free software and potential contacts.

The only way to get at these riches is with a modem and a communications package, a tandem that many companies depend on for handling PC-to-PC file transfers between branch offices. Faxes are fine, but they're uneditable images, dead on arrival. When you send by modem, the file lives on.

Though you'll rarely be aware of the modem itself, you will be getting personal with your communications software, so make sure you're the best of friends. Only a few new bells and whistles have arrived since our last roundup a year and a half ago, but, more important, most programs have become easier, especially for new users.

#### **Windows on Communications**

Four of the packages reviewed here seek an edge in ease of use by tapping Windows' visual approach to computing. Compared to character-based programs, all the Windows packages make it easier to cut and paste text to and from on-line sessions, and all let you work on another program while you're transferring files. Some offer Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) links to other Windows applications for automating communications—they can pass selected on-line news to Ami Professional, for example, where a macro automatically formats it into a custom newspaper. Several packages offer innovative icon-based front ends—just click on an icon, and your modem dials Compu-Serve; click on the airplane icon, and start making travel reservations.

What could be easier? Nothing—if the icons were easy to set up. Although we're wild about *Windows*, we were at a loss to find a Best Buy among the *Windows* packages—each had at least one major problem or omission. Oddly

enough, the promising icon-based interfaces of DynaComm and MicroPhone turned out to be the thorniest, and the least innovative Windows contender—Crosstalk for Windows—was the best Windows value.

Windows communications packages will undoubtedly improve, but for now the winners are among new, easier-to-use versions of old character-based reliables. We awarded four Best Buys. Crosstalk Mk.4 is perfect for the high-end communicator who needs a heavy-duty scripting language, and its scaled-down sibling, Crosstalk Communicator, is tops for beginners. HyperAccess/5 and Procomm Plus are aimed at the masses of casual users who fall in between.

So how did we make our choices? Ease of use is all-important, but features count too. You'll want a full list of error-checking file transfer protocols so you can swap files at the fastest possible speed without losing a byte of data. Basic messaging features such as a dialing directory are also crucial.

Multitasking features like background transfers are helpful if you send large files. Next in importance are advanced script languages for creating unattended applications; terminal emulations for logging on to minicomputers and mainframes; and remote operations, which let callers dial in to your unattended PC and swap files (see "Buying Smart" for more details).


#### Crosstalk Mk.4 2.0



**PROS:** Powerhouse script language, multiple sessions, numerous emulations

**CONS:** Skimpy remote mode, thorny documentation

Crosstalk Mk.4's original incarnation was blighted by a clunky interface that inspired users to hack together their own front ends. But DCA has changed all that with version 2.0—the muchimproved interface revolves around a slick, Procomm-like dialing directory. Crosstalk Mk.4's new ergonomics, combined with its heavyweight script language and sound terminal emulations, makes it well worth its \$245 price tag. It's the Best Buy for the corporate power user with plans to design custom applications, and at last it's a good deal for



Best Buys Crosstalk Communicator and Crosstalk Mk.4 share the same easy-to-use dialing directory interface. You can modify the display to show other fields, such as the phone number and the last time an entry was called.

#### **BUYING SMART: CHECKING OUT COMMUNICATIONS SOFTWARE**

When evaluating a communications package, the key buying issue is ease of use, followed by messaging and file transfer support. Next in importance is multitasking, then session automation, remote options, and terminal emulations. Here are the key features to look for.



#### **EASE OF USE**

This is crucial. A program must offer an intu-

itive customizable interface off line and on line. Good interfaces have well-designed menus, dialing directories, hot keys, and mouse support. The package should provide easily modifiable preset scripts for popular services. Easy installation, clear documentation, and unlimited technical support are helpful.



#### MESSAGING

Each package should have an easily accessible

dialing directory where you can view and modify all entries in one place. If you like to log on to BBS's, you'll want a queue dialer, which dials the next number if the first is busy.

On line, you'll want an auto-capture buffer so you can scroll back through text, and you should be able to cut and paste that text to your local terminal screen and vice versa. Other on-line essentials include print and capture commands, an onscreen clock, and good status feedback during file transfers. You'll need a capable text editor or the ability to shell out to a word processor.



#### FILE TRANSFER

When swapping files with other PCs or on-line

services, you'll want to use an errorchecking protocol to make sure every byte that is sent is also received—even if you have an error-correcting modem. All the programs offer old reliables like XMODEM, but if your program has a faster protocol, such as YMODEM or ZMODEM—and your remote partner has the same—you can save a lot of time and money. Demand XMODEM, CompuServe B, Kermit, YMODEM, and ZMODEM.



#### MULTITASKING

If you frequently swap large files you'll want to

be able to run other applications while a file transfers in the background. Performance shouldn't degrade, and you should have plenty of RAM left to run large applications. Less crucial—a few high-end programs let you run more than one session at a time either via multiple modems or a multitasking X.25 network such as Tymnet. This could come in handy for a stockbrocker who wanted to keep tabs on two stock services at once.



#### SESSION AUTOMATION

This category rates the power and flexibility of

the script language and other tools for automating communications.
You'll want keystroke macros so you can send frequently used text strings or launch scripts. Also essential is a learn mode that lets you record a log-on procedure and run it as a script.

You'll probably want to write a script that automatically logs on to a service such as CompuServe or MCI Mail, uploads and downloads E-mail, and logs off—perhaps in the middle of the night when rates are lowest. For this, you'll need to get

your hands dirty with a script language. Corporate developers who need to create front ends for novice users will want far more power, such as the ability to create custom online interfaces with windowing commands.

Some programs offer special script editors that let you select commands from menus, and tools such as debuggers can help you trouble-shoot a script. If you have a Windows package, it should support Dynamic Data Exchange (DDE) so you can automate transfers with other Windows programs—for example, downloading a Dow Jones stock quote and handing it to Excel, where a spreadsheet is automatically updated.



#### **REMOTE MODE**

These packages aren't true remote packages

like Carbon Copy, but they all offer a remote host function so callers can dial in while the PC is unattended and swap files. The remote mode should provide several layers of password protection. Authorized users should be able to access DOS, and you should be able to define access by directory, not just by drive. The best packages are like miniature BBS's, with menus that guide the caller.



### TERMINAL EMULATIONS

All the packages should

offer the basic emulations, including TTY, VT-100/102/52, ANSI (IBM PC), and IBM 3101. With these, you can log on to just about any popular service or BBS. If you need to log on to a variety of minis and mainframes, it's best to have a good selection of more exotic emulations. —J. H.



the casual user as well.

Crosstalk Mk.4 greets you with a friendly, customizable dialing directory, and <Alt>-key combinations lead the way to utilities, scripts, and well-designed setup screens. Logging on is as simple as moving to an entry and pressing <Enter>. Hit <Alt>-S instead, and you can tailor parameters and remap cursors and the keypad. On line, you use <Alt>-key combinations to launch file transfers, toggle into an improved editor, and even change settings on the fly.

If you don't like dialing directories, *Mk.4* offers three alternatives: its old, confusing pop-up menu front end, a *Crosstalk XVI* interface, and a command line. Most users will stick with the dialing directory (see the *Instant Reference Card* in this issue for *Mk.4* tips).

*Mk.4* provides all major file transfer protocols, including the IND\$FILE protocol used on IBM mainframes. Its list of 17 well-designed terminal emulations is one of the most complete in the roundup. *Mk.4* also supports synchronous devices such as DCA's IRMA card.

Mk.4's titanic script language, CASL, is the biggest and best in the roundup. CASL includes over 400 commands that handle everything from windowing to complex math. It offers unlimited variables, a debugger, and seven data types. By attaching commands and scripts to function keys, you can even create customized utilities.

Mk.4 lets you work on other applications while you're transferring files behind the scenes. This usually eats up a sizable 320K, but stripping away some features can pare it down to about 90K. The program also lets you run up to 15 simultaneous sessions with either multiple modems or Tymnet's X.PC protocol—handy for heavy-transaction duties. Mk.4's host mode is austere—DCA would rather you buy its Remote.

No longer will Mk.4 scare off novices. Despite its power, it's one of the easiest packages around. And for the advanced user who needs scripting, Crosstalk Mk.4 is the Best Buy.

#### **Crosstalk Communicator**



**PROS:** Easy to use, many predefined scripts

**CONS:** Scantily documented script language, no background mode

The \$99 Crosstalk Communicator is the subcompact version of the \$245 Crosstalk Mk.4. Designed to take over the low-end slot held by Crosstalk XVI, Communicator succeeds—it's the Best Buy for beginners.

Nearly identical to Mk.4, Communicator lacks Mk.4's background transfers, a few transfer protocols, and most of the emulations. Less important, it's also missing Mk.4's synchronous mode and multiple sessions. But Communicator adds a few tricks, too—there's an expanded on-line menu and many more preset scripts for logging on to on-line services. A new mini-BBS host mode offers password protection, menus, and simple messaging. While Communicator includes the complete CASL script language used in Mk.4, DCA would like you to believe that only 13 commands are available—only 13 are documented.

Communicator's smooth dialing directory interface mimics Mk.4's, and the dialog boxes are packed with just as many parameters. The only differences are in protocols and emulations. Communicator lacks Mk.4's DART, Crosstalk, and IND\$FILE protocols—no great loss for most—and emulations are whittled down to the usual six.

Crosstalk Communicator's low price, ease of use, and numerous preset scripts make it the Best Buy for the modem tenderfoot.

#### Crosstalk for Windows 1.1

**PROS:** Setup tutorial, easy cut and paste, efficient multitasking

CONS: No interactive dialing directory

The most feature-rich Windows package reviewed, the \$195 Crosstalk for Windows includes Crosstalk Mk.4's

powerful CASL language, fully documented. Neither its interface nor CASL takes full advantage of *Windows*, but it's your all-around best *Windows* value.

As with any *Windows* program, you select options from pulldown menus and then fill out dialog boxes. There are no icons, but you can customize and colorcode 12 "buttons" that can launch scripts as well as issue keystrokes. The installation routine is tops—you can even select an on-line tutorial that covers communications basics.

Crosstalk for Windows is easy to set up, but it sorely needs a dialing directory. To get on line, you have to open the File menu, then select a phone book entry, and click again to dial. The entries are short and lack comments, and to find related data such as phone numbers and attached scripts, you must go to a separate menu.

Added to CASL are six commands that control DDE links to other *Windows* applications. But CASL lacks *DynaComm*'s tools for easily constructing *Windows* dialog boxes, scrolling lists, and buttons to custom front ends.

File transfers run in the background without a hitch, and cutting and pasting to the built-in notepad is a breeze. An above-average remote host mode offers solid security, but no menus.

Crosstalk for Windows lacks a dialing directory and yet fails to offer a better system that would exploit Windows. Still, it's a friendly, capable program and a solid buy.

#### DynaComm 3.0a

**PROS:** Good script longuage, windowing, icon-driven front ends

**CONS:** Limited remote mode, hard to set up, weak documentation, limited protocols, poorly designed XMODEM transfers

The most ambitious of the *Windows* communicators, Future Soft's \$295 *DynaComm* is marked by a robust script language that supports DDE and *Windows* screen objects. *DynaComm* also exploits *Windows* by offering tiling

and stacking windows, plus icon-driven front ends for a few on-line services. It's a good deal overall, but a confusing design, limited protocols, and some rough edges keep it from the top slot.

When you load *DynaComm*, an iconbased menu pops up the main program plus 19 utilities and scripts. These include the learn mode, a tutorial, and several games. Unlike with *Micro-Phone II*, however, you can't launch online services from icons or add icons for your own log-in scripts.

Dialing a number is even more tedious than with *Crosstalk for Windows*—you click on the *DynaComm* icon to open the main screen, head to the File pulldown menu, select the option to open a file, choose the settings file, then go to the Phone menu and click on *Dial*.

The program includes scripts for seven on-line services that let you navigate by clicking on icons at the bottom of the screen. On CompuServe, for instance, you click on an envelope to get to your mail or on a jet to make airline reservations. But the icons only take you so far, and soon you're back to typing in commands. The visual cues make it easier to find what you want, but sometimes the icons can lead you astray, and for

some services icons are blotted out.


On line, you can access a modest editor, and cut and paste is flexible. Users of high-speed modems will miss ZMODEM and YMODEM-G, but a new version of *DynaComm* that includes these protocols should be out by the time you read this article.

File transfers have other problems—during XMODEM transfers of very large (over 300K) files, we encountered lockups that caused the transfers to be aborted. Also, during transfers, there's scant progress status, and there's no alarm upon completion.

DynaComm's sophisticated script language is comparable to that of Crosstalk for Windows, but it's better suited for creating Windows front ends. For example, you can easily script Windows artifacts like icons and dialog boxes.

You get 13 emulations, the most of any *Windows* contender. The remote mode is skimpy, however, lacking menus.

A mighty script language and impressive windowing make *DynaComm* shine, but a bumpy interface gets in the way. It's a good value, especially for developers who want to set up *Windows* front ends, but the program has yet to live up to its potential.



DynaComm provides icon-based front ends for popular services. On CompuServe, for example, you click on the airplane to move to travel services.

#### HyperAccess/5 1.1



**PROS:** Easy to use, polished emulations, slick cut and paste, good remote mode

**CONS:** No background transfers, no predesigned scripts

The easiest-to-use package in the roundup, Hilgraeve's \$99.95 HyperAccess/5 also packs a lot of features. You get a capable script language, numerous quality emulations, and a complete list of protocols, plus extras like data compression and virus detection. If you're a developer you'll probably prefer Crosstalk Mk.4, but the typical user will find HyperAccess/5 the Best Buy.

The program opens with a logical, first-letter menu on top and a dialing directory below. You can choose an entry and dial the modem with just three keystrokes. On line, you can toggle back to the main menu or pop up a 1-2-3—like banner menu. Unlike with Mk.4, all <Alt>-key shortcuts are conveniently listed at the bottom of the screen.

HyperAccess/5's cut-and-paste is better even than the Windows packages'. You can either use the exemplary editor or shell out to your own word processor. The learn mode is also the easiest in the roundup—a good thing, too, since there aren't any prewritten scripts for major services.

In addition to all the top protocols, you get Hilgraeve's proprietary data compression and a built-in virus scanner that scans downloads for the bit signatures of 68 viruses. It's an ingenious feature, but of negligible use since it won't work on compressed files. You'll find soundly implemented emulations such as those for IBM, Wang, and DEC terminals (including the DEC 220).

The script language is comparable to *Procomm*'s, and it's easier to use. A superb remote mode provides remote printing and a callback feature. By the time you read this, version 2.0 should be shipping, offering an expanded host mode that allows the remote running of text-only applications but still no back-

ground mode or prewritten scripts.

*HyperAccess/5*'s top functionality and easy interface make this a Best Buy for dabblers as well as pros.

#### MicroPhone II 1.0

PROS: Icons for major services, mini-BBS

**CONS:** Few protocols and emulations, no DDE support

MicroPhone II jumps from the Macintosh to Windows with its colorful interface nearly intact—it's a festival of icons integrated with simple menus. But with its paucity of protocols and emulations, no support for DDE, and an occasional propensity to misbehave on line, it's only a fair value—especially at \$295.

The program opens promisingly with a menu equipped with icons for Compu-Serve, BIX, Dow Jones, GEnie, and MCI Mail. Once you've set them up, clicking on any icon launches a script that logs you on to the service. This is how communications was meant to be.

Unfortunately, the scripts don't come plug-and-play. You have to fish around several menus to set them up, and in some cases you have to change parameters. If you forget to save the parame-

ters (oddly enough, you must do so in a separate menu), the script forgets them after logging off. Setting up a new service is even more involved.

MicroPhone II lacks DynaComm's on-line icons, but for major services you get on-line text buttons that provide a custom, mousable interface. The buttons are better behaved than Dyna-Comm's but just as shallow. On Compuserve, for example, you can click your way to the billing, games, and news sections, but then you're on your own.

There's no on-line status, not even a clock or a way to know whether you're capturing a file. Cut and paste is easy, but there's no editor aside from *Windows*' Notepad. *Microphone II* has the fewest protocols in the roundup—all you get are XMODEM, YMODEM, and YMODEM-G. Terminal emulations are limited to VT-100, VT-52, ANSI, and TTY. A mini-BBS feature includes menu-driven messaging and password protection but no access to DOS.

MicroPhone's limited script language is further hampered by the lack of DDE support, but by the time you read this a new version should include DDE. It also lacks DynaComm's wizardry with Windows objects—there's



**Terminal emulations** To win an Excellent, a program must offer the basic emulations (VT-100/102/52, ANSI, TTY, IBM 3101) plus at least six more. Points are subtracted for flaws and bugs.

no support for scrollable lists, and only limited tools for creating dialog boxes. The learn mode doesn't record pauses, so you must enter them manually. One plus: You get a slick script editor that lets you piece scripts together from menus.

*MicroPhone* has a few rough spots. If you pull down menus during a communications session, *MicroPhone II* sometimes misunderstands modem responses—for example, you might see "Modem not responding" if you open a menu while the modem is hanging up.

With its icon interface, *MicroPhone II* is moving in the right direction, and once set up, it's pretty easy to use. But until the basic functionality is boosted, look elsewhere.

#### Mirror III 2.0

**PROS:** Good script language, mouse support

**CONS:** Some poorly implemented on-line features, peculiar interface

Mirror III began life as a Crosstalk XVI clone but has since graduated to become a Procomm and a Crosstalk

clone. The latest version of this \$149 program boasts features that its mentors lack, including mouse support, background transfers, and a slew of terminal emulations. However, the program's hodgepodge interface and screen glitches make it a so-so value.

Mirror III's interface couldn't be more schizophrenic—even Procomm and Crosstalk XVI users will find it disorienting. A ghost of a Crosstalk XVI screen flashes on the screen when you load the program, but in a blink it's gone as Mirror dresses itself in a Procomm-like dialing directory. You use a Crosstalk XVI—style status screen to change global parameters and launch scripts and the dialing directory to get on line. Once on line, you choose between a 1-2-3-issue top-line menu or a Crosstalk XVI—style command bar.

The program's screen display is buggy—at times, *Mirror III* blanks the online screen. Log off a mainframe after using VT-220 emulation, and the screen blossoms into a confetti of extended ASCII symbols. The mouse support is welcome, but while on line the mouse occasionally freezes up.

Among Mirror III's other quirks is

its curious ritual of stalling several seconds to build menus whenever you log off. File and error handling is poor—when accessing alternate drives (such as D:) you can look only at the root.

Support for transfer protocols is complete except that ZMODEM isn't built-in—you must install it from a separate disk (no picnic) and register it as shareware. The background mode works well, but it consumes 470K, leaving scant room for other programs. You can trim it to 185K if you prune key features like the dialing directory.

*Mirror*'s capable script language is comparable to that of *Procomm Plus*. A mini-BBS greets remote callers with menus and even lets authorized users shell to DOS, but you can't restrict callers to specified directories.

*Mirror III* offers a wide array of features, but the bumpy interface makes it only a fair value.

#### **Procomm Plus 2.0**



**PROS:** Easy-to-use dioling directory, simple setup, mouse support, good remote mode

**CONS:** No background transfers, faulty DEC emulations, poor documentation

An up-from-shareware best-seller, *Procomm Plus* has recently undergone its first major upgrade in years. Version 2.0 adds ZMODEM, mouse support, an improved editor, 15 terminal emulations (for a total of 32), and a more powerful script language. On the downside, some DEC emulations still don't work properly, and the documentation is a loser. Thanks to its ease of use, however, *Procomm* retains the Best Buy it won in our last roundup a year and a half ago.

Always easy to use, *Procomm* has become even easier. New fields grace *Procomm*'s intuitive dialing directory, including date of last call, emulation, and protocol. Also new: You can annotate entries with a pop-up notepad. As always, <Alt>-key combinations let

you quickly access setup parameters, and you can now use function keys to call scripts and external programs. You get prewritten scripts for CompuServe, Dow Jones, and BIX.

Mouse support is a big help—you can use a mouse to dial numbers and scroll and select choices from menus. While *Procomm*'s script language now boasts its own manual, neither it nor the main manual is very thorough, and expanded on-line help doesn't fill the gap. The new *Procomm* is a memory guzzler, requiring 295K (192K if you sacrifice Kermit, CompuServe B+, the editor, and the DOS gateway).

The on-line interface is improved—you can cut and paste file names between *Procomm* and a remote system, and you can now easily mark on-line text and pop it into a vastly improved editor that includes word wrap and a split-screen display. The addition of ZMODEM and CompuServe B+ brings *Procomm's* list of protocols up to snuff, and the 15 new emulations include DEC VT-220, VT-320, and IBM 3161. A few DEC emulations still retain flaws, exhibiting faulty backspace and function key behavior.

Procomm's enhanced script lan-

guage will be welcomed by developers who want to write their own emulations. Scripts are now compiled for greater speed, and the over 90 new commands include better file and string manipulation, support of floating variables, and a full set of arithmetic operators. However, it lacks the windowing power of top languages like Mk.4's CASL. Also, if your existing Procomm scripts are complex, they'll probably need to be modified.

Despite some gaps and blemishes, the \$119 Procomm Plus is still a Best Buy—especially if you buy it from one of the many mail-order outfits that offer it for about \$40. It's highly recommended for mainstream users, but if you need to call into the company DEC VAX, choose HyperAccess/5 instead.

#### **Qmodem SST 4.2**

**PROS:** Good text editor, easy dioling directory, superb remote mode

**CONS:** No bockground transfers, few emulations and protocols, no predefined scripts

The Forbin Project's shareware *Qmodem SST* is a kissing clone cousin

to *Procomm Plus*. The \$79.95 program offers an outstanding host mode, dialing directory, and editor. Although its list of emulations and protocols is somewhat short, it's a good value for bargain hunters and BBS browsers.

*Qmodem*'s unique setup automatically tests and optimizes many different brands of high-speed modems. Documentation is mediocre, but the on-line help is tops. Unfortunately, the program lacks prewritten scripts, and there's no background mode.

Like *Procomm*, *Qmodem* is built around an interactive dialing directory, complete with queue dialing for polling busy BBS's, and pop-up notecards for each dialing entry. *Qmodem*'s superb *WordStar*-like editor is the best in the roundup, and cut and paste is easy. Online support is good, but *Qmodem* can't read Kermit or CompuServe B protocols, and its limited list of emulations lacks IBM 3101 support.

The 68-command script language is similar to the one in *Procomm*, adding true windowing ability, a slick debugger, and a facility to execute DOS commands from within scripts. The BBS-like host mode is the best in the roundup—it has everything that *Procomm* has, plus a



#### Relay Gold 4.0

**PROS:** Links to *Relay*-based mainframes, multiple sessions, 3270 support

**CONS:** Confusing interface, poor documentation

Microcom's \$299 Relay Gold is aimed at corporate users with links to those IBM 3270 and VM systems that also run versions of Relay. Version 4.0 adds emulations, expanded memory support, a popup scroll buffer, and script enhancements. Despite the program's 15 multiple sessions, support for 3270 boards, and powerful script language, however, Relay Gold drops the ball with its poorly organized interface. Now that Crosstalk Mk.4 proves that power needn't be intimidating, there's scant reason to buy Relay Gold unless you're talking to Relay mainframes.

Relay Gold is awash in excess menus, and you must often work through a puzzle box of function keys and script commands. The program opens simply enough with a function-key menu, but then things get messy. There's an adequate dialing directory, but you must toggle to another screen to find out, for instance, if an entry is linked to a script.

On line, it gets messier. There are no predefined scripts, so you must rely on *Relay*'s learn mode, which works only with TTY emulation—this double whammy will keep many a novice from creating log-in scripts. To coax *Relay Gold* into printing, you must enter script commands.

Background transfers consume only 256K. They run smoothly when the program is loaded as a non-TSR and later toggled into resident mode, but if you load it in resident mode and then go on line, *Relay* reports that there isn't enough memory and hangs up.

The hefty script language includes

plenty of variables and math functions, but it offers no support for windowing, and only one data type. The menuless remote mode accepts calls only from other *Relay* systems.

Relay Gold may be a suitable choice for corporations that link up to mainframes via *Relay*, but for the rest of us, it earns a thumbs-down.

#### Smartcom III 1.2a

**PROS:** Good file manager, capable editor, multiple sessions

**CONS:** Difficult to set up, few emulations, no CompuServe B or ZMODEM

Marred by a confusing interface and limited support for emulations and protocols, the \$249 Smartcom III probably would not be as widely used as it is if it didn't come bundled with some V-Series Hayes modems. If you want power, check out Crosstalk Mk.4. If you're looking for ease of use and want to stay in the Smartcom family, try Hayes' new lower-end Smartcom Exec.

# Smartcom Exec is superior to Smartcom III and only a tad less powerful.

Smartcom III lacks a true dialing directory. Communications settings are broken into two categories: activity settings, which consist of the phone number, emulation, and file transfer particulars, and connection settings, which are parameters like modem speed and COM port. Ideally, you're supposed to mix and match these so you can run multiple activity settings from a single connection setting, but in real life it's a mite confusing, and the limited manual doesn't help. It's also difficult to link a log-in script to a phone number.

Once it's set up, *Smartcom III* gets a little easier. On line, you can open a complete menu of options, including an

excellent capture buffer and editor and the best file manager in the roundup. The lack of hot keys, however, results in too much button pushing, and you can't change parameters—or even protocols—while on line.

Smartcom III is oddly out of sync with the modem—it takes 3 to 5 seconds to dial the modem, and a suddenly severed link can leave you temporarily unable to access the main menu.

With two modems, you can run two sessions at once—four sessions if you have two modems linked to an X.25 network. The scantily documented background mode, dubbed "Caveat Emptor," is for "experimental" use only—it's really no different from the DOS shells offered by most of its rivals. If you adjust *Smartcom*'s memory usage, you may be able to run a few small, well-behaved programs during file transfers, but you risk losing the connection.

The script language is comparable to *Procomm*'s. An excellent script editor lets you parse together commands from menus. The limited remote mode offers passwords and a simple menu, but callers can't access DOS.

A nerve-jangling interface, limited emulations, and the lack of ZMODEM make *Smartcom III* a mediocre buy.

#### **Smartcom Exec 1.0a**

PROS: Easy to use, mouse support

**CONS:** Few emulations, no prewritten scripts

A scaled-down version of *Smartcom III* designed for novices, the \$129 *Smartcom Exec* is a vast improvement over Hayes' low-end *Smartcom II*, which is being phased out. It's also superior to Smartcom III and only a tad less powerful. The only omissions from *Smartcom III*'s feature list are multiple sessions, data compression, and encryption—items not likely to be missed by most. *Exec*'s Caveat Emptor background mode, remote mode, and paltry emulations are identical to *III*'s, and the script

Exec's interface resembles Smartcom III's, but it's far more streamlined and intuitive. Unfortunately, you're lim-

ited to setting up only one protocol per on-line system. No prewritten scripts are included, but you can download some from Hayes' toll-free BBS.

There's no CompuServe B support, but like *Procomm*, *Exec* includes Interrupted ZMODEM—a new high-speed version of the protocol that enables the modem to resume a file transfer where it left off if line noise intrudes.

Smartcom Exec could use a true dialing directory and more emulations, but it's a good deal for beginners.

#### Telemate 2.11

**PROS:** Full list of protocols, mousable windowing interface

**CONS:** No background mode, no remote mode, few emulations, requires 500K RAM, no phone support

The innovative *Telemate* is not a *Windows* program, but it offers a character-based windowing interface and a popup *Windows*-like clipboard for cut and paste. This shareware prodigy costs only \$40, but you must print the manual yourself. *Telemate* has its problems, including negligible emulations and no remote mode, but thanks to its friendly interface it's still a very good deal.

A sleek setup routine opens *Telemate*. You access all functions, including the dialing directory, via cascading pulldown menus. The outstanding editor, file viewer, and other modules pop up

in windows. You can zoom, move, or resize the windows and shuffle data between them. You can even work in windows during file transfers, but only within the program—there's no background mode.

The Pascal-like script language is well structured and well documented. It lacks trace and debug, but it offers numerous data types and unlimited string and integer variables.

Telemate needs to go on a RAM diet—if you have extended or expanded memory, though, you can reduce some of the whopping 500K RAM consumption. It's the only program reviewed that lacks telephone technical support—you must contact the author via E-mail.

Telemate puts communications into windows for the non-Windows world. Despite its limitations, it is impossible not to recommend this wonder to adventurous users who are hooked on the mouse but not on Windows.

#### Unicom 2.0c

**PROS:** Easy dialing directory, powerful onscreen buttons

**CONS:** No learn mode, limited script language, no DDE support

The only *Windows* program reviewed that offers a *Procomm*-like dialing directory, the shareware *Unicom* is also the easiest to use. The \$60 *Unicom* is such a pleasure, you may want to ignore its underachieving script language and lack of a learn mode and buy it anyway.

Unicom offers the usual pulldown menus, one of which runs such Windows utilities as the Calculator, Calendar, and Notepad. Three rows of buttons on the bottom invoke communications chores like dialing, hanging up, uploading, and downloading. You can customize the bottom two rows to launch scripts or external programs. This high level of integration makes the lack of DDE support less onerous. On line, you can shuttle to the clipboard the contents of the capture buffer or the terminal window, but you can't mark and cut the text be-

fore doing so. *Unicom* offers an impressive list of protocols, but emulations are limited to TTY, ANSI, and VT-100.

Unicom's script language is the most limited in the roundup. It's good for writing log-ins, but for little else. You can record keystrokes for later playback, but there's no true learn mode. On the plus side, you can schedule script activation using VCR-like buttons, and the remote mode is capable. Tech support, however, is limited to calling the author during 3 hours in the evening or contacting him on CompuServe.

*Unicom* has its shortcomings, but a friendly design makes communications straightforward. It's a good deal for the casual *Windows* communicator.

### Windows Communications—Not Quite Ready for Prime Time

Windows holds the promise of making on-line access easier—icons, buttons, and dialog boxes can smooth the rough edges of on-line life, and multitasking, the Clipboard, and DDE support can better integrate communications with other applications.

If only the reality lived up to the promise! Windows communications packages—especially DynaComm and MicroPhone—have made innovative strides, but their fancy iconic interfaces are even more difficult to set up than a standard communications package.

For now, the easiest, most complete communications solutions are still found in the character-based world. Our Best Buys: Crosstalk Mk.4 for high-end users, HyperAccess/5 or Procomm Plus for more casual users, and Crosstalk Communicator for beginners.



## MARKET!

Information isn't just power—in some cases, it's survival. Before you launch a new product or service, discover how other businesses are ensuring success with on-line and CD ROM data bases of key demographic and competitive data.

rimare Incorporated epitomizes what can happen to the American Small Business Dream. Located in La Mirada, California, a town 30 miles east of Los An-

geles, the interior design firm started with just two employees in 1983. By 1988 the company had moved to plush offices in Santa Monica and increased its staff to ten. Then came a budget crunch among health care providers—the clients Primare had spent its marketing time and money wooing. At the same time, new jobs were won by rival firms that kept expenses low by hiring designers on a per-job basis.

By 1989 Primare was barely afloat. "We're still fighting back from doing too little market research too late," laments Alane West, a principal with the firm.

Primare's story is not unusual, says Tom Gray, a chief economist with the Small Business Administration (SBA) in Washington, D.C. According to the SBA, 51 percent of all new businesses fail within four years due to poor management and poor market planning. Companies don't fully research the market before introducing products. They don't understand who their competitors are. And they don't anticipate market changes in time to refocus their business plan.

But the tool that could help companies investigate potential customers or get the scoop on competitors is close at hand: the PC.

#### A RARELY USED WEAPON

Although most small businesses use PCs, few are aware of their potential as marketing tools. In a 1990 SBA survey of 2000 businesses, nearly 75 percent of the respondents had PCs. But none of these companies reported using their PCs for market research. That's unfortunate, since using electronic resources would put firms on an equal footing with larger competitors, says Gray.

Virtually all the "textbook" market research required to launch a product or service can be done today with just a PC and modem or CD ROM drive, says Jeffry Timmons, professor of entrepreneurial finance at Harvard Business School.

By accessing commercially available data bases, you can get the lowdown on a competitor's sales, profit and loss history, R&D plans, credit history, contracts and affiliations, organizational structure, intellectual property, and more—all useful information when formulating a business plan for a new venture.

#### STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL SEARCH Step 1: Choose your data sources Determine information requirements. (Data bases cover financial information, industry/trade news, and demographic data.) Look for tools to make your search easier, such as front-end software and training programs. Evaluate services based on fixed costs, costs for downloading, frequency of updates, and number and variety of data bases. Step 2: Develop a search plan Establish broad search criteria when you're entering a new market and want information on all potential competitors. Narrow your search criteria when you want to zero in on a few key companies. Step 3: Optimize on-line time Plan your search off line. Download one article at a time. Review all material off line. If unsure of next step, go off line and reevaluate.

#### A TRIED-AND-TRUE METHOD

The ability to search on-line and CD ROM data bases with PCs isn't new. Such data collection and analysis has been going on at companies like Coca-Cola in Atlanta for years. "We wouldn't launch any new product without first researching who will buy it and what other products they buy," says Terry Koch, the company's director of market research.

The switch is that access to the wealth of publicly available data is now within reach of small companies as well, says Julie Scofield, director of education for the Smaller Business Association of New England (SBANE), a private nonprofit association of 2000 small companies. She notes that PC prices have decreased and data bases are easier to access, which makes the information accessible to smaller companies that previously couldn't afford to hire an outside marketing firm or set up an in-house staff dedicated to market research. "With PCs, the owner, the secretary, or anybody else can conduct market research," she says.

#### **ENDING THE PAPER CHASE**

Most business executives are familiar with the paper-based reference sources specific to their industries. What they may not know, however, is that many of these same references are available on CD ROM disks or through on-line subscription services.

Data bases range from the industry-specific to those of general business interest. Many popular on-line data bases are available through data banks—on-line "supermarkets" of information, such as BRS, Nexis, Orbit Search Services, and Dialog (see "Strategic Data Sources" in this issue). These business data banks often offer one-stop shopping for the market researcher, since many provide access to hundreds of individual data bases. Dialog, the largest data bank, has 380, many of which are also published on CD ROM.

Usage rates vary considerably from one data base to the next, with some charging fees as high as \$200 or more an hour. Users generally pay for on-line time, telecommunications charges, and products ordered, such as a hard copy printout of a report.

Since several of the major data bases are available through a variety of sources, it pays to find the best price. The Disclosure data base, for example, which provides detailed financial information on publicly held companies, is available through Dialog, BRS, and Nexis. On Dialog and BRS the data is updated weekly and costs \$45 per hour. On Nexis, the same data base costs \$39 per hour.

In addition to on-line data, about 1000 data bases are published on CD ROM, mostly by government agencies. SilverPlatter Information, in Newton Lower Falls, Massachusetts, is one of the most comprehensive commercial distributors of CD ROM data, with 60 titles in its 1991 catalog. CD ROM disks cost anywhere from \$29 to more than \$10,000 and are sold through computer stores and consultants and by mail order. Some data bases are available only on CD ROM.

The media type you choose will depend on what information you need and how often you'll search, says Bill Perry, director of research at Helgerson Associates, a market research firm in Boulder, Colorado.

When data bases won't be used frequently, it's generally less expensive to use the on-line versions. "On-line data bases are easier to access and have upto-the-minute information," explains Nancy Herther, editor of the magazine CD ROM Professional. When information will be needed more frequently, though, she advises users to compare CD ROM prices. "With CD ROM, you can use the information year-round, keep it running day and night, and look at as much as you want," says Herther. The one disadvantage to using CD ROM data bases is that they are updated much less frequently than their on-line counterparts.

Perry urges consumers to compare CD ROM and on-line data bases by both cost *and* stress factors. "With CD ROM, you won't rush. On-line users are conscious of the ticking clock."

### EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW—BUT YOU'LL HAVE TO LOOK FOR IT

Most businesses have three key questions when launching a product or expanding their business into new territory: Is there a market for my product or service? Will the necessary suppliers be available? Who are my competitors?

The answer to each of these questions is available through on-line and CD ROM data bases—but finding the information can take some digging.

"The hot information, the true intelligence, has to be sifted for," says Kirk Tyson, president of Kirk Tyson International, an Oak Brook, Illinois, market

research firm specializing in competitor intelligence. He estimates that 80 percent of the information available through these resources falls into the nice-to-know, but not strategically necessary, category.

Often, in fact, truly strategic information may not exist in the published sources. What you will find, however, are clues about which direction a market is moving, what specific products or services a company will introduce, and what technologies are being developed that will yield new products.

To get a complete picture, Tyson suggests studying multiple sources and talking with lots of people, effectively "putting together the pieces of a jigsaw puzzle." Strategic information should be confirmed by two or three sources before you act on it, he cautions.

"It's amazing how much we can find out using only commercially available data bases," says Earnest Deadwyler, manager of market research for Texas Instruments in Dallas. He uses on-line data bases to compile detailed corporate information on competitors: how they're organized, their financial commitments, labor relations information, and product news.

#### WHERE TO GO FOR DATA

To research publicly held companies,

#### FACING OFF WITH COMPETITORS

nna Maria DiCicco faces formidable competition every day—the faces of celebrities-turned-gourmet-cooks Paul Newman and Frank Sinatra, for starters. The ambitious 26-year-old owns six Italian restaurants in Northern California and markets three sauces (spicy, regular, and marinara) to 680 upscale grocery stores.

We asked Bill Perry, director of research at Helgerson Associates in Falls Church, Virginia, a CD ROM clearing-house specializing in market research, how DiCicco could use her PC to research new outlets for her sauce. Here's what he said.

First, using Dun's Electronic Yellow Pages, DiCicco could locate grocery stores within a defined area. She would then delete the names of stores already selling her products and concentrate on learning more about potential outlets.

The Census Bureau STF would be a good source for researching the demographic makeup of the neighborhoods surrounding each store. Since her sauce sells for about \$3 and is labeled to appeal to a gourmet audience (it usually shares shelf space with Newman's Own and Classico), she would need to target stores in middle- to upperclass neighborhoods. With the names and addresses of these stores, she would then use Dun's Electronic Yellow Pages to get contact names and other information (ownership, financial status) for each store.

Next, DiCicco might want to see how competitive products were selling at these outlets, how competing firms were organized, and what product areas they were researching. To find that information, she'd enter product names into Thomas Register Online, which has 50,000 classes of products made by 140,000 companies. The company names could then be used to look for announcements, promotions, or recent patents, for instance. Full text of any relevant articles about those companies could be accessed through Trade & Industry Index or other news data bases for downloading to her PC.

"Everything [DiCicco] wants is readily available—it's just a matter of sifting through the data bases to find the information," says Perry. —L. L.

you can use Disclosure or Standard & Poor's Register-Corporate. Wasserstein Perella and Company, a 250-person investment banking firm based in New York City, uses Disclosure to "screen" clients and competitors for acquisitions and mergers. Large corporations with net worths of \$500,000 or more are in Dun & Bradstreet's Million Dollar Directory, while both public and privately held businesses of all sizes are listed in Dun's Electronic Yellow Pages. Current articles on products, promotions, and earnings can be found on Moody's Corporate News-U.S., Newsearch, or Newswire ASAP.

You can use these same resources to find information on potential suppliers, including names of key executives, a company's financial status, and current contracts. Texas Instruments, for example, uses S&P's Register and Disclosure to research suppliers and companies that want to team up with them on a contract. "We use the data to evaluate current work loads and contracts to see if they're overcommitted," explains Deadwyler.

The long arm of on-line electronic data even reaches consumers. Dun & Bradstreet's Donnelly Demographics gives information on age, gender, race, occupation, marital status, household size, education, income level, and so on, down to the ZIP code level. Using address and telephone directory lists, businesses can then get house-by-house addresses and even unlisted telephone numbers for use in direct marketing campaigns.

As the recent storm of controversy surrounding Lotus Development's now-discontinued *Marketplace* products illustrates, however, the widespread availability of detailed consumer information for direct marketing purposes raises serious concerns about individual privacy rights (see *Consumer Watch* in this issue).

This year for the first time, consumer data will be available on CD ROM. The Census Bureau is now releasing its Summary Tape Files (STF) series, based on the 1990 census. The two products most useful for demographic research won't be available for another year or so, however. STF 3 will provide the sample data (gathered from detailed questionnaires given to some houses) down to the block/group level (city

#### PUTTING DEMOGRAPHIC DATA ON THE MAP

New York state, faces stiff competition in its retail areas, so it relies on demographic data from the National Planning Data Corporation and CACI (both based in Washington, D.C.) to analyze fluctuating business. It has long used such data to locate new offices, understand performance levels, and target a branch's services. But the bank's recent conversion to mapping software to plot the demographic data on maps makes its analysis of population trends more timely, more precise, and just plain easier.

&T Bank, with 79 branch outlets in western

One use for demographic data is in scouting out new branch locations, according to Lew-Jean King, project manager for the bank's delivery systems group. "We look at a neighborhood's loan and savings potential based on the number of households and the area's demographic makeup—particularly income and age," says King. With those figures, his department determines deposit and loan potentials on a neighborhood-by-neighborhood basis. "Without this kind of specific information we couldn't make a case for opening a new branch," he says.

The information is also used to research why existing branches aren't performing as they have in the past. King develops a profile for each branch area based on the competition and on its demographics. "By looking at how an area has changed demographically and projecting how it will change

during the next five years, we tailor our services to attract the area's customers," explains King. The bank is most concerned with income and household growth information for each area. "We want to know if we're being too optimistic about credit card lending in an area with a high percentage of elderly people, or about CD balances in lower-income areas. We'd make adjustments in the expectations of those offices."

The bank also sets up direct-mail programs for its products that should be strong in each area. For instance, a neighborhood with first-time homeowners might receive mailings about the bank's home-loan and refinance plans.

For at least 20 years, researchers gathered this data manu-

blocks covering 800 to 1000 people). It will list averages for income, occupation, education, and more. STF 3B (scheduled for release in early 1993) includes all the same information, plus ZIP code data. Pricing will vary, depending on the size of the geographic area you want to study. Full demographic information on California, for example, will cost approximately \$830 (final pricing has yet to be determined). Information is available on CD ROM and through the federal government.

Census data holds the greatest potential for direct marketers of products or services. Producers of a new gourmet baby food, for example, could target its introduction at high-income areas, with direct mailings sent to families with young children. And when combined

ally by sifting through demographic information compiled by the National Planning Data Corporation and CACI. The NPDC provides base maps, which are reference maps of the geography of a city or a block. CACI offers age, population, and race and income data, and projects demographic changes that will happen between the census counts.

But the bank was able to estimate only the relationships between the base map and the demographic information. It had no way to match the demographic information with the geographic data to make a map showing, for instance, decline and growth areas for average household income.

In the mid-1980s, CACI began distributing its resources in 1-2-3-compatible formats, which made it easy for M&T Bank to analyze and manipulate the statistics. The analysis process, however, wasn't fully automated until 1989, when the bank adopted Atlas-GIS, a PC-based mapping product from Strategic Mapping. Atlas-GIS uses the Census Bureau's computerized street maps of the country to match addresses with latitude/longitude coordinates and then attach data to those points on the map. An internal data base gives the software its analysis capabilities, while drawing and editing features allow you to create and modify the computerized maps. Pop-up menus and on-screen windowing simplify the user interface.

With Atlas-GIS, the bank started to analyze its demographic

data on line, combining it with geographic data on specific metropolitan areas like Rochester and Long Island. The mapping software shows bank branches, nearby shopping centers, highways and roads, and outlines of census block groups within the metropolitan area. On-line data, which is updated monthly, is downloaded from either of the two data bases or from the bank's own mainframe data base of customer information. It is then passed directly into Atlas-GIS as an ASCII file for mapping and analysis.

Using the mapping software allows the bank to highlight geographic areas for study and view data plotted on a map rather than as columns of numbers. For instance, the software might display concentrations of customers of a specified age or income level, making it easy for an analyst to track and interpret demographic trends at a glance.

King says that M&T plans to make full use of the Census data disks as they become available, since they will be "the most current, realistic data set around." King will use the CD ROM version of the data for his state.

"We're finding that up-to-date demographics make a big difference in how well we are meeting the savings and loan needs of our customers—now and in the future," he says. "I'd be blind without it, with no idea of how to assess an area or how our branches should be doing there," he says. —L. L.

#### SIMPLIFYING YOUR SEARCH

The sheer volume of data available scares away many small companies, says SBANE's Scofield. Once on line, businesses fear navigating the data bank's user interface and being unable to locate the information they need.

To alleviate those concerns, most resources have "front end" software to help users develop and conduct searches. For example, *Nexis News Plus* (\$50), a front end for Nexis, creates search patterns on keywords such as company names. As keywords are located, data is flagged and downloaded to the user. Front ends such as *Nexis News*

*Plus* are sometimes bundled with the system or may cost from \$50 to more than \$500 as stand-alone packages.

Large data banks also offer software and seminars to teach new users how to formulate productive searches. Dialog, for example, offers Starter Package programs, which include reference manuals, user seminars, and \$100 worth of search time—all for \$150. Tyson says with about a half-day's training, most subscribers are able to conduct effective searches.

Suzanne Swenson, manager of market research at Unisys Defense Systems in McLean, Virginia, attended a local Dialog user seminar to learn the basic search strategy. "Once I learned to conduct on-line searches, I could move easily from one data base to the next," she says, noting that each data base offered through Dialog follows the same format, so searching patterns are uniform.

To make the most of search time, users should establish search plans before accessing either type of data base, says Tyson. Searches should start on a general note and then narrow in focus. "Don't search at a too-specific level," Tyson says. "It's better to use broad industry names or technology types." Broader searches identify existing and new competitors—crossovers from other vertical markets that could escape a narrow search of one technology type. For example, searching for oil industry/pumps would update a company on what its suppliers or competitors were doing. Searching for pumps would also generate information about a manufacturer in another industry who was going to market a pump to oil companies in the near future.

#### WHEN YOU CAN'T DO IT YOURSELF

Companies unwilling or unable to conduct their own market research can still take advantage of these data sources by using information brokers. For a fee, a broker will search relevant data bases and compile strategic reports on com-

petitors, suppliers, or customers.

Because of their familiarity with the variety of sources available, brokers can often provide you with full reports in a few days. This may be the easiest way for small companies to capitalize on the available resources, but expect to pay \$150 to \$350 for a typical project.

Brokers are listed in Houston-based Burwell Enterprises' *Directory of Fee-Based Information Services* (\$49.50 plus \$3 for postage), which is indexed by geographic area and subject.

#### **GETTING THE WORD OUT**

With such a wealth of information available, it's hard to believe that many small companies are still ignoring this valuable resource.

Despite efforts by vendors to simplify the search process, many small business users are scared off by the technology, which could still be easier to use, says SBANE's Scofield. "[Vendors also] need to market themselves to the small-business user."

The time commitment involved in developing and implementing a market research strategy may also deter some small businesses. "Anyone who wants to use these resources has to be willing to invest time to use the system," adds Harvard's Timmons, and for many small businesses, day-to-day operations may take precedence over long-term market research.

Until these data bases become more publicized, small businesses will maintain a healthy skepticism toward them, he adds. "They probably think they're doing a good job right now listening to their customers," he says. "This false security can keep them from seeing warning signs until it's too late—and new products or a market downturn puts them out of business."

On-line and CD ROM data bases offer a wealth of information to help businesses keep up-to-date and plan for the future.



othing remains constant except change. Certainly, all the factors that affect a business—from customer demographics to supplier availability to the over-

all economic climate—are in a state of continual flux. Data bases available on CD ROM or on line can keep you up-to-date.

Below, we've listed a number of data bases designed to assist the general business user. They include full-text data bases of business publications, data bases of statistical information for and about companies, demographic data based on United States Census information, and business directories. The frequency of updates varies from daily to semiannually.

You can also find hundreds of data bases for more specialized applications—everything from farming to weather to real estate to medicine—which we were unable to list here. One source of information about both general-interest and specialized data bases is Computer Readable Data Bases: A Directory and Data Sourcebook from the Gale Research Group in Detroit, Michigan.

Because they tend to be expensive, data bases on CD ROM are best suited to users who need information about a narrow topic on a regular basis. Fees and fee structures vary widely for these data bases. For example, some services will charge a yearly subscription, others

a one-time fee with an additional charge for updates. The disks are usually distributed with a software package to search the CD and retrieve the information you need.

If your market intelligence needs aren't sufficient to warrant purchase of a CD ROM drive, a dial-up service offers a more cost-effective approach. You usually pay a one-time charge for access to the data base and additional fees for time spent on the service. Although these services may be more difficult to use, they offer a much broader range of data bases. The listings below indicate which services carry these data bases.

# CD ROM DRIVES

n the world of storage, you can never be too thin or too fast.

Today's crop of CD ROM (compact disk read-only memory)
drives won't blind you with their speed, but they're twice as
swift as their predecessors and small enough to fit in a floppy
drive bay—and they break the \$500 street price barrier with
amazing regularity.

That's good news if you hanker to get at the commercial data bases distributed on CD ROM disks. No longer a novelty, CD ROMs include everything from sophisticated financial data bases to massive font collections. Multimedia disks, which incorporate video and synchronized sound, are on their way, too, but they may require the next generation of faster CD ROM players (see the sidebar "Is Multimedia in Your Future?").

Another big plus in today's CD ROM drives is standardization. Since the drives are made by a handful of manufacturers that

abide by the same specifications, most units are pretty similar. And since all CD ROM drives support the High Sierra and ISO 9660 standards, which lay out basic rules for storing data, you should be able to play most contemporary disks in almost any CD ROM drive.

Nonetheless, manufacturers are competing by offering lower prices, greater speed, or more sophisticated features—some new drives can read the maximum possible amount of data on a CD ROM (about 680MB) or run on their side; others feature linear transport motors that position the read head much more quickly.

#### BEFORE YOU BUY

Since most CD ROM drives are fairly similar, the bottom line here is speed and price. However, don't forget the basics: Make sure the drive comes complete with a mounting kit (if the unit is internal), cables, adapter, a "caddy" for holding disks in the drive, and Microsoft's MS-DOS CD-ROM Extensions version 2.2. And don't take mean time between failure (MTBF) ratings too seriously. MTBF typically applies to motor life, but most drives die from bad power supplies, faulty lens assemblies, and other ailments. A long warranty is your best protection. Finally, consider the following factors.

Performance The three most reliable measures of a drive's performance are average access time, throughput, and the size of the drive's buffer. The fastest drives hit 340ms to

360ms, include 32K or 64K buffers, and boast throughput of 150K per second. This is still three times slower than a floppy drive, so the faster the CD ROM drive, the better.

Capacity A CD ROM can theoretically hold 680MB of data. Most commercial applications don't go beyond 600MB, but upcoming disks packed with graphics, video, and digital sound may need every byte. Plan for tomorrow—buy a drive that can access as much data as possible.

**Expandability** Adding multiple CD ROM drives to your system is relatively easy. Depending on the manufacturer, you can plug multiple drives directly into one or more adapters or, more commonly, daisy-chain drives off the first installed unit.

Another solution is Pioneer's DRM-600 CD ROM Changer—it has a cartridge that holds up to six disks and treats each like a different logical drive. If LAN access is a must, consider the multidrive units, software, and high-speed controllers offered by Online Computer Systems and Meridian Data that let several users access multiple drives simultaneously.

Compatibility Today's CD ROM drives are so standardized that you should be able to connect them to just about any PC, XT, AT, 386, or 486 system. Many vendors also supply interface kits for the PS/2. If Mac access is important, consider purchasing a (continues)

of text-oriented data bases available on CD ROM, the drives listed in our table will do nicely. But if you're concerned about multimedia, the picture is decidedly fuzzy.

Most experts agree that "compatibility" with video standards such as DVI (full-motion video) and XA (synchronized sound) boils down to speed—raw, continuous throughput. Most surveyed vendors believe their existing drives will be fast enough, but not all multimedia developers are convinced.

Intel has only approved three drives for its DVI standard: the Toshiba XM3201A1 and XM3201B1, and the Sony CDU-541. (Intel's not saying which drives failed.) Savvy buyers should call Intel and get an updated list before buying a drive for multimedia.

Additionally, Intel, Microsoft, and other multimedia players say that a CD ROM drive for multimedia applications should support version 2.2 of Microsoft's CD-ROM Extensions and come with large buffers and device drivers optimized by the drive supplier for multimedia applications. Also look for units that use faster linear transport head positioning and that can access as much data as possible (up to 680MB).

But if multimedia capability is your key reason for buying a drive, your best strategy may be to wait. Industry insiders and drive vendors admit off the record that much faster drives are expected in late 1991. —R. L.

SCSI drive—you may be able to plug the drive directly into a Mac's SCSI port. However, CD ROM applications designed for the PC usually can't be read by a Mac. Note, too, that operating system support other than for DOS varies wildly, so check carefully.







**Word Processing** 

Switching from Word to Word for Windows is a bit like falling in love for the second time. The basic moves are the same, but the details are completely different.

Word for Windows, affectionately called WinWord, retains Microsoft's "select, then format" approach but is built around a completely new set of commands. This guide to WinWord begins by walking you through the editing commands you probably used most in Word—selecting text, cutting and pasting, using the glossary, and so on.

Next, you'll meet the Ruler and the Ribbon, *WinWord*'s push-button solutions to formatting. Finally, you'll spend some time with advanced functions like styles, macros, and document conversion and learn where to find more help.

#### Taking Command of WinWord

WinWord's new menus are far more logical than Word 5's old system. To take full advantage of them, though, you need a mouse. Here's how WinWord's menus are organized: Word's Transfer and Print menu commands are now in its File menu. The Format and Window menus remain about the same. Library selections, like hyphenation, spell checking, and the thesaurus, have moved to the Utilities menu.

You'll use the Insert menu to insert bookmarks, footnotes, page numbering, annotations, graphics, spreadsheet data, mail merge fields, and index and table of contents entries. The View menu controls the document's on-screen appearance, while the Macro menu han-

#### A Basic Anatomy of Word for Windows

Word for Windows makes basic editing operations quick and easy. Here are the main commands for selecting text, cutting and pasting, inserting boilerplate, and managing windows.



#### **Using Multiple Windows**

#### Search, Replace, and Go To

#### WinWord's Ribbon and Ruler: Shortcuts to Productivity

WinWord's real claim to fame is its new Ribbon and Ruler. These features allow you to perform common formatting chores merely by clicking on a "button." If neither feature appears on screen, click on the *View* menu, then click on the appropriate entry.

The Ribbon, which appears near the top of your screen, controls basic text formatting; you'll need the Format menu only for complex changes. Here's how to use the Ribbon:

First, select the text you want to format. Then, to choose a font, click on the arrow to the right of the box displaying the current font's name, and select a new font from the list box. You can alter the size of the text by clicking on the arrow next to the 'Pts:' (points) box and selecting a size. If you need a font size not shown in the list box, click inside the

size window and type a new value.

The buttons on the right half of the Ribbon control character appearance. Click on the button marked B for boldfacing. The remaining buttons control italics, small caps, underlining (with options for continuous, word-by-word, and double underlining), superscript (+), and subscript (=) formats. The button marked with an asterisk toggles the display of text boundaries and special characters, like spaces and tabs, that are not checked in the View Preferences dialog box.

Clicking a button applies its style to selected text. Click on it again, and you remove the formatting. If you double-click on any blank area on the Ribbon, the full character-formatting dialog box pops up.

To control the document's margin and multiple-column-width settings, first click the tiny ruler icon that's on the right side of the Ribbon to toggle the Ruler's mode. The tab indicators disappear, and *WinWord* displays square-

To apply another style, say Heading 1, put your cursor in the line or paragraph you want to change, click on the Style arrow, and select *Heading 1*. The entire paragraph will change style.

To apply the style to the entire document, select the document by holding down <**Ctrl>** and pressing **5** on the numeric keypad; then apply the style.

You can easily create your own styles. Just choose whatever enhancements you want to make—underlining, indentation, a new font, and so on. Then place your cursor anywhere on the paragraph, click on the Style arrow, type a new style name right in the list box, press <\*Enter>\*, and click on Yes to confirm the new style.

All in all, you'll find *WinWord* styles more sophisticated yet simpler to use than *Word*'s.

You can use these handy buttons on the Ribbon instead of consulting a menu to perform common formatting chores.



The buttons on the Ruler control paragraph formatting and access to styles.

The Ruler, which appears at the top of each document, controls paragraph formatting and styles. To attach a style to selected text, click on the Style arrow, then click on your choice.

With the first four buttons to the right of the Style arrow, you can align selected text flush left, center it, move it flush right, or make it fully justified on the page. Set line spacing with the three buttons in the center of the Ruler, which allow for single-, one-and-a-half-line, and double-spacing. The next two buttons control single- and double-spacing between paragraphs.

The four buttons marked with arrows are tab selectors, representing flush-left, center, flush-right, and decimal tabs. To set a tab, simply click one of the tab selector buttons to highlight it, and then click on the Ruler at the desired tab position. Setting a tab clears the default tabs to the left of the tab you set (the default tabs are represented by inverted Ts just below the Ruler). To clear a tab that you've set, simply click on it and drag it off the Ruler.

Below the Ruler you'll find two triangular icons, the left one split in two. You control the right margin of the paragraph containing the cursor (or of highlighted paragraphs) by dragging the right triangle. The lower half of the left triangle does the same for the left margin of the paragraph(s). The upper half of the left triangle sets first-line indent or outdent.

bracket icons that indicate document margins, which you can drag to reposition. For more complex chores, you can pop up the paragraph-formatting dialog box by double-clicking on any blank area of the Ruler.

#### **Working With Styles**

If you're like most people, you probably never used style sheets in *Word*. In *WinWord*, many of the style sheet functions have been simplified and collected in pulldown style menus specific to each document.


When you click the Style arrow on the Ruler, you can choose Normal, which is 10-point Times Roman, or one of three heading styles. All text appears in Normal by default.

#### WinWord's Way With Macros

There's one painful consequence of making the switch to *WinWord*. Your *Word* macros become history, and you must start over from scratch.

It's easy to record macros in *Win-Word* though, and the improved Word Basic macro language lets you create more complex macros. Even better, you can attach *WinWord* macros to keystrokes or even place favorite macros on any *WinWord* menu.

To record a macro, click on Macro



To change WinWord's default font, you load NORMAL.DOT from the \WINWORD directory, select Format Define styles, click the Character button, and choose your desired font and point size.

Record, type in a name and a description, press < Enter>, and issue the keystrokes and mouse clicks you want to record. When you're done, click on Macro Stop recorder.

You can run a macro by selecting *Macro Run* and double-clicking on the macro's name in the list box. But a macro is easier to run if you assign it to a keystroke or add it to a menu.

To do this, select the Macro Assign to key or Macro Assign to menu command. Choose the appropriate macro, specify a keystroke or select the menu where you want the macro to appear, click Assign, select OK, and you're in business.

#### SHORTCUTTING WORD FOR WINDOWS

Many *Word for Windows* keystroke shortcuts are similar to those in *Word*. To perform most character and paragraph formatting shortcuts, for example, substitute <Ctrl> for <Alt>. <Ctrl>-B instead of <Alt>-B will make your text bold. Here's a quick guide to 25 useful shortcuts.

#### From WinWord to Word and Back Again

While you're learning Word for Windows, you'll probably feel more at ease if you know how to convert documents to and from Word. Converting old Word documents is simple: Just load the document with File Open, click on Word for DOS in the conversion dialog box, and the process will occur automatically.

Most document features convert perfectly; however, margins set in more than one division in the old document will not convert. Also, if you used fonts in *Word for DOS* that are named differently in *Word for Windows*, you'll have to rename the fonts.

To save the file permanently as a WinWord file, use the File Save as command and accept the Normal style. To convert a Word for Windows document to Word format, select File Save as, type in a different document name, select Options, click on the File Format arrow, and then scroll down to MS Word and select it.







# Tips for getting the most out of your word processor

This month: Import spreadsheet data into your documents, print blocks of text in WordPerfect, and center documents vertically with a Word 5.0 macro.

hether you're creating a sales letter, a memo, or an annual report, a table of spreadsheet data can back up your argument and add impact. Fortunately, word processors like *WordPerfect* and *Word* make spreadsheet imports easy. You can even update the data whenever the original worksheet changes.

You'll typically include spreadsheet data in a table format. For letters and memos, try a simple text table set off with white space. In formal documents, like annual reports, surround data with a box or add captions and shading.

Table updates can be helpful when you're assembling a document over a period of time or when the document is revised on a regular basis. When you update the data, the entire worksheet or range is reimported. That usually results in the loss of at least some formatting, so it's usually best to format the table just before printing.

The memo in **SCREEN 1** shows an example of a *WordPerfect* table that incorporates sales data from *Excel*. To create this memo, you would type the text, and then use your word processor's spreadsheet linking commands to import the entire spreadsheet or just a range of cells. After a little minor formatting to realign the tabular material, you're done.

Every word processor handles spreadsheet imports differently. Here are some tips for *WordPerfect 5.1* and *Word 5.0*.

#### **Linking Up With WordPerfect**


WordPerfect 5.1 documents can include data from 1-2-3, Excel 2.x, and PlanPerfect versions 3.0 through 5.0. 1-2-3 re-

lease 3 users must save spreadsheets in WK1 format.

To create an updatable link, position the cursor within a document, then press <Ctrl>-<F5>sc or, if you won't need to update, <Ctrl>-<F5>si. Next, press f, type the path and file name for the spreadsheet, and press <Enter>.

If you need only a range of spreadsheet cells, press r, and enter the range in any of three formats: A1:H15, A1.H15, or A1..H15. If the spreadsheet contains named blocks or ranges, just type the range name, or press <F5> to pick from a list. Then press <Enter>.

To import the data in text format, press t, then e. If you have WordPerfect 5.1, you can type a instead of e to import the data into the table editor instead. Still, it's usually easier to use the text option for simple links where you don't need lines, boxes, or shading. If you import the spreadsheet into a table, every cell, including each empty cell, becomes

a cell in the table, which can sometimes make editing difficult. The table editor is a big help, however, for advanced table formatting. For example, you can draw boxes, shade selected cells, and wrap text within cells, handy for long text labels.

To perform the link, press p. You'll see the data, with comment boxes above and below. If you import the data as text, tabs separate the cells, with hard returns at the end of each line. Since empty cells are imported too, you may need to delete excess tabs. To view the tab markers, press <ali>Alt>-<F3></a>, which opens the Reveal Codes window.

If you choose WordPerfect's table option, move the cursor inside the table, then press <alit>-<f7>. You can use normal table editing tools to control lines and cell dimensions and to delete unwanted rows and columns. For example, to delete a column, move the cursor to a cell within the column, press <alit>Delete></a>, and then press c. To control lines and shading, press <alit>-<f7></a>, block a group of cells, then press I to use the Lines menu.

You can use *WordPerfect* formatting tools to add fonts or alter imported data in either text or table format, but if you update the link, the formatting is lost. To update the data, move to the top of

#### **Print a Block**

A little-used *WordPerfect* command lets you print a block of text. Just follow these steps:

- 1. Use the <Alt>-<F4> block command or your mouse to mark the text you want to print.

#### **Vertical Centering**

Many short documents, like letters, look better if they're centered vertically on the page. This *Word 5.0* macro does that job with one keystroke. On a blank *Word* screen, follow these steps:

- 1. Press <\$hift>-<F3> to begin recording.
- 2. Press <Shift>-<F10><Esc>
  fo<Cursor Down>.
- 3. Type centered, then press <Enter> < Cursor Up>.
- 4. Press <Shift>-<F3> and type VCenter.Mac, but don't press <Enter>. (If you want to assign this macro to a hot key, such as

<Ctrl>-C, type a caret (^) and then press <Ctrl>-C.)

5. Now press < Enter>. Press < Esc>tgs < Enter> to save the macro.

To use the macro, create a document, then press < Ctrl>-C, or if you didn't assign it to a hot key, press < Esc>i<Fl>, then select VCenter.Mac from the menu. The normal editing screen won't show the difference, but if you press < Ctrl>-< F9>, you'll see the text centered between the top and bottom of the page. — G. C.

the document by pressing <home>
<Home><Cursor Up>, and then press
<Ctrl>-<F5>sl. To update the table's
contents manually, press u, and to update automatically each time you retrieve the document, press r. If you update automatically, just remember to
check the figures so your text references to the table stay up-to-date. In the
same menu, press s to view or hide the
link's comment boxes.

#### **Word's Way With Links**

Creating spreadsheet links in *Microsoft Word 5.0* is similar. *Word* can handle *1-2-3* WKS and WK1 files, plus files from *Excel* and *Multiplan*.

To establish a link, position the cursor, then press < Esc>IIs. At the prompt, type the data file's path and name. To import the entire spreadsheet, press < Enter>. To import a range of cells, press < Tab>, then specify the range desired—for example, Al..H15 in 1-2-3, Al..H15 in Excel, or R1C1:R15C15 in Multiplan. You can also press < F1> to select

from a list of the worksheet's current range names. Press < Enter> to complete the link. Word marks links with hidden text codes. To view them, press < Esc>o < Cursor Right>y < Enter>.

Word imports spreadsheet data into a single paragraph, with new line characters between lines. Tabs separate the cells. Empty cells in the original spreadsheet also appear as tabs. To view the tab markers, press < Esc>o < Cursor Right> < Cursor Down>a < Enter>. To display the tab-setting ruler, place the cursor anywhere in the paragraph, then press < Alt>- < F1>. As with WordPerfect, you can format the data using ordinary formatting commands.

Word offers no automatic updating, but manual updates are easy—with the document loaded, just press <\$hift>-<\F10><\Esc>|ls<\Enter>y. As with Word-Perfect, all linked data is reimported, forcing you to reformat the text.



# Practical tips for building better worksheets

This month: a printing primer

often comes right after you plug in the latest numbers. But committing your cellular masterpiece to print for others is equally important—and often frustrating. In this month's column, we'll discuss some techniques for trouble-free printing.

Printing 1-2-3 release 2.x worksheets is simple—as long as all your rows and columns fit on one page. Select /Print Printer to access the print menu, choose Range, move the cell pointer to one corner of the range, press <Period>, paint the range, and press <Enter>. Then select Align to indicate the beginning of a new report, Go to begin printing, and finally, Page to eject the page. Don't neglect the Align command: It tells 1-2-3 that you're beginning a new report, and leaving it out will result in misaligned page breaks in your second printout.

#### **Small Is Beautiful**

This procedure works well as long as your print range fits within the screen width. With standard top and bottom margins and page length, *1-2-3* prints up to 56 rows on one sheet; additional rows go on an additional page.

The 1-2-3 screen is 72 characters wide—exactly the same as a page with standard margin settings at 4 and 76. This setup is just right for 8½-inch pages at 10 characters per inch. If you center something on the screen, it will be centered on the page.

#### **Getting Bigger? Squeeze It!**

But what if the range you want to print is wider than 72 characters? You have several alternatives: The simplest is to use a wide-carriage printer. On 14-inchwide paper, each line can hold up to 140 characters. Use/Print Printer Options Margins Right to set the right margin to about 132. With the left margin at 4, you'll be able to print a range up to 128 characters wide.

If you can't make the page bigger, make the print smaller. Let's say your printer's compressed mode yields 17 characters per inch with a maximum line length of 137 characters. Use /Print Printer Options Margins to set the left and right margins to, say, 10 and 134.

If your printer is equipped with font selection buttons, use them to select the compressed font; if not, use /Print

#### What WAS in Your Last Worksheet?

WAS: The Worksheet Archive
System fills an important niche

you maintain an audit trail of

successive generations of the

A WAS archive stores a map of the current worksheet; after editing and resaving the worksheet, you append the new version to the archive. WAS records just the changes, along with the date of the changes and notes, such as who made them. At any point, you can quickly compare the current worksheet with the previous version, or even recon-

struct any of the successive versions in a new WK1 file.

WAS is a stand-alone program with a simple, 1-2-3-like interface. It's most valuable for large, static worksheets; if your worksheets change their structure frequently, the significant changes will soon become lost in a swarm of irrelevant ones. But if accuracy and accountability are critical, using WAS could become an important step in your organization's procedures.

#### **EXCEL SHORTCUT**

#### **Create Cell Names Quickly in Excel**

Excel's Formula Create names command is a handy way to assign meaningful names to a range of cells en masse. It's especially useful when you have a rectangular range with text labels at the left and at the top.

Let's say you've got a worksheet that breaks down sales figures by month and state for the Midwest region in the range A1:K10, with text labels for the states in column A and for the months in row 1. Simply select the entire range A1:K10, select Formula Create names, select the Top row and Left column options in the dialog box, and click OK. That's all it takes.

This makes building formulas much easier. If row 9 is labeled *Minnesota* and column J is labeled *October*; formulas can refer to cell J9 as simply *Minnesota October*.

#### **Using 1-2-3's Borders Command**




FIGURE 1: Using the Print Printer Options Borders command, you can retain row and column labels on each page. Make sure the print range does not overlap the border rows and columns.

#### **Managing Multipage Reports**

Some print ranges can't be squeezed onto one page but must be arranged into a multipage report. As **FIGURE 1** shows, if the print range is wider than the current margin settings will allow, *1-2-3* "slices" the worksheet into pages. So far, so good, but some pages will inevitably lack the labels needed to identify their contents.

With the *Borders* command, you can duplicate the labels in designated rows and columns at the top and left of each page of the report. To set the border row(s), place the cell pointer in the top row of labels and select /*Print Printer Options Borders Row*. Use a similar procedure to set the border column(s); select /*Print Printer Options Borders Columns*. Next, set the print range so that it doesn't include the border rows and columns (see **FIGURE 1**).

On a multipage report, you'll also want to include a header and/or footer to indicate the page number and to present other information. Select /Print Printer Options Header (or Footer) and enter the header text. Use the vertical bar character (|) to split the header text into flush-left, centered, and/or flush-right parts; use # to include the page number and @ to include the current date. For example, the header line PCW, Inc. | | page # produces the header shown in FIGURE 1.

Finally, you can control the report's page length using page breaks. To make a row in the print range appear at the top of a new page, place the cell pointer in that row in the leftmost column of the print range, and then select /Worksheet Page. 1-2-3 inserts a row and places a special page break character in the cell (\dagger):). The new row doesn't appear on the printed report.

# Tips and techniques for managing your data

This month: structuring an efficient mailing list

hether you run a corporate marketing campaign or a seat-of-the-pants mail-order business from your home, your direct-mail program is a key element in the enterprise's overall success. You'll get a lot more mileage from the software—and avoid time-consuming design overhauls down the road—if you plan your mailing list data base carefully at the outset.

Start by thinking through your overall mailing strategy. It's not wise to send every ad or newsletter to everyone on your list—you'll save money by targeting mailings to specific groups. To do this, you'll need additional information about the people and companies on your list, such as their income level and previous purchase patterns.

Once you know what you want, write down the specific fields your data base should contain and how large each field should be. Divide distinct items into separate fields—even if you won't use them right away. Here are some more tips for designing a mailing list data base:

- Create separate fields for the first and last name. Your data base program can't sort the names *Charles M. Jones* and *Fred Avery* by last name, and you'll alienate customers with letters that begin *Dear Mr. Freleng, Fritz.* Allow 25 characters for the last name and 15 for the first name and middle initial. A 4-character field will suffice for the title (Mr., Ms., and so on).
- Add a field for the recipient's formal title, and another for his or her company, university, or other affiliation. Assign 40 characters for each.

- You'll need more than one field for the street address, as some require additional lines for building numbers, department names, and other details. As a rule of thumb, two 40-character fields will do for a data base of home addresses, three for business destinations.
- For full sorting and selecting flexibility, use separate fields for city, state, and ZIP code. Allow 25 characters for the city field to avoid trouble with names like *Bellefontaine Neighbors*.
- A comments field lets you keep notes on your customers. Many data base programs offer variable-length memo fields for this purpose, giving you plenty of room to write. If your data manager lacks memo support, use a text

#### **PARADOX SHORTCUT**

#### Please Squeeze the Field

How do you strip out the excess blank spaces when printing *Paradox* reports? You don't want reports with names like:

Eva Howard-Simpson

The easiest way is with the FieldSqueeze option. Place the First Name and Last Name fields side by side in a report form, with one blank space between them. With the cursor on the First Name field, press <f10>, and select Setting RemoveBlanks FieldSqueeze Yes. From then on, there will always be one space—and only one—between the names.

If you're short on space, FieldSqueeze has drawbacks. For instance, if you must print names in a 35-character box, you won't have room for a 15character First Name, a space, and a 25-character Last Name. Making the two report fields shorter than their table fields will result in truncated names whenever a first or last name is long, even when the combined name fits in 35 characters. The solution? Use a calculated field in place of the other two. To create this field, press < F10>, select Field Place Calculated, type [First Name] + "" + [Last Name], and press < Enter >. Only combined names longer than 35 characters will be truncated.

field of about 200 to 300 characters.

• Any chance you'll be calling the people on your list? If so, you'll want one or more telephone fields (you may also need one for a fax number). The area code should go with the number, bringing the minimum length for the field to 10 characters.

#### **Getting the Demographics**

For selective mailings, you'll need to know more than names, addresses, and telephone numbers. Demographic data that describes your customers' age, sex, income, and education can help you decide whom to mail to. If you're selling to a corporate or institutional client, consider fields for the customer's primary business, number of employees, and sales volume.

Consistency is important with demographic data. It won't do to list one customer's education as *Four years of college* and another's as *Bachelor's degree*. Almost all data managers offer some way to restrict a field's contents to a set of choices, and most let you pop up multiple-choice pick lists so users can merely select from a menu (see **SCREEN 1**). Find out how to do this in your program,

and set up your fields accordingly.

Information on recipients' past dealings with your organization is even more critical. Which products or services have they purchased from you?

How much have they spent? Have they responded to previous mailings?

When you move to this level of complexity, a relational data base proves its worth over a flat filer. Because each customer can make any number of purchases, customer and sales information must be kept in separate tables. Only a system that can *relate* one table to another can look up a customer and his or her past purchases in a separate table.

Don't worry too much about having to change your mailing list design later. You can always add, delete, or reformat fields if you need to. Still, careful planning will help you avoid any wholesale restructuring and ensure that your data base contains all the information you need for effective direct mail.


When using separate fields for first and last names on your mailing list, the dBASE TRIM() function removes the unwanted blanks from the end of text fields. For instance, if you have a 15-space FName field, using the statement FName + LName for a report column's contents will print out this way:

Carla Stevenson
That's not the way to win
new customers. If you use

TRIM(FName) + '' + LName, however, all those unwanted spaces will disappear. (The "+ ' '+" is needed to make sure one space remains between the names.)

When indexing, you'll want the last name first. Here, TRIM() isn't needed, since you're not concerned with the look of the index key, and the extra spaces don't affect the order of your sort—a simple INDEX ON LName + FName TO Cu\_name will suffice. But if you're printing a list of names, last name first, use TRIM(), as in TRIM(LName) + ',' + FName.



# Expert advice for creating high-impact documents and presentations

This month: making your documents picture perfect, and printing edge-of-the-page graphics with PageMaker

Sometimes, the easiest way to help employees or clients get the picture is to give them one. *Pictorial graphics* add life to text-heavy pages and help reinforce your document's message. Whether you're adding employee mug shots to an office newsletter or simple diagrams to a technical manual, the pictures you use play a big part in your document's success.

There are plenty of ways to get pictures into your documents and onto the page. You can create your own with programs like *Corel Draw* or *Publisher's Paintbrush*, or import ready-made images via a scanner or clip-art collection. You can print the images on the office laser or take them to a print shop for manual pasteup. No matter what meth-

ods you use, you'll need to choose an effective strategy for placing pictures on the page.


First, consider how readers will actually view your document. If your pages are bound and printed on both sides, treat each *spread* (opposing left and right pages) as a single unit, and lay out your pictures accordingly. Select pictures appropriate to your company's identity and the document's style and content. And finally, don't lard your document with images; if they don't help make your point, leave them out.

Here are some tips for placing and manipulating pictures.

• Formal business documents like training manuals demand a conservative tone. Keep pictures inside the page margins and align them consistently throughout.

- With less formal documents like newsletters, you can be more creative. Occasionally, positioning a picture to overlap the margins and gutters (spaces between columns) helps grab the reader's attention. For a three-dimensional effect, add a *drop shadow* (shaded box) under the picture.
- For dramatic impact, you can bleed, or extend, an image to the edge of the page, or tilt it at an angle. However, both effects may require manual pasteup, since laser printers can't print to the edge of a page and DTP programs can't tilt imported graphics.
- With multicolumn documents, picture width should correspond to col-

#### **NUTS & BOLTS**

#### Taking PageMaker Graphics to the Edge

A good way to add pizzazz to a pedestrian layout is by *bleeding*, or extending, a graphic to a page's outside edge. Bleeds can be used for simple design enhancement or for practical purposes, such as creating margin tabs to guide readers through a document.

But printing a bleed isn't easy. Even if you set the page margins at 0.00 inches, a laser printer automatically surrounds the page with a thin blank border. However, *PageMaker* users can employ a simple trick to create customized bleeds on the top

and bottom of letter-sized pages (though not the sides or the corners). Here's how.

Set up your *PageMaker* document for a letter-sized page, and place the graphic so it overlaps the top or bottom edge. When you're ready to print, change the page setup to legal-sized, print the final copy on 8½-by-14-inch paper, and use a paper cutter to trim the excess. To make the job even easier, you can add dotted lines as a guide for trimming the page. —*R. J.* 

#### **DESKTOP PUBLISHING TOOLBOX**

#### An Image Manager With a View

You know how tough it is to find the right illustration, scanned image, or other graphics file on a deadline. Now you can reach for Image-In's \$99 *Panorama* and organize your image library into an on-line catalog.

This *Windows*-based image manager is a snap to use. Simply select *Add* image and click on the graphic file's name. *Panorama* creates a page containing a 200-by-200-pixel version of the image, then prompts you for up to 16 keywords and a 254-character description. You can view up to five pages at once, search for files via keywords or

file format, and print out catalog text (but not images). To import a graphic, simply use the Edit menu to copy the file name to the Clipboard, then paste it into your document.

Panorama supports many popular graphics file formats, but not CGM or EPS. Unless you need to print a lot of Post-Script graphics, Panorama gives you the big picture on your image library. —R. J.

umn width. In other words, pictures in a three-column newsletter should be one, two, or three columns wide.

- In a single-column document, place horizontal (wide) pictures at the top or bottom of a page, and vertical (tall) ones flush with the left or right margin. If a picture is less than half a column wide, wrap text around it or place a caption next to it. If the picture is wider than half a column, leave the area next to it empty. Avoid centering a picture with white space or text on both sides—a single block of space or text works better.
- When using several pictures on a page, make the most important image the largest. An exception to this rule: photos of speakers or employees of equal status.
- Symmetry is essential for designing airplanes, but it gets boring fast when you design documents. Instead of using the same size, shape, and placement for all your pictures, use asymmetrical layouts with contrasting shapes and sizes, as shown in FIGURE 1.
- Always consider the content of a picture when deciding its location. If a picture features a person facing toward the right, place it on the left side of the page to direct the reader's eyes toward the relevant text on its right.
- Pictures are usually more effective after they've been *cropped*, or trimmed to emphasize their most important details. For example, if your publication includes a series of photo portraits, cropping or resizing them so the faces match in size and eye level will produce a more balanced layout.

Finally, proofread your publication to ensure that each image is placed near related text and the captions match the pictures. And don't hesitate to drag out that old precomputer tool, the hand ruler, to check a picture's position and alignment.  $\blacksquare$

# On-line resources for business and professional users

This month: Join in a freewheeling global town square with Usenet, the largest network in the world, and polish your financial portfolio with Telescan.

f Big Brother exists, he must spend many a sleepless night worrying about Usenet. This anarchic global information network is a celebration of free speech, unmuzzled information flow, and everything else that would curl the toes of a totalitarian.

No central organization owns or governs Usenet, yet the network grows and grows of its own momentum, linking universities, corporations, research centers, nonprofit groups, government agencies, hospitals, and public-access BBS's. No one knows for sure, but it has been estimated that Usenet has 33,000 nodes and more than 6 million users, making it the largest computer network in the world.

Few countries are safe from Usenet,

not even the Soviet Union, although several governments attempt to censor its content. Its corpulent bit stream snakes around the world and swells with each passing month, causing nodes to crash from overload and fueling speculation that the network itself is on the verge of tumbling.

## A Focus on Computing

Usenet began a decade ago as a forum for academic UNIX hackers and evolved into a more general conferencing system. It's chatty and clamorous, and its users don't suffer from lack of contentiousness. Over 650 public conferences are available, but the exact number ebbs and flows according to the whims of the users. Conferences are created or dissolved with a haphazard democracy—sometimes users vote, sometimes they lobby, occasionally someone just barges in and creates a new one.

Usenet's primary focus is still computers, with conferences for every programming language, computer, and popular application in existence. UNIX is still the chief topic, but more and more of the conferences focus on *Windows*, personal computers, and public domain software. Software libraries are also available.

Next to computers, science is the main draw, with many international debates devoted to hot topics like scientific ethics. Usenet is also a hotbed of debate on social and political issues, such as Middle Eastern politics, and there's the usual mix of hobbyist groups devoted to travel, cars, science fiction, and other such topics. Currently there are few business-specific conferences, but the one containing job listings is extremely popular.

Although Usenet per se does not offer the ability to send private E-mail, many Usenet nodes offer links to the international E-mail network Internet, which lets you send mail to just about any E-mail address in the world, including to MCI Mail addresses and Compu-Serve users.

So how do you tap in? If you lack access to a business or academic computer that's already tied into Usenet, you'll need to seek out one of the roughly 100 public-access Usenet systems that have cropped up across the United States over the last few years. These systems range from casually run BBS's that offer a sprinkling of Usenet conferences to commercial on-line services like Portal that provide close to the full deck.

Most of the services are blighted by Usenet's own menuless UNIX interface, but Usenet's excellent built-in help makes navigation reasonably easy. A typical service is the Milwaukee Information Exchange, which offers the com-

# **Hunting for Investments With Telescan**

Sniffing out good investments is like spotting mushrooms in tall grass. Where one person sees nothing, another might spot a dozen succulent chanterelles. Everything depends upon the angle from which you look. Telescan is a veritable financial spy satellite that lets you hunt for data and view it from myriad vantage points.

Telescan provides on-line prices for stocks, options, mutual funds, and futures contracts and also offers market averages. Prices go back as far as 1973; some are only 15 minutes old. In contrast to services like Dow Jones that let you download reams of numbers, Telescan presents them to you in charts, accompanied by the graphic indicators you select.

Telescan also gives you the meat of company reports, such as information on cash flow, capital spending, and earnings, plus a half-dozen investment newsletters, including the prestigious *Princeton Portfolios*. You can also tap into gateways to 850 business-related data bases including those of Dow Jones News/Retrieval and Standard & Poor, and you can

attend regular real-time forums that feature investment gurus like Gerald Appel.

To dial Telescan, you need a copy of the *The Analyzer*; which lists for \$99.95. Part communications package, part charting software, *The Analyzer* lets you dial the service manually, or you can set it up to automatically gather, chart, and print selected data and prices on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis. Once the data is captured, you can change and redraw the indicators as often as you like. Unfortunately, you can't export data to other applications for further analysis or charting.

The Edge (\$295) does the same thing, but with half the search criteria, and Mutual Fund Edge (\$295) does the same for mutual funds. Telescan Portfolio Manager (\$495) aids in managing portfolios.







# SHARE Clears Up Problems When AutoCAD Runs Under DOS 4.xx

I recently upgraded from a PC running DOS 3.3 matched with a 30MB hard disk to a machine using DOS 4.01 and an 80MB hard drive. On my old machine, AutoCAD 10 was heavily customized to incorporate symbol insertion through my tablet menu. Problems cropped up as soon as I moved my AutoCAD system to the single 80MB partition. For instance, the INSERT command would produce a 'cannot open file' message when I tried to access a symbol located outside the current directory. I consulted with other experienced AutoCAD users without success, and all my experimentation was fruitless until I heeded the system boot-up message warning that SHARE must be loaded for large partitions. Like a lot of people who aren't on a network, I'd always ignored the message because I didn't want to give up a piece of conventional RAM to another memory-resident program. But as soon as I placed the line install =c:\dos\share.exe in my AUTOEXEC-.BAT file and rebooted my computer, my AutoCAD problems disappeared. So the common wisdom that SHARE is just for networks isn't so wise when using AutoCAD 10 in a large partition under DOS 4.01. AutoCAD uses a lot of temporary files, so to avoid further eventual problems, place the line fcbs = 48,8 in your CONFIG.SYS file. This instruction allows AutoCAD to access up to 48 temporary files and requires DOS to keep 8 of them open.

## **A Little Bit More**

"MORE Automation" in October's User Group Tips can be improved. The suggested command type filename | more is a slow, inefficient way to use MORE to present a text file a screenful at a time. It runs two commands and requires the creation of a pipe, causing disk writes and holding up the MORE invocation until the TYPE command is finished. The process is further slowed if you include this command in a batch file. It's more efficient in terms of keystrokes and time simply to type more > filename. This way, you achieve the same effect and run only one command without having to create a pipe.

# An Easy First Choice With Paradox

If you ask for a list of tables while you're viewing a *Paradox* table, that table will be listed first, and any action you request will happen to that table unless you specify otherwise. This "automatic first choice" arrangement can be useful. After a query, I often want to rename the Answer table to protect it from deletion when I exit Paradox. To do this the quick way, I press < F10 > to bring up the menu, t to select Tools, < Enter> twice to select Rename and Table, < Enter > again to display the list of tables, and <Enter> once more to select Answer, the automatic first choice. This sequence delivers me to the prompt to type in the new name for the table.

# Speed Loading in Ventura Publisher

If you're using a 286 or slower machine to work on several large chapters in *Ventura Publisher 2.0*, you can speed loading by saving each chapter in a separate

subdirectory along with its own VP.INF file. By default, *Ventura* saves VP.INF in the Ventura subdirectory, and each time a new chapter is loaded, *Ventura* overwrites the existing VP.INF, thereby slowing the process. But you can save VP.INF in any subdirectory you wish by using a command line switch.


You'll need to alter the line in VP.BAT that contains the DRVRMRGR command to include the variable %1, which will represent the path of the subdirectory containing the chapter you wish to load, and the variable %2, which will represent the chapter you wish to load. Then your DRVRMRGR line will begin with DRVRMRGR VP %1\%2 (DRVRMRGR **VPPROF** %1\%2 with the Professional Extension) and be followed by the switches for your screen driver and mouse. At the end of the line, place the switch /1=%1, which will force Ventura to save the INF file in the subdirectory containing your chapter file. When you load Ventura, begin the command with vp (or vpprof, depending on your version), followed by the path, a space, and the file name of the chapter you want to work on. Ventura Software recommends that you always work from your hard disk, and unfortunately this speed-loading technique won't work with chapter and INF files created on a floppy disk.





# A global exchange of personal computer discoveries

Use Turbo Pascal to create a oneshot DOS prompt for Windows, profile BASIC code for faster performance, read key presses in batch files, and check out a macro that adds check boxes to WordPerfect documents.

# One-Shot DOS Prompt for Windows

I'm a Windows fan, but I miss having a DOS prompt immediately available. When I need to type an ASCII file or list a directory, I use a Turbo Pascal program, ONESHOT.PAS [see LISTING 1]. The program works like Program Manager's and File Manager's RUN options but is easier to use and recognizes built-in DOS commands like DIR and COPY.

Editor's note: Although you can open a DOS Prompt window to issue DOS

commands, that window will stay open until you close it. ONESHOT is ideal for any once-and-done DOS command.

I added several extensions to Mr. Pirkey's original submission. Like COMMAND.COM and the PROMPT \$P\$G command, ONESHOT displays

the current directory within the command prompt. A double greater-than symbol (>>) reminds you that this is not the usual DOS prompt. After you type a response, ONESHOT executes built-in DOS commands directly. For other commands, ONESHOT searches (continues)

the current PATH for a COM file, an EXE file, or a BAT file, in that order. You can override this search order by including the file name's extension— MYPROG.EXE, for example.

After compiling ONESHOT with Turbo Pascal 5.5 or 6.0, open File Manager, locate ONESHOT.EXE, and drag it to a Program Manager group window. To use ONESHOT, select its icon and type any DOS command or program name at the resulting prompt. After the command finishes, ONE-SHOT reports the current DOS errorand exit-code values, or '0' if no problems were detected. Press < Enter> to return to Windows.

If ONESHOT's window stays visible, press <Alt>-<F4> to close it, start the Windows PIF Editor, open \_DEFAULT.PIF, and then check the box labeled 'Close Window on Exit'. After you have made this change, ONESHOT's window will disappear automatically.

### **BASIC Profiles**

To time BASIC routines, I wrote PRO-FILE.BAS [see LISTING 2]. The program runs a profiling subroutine that times up to 100 elapsed repeats of any instruction.

To profile a program, copy the subroutine (lines 9000 through 9250) to your own code. (Lines 1100-1999 are included here only to demonstrate the profiler.) Near the beginning of your program, dimension an array PFAC-CUM!(100), set PFPOINT% to 0, and execute GOSUB 9000 as PRO-FILE.BAS does at lines 1100 through 1200. Then, at strategic locations, set PFPOINT% to a number between 1 and 99, and execute GOSUB 9000. (See lines 1250 through 1600 for examples of these steps.) The profile numbers do not have to be in sequence.

To display results for profiled points, set PFPOINT% to 100 or higher, and execute GOSUB 9000 as in line 1900. Once you have done that, any future calls to the profiler subroutine will be ignored.


Precision is limited to the smallest fractions of seconds that TIMER provides. Short sequences may run so fast that they won't show in the report. Therefore, to profile a single statement, you may have to insert it into a FOR loop that cycles at least 1000 times.

Editor's note: Use the profiler's report to find where your code spends the bulk of its time. By optimizing the most heavily traveled sections, you'll gain the greatest speed advantage with the least amount of work.

Because PC clocks are imprecise, you may receive different results for the same program profiled twice in succession. For better accuracy, profile your code three or more times and average the reported values.



# **Skeleton Key**

DOS lacks a batch-file command for reading key presses, so I wrote my own. KEY.COM is like a skeleton key that can unlock the keyboard for any batch file.

In a batch file, feed KEY a set of characters in commands like key yng or key 01234. If you type just key, the characters default to YN.

KEY waits for you to type a character. The program sets ERRORLEVEL to 0 for the first character, 1 for the second character, and so on. For the command KEY YNQ, pressing Y, N, or Q sets ERRORLEVEL to 0, 1, or 2, respectively.







Editor's note: I can think of dozens of great uses for this macro. You could use it to prepare multiple-choice tests, opinion polls, or even shopping lists.

FIGURE 1 shows the macro commands as they appear in the macro editor. To enter the macro, start WordPerfect, then press <Home><Ctrl>-<F10>. Press < Alt > - C to assign a hot key—or type a file name if you prefer to name your macros—and type a description  $such \ as \ Check \ Boxes \ followed \ by < Enter>.$ This will take you to the macro editing screen. Once you're there, press <Delete > to delete the '{DISPLAY OFF}' command.

Next, type the macro commands. The commands displayed in uppercase must be selected from the macrocommand menu, which you bring up by pressing <Ctrl>-<Page Up>. For others, press the associated key. For example, to enter '{Indent}', press <F4>. To enter '{Left Mar Rel}', press < Shift>-<Tab>. Press <Ctrl>-V before macroediting keys such as '{Tab}', '{Home}', '{Left}', '{Enter}', '{Down}', and '{Exit}'. Press < F7> to exit the macro editor.

In your document, press < Alt > - C (if that was your choice for a hot key combination) to begin a new check-mark paragraph. If you wish to number your paragraphs, type in a number and press < Enter>. Otherwise, just press <Enter>. Be sure to press <Enter> after the optional number and at the end of each paragraph.





# DEVELOPER'S TOOLBOX

# **Windows Tools Show Faint Promise**

At Fall COMDEX, I expected to find a flood of *Windows* development tools. But what I saw at the show and what has trickled in since haven't exactly drowned me in goodies. Maybe when Borland releases *Turbo Pascal for Windows*, my spirits will lift. Until then, current *Windows* tools show promise, but many also exhibit glaring flaws.

Consider *Dialog Coder* from The Software Organization. After designing a dialog with an editor or a similar product, you use *Dialog Coder* to create triggers and links between fields. For example, you can set up a Description button that enables additional controls.

This is exactly the kind of tool I need to reduce the amount of hand work in C. But I also need a clearly written manual. *Dialog Coder*'s manual is poorly organized, and the step-by-step tutorial is incomplete. The product's interface also needs improvement: After setting up a link between a button and a field, there's

nothing on screen to indicate that a link exists. I should be able to *see* triggers and links as I create them.

Another product I'm trying to like (with better success) is *Control Pak/W*, written by Eikon Systems and sold by Sage Software. The product's manual is superb. In fact, I learned more about custom controls by reading the first few chapters than from any other source.

Control Pak/W includes a control tester and several custom controls—buttons, arrows, picture frames, rulers, a color-palette selector, sliders, and a toolbox. The toolbox is nifty; you set up tools in a small window, like a paint program's brush palette.

This product would be great if it had more control styles and an editor for designing new controls. Currently, if the toolbox doesn't have the control you need, you're out of luck. *Control Pak/W* is good, but at \$595, it's overpriced.

On the convention floor, *Object Script* from Matesys caught my eye. Billed as an alternative to Asymetrix's *ToolBook*,

Object Script lets you design applications by cutting, pasting, and linking graphical elements. Despite its name, however, Object Script lacks ToolBook's sophisticated, object-oriented script language, so you can't, for instance, use common OOP techniques like inheritance and encapsulation to build reusable objects. Too bad, because unlike ToolBook, Object Script is fast.

Some encouraging words came in the mail: Peter Norton and Paul Yao's Windows 3.0 Power Programming Techniques, published by Bantam. Yao knows Windows inside and out, and his extensive knowledge shows on every page. Good book.

I wish I could say the same about the current wave of *Windows* development tools. But so far, the surge is barely making a ripple.

#### TAKING IT HOME

### The practical guide to home/office computing

Saving your bacon and CMOS

Steve Bass

"Gusty winds below the foothills" is the weather report I used to dread most. It means that Santa Ana winds are kicking in and a downed power line can knock out the electricity at any time.

Losing data is bad enough. But what really hurts is if you don't turn your system off before the power company's auxiliary generator kicks in. It's a sickening feeling watching your screen pop off and hearing your hard disk power down, only to see everything jolt back to life again. That'll fry your CMOS memory quicker than anything Kentucky Colonel can whip up—and not even a surge suppressor can save you.

The CMOS chip holds vital configuration specs for all your hardware—information about memory, time, and date, plus the display and disk types entered when you first got your PC. Without that data, the computer is inoperable, and unless you've made provisions, getting it back can take days.

On the other hand, you can restore your CMOS table in about half an hour if you've created a rescue disk containing all your essential setup programs and CMOS data. Start by making the disk bootable, using the DOS format /s command. Next, copy the values of the CMOS table to a file on the rescue floppy using The Norton Utilities' Disk Tools.

If you have a power failure, you can boot off this disk and run Disk Tools to restore these values to your CMOS chip.

In addition to that file, you'll want to put every conceivable tool and device driver you can on your rescue disk. I start with *QEdit Advanced*, a lean shareware text editor with which I can rebuild my CONFIG.SYS and AUTO-EXEC.BAT files as I check the integrity of my devices. Then there are all the drivers I might need for my peripherals, including my Plus Hardcard driver, which lets me access that hard disk even if my C: drive won't boot. I also have *The* 



Norton Utilities' Disk Tools and Disk Doctor II to fix any damage to my hard disk. Finally, I keep the SETUP program for my computer in case I need to reconfigure the CMOS data.

Even if disaster doesn't strike, the CMOS may go kaflooey (a DOS technical term) if the batteries powering its volatile memory run down. Symptoms could include the time and date falling behind or inexplicable read/write errors. I substituted the old batteries with new Rayovac four-year alkalines. Replacement is an easy and satisfying chore.

Finally, since I don't mind putting my

money where my data is, I went one better and outfitted my home and office computers with uninterruptible power supplies instead of surge suppressors. UPS's have fallen in price, and they give you surge protection as well as enough battery power to save files and shut down your system safely.

I chose an inexpensive UPS for home—the Smart UPS-400. It comes with *Power-Doctor*, software that measures the quality of the electric company's power. For the office file server, I selected a more powerful and feature-laden UPS, the Professional Series UPS 7200. Besides providing a network interface and RJ-11 jacks for my modem lines, the 7200 lets me power up my computer for remote access.

That should protect me against most power mishaps. Even in the worst case, though, I can take out my emergency rescue disk and get my equipment back in working order in the time it takes to jog down to the Colonel for a bucket of extra crispy. So can you.
